There was an error committed by my Committee,

1. Mr. President, Senators, and it refers to SB 920. 2. I have the...the roll call here and it was seven з. and seven and one present. Now, that bill is 4 . erroneously on 2nd reading here today on page 1, 5. second column near the bottom of the column. I 6. want to call to the attention of the Secretary, 7. that this bill is still in committee, and was 8. erroneously reported; and should not be on the

Calendar. PRESIDENT:

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Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Apparently, possibly, the Secretary followed the rules. What had happened in that committee was that on the roll call that was announced by the Chair, the vote was seven to six, with one present. After the roll call was announced, there was a change in vote, which we objected to and I guess the final disposition was a seven to six vote, with it appearing on the Calendar. Because once the vote was announced, I don't think anybody had the power to change their vote that would have substantially changed the effect of the roll call. Apparently, that's what the Secretary has picked up.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Sours.

SENATOR SOURS:

Glass, member of the committee, requested permission to change his vote. It was given to him, and it's seven to seven and should remain and is in committee.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

As the committee will recollect, Senator Glass originally voted present. The vote was announced as seven to six. Mr. Chairman he then requested permission to change his vote. Mr. Chairman...Mr. President, the vote that was...

PRESIDENT:

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Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

a seven to six with one present. When leave was sought to change the vote after the annoucement of the roll call we had objected strenuously and I don't think any single person under our rules has the right to at that point, make such a change that the roll call having been announced would take unanimous consent, under our rules.

Senator Carroll, I was diverted. I...will you state your comments, observations again.

Mr. President, my comment or observation is that

SENATOR CARROLL:

PRESIDENT:

apparently it is properly on the Calendar. When a roll call was had in committee, the vote that was announced by the Chair was seven votes aye, six votes no, one voting present. He announced the vote and announced that it would be so reported. Subsequent to that one of the members sought to change his present vote to a no vote, which would have the effect of having tied the vote seven to seven, and thereby would have had the effect of leaving the bill in committee. However, the vote having already been announced by the Chair, it could not be changed at that time any change in the vote that would have substantially changed the outcome

which that change would have done, without unanimous

consent of the committee. Not by the Chair's action alone. The vote was announced, apparently that was what was sent to the Secretary and apparently that's how it is on the Calendar now, and we think properly so. PRESIDENT:

Well, we are discussing activity in the committee. I will recognize Senator Sours for one more observation and then rule on what I think is the means of disposing of this matter as far as the Senate is concerned. I think the discussion relative to the action of the committee is not germane to Senate response except by appropriate procedural motions dealing with the bill in its form before the Senate. Senator Sours, do you want to make any further comment?

SENATOR SOURS:

Yes, Mr. President. The report in the Office of the Secretary shows quite properly and quite accurately that the vote was seven to seven, one present. Now, Glass wanted to change his vote, I gave him that permission, and the report shows in the Secretary's Office it was seven to seven. Now, I think so far as the rules are concerned, we have our own rules in Judiciary and of course the good Senator knows that too. We vote proxies, contrary to some people's opinions, they vote it, we do to. Now, Glass changed the vote and the vote was seven to seven and the report in the Secretary's Office so shows that. And so far as I'm concerned that's final.

PRESIDENT:

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The...the report of the committee yesterday, reported the bill to the Senate Do Pass. The only means that I know of to cure that problem Senator Sours is to move to recommit the bill to the committee. We are faced with

the matter of the committee report having been reported
 to the Senate yesterday that the bill was reported
 favorably with a Do Pass motion. And according to the
 Journal we are in the position of the bill being on
 the Calendar, according to the appropriate motion having
 been reported to the Senate. So that your procedure to
 cure it, it seems to me would be to recommit the bill.

Senator Sours.

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SENATOR SOURS:

Mr. President, the...the report itself is ambiguous because it shows seven and seven on a Do Pass. In other words, the result is contrary to the statement that... it Do Pass. That's the problem.

PRESIDENT:

Well, Senator, irrespective of the roll call, the typewritten report that was reported to the Senate was a Do Pass motion. Is that correct? The matter is now before us and the bill is on the Calendar, so it seems to me the only reactions from the Senate at this point, irrespective of the action of the committee, is to recommit the bill. Senator Sours.

SENATOR SOURS:

I so move.

PRESIDENT:

For what purpose does Senator Carroll arise? SENATOR CARROLL:

I would suggest to the President that such a motion at this time is out of order. We have not reached that order of business in the daily order of business, and as the sponsor of the bill, I do believe, I have control. I would like to mention 3. just one thing this morning, in addition to my thanks for 4 . all your thoughts, prayers, concerns and in every way 5. 6. that you have assisted the POW's and MIA's. 7. to thank you very much, and I'm might happy...and if I may on behalf of the other POW's not only from 8. Illinois, but from the United States. But there is 9. one thing that is still on my mind, and has a very 10. prominent role for me right now, and that is that we 11. still have over 1300 Americans who are missing in action. 12. We have 61 I believe from Illinois, and I would hope, 13. and I know this is a more a Federal matter than it is 14. a State matter, but I would hope that in any way you 15. can, that you would assist in getting an accountability 16. for these men, and not of these men for their families. 17. 18. The...I've talked to many wives, I've talked to many families, mothers and fathers, and my mother of course 19. is elated, she's very happy that I'm home as well as 20. the other POW's, but these families are in such a state 21. of affairs, the other families, the families of the MIA's 22. are in such a state of affairs because they don't know 23. about their sons. They don't know about their husbands, 24. and so, I would ask you to do whatever you can to try 25. to get this accountability. There are teams that are 26. scheduled to go in, they either have just gone in or 27. are going to go in within the next few days, into north 28. View Nam to investigate some crash sites, and this is 29. a move in the right direction. Now from here on out, ВΟ. it's going to be a matter of trying to get an 31. accountability of as many as possible of these other 32. men. And I don't know what the Senate of Illinois 33.

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can do, perhaps send a Resolution if they are so ı. inclined to the Federal Government to let them know 2. that we are interested in these 60 families, these 3. 60 men in Illinois as well as the others. And if you 4. would do that I would personally appreciate it very 5. much, and I'm sure all of the POW's who are aware 6. of the situation would appreciate it also.
