11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Mohr.

13. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

14. Mr. President, I move to dispense with further  
15. reading of the Journals of May 1st, 2nd and 3rd, unless  
16. some Senator might have some corrections to offer the  
17. Journals stand approved.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Mohr moves to dispense with further  
20. reading of the Journal of May 1st, and unless some  
21. Senator has corrections or additions, the Journals  
22. stand approved. All in favor signify by saying aye.  
23. Contrary no. The motion carries, the Journal is  
24. approved.

25. SECRETARY:

26. Wednesday, May 2nd, 1973.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Mohr.

29. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

30. Mr. President I now move to dispense with further  
31. reading of the Journal of May 2nd, and unless there are  
32. some other corrections to offer, I move the Journal  
33. stand approved.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Mohr moves to dispense with further reading  
3. of the Journal of May 2nd, unless there are additions or  
4. corrections by any Senator. Motion is to approve the  
5. Journal of May 2nd. All in favor signify by saying aye.  
6. Contrary no. The motion carries, the Journal is approved.

7. SECRETARY:

8. Thursday, May 3rd, 1973.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Mohr.

11. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR :

12. Mr. President I move to dispense with the further  
13. reading of the Journal of May 3rd, unless there is  
14. some correction, the Journal stand approved.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Mohr moves to dispense with further reading  
17. of the Journal of May 3rd, and unless there are additions  
18. or corrections from Senators the motion is that the  
19. Journal be approved. All in favor signify by saying  
20. aye. Contrary no. The motion carries, and the Journal  
21. is approved. Senator Mohr.

22. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

23. Mr. President, I now move to postpone the reading  
24. and approval of the Journals of May 4th, 7th, 8th, 9th  
25. and 10th pending the arrival of the printed Journals.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Mohr moves that we dispense with further  
28. reading of the Journals of 4th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th  
29. pending the arrival of the printed Journals. All in  
30. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion  
31. carries. Senator Sours.

32. SENATOR SOURS:

33. There was an error committed by my Committee,

1. Mr. President, Senators, and it refers to SB 920.  
2. I have the...the roll call here and it was seven  
3. and seven and one present. Now, that bill is  
4. erroneously on 2nd reading here today on page 1,  
5. second column near the bottom of the column. I  
6. want to call to the attention of the Secretary,  
7. that this bill is still in committee, and was  
8. erroneously reported; and should not be on the  
9. Calendar.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Carroll.

12. SENATOR CARROLL:

13. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Apparently, possibly,  
14. the Secretary followed the rules. What had happened  
15. in that committee was that on the roll call that was  
16. announced by the Chair, the vote was seven to six,  
17. with one present. After the roll call was announced,  
18. there was a change in vote, which we objected to and  
19. I guess the final disposition was a seven to six vote,  
20. with it appearing on the Calendar. Because once the  
21. vote was announced, I don't think anybody had the  
22. power to change their vote that would have substantially  
23. changed the effect of the roll call. Apparently,  
24. that's what the Secretary has picked up.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Sours.

27. SENATOR SOURS:

28. Glass, member of the committee, requested permission  
29. to change his vote. It was given to him, and it's  
30. seven to seven and should remain and is in committee.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Carroll.

33. SENATOR CARROLL:

1. As the committee will recollect, Senator Glass  
2. originally voted present. The vote was announced as  
3. seven to six. Mr. Chairman he then requested permission  
4. to change his vote. Mr. Chairman...Mr. President, the  
5. vote that was...

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Carroll.

8. SENATOR CARROLL:

9. ...the vote that was announced Mr. President, was  
10. a seven to six with one present. When leave was sought  
11. to change the vote after the announcement of the roll  
12. call we had objected strenuously and I don't think any  
13. single person under our rules has the right to at that  
14. point, make such a change that the roll call having been  
15. announced would take unanimous consent, under our rules.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Carroll, I was diverted. I...will you state  
18. your comments, observations again.

19. SENATOR CARROLL:

20. Mr. President, my comment or observation is that  
21. apparently it is properly on the Calendar. When a roll  
22. call was had in committee, the vote that was announced  
23. by the Chair was seven votes aye, six votes no, one  
24. voting present. He announced the vote and announced  
25. that it would be so reported. Subsequent to that one  
26. of the members sought to change his present vote to a  
27. no vote, which would have the effect of having tied the  
28. vote seven to seven, and thereby would have had the  
29. effect of leaving the bill in committee. However, the  
30. vote having already been announced by the Chair, it  
31. could not be changed at that time any change in the  
32. vote that would have substantially changed the outcome  
33. which that change would have done, without unanimous

1. consent of the committee. Not by the Chair's action  
2. alone. The vote was announced, apparently that was  
3. what was sent to the Secretary and apparently that's how  
4. it is on the Calendar now, and we think properly so.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Well, we are discussing activity in the committee.  
7. I will recognize Senator Sours for one more observation  
8. and then rule on what I think is the means of disposing  
9. of this matter as far as the Senate is concerned. I  
10. think the discussion relative to the action of the  
11. committee is not germane to Senate response except by  
12. appropriate procedural motions dealing with the bill  
13. in its form before the Senate. Senator Sours, do you  
14. want to make any further comment?

15. SENATOR SOURS:

16. Yes, Mr. President. The report in the Office of the  
17. Secretary shows quite properly and quite accurately that  
18. the vote was seven to seven, one present. Now, Glass  
19. wanted to change his vote, I gave him that permission,  
20. and the report shows in the Secretary's Office it was  
21. seven to seven. Now, I think so far as the rules are  
22. concerned, we have our own rules in Judiciary and of  
23. course the good Senator knows that too. We vote  
24. proxies, contrary to some people's opinions, they  
25. vote it, we do to. Now, Glass changed the vote and  
26. the vote was seven to seven and the report in the  
27. Secretary's Office so shows that. And so far as I'm  
28. concerned that's final.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. The...the report of the committee yesterday, reported  
31. the bill to the Senate Do Pass. The only means that I  
32. know of to cure that problem Senator Sours is to move  
33. to recommit the bill to the committee. We are faced with

1. the matter of the committee report having been reported  
2. to the Senate yesterday that the bill was reported  
3. favorably with a Do Pass motion. And according to the  
4. Journal we are in the position of the bill being on  
5. the Calendar, according to the appropriate motion having  
6. been reported to the Senate. So that your procedure to  
7. cure it, it seems to me would be to recommit the bill.  
8. Senator Sours.

9. SENATOR SOURS:

10. Mr. President, the...the report itself is ambiguous  
11. because it shows seven and seven on a Do Pass. In other  
12. words, the result is contrary to the statement that...  
13. it Do Pass. That's the problem.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Well, Senator, irrespective of the roll call, the  
16. typewritten report that was reported to the Senate  
17. was a Do Pass motion. Is that correct? The  
18. matter is now before us and the bill is on the  
19. Calendar, so it seems to me the only reactions from  
20. the Senate at this point, irrespective of the action  
21. of the committee, is to recommit the bill. Senator  
22. Sours.

23. SENATOR SOURS:

24. I so move.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. For what purpose does Senator Carroll arise?

27. SENATOR CARROLL:

28. I would suggest to the President that such a motion  
29. at this time is out of order. We have not reached that  
30. order of business in the daily order of business, and as  
31. the sponsor of the bill, I do believe, I have control.  
32. I think that motion would only be in order until the  
33. time...at the time I call it at 2nd reading. I don't

1. think at this time anybody but I have control over  
2. that bill. I have not called it, nor are we in that  
3. order of business, and I think he's out of order.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Yes the motion to recommit is...you are correct.  
6. That Senator Sours motion would be move to proceed out  
7. of the regular order of business, and if so then, on  
8. the order of motions he could make this motion. I  
9. will rule that he can make the motion to recommit  
10. on the order of motions. But he...he does need  
11. permission of the Body to proceed out of the regular  
12. order of business. Senator Sours, did you...did you  
13. hear my ruling to Senator Carroll? He raised a valid  
14. point of order. In the absence of objection, your  
15. motion to recommit at this order of business is...is  
16. objected to. You have the privilege to move to proceed  
17. out of the regular order of business or wait until the  
18. order of motions...

19. SENATOR SOURS:

20. We'll just wait. There's no need to kill time on  
21. superfluous motions.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. ...for what purpose does Senator Glass seek recognition?

24. SENATOR GLASS:

25. Mr. President, for a matter of personal privilege,  
26. and members of the Senate.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Proceed.

29. SENATOR GLASS:

30. I would very briefly like to introduce to the Body  
31. members of the Immanuel Lutheran School in my District,  
32. in Glenview, Illinois, and Miss Hazen who is bringing  
33. them down here for a tour of the Capital City and ask

1. them to rise and be recognized.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Wooten.

4. SENATOR WOOTEN:

5. Mr. President, I would ask leave of the Body to  
6. be shown as co-sponsor of Senate Joint Resolution 32.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Is there leave? So ordered. Messages from the  
9. Governor.

10. SECRETARY:

11. (Secretary reads message from the Governor.)

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Executive. Could I have the attention of the Senate?  
14. Senator Hynes wishes to make an introduction which I  
15. think we all will be interested in learning about.  
16. Senator Hynes.

17. SENATOR HYNES:

18. Thank you Mr. President, members of the Senate,  
19. it's my great pleasure today to introduce a young man,  
20. who has sacrificed greatly for all of us. He was a prisoner  
21. of war in Southeast Asia for five years. He's a fine  
22. American, I've gotten to know him very well since his  
23. release, and I...I just can't say enough about him.  
24. He's here with his mother, and I'd like to introduce  
25. Mrs. Stark and Larry Stark and ask Larry if he would  
26. say a few words and, I would ask that the Senate stand  
27. and acknowledge his presence.

28. LARRY STARK:

29. Thank you very much gentlemen. It is indeed an  
30. honor to be here this morning, and to have such a  
31. welcome. I am much impressed, and I'm not going to  
32. make extensive remarks because I know just how busy  
33. you are, at least I know a little bit about how busy



1. you are. And I am very impressed with this...I've been  
2. really encouraged to see our Senators working so hard  
3. to get legislation for our State. I would like to mention  
4. just one thing this morning, in addition to my thanks for  
5. all your thoughts, prayers, concerns and in every way  
6. that you have assisted the POW's and MIA's. I want  
7. to thank you very much, and I'm might happy...and if  
8. I may on behalf of the other POW's not only from  
9. Illinois, but from the United States. But there is  
10. one thing that is still on my mind, and has a very  
11. prominent role for me right now, and that is that we  
12. still have over 1300 Americans who are missing in action.  
13. We have 61 I believe from Illinois, and I would hope,  
14. and I know this is a more a Federal matter than it is  
15. a State matter, but I would hope that in any way you  
16. can, that you would assist in getting an accountability  
17. for these men, and not of these men for their families.  
18. The...I've talked to many wives, I've talked to many  
19. families, mothers and fathers, and my mother of course  
20. is elated, she's very happy that I'm home as well as  
21. the other POW's, but these families are in such a state  
22. of affairs, the other families, the families of the MIA's  
23. are in such a state of affairs because they don't know  
24. about their sons. They don't know about their husbands,  
25. and so, I would ask you to do whatever you can to try  
26. to get this accountability. There are teams that are  
27. scheduled to go in, they either have just gone in or  
28. are going to go in within the next few days, into north  
29. View Nam to investigate some crash sites, and this is  
30. a move in the right direction. Now from here on out,  
31. it's going to be a matter of trying to get an  
32. accountability of as many as possible of these other  
33. men. And I don't know what the Senate of Illinois

1. can do, perhaps send a Resolution if they are so  
2. inclined to the Federal Government to let them know  
3. that we are interested in these 60 families, these  
4. 60 men in Illinois as well as the others. And if you  
5. would do that I would personally appreciate it very  
6. much, and I'm sure all of the POW's who are aware  
7. of the situation would appreciate it also. I thank  
8. you very much for letting me talk to you this morning,  
9. and I just thank you for all the things you've done  
10. for me in the past. Thank you very much.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator...Senator Partee.

13. SENATOR PARTEE:

14. Well, Mr. President, I'm sure that you are touched  
15. as I was by the remarks and the impact of the remarks  
16. of the gentleman who was good enough to come to be here  
17. with us today. And I would invite you to jointly sponsor  
18. a Resolution with me on that subject.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. I accept that invitation to join as co-sponsor with  
21. you. Thank you. Committee Reports.

22. SECRETARY:

23. (Secretary reads Committee Reports)

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Resolution.

26. SECRETARY:

27. ...Resolution 151 by Senators Daley, Rock and Carroll  
28. and it's congratulatory. Congratulates Mr. Edward T.  
29. Hanley.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Carroll.

32. SENATOR CARROLL:

33. Thank you Mr. President. I would move for the

1. suspension of the rules for the immediate consideration  
2. and adoption of this congratulatory resolution. It's  
3. congratulating Ed Hanley, the International President  
4. of the Bartenders Union on his recent election.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Carroll, do you...

7. SENATOR CARROLL:

8. For suspension of rules for the immediate consideration  
9. and adoption.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Carroll moves to suspend the rules for  
12. the immediate consideration of the Resolution. All in  
13. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion  
14. carries. The rules are suspended. Senator Carroll.

15. SENATOR CARROLL:

16. Thank you Mr. President, I would now move for the  
17. adoption of the Resolution that commends Edward Hanley  
18. who is the new president at the age of 41 of the Hotel Restaurant  
19. Employees and Bartenders International Union, the youngest  
20. man to ever serve in that position.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. All in favor of the motion to adopt signify by  
23. saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries and the  
24. Resolution is adopted.

25. SECRETARY:

26. Senate Resolution 152 by Senators Scholl, Schaffer  
27. and Weaver, and it provides for the creation of an  
28. establishment of a special committee.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Senator Scholl.

31. SENATOR SCHOLL:

32. I would appreciate this Resolution being sent to  
33. the Executive Committee.

2. Executive.

3. SECRETARY:

4. Senate Resolution 153 by Senator Regner. Senate  
5. Resolution 153 by Senator Regner.

6. PRESIDENT:

12. by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries, the  
13. Amendment No. 4 is adopted. Senator Regner.

14. SENATOR REGNER:

15. Mr. President, I'd like to request that SB 796 be  
16. held on 2nd reading, I have one more amendment that is  
17. being prepared.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. All right. Now the Calendar is wrong as relates  
20. to SB 765. That should show Senator Dougherty as the  
21. front sponsor. And Senator Dougherty, you wish that  
22. advanced.

23. SECRETARY:

24. SB 765 (Secretary reads title of bill)  
25. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.No committee  
26. amendments.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3 rd reading.  
29. Senator Regner, 799. 802. 797, advance.

30. SECRETARY:

31. SB 799 (Secretary reads title of bill)  
32. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Regner.

2. SENATOR REGNER:

3. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate, the  
4. amendment I have up there right now sets an interim  
5. reporting date for this commission that report back  
6. this year and the final report in the 79th General  
7. Assembly. I move for the adoption of Amendment No. 1  
8. to SB 799.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Is there further discussion? Senator Regner  
11. moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1. All in favor  
12. signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries,  
13. and the amendment is adopted. Are there further amend-  
14. ments from the Floor? 3rd reading. 802, Senator  
15. Regner, advance.

16. SECRETARY:

17. SB 802 (Secretary reads title of bill)  
18. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive  
19. offers one amendment.

20. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Regner.

2. SENATOR REGNER:

3. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate, the  
4. amendment offered by the Committee, gave the commission  
5. authority to be provided with all records and information  
6. wanted from other departments. I move for its adoption.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. All in favor of the motion to adopt, signify by  
9. saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries, and the  
10. amendment is adopted. Are there amendments from the  
11. Floor?

12. SECRETARY:

13. Amendment No. 2 by Senator Regner.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Regner.

3. SENATOR REGNER:

4. Mr. President, Amendment No. 2 puts an interim  
5. reporting date in this commission for next year, and  
6. I move for its adoption.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Is there further discussion? All in favor of  
9. adoption of Amendment No. 2 signify by saying aye.  
10. Contrary no. The motion carries, the amendment is  
11. adopted. Are there further amendments from the Floor?  
12. 3rd reading. 811, Senator Hynes. 841, Senator  
13. Newhouse, advance.

14. SECRETARY:

15. SB 841 (Secretary reads title of bill)  
16. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.  
19. Now, the Chair wishes to advise the Senate that we've  
20. reached the point in time in which there was agreement  
21. in the Executive Committee this morning, which committee  
22. is hard put to work out the remainder of committee  
23. activities, that we would adjourn as close to 1:15 as  
24. possible. We've gone beyond that point. There is one  
25. item of business I understand that Senator Glass  
26. has cleared with Senator Partee. Is Senator Glass  
27. on the Floor? Is there leave to return to the order  
28. of Resolutions? Resolution. Senator Glass.

29. SENATOR GLASS:

30. Thank you Mr. President and Senators I would move  
31. for waiver of the appropriate rules so that Senate  
32. Resolution may be considered at this time. It is a  
33. Resolution memorializing Dr. John A. Kennicott, who

1. arrived in West Northfield in 1936 and built his home  
2. in an area which is now know as "The Grove", and supports  
3. the efforts of local citizens in that community to save  
4. "The Grove". And I would urge your support.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Glass moves to suspend the rules for  
7. the immediate consideration of the Resolution. All in  
8. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion  
9. carries, the rules are suspended. On the motion to  
10. adopt. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no.  
11. The motion carries, the Resolution is adopted. Senator  
12. Vadalabene has called my attention to the fact that the  
13. Treasurer does have one bill on 2nd reading, or Senator  
14. Vadalabene has a bill for the Treasurer that is of  
15. emergency nature. We'll return to 2nd reading and  
16. advance 1147.

17. SECRETARY:

18. SB 1147 (Secretary reads title of bill)  
19. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.  
22. Senator Partee.

23. SENATOR PARTEE:

24. I'd just like to ask for leave to submit to you  
25. and the Secretary a list of bills that I have talked  
26. about at a later time.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Yes, I'd...leave is granted. We've checked the  
29. rules. We are under no embargo to take that exemption  
30. action today. So that we're...we will get to that motion  
31. on Monday, and that will give your staff and our staff  
32. a little more time to work out in specific detail the  
33. ones that we want to exempt.

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. Very good. Thank you.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Buzbee.

5. SENATOR BUZBEE:

6. Thank you Mr. President. I rise on a point of personal  
7. privilege. We had a situation happen in the Education  
8. Committee this morning which I think typifies what's  
9. happening to this State Senate right now, Mr. President.  
10. We were going through bills so rapidly because of this  
11. last minute crunch that we were at one point starting  
12. to vote on a bill and I had not even found the bill yet,  
13. had no idea what it said, had no idea what it was  
14. about. Mr. President, I think it's time that this  
15. Legislative Body started facing up to our responsibilities  
16. and do one of two or perhaps both things, and this is  
17. to start providing ourselves with enough money so that  
18. individual legislators will be able to have staff so  
19. that we're able to find out a little bit about what's  
20. going on in some of these bills. I for one don't like  
21. to sit in committee or on this Floor, and not know what  
22. 80 or 90% of the legislation that's coming up is about.  
23. The second this is, I do resent this last minute crunch,  
24. these deadlines that we have to meet. I'm being paid \$17,500  
25. a year by the people of the State of Illinois to do the  
26. peoples business. I don't feel like that I'm able to  
27. adequately do the people business if I've got to vote on  
28. forty or fifty or sixty bills a day without knowing what  
29. they're about. And I would like to see these dead-  
30. lines that we have now, I'd like to see them stopped  
31. in the future. Thank you Mr. President.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Are there further announcements to come before the

1. Senate? Senator Rock.

2. SENATOR ROCK:

3. I thought Senator Glass was going to announce, but  
4. we have one announcement of major importance. Monday  
5. evening the Senate softball team will have practice.  
6. If we have a team, we will have practice. But the  
7. practice is scheduled for Monday night. The House  
8. is going to practice with us. It's out at...what's the  
9. name of that park? No, it's not Iles. Lincoln Park.  
10. Lincoln Park, diamond number 4.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Scholl.

13. SENATOR SCHOLL:

14. I just wanted to ask Senator Rock, is there an  
15. age limit?

16. SENATOR ROCK:

17. No. No limit of any kind. We expect everybody to  
18. be out with their proper equipment.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Ozinga.

21. SENATOR OZINGA:

22. Senate Executive Committee goes right back into  
23. Session right now.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Don Moore.

26. SENATOR DON MOORE:

27. Yes, Mr. President, at the request of the House  
28. sponsor of HB 180 and HB 233, Representative Hoffman,  
29. I would like my name to be shown as the chief Senate  
30. sponsor in lieu of Senator Clarke on those two bills.  
31. HB 180 and HB 233. And I would aks for unanimous consent.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Is there leave? So ordered. Senator Don Moore.

1. SENATOR DON MOORE:

2.           These are companion bills, Mr. President. They are  
3. in different committees. I have talked to the chairman  
4. of both committees involved and I would like to ask  
5. leave to have the Committee on Insurance and Financial  
6. Institutions discharged from further consideration of  
7. HB 180, and then ask to have that bill referred to the  
8. Committee on Credit Regulations and Licensed Activities.  
9. I would now ask Mr. President that the Committee on  
10. Insurance and Financial Institutions be discharged from  
11. further consideration of HB 180. I would ask for  
12. unanimous consent.

13. PRESIDENT:

14.           Senator Moore moves to discharge the Committee  
15. on Insurance and Financial Institutions from further  
16. consideration of...

17. SENATOR DON MOORE:

18.           HB 180.

19. PRESIDENT:

20.           HB 180. All in favor of the motion signify by  
21. saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries. So  
22. ordered. Senator Moore.

23. SENATOR DON MOORE:

24.           I now ask unanimous consent Mr. President, to  
25. have HB 180 re-referred to the Committee on Credit  
26. Regulations and Licensed Activities. I now ask tht  
27. HB 180 be re-referred to the Committee on Credit  
28. Regulations and Licensed Activities.

29. PRESIDENT:

30.           All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no.  
31. The motion carries, the bill is recommitted. Senator  
32. Fawell.

33. SENATOR FAWELL:



1. Mr. President, I merely wanted to bring out that  
2. the Education Committee is going to be going back into  
3. Session immediately after adjournment.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Are there further announcements to come before  
6. the Senate? The Chair wishes to announce that as we  
7. did this last Monday, although the original schedule  
8. suggested 3:30, that...scratch what I began to say.  
9. The Senate stands adjourned until Monday, at 3:30,  
10. pursuant to the adjournment resolution that we adopted.  
11. So we will reconvene Monday at 3:30 p.m. Senator  
12. Nudelman.

13. SENATOR NUDELMAN:

14. How many days next week Mr. President?

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Well, we will make a determination on that

32. SENATOR MCBROOM:

33. Mr. President, probably a little premature, but

1. the Appropriations Committee will meet two days next  
2. week, Tuesday and Wednesday.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Glass.

5. SENATOR GLASS:

6. Has the practice for Monday night been...

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Yes, it has been announced. Now the adjournment  
9. Resolution does provide for a meeting of the Senate  
10. tomorrow, but that will be perfunctory. We've made  
11. arrangements for that to be covered, so if there are  
12. no further announcements, the Senate stands adjourned
