23. I believe there's a committee amendment and I think Senator
24. McBroom will move its adoption.

26. Is there further discussion? On the adoption of Committee
27. Amendment Number 1, all in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
28. no. The motion carries and the amendment is adopted. Are there

14. that it isn't a case of poor housekeeping in the Senate Chamber with
