28. SB 1476  
29. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
30. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.  
31. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
32. Any amendments from the Floor? Any discussion? Senator Rock.  
33. SENATOR ROCK:

1. No...not on 1476 Mr. President.  
2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
3. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. For what  
4. purpose do you arise Senator?  
5. SENATOR ROCK:  
6. My question, if I might inquire of the Chair, did...have we  
7. moved or attempted to move SB 1475 or was that passed over?  
8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
9. We did not attempt to move it Senator.

11. You did not. Ok.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
24. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.  
25. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
26. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. For what  
27. purpose does Senator Vadalabene rise?  
28. SENATOR VADALABENE:  
29. Thank you Mr. President. On a point of personal privilege,

31. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
32. State your point Senator.  
33. SENATOR VADALABENE:



1. Immediately to my rear is the 8th grade class of the Trinity  
2. Lutheran School at Edwardsville, with their Principal Aldo Snock,  
3. the mothers and the teachers and I would like for them to stand  
4. and be recognized by this august Body.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

6. We are now on SB 1492. Senator Conolly.

7. SECRETARY:

8. SB 1492

9. (Secretary reads title of bill)

10. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

12. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd...Senator Mitchler,  
13. for what purpose do you rise? Amendment number 1 presented  
14. by Senator Mitchler, Senator Conolly, do you have a copy of  
15. that amendment? Senator Conolly.

16. SENATOR CONOLLY:

17. That courtesy hasn't been extended to me.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

19. Well, the Secretary...how big of an amendment... Senator  
20. Conolly. I'll recognize you after...Senator Mitchler is presenting  
21. the amendment. Senator will you explain your amendment?

22. SENATOR MITCHLER:

23. Mr. President and members of the Senate, Amendment 1...number  
24. 1 to SB 1492 is introduced by myself and Senator Bell. This  
25. amendment adds a section to the SB 1492 relating to the regional  
26. Transportation Authority Act. SB 1492 provides that one hundred  
27. percent of the part of the tax proceeds from any area be required  
28. to be spent for services in that area. Now, it was felt that in  
29. some areas and when we speak about areas, an area is determined  
30. in the Act to be the City of Chicago, suburban Cook County outside  
31. the City of Chicago or one of the counties of Kane, Lake, DuPage,  
32. Will and McHenry. And if, inasmuch as one hundred percent of the  
33. money raised by taxes in an area is to spent in the area, this

1. amendment gives the RTA Board the authority to reduce taxes in  
2. an area when the Board feels that excess...excessive taxes are  
3. collected. In other words, if more money is collected in an area  
4. than they actually need through the type of taxation put on by  
5. the Board. The Board has the authority by this amendment to  
6. reduce the amount of taxes collected, because it's felt that  
7. the manner in which the taxes are going to be imposed some of  
8. the areas will not be able to use the taxes collected and rather  
9. than just have them piled up, they can have a reduction in the  
10. taxes by authority of the Board. I move for adoption of this  
11. Amendment number 1 to SB 1492.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

13. A motion to adopt Amendment number 1. Any discussion?  
14. Senator Conolly.

15. SENATOR CONOLLY:

16. Thi...having just received this amendment I cannot...

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

18. I think...just a minute Senator. There are some members of  
19. the Senate who have an extreme interest in this subject matter.  
20. I think they are entitled to hear both sides of the debate, once  
21. again I can only say please. Continue.

22. SENATOR CONOLLY:

23. Mr. President, having just momentarily ago received this  
24. amendment, I have not been able to determine whether it has  
25. merit or not. This bill and the whole subject of RTA has  
26. been rediscussed in the Senate Transportation Committee and I'm  
27. surprised that the Senator did not bring it and offer it when  
28. he appeared before the committee. So, on that basis since it  
29. has not been discussed by the entire committee and has not...  
30. I have not had time to see whether or not has merit. I would have  
31. to, therefore, at this time move to Table that amendment.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

33. There has been a motion to adopt the subsequent motion to

1. Table...Senator Bell.

2. SENATOR BELL:

3. A...

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

5. Are you debating the motion to Table, it's not debatable.

6. Senator Bell.

7. SENATOR BELL:

8. Mr...Mr. President, I'm speaking to the amendment...

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

10. Senator Conolly has for, the purpose of discussion, withdrawn

11. temporarily his motion to Table.

12. SENATOR BELL:

13. Mr...Mr. President...

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. Take it out of the record.

16. SENATOR BELL:

17. ...is it not possible for me to address myself to speaking

18. to the motion to Table?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

20. It...it is not because that is not debatable, but that motion

21. has been withdrawn, so you may speak to the amendment.

22. SENATOR BELL:

23. Thank you Mr. Pres...

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

25. You did not withdraw your... Senator Bell.

26. SENATOR BELL:

27. Mr. President, I wonder if the Chairman of Transportation

28. Committee Senator Conolly would withhold that motion to Table

29. temporarily.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

31. Senator Conolly may respond to the request of the Senator from

32. Joliet.

33. SENATOR CONOLLY:

1. As I mentioned earlier, this was debated thoroughly,  
2. not this amendment and I don't know why Senator Bell, you didn't  
3. bring up since are taking authorship why you didn't bring this  
4. up yesterday in the...so I just for the speed to get through  
5. the House he...the Senate I think that this...busy calendar here  
6. and I just as soon leave my amendment in or my motion to Table.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

8. Did you answer directly the question? You did not...motion.  
9. Senator Glass for what purpose do you rise?

10. SENATOR GLASS:

11. Mr. President, I rise for clarification of what this amendment  
12. does if that's possible?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

14. I...the Chair can only that it is a lengthy deb...amendment  
15. which was explained at a time that the Senate...the Chair was  
16. trying to get order in the Senate. It is an amendment of  
17. considerable magnitude, type wise anyway. And, I think if we are  
18. interested in expediting the action in the Senate perhaps that the  
19. two principals involved in this would talk over the amendment and  
20. we would...withhold action temporarily on this bill. I'm making that  
21. as suggestion from the Chair. Does the sponsor of the amendment  
22. indicate a willingness to withhold your motion, we'll hold  
23. the bill for at least temporarily and you talk with Senator Bell  
24. and Senator Conolly and maybe we can alleviate a long debate.  
25. Senator Mitchler.

26. SENATOR MITCHLER:

27. I'd be very agreeable to holding it on 2nd reading, this bill  
28. and till people have a chance to analyze the amendment, yes.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

30. It'll be taken from the record. For what purpose does Senator  
31. Hall rise...Senator Kenneth Hall.

32. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

33. Point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
2. State your point, Senator.

3. SENATOR HALL:  
4. I would like to introduce to the Senate, the Irvin School  
5. from St. Louis, who's present here today in the gallery over  
6. there and they're accompanied by their teachers Atchison and  
7. Walker. I wish they would rise and be received from the Senate.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
9. Senator Buzbee.

10. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
11. Mr. President, I rise in a point of personal privilege.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
13. State your point, we're in the middle of debate, but state  
14. your point.

15. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
16. I...I will yield to Senator Conolly, I assumed that you had  
17. already decided...

18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
19. State your point.

20. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
21. I would like to introduce Mr. Ralph Johnson and a group  
22. of students from Southern Illinois University. Students in  
23. Journalism and Public Affairs reporting. I would like to have them  
24. rise and be recognized and I might say to the gentlemen and ladies,  
25. that you might look at them because they very well may be waiting...  
26. writing stories about you in a year or two.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
28. Senator from Waukegan, Senator Conolly. Now, may we have  
29. some order, gentlemen.

30. SENATOR CONOLLY:  
31. Mr. Pres...Mr. President, I thought...

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):  
33. A little order that's what we have, very little.

1. SENATOR CONOLLY:

2. I thought...

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

4. Just a minute...just a minute Senator. Gentlemen. Senator  
5. Mohr, for what purpose do you rise? Senator Conolly.

6. SENATOR CONOLLY:

7. Mr. President, I thought it was the intention for us to try  
8. to expediate this session and be out of here by June 15th and I  
9. also thought that I control over the bill and I did not ask for  
10. it to be postponed. I think we should proceed with this and I  
11. think that the sponsor of this...amendment could have contacted me  
12. prior to this session and we might have been able to work this  
13. out.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. Senator, that's what I thought I was trying to do.

16. SENATOR CONOLLY:

17. I said prior to the calling of the bill he could...

18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

19. Oh, of course I didn't know anything about that. I was  
20. trying to save us the time on the Floor. Senator Mohr.

21. SENATOR MOHR:

22. Yes, Mr. President, that's what I am about to address myself  
23. to saving some time on the Floor. Many of us insisted that these  
24. bills be heard in committee and we did have two hearings on  
25. Transportation this past week. These amendments weren't offered  
26. and I can appreciate that people get different ideas maybe after  
27. committee meeting, but I think, so we're able to move along  
28. here that these amendments would be printed and placed on our  
29. desk and given...given to each member and especially they should  
30. hand over to the sponsor of the bill and discuss it so we can  
31. get on with our business. Now if we're in...I think Senator  
32. Mitchler you would have to agree that...

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

1. May we have some order please, gentlemen, let's break up  
2. the caucuses. That includes the Staff.

3. SENATOR MOHR:

4. That I...I for one have tried to accommodate you along with  
5. other members of the committee and accommodate those that had some  
6. objection an...to the RTA bill which I...which I agree with you  
7. on. There were some...some bills that came out of Transportation  
8. that...this week that are good for the RTA. But if we're going  
9. to get into the subject of debating and...and starting to present  
10. all kinds of amendments to the bills that came out of that  
11. committee, you're going to find yourself in my opinion back in the  
12. same position that we were when we left here with the final  
13. package. Now if you want to operate in...in the,I'll say good  
14. faith and present these well in advance why I'm sure that they'll  
15. be considered. They weren't brought up in committee, they should  
16. have been and I...I just don't want to get this session into  
17. the delaying tactics that were attempted here prior to the passage  
18. of RTA. I don't think it's going to serve any purpose, I'm  
19. sympathetic to the people in the collar counties. I think you  
20. can gain more by going along with the legislation that has been  
21. presented here and if you...you're going to spin your wheels  
22. and keep us here till the end of June, why I guess there's not  
23. much that can be done about that. But the end result will be  
24. the same and I think you have more to gain by operating in a  
25. proper fashion, getting your amendments to the sponsor, in particular,  
26. in advance of his calling a bill.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

28. The Chair will recognize you gentlemen and I'll recognize you  
29. in the manner that I see fit and then when you rose. The first  
30. one will be Senator Bell and it'll be Senator Course and it'll be  
31. Senator Knuepfer and then Senator Conolly in that order and gentlemen  
32. it looks like we might as well debate the amendment. I recognize  
33. Senator Bell. I recognize Senator Bell, do you yield to Senator

1. Conolly? He yields to you Senator Conolly. For what purpose do you

3. SENATOR CONOLLY:

4. I will take the whole series out of the record today.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

6. Thank you. Does it mean the remaining bills Senator that  
7. have not been acted upon? Senator Knuepfer.

8. SENATOR KNUEPFER:

9. I still want to speak on a point of personal privilege.

10. I have no brief for or against these amendments, I haven't heard  
11. them and I again...I also would certainly hope that the debate  
12. is not overly lengthy. Yet I would not have that hope at the  
13. expense of suggesting that if an amendment hasn't been heard  
14. in committee, therefore, it is improper. I would also hope that  
15. the Tabling motion will not take place because with the Tabling  
16. motion you never can get the issue before this Body. I am sure  
17. there going to be amendments presented there are amendments  
18. presented to bills that come out of my committee and I am not  
19. offended that they did not go to the committee. I recognize  
20. it is better if they do go through that process, but a suggestion  
21. that no amendment can be offered except one that has been through  
22. the committee, I think is presumptuous of this Body.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

24. After that admonition that's what this Chair tried to do  
25. this morning, was avoid that. Senator Course.

26. SENATOR COURSE:

27. Thank you Mr. President. I rise on a point of personal privilege.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. State your point.

30. SENATOR COURSE:

31. I would like the Senate to rise and recognize a former member  
32. of the House of Representatives, a very outstanding hard working  
33. member. He was a member of our committee John, John Henry Klein...

3. Welcome to the Senate, John. He was an outstanding member  
4. of our Prisons Commission. Now that Senator Conolly has with-

13. Senator Partee. Just a minute, Senator. Please, gentlemen.  
14. Senator for what purpose...

15. SENATOR PARTEE:

16. Mr. President and members of the Senate, particularly  
17. Senator Weaver, I'd like for you to listen here. I have filed  
18. and the motion is on the Secretary's desk pursuant to Rule 19,  
19. a motion to recommit this bill to the Committee from which it  
20. came, which was the Committee on Licensed Activities and Credit  
21. Regulations and I'd like to be heard on the motion.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. Senator Partee.

24. SENATOR PARTEE:

25. Now, Mr. President, this is the first of a series of 30  
26. bills which came out of the Rules Committee on a vote of 3 to 2.  
27. Let me say that I express my admiration to the President for  
28. trying to hold the line on bills, which were in that committee  
29. which did not relate to the subject matter which we have de-  
30. termined shall be considered in this even numbered year session.  
31. Now, I would say that this is, in my judgment, an unnecessary  
32. departure from that rule. I accept the ruling of the Rules Com-  
33. mittee, because that is the Rules Committee. I make this

1. motion to recommit, very seriously, because I think, first of  
2. all, if we are going to limit the session, that we should not  
3. then bring in a package of 30 bills. It is not a Revenue  
4. measure, it is not an Appropriations measure, and it certainly  
5. is not an emergency. Let me point out that this matter, or  
6. the entire consideration of these bills, is in the Supreme  
7. Court. The Supreme Court issued an opinion which did not go  
8. to the merits of the consideration, which relates to this  
9. Home Rule Preemption question. The Supreme Court made a  
10. decision and that decision is now still inactive in...for the  
11. reason that there has been a motion for a rehearing filed in  
12. the Supreme Court. Hence, the matter is not final. Now it's  
13. not an emergency, it seems to me, because it isn't an emergency  
14. but more than that, when a matter is still pending in the  
15. Supreme Court and has not finality it is strongly suggested  
16. to me that we should not be dealing with the matter. I can  
17. understand that the matter contains some political considerations.  
18. I can understand that these bills are also in the House, but are  
19. still in the Rules Committee and this is one of the times that I  
20. have to be complimentary for the House for not clogging their  
21. Calendar with bills which are not of an Appropriation or  
22. Revenue measure and not an emergency. They have, I take it,  
23. in this instance used more judgment than we. I know that there  
24. is a campaign coming and I know that there are a lot of people  
25. involved in these bills, in terms of whether or not it affects  
26. their particular business or profession. I seriously move that  
27. these bills be recommitted, and that we not get involved in a  
28. hassle about passage of bills, which bills are still the subject  
29. matter of a Supreme Court hearing. There is no finality in the  
30. Supreme Court on this question, and I think it is foolhardy for us  
31. to adjust ourselves to them. So I now move you, Mr. President,

2. The rule involving consideration of bills in the even num-

6. in the even numbered year. And there have been several excep-  
7. tions to the point that Senator Partee made about the fact that  
8. these bills did not deal directly with Revenue or Appropriation

5. treated to a lengthy debate on a very interesting, if not  
6. important matter, and ultimately the fate of the matter was  
7. decided by a legitimate roll call or tote board total. Now,  
8. Mr. President, you and I, as well as all members of this body,  
9. recognize that there are legitimate differences of opinion on

32. Transportation for further consideration. That's your first  
33. motion.

1. SENATOR CONOLLY:

2. I so move.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

4. Senator Conolly moves that Senate Bills 1489, 1490, and  
5. 1491 be discharged from further consideration of the Committee  
6. of Transportation. All in favor signify by saying Aye.  
7. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The bills are discharged. Now  
8. Senator Conolly makes the Tabling motion on Bills 1489, 1490,  
9. 1491. All in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes  
10. have it and the three bills, just listed, are Tabled.  
11. Any further announcements? Senator Harris.

12. SENATOR HARRIS:

13. Mr. President, I would like for the members of the Senate  
14. to pay attention. There are two bills in the Rules Committee  
15. that I have discussed with Senator Partee. One, a Campaign  
16. Disclosure Bill, and the other, a bill involving an amendment  
17. to the Civil Administrative Code by Senator Ozinga. We would  
18. like for both of those bills to be heard in Executive next week.  
19. Therefore, it will be essential to have a meeting of the Rules  
20. Committee on...on recess and subsequent to the action by the  
21. Rules Committee to report those, I would like to have the  
22. understanding with the membership that we would ...read the  
23. bills, the report of the Committee into the record and then  
24. Senator Graham can assign the bills to Executive so that Sena-  
25. tor Ozinga then can post appropriate notice for the hearing  
26. next Wednesday. When we have completed our work here now then  
27. I will move to recess subject to the call of the Chair and then  
28. we can follow up with the procedural matters relating to these  
29. two bills, if that's understood, I have discussed it with Senator  
30. Partee. That is the action I would like to implement when we  
31. have completed our work, I will then move to recess to pursue  
32. this action.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

1. Senator Newhouse, for what purpose do you arise?
2. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:
3. An announcement Mr....Mr. President. Is Senator Berning
4. on the Floor? A...Mr. President, Senator Berning made some
5. remarks previously about an article that appeared in the Chicago
6. Tribune.
7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
8. You didn't state the purpose for your arising, Senator.
9. I asked you for what purpose you arose.
10. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:
11. For an apology to Senator Berning.
12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
13. You're on a....
14. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:
15. Point of personal privilege, yes.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
17. Thank you.
18. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:
19. I'm sorry, Mr. President. I want Senator Berning to know
20. that I sent my check in for membership to the National Organiza-
21. tion for Women a couple of months ago. I haven't as yet received
22. my card so I can't say that I'm officially a dues paying member,
23. but I am a paid up member, and as such I want him to know that
24. I did not vote on what happened, the spokesperson that made the
25. remarks that were made in the Tribune, and I want to apologize
26. to him for it. I also want to apologize in my...in my behalf as my
27. status as...I think...member to those Senators, who, as a matter
28. of fact, did vote for ERA and who were accused of not voting for
29. ERA, and I want that to go into the record. I...I...I'm taking
30. upon myself, as a spokesperson, as the other spokesperson took
31. it upon himself to give out an interview. Thank you, Mr.
32. President.
33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):



1. Thank you. Senator Harris.

2. SENATOR HARRIS:

3. Mr. President, in my explanation of the procedure we were  
4. going to follow later today, I inadvertently failed to mention  
5. the fact that we would read a First time these two bills also  
6. today. I didn't want to leave that unmentioned. It was called  
7. to my attention that after the meeting of the Rules Committee  
8. on the bill relating to the amendment of the Civil Administra-  
9. tive Code, and the bill relating to the enactment of...of a...  
10. campaign disclosure section in the State Election Code, that  
11. the bills would be reported, read a first time, and referred  
12. to the Committee on Assignment of Bills, which Committee then  
13. can proceed with its assignment.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. Any...Senator Partee.

16. SENATOR PARTEE:

17. Based on what Senator Harris has just said, I think it's  
18. fair to say that the activities of the Rules Committee is  
19. fairly predictable, and on that basis why don't we just make a  
20. motion to discharge them from the Rules Committee while we're  
21. here and read them right now.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. Senator Harris.

24. SENATOR HARRIS:

25. A great idea.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

27. We need the numbers. Senator Nimrod, do you have something  
28. to add to this confusion?

29. SENATOR NIMROD:

30. Yes. While we're...while we're waiting can I inject another  
31. thought to your head. I would like to move to suspend the rules  
32. to add Public Aid Appropriation Bill, Senate Bill 1559, to next  
33. Tuesday's Appropriation meeting. That's on the 28th of this

1. month at 10 a.m.
2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
3. I think that if you should clear that with the Chairman of
4. the Appropriations Committee. I do not see him on the Floor.
5. SENATOR NIMROD:
6. I understand it was cleared with him and they asked me...
7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
8. Well, I would rather he be on the Floor.
9. SENATOR NIMROD:
10. Thank you.
11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
12. Senator Harris.
13. SENATOR HARRIS:
14. Well, Mr. President, I now move that the Senate Committee
15. on Rules be discharged from further consideration of Senate
16. Bills 1568 and 1562, and that they be read a first time and
17. referred to the Committee on Executive.
18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
19. You have heard the motion of the President of the Senate.
20. All in favor will signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
21. have it, the motion prevails. Senate Bills 1568, 1562 will be
22. read a first time.
23. SECRETARY:
24. Senate Bill 1562.
25. (Secretary reads title of bill.)
26. First Reading of the bill.
27. Senate Bill 1568.
28. (Secretary reads title of bill.)
29. First Reading of the bill.
30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
31. Senator Harris. They have been read a first time. You
32. have a motion?
33. SENATOR HARRIS:

1. Well, my motion was that they be referred, after being read  
2. a first time, to the Committee on Executive. That motion was  
3. adopted. I think no further action is necessary, if you want  
4. to order them to Executive, that will certainly clarify the  
5. Record.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

7. Senate Bills 1562, 1568, are now referred by...pursuant  
8. to the motion by Senator...of Senator Harris to the Committee  
9. on Executive. Senator Mohr.

10. SENATOR MOHR:

11. Yes, Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.  
12. In the President's Gallery I have some guests from the North-  
13. west Suburban Manufacturers Association. I'd like them to  
14. rise and be recognized by the Senate.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

16. Senator Ozinga.

17. SENATOR OZINGA:

18. Just so there's no misunderstanding now. These bills that've  
19. just been referred to the Executive Committee will be heard next  
20. Wednesday, May 29th, at 1 p.m. in the Executive Committee. There  
21. will be a notice on all your desks...or on all of the desks of  
22. the members of the Committee in a few minutes with regards to  
23. the notice there so we will not have to mail them out.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

25. Senator Nimrod has a motion...we'll wait just a moment.  
26. Take your time Senator. You're recognized. The Senator from  
27. Skokie. May we have some order, please.

28. SENATOR NIMROD:

29. Mr. President, I would move that we suspend the rules for  
30. the 6-day notice to add the Public Aid Appropriation Bill, Senate  
31. Bill 1559 to next week's...next Tuesday's Appropriation meeting  
32. on the 28th at 10 a.m.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

1. All in favor of the motion of Senator Nimrod, will signify  
2. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it and your motion  
3. carries, Senator. Any further announcements? Senator Mohr  
4. moves...he almost moved. Senator Mohr.

5. SENATOR MOHR:

6. Mr. President, earlier in the morning we adopted a reso-  
7. lution honoring our....

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

9. Gentlemen, you may be 90 years old some day, will you...  
10. can we have some order?

11. SENATOR MOHR:

12. ...honoring the young man from Urbana-Champaign Area,  
13. and you'll note that a birthday cake was brought out, and to  
14. show you the way they do things in that district as compared to  
15. the conservative Bohemian area that Senator Soper comes from,  
16. there'll be enough cake to go around to all the members.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

18. You have heard the explanation of the Senator Mohr. I  
19. didn't...I was doing...We congratulate you on your 36th Anni-  
20. versary of your birth, Senator Weaver. All join in extending  
21. you our best wishes. And now, Senator Gene Johns. I'm afraid  
22. of this.

23. SENATOR JOHNS:

24. Mr. President, what's his home town? Where was he born?

25. SENATOR WEAVER:

26. I was born down in your district there. They call that  
27. Little Egypt.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. You got your commercial in. Senator Mohr. Any further  
30. announcements? Senator Mohr moves that the Senate adjourn its  
31. regular session pursuant to the Amendment Resolution adopted.  
32. All in favor signify by saying Aye, and the session...regular  
33. session is adjourned until 1 o'clock next Tuesday. Now we have some  
more business.
