Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, Senate Bill 1395, as now amended, provides for eleven State Aid payments throughout the fiscal year that corresponds with that of the State and that of our common schools throughout the State of Illinois. As you know, for the past year there has been a controversy concerning the shifting of payments from one month to another and causing potential loss of one month's State Aid payment to the districts throughout the State. This bill, as amended, attempts to clarify that, in that it will mandate that a 1/12th payment be made for ten months throughout the year, commencing on August 15 and ending on May 15. On June 15 a 1/6th payment will be made, which will complete the full

funding for the entire year. It is through this clari... l. 2, clarification of the dispursements of our State Aid, through the Distributive Fund, that our schools will be better able to 3. plan their fiscal years. In other words, they will know that 4. 5. they are going to get their 12 payments of the total amount 6. that we appropriate to the Superintendent of Public Instruction 7. as long as the funds are available. In no way does this impair 8. the power and duty of the Governor to maintain the fiscal 9. integrity of the State of Illinois as it is spelled out in the State Finance Act. This will set at ease the minds of our 10. 11. administrators, school faculty and citizens throughout the 12. State as to the amount of money that they will receive. 13. addition, the bill, as amended, also gives the power to the 14. Governor and the Bureau of the Budget that timely transfers 15. can be made from the Federal Fiscal Assistance Fund, the 16. Federal Revenue Sharing Funds, to the Common School Fund. 17. addition there is an amendment that allows for the payment of 18. the school transportation costs for the Special Education child-19. ren throughout the summer and throughout the year. 20. close very briefly, you heard a considerable discussion concern-21. ing these amendments yesterday, I want to close very briefly by stating, that if you believe in full funding for the common 23. schools through the Distributive Fund of the State of Illinois, as is spelled out in Senate Bill 1395, which passed unanimously last week, then you also have to believe in and vote affirmatively for Senate Bill 1395.
