I would just like to rise to vigorously oppose his motion to Table committee Amendment No. I because without that Amendment the bill I am certain would have been totally unacceptable to the committee. It makes an entirely new concept of making present insurance companies guaranteeing those by putting up a fund, I mean by guaranteeing those smaller companies that...that might be on perilous ground. It would be totally unacceptable in its present form. This amendment merely says over a five year period they get proper credits against those monies paid into the fund in computing their tax liability. It's a fair amendment and I certainly would ask that the members here, that the committee who heard this...it had a very fair hearing, a long hearing, and I would vigorously oppose the attempt to remove Amendment No. 1.

Thank you Mr. President. The purpose of this legislation is to adequately insure those people who have taken
out life insurance from a company becoming insolvent. Now,
we know it doesn't happen often but we know right now we're

may have been fraud. What we are saying is...to the insurance companies of this State...as a privilege of doing
business, they shall create this fund just, just as they
do in casualty insurance. -- Very little difference. -Should a company go under, they themselve will assess

ı. inadequate management on their part. I would only like 2. to refer you to the letter received yesterday that I'm sure each and every one of the members of this Senate 4. received from Fred Mauck, the Director of the Department 5. of Insurance and rather than read the whole letter, I'm 6. sure all of you got it. I would just restate the closing 7. paragraph, the Citizens of the State of Illinois need 8. HB 828 without the premium tax offset amendment. 9. premium tax offset puts these insurance companies in 10. the position of translating and transferring their 11. responsibility back to the 11 million citizens of this 12. State. That should not be the cost of doing business. 13. Your constitutents should not have to pay this type of 14. a premium offset. What they are trying to do by this 15. amendment is to transfer the burden from themselves to 16. all the citizens of the State by taking a tax credit. 17. Many of us have opposed tax credits in all form. I think 18. this is just another attempt on the part of the insurance 19. industry to spread their burden over the 11 million 20. people. I think also as the sponsor of this bill I 21. should be entitled to have the bill in the form in which 22. it pleases me.
