5. (Prayer by Senator Fred Smith)

6. SENATOR SOPER:

7. Mr. President, Members of the Senate, I move that we
8. postpone the reading and the approval of the Journals of
9. June 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th, 29th, and
10. 30th pending the arrival of the printed Journal. Amen.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. You've heard the motion, all in favor signify by
13. Saying, Aye. Contrary, No. The motion carries. House
14. Bills on 3rd reading. Is Senator Bruce on the Floor?
15. ...All right. HB 604.

16. SECRETARY:

17. HB 604 (Secretary reads title of bill)
18. 3rd reading of the bill.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Mr. Sweeney. Senator Bruce.

21. SENATOR BRUCE:

22. Yes, Mr. President, this is the annual appropriation
23. to the Department of Conservation. There are four amend-
24. ments that have been adopted. They meet with the approval
25. of Members of both sides. I ask for a favorable roll call.
26. I would point out we do need thirty-six affirmative votes.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Sours.

29. SENATOR SOURS:

30. Mr. President, I'm carried away with the persuasion of
31. the Senator from Olney. I move the previous question.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Sours has moved the previous question. All

17. Senator Merritt, aye. Senator Romano, aye. On
18. that question the yeas are forty-seven, the nays are
19. none. HB 604 having received a 3/5 constitutional
20. majority and it is the intention of the General...of
21. the Senate that the bill be effective immediately, is
22. declared passed. HB 1639, Senator Carroll.

23. SECRETARY:

24. HB 1639 (Secretary reads title of bill)
25. 3rd reading of the bill.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Carroll.

28. SENATOR CARROLL:

29. Thank you Mr. President, Members of the Senate, this
30. is a bill dealing with the regulation and registration
31. of the offering of franchises in this State in an attempt
32. to alleviate and eliminate the abuses that have been
33. brought about on our citizens by this new business phenomena.

1. We have divided the powers as have done other States
2. and this is now considered model law so that the
3. registration of these offerings...and the types of
4. disclosures necessary to which to make intelligent
5. financial decisions are given to the Secretary of
6. State and the fraud type provisions and enforcement
7. are given to the Attorney General. There are definitions
8. of franchise fees and there are many safeties and guidelines
9. within this act. I would hope in the future Sessions
10. of the General Assembly we would go after those franchise
11. offerings that are the door to door type that are
12. bilking the smaller people of this State but this
13. seems to be as much as we can get out of this General
14. Assembly. It is the first step forward for this State
15. in model legislation and I would urge its adoption.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Sommer.

18. SENATOR SOMMER:

19. Mr. President, Members of the Body, the Attorney
20. General has indicated...the Attorney General has indicated
21. to me that he is very pleased with the input that Senator
22. Carroll has had. He fully supports Senator Carroll's
23. input and he would be very much pleased if we could all
24. support this bill.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Nudelman.

27. SENATOR NUDELMAN:

28. Mr. President, I would some how like to renew my
29. motion of about 3:00 o'clock in the morning last night.
30. I personally and I think we should all be afronted by
31. the fact that these cat and mice and odds and ends bills
32. are still around, are taking up our time on July 1st at
33. 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon when we should be dealing

1. strickly with budgetary matters. I don't think the Senate
2. should be burdened with having to consider items such as
3. this which should have been dealt with much earlier or can
4. still be dealt with in the next Session. It's not an
5. emergency and I think we should somehow limit...limit
6. ourselves to...to the budget and if there is some kind of
7. motion to lie this bill on the Table I would so move.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Well, ...I...I will rule your motion out of order,
10. Senator Nudelman and recognize Senator Partee.

11. SENATOR PARTEE:

12. I...I don't know about what happened at 3:00 in the
13. morning, I was asleep. When I left here it was twenty
14. minutes to twelve.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. The Chair just wants to say that this bill has been
17. on the order of 2nd reading for quite some time while
18. efforts to work things out between the Senate sponsor
19. and the Attorney General and the Secretary of State's
20. office were developing. Last evening agreement was reached.
21. And the Chair at the personal request of the Attorney
22. General agreed to call this bill today. It is up to
23. the disposition of the Senate as to what your action
24. will be. But I wish to make that...at the joint request
25. of Senator Carroll and the Attorney General that since
26. we were going to be here tomorrow and if...if the...
27. last evening I made this commitment. So I am obligated
28. to call the bill. I certainly am inclined to agree with
29. Senator Nudelman that matters that do not relate to the budget
30. necessarily..... should be extraordinary and a request
31. from a constitutional officer comes into the category
32. of an extraordinary request and we've always honored
33. that kind of personal request. I recongize Senator Carroll

1. who seeks recognition. Is there further discussion on the
2. bill itself?

3. SENATOR CARROLL:

4. I would merely close then by saying again this is an
5. area of abuse that has been prevalent. We have been working
6. on this for some two and a half years now attempting to
7. effect legislation. Unfortunately because of some staff
8. problems and disagreements it did become a last hour thing,
9. I find that unfortunate but finally when the Attorney
10. General and the Secretary of State individually stepped
11. in with the leadership of both sides we were able to work
12. it out. I think this is model legislation and would urge
13. its support.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Question is shall HB 1639 pass. And on that question
16. the Secretary will call the roll. The roll call will require
17. thirty-six votes.

32. fifty-one, the nays are one. HB 1639 having received a
33. constitutional 3/5 majority and it being the intent of

1. the Senate for the bill to become effective immediately,
2. is declared passed. HB 1979, Senator Rock.

3. SECRETARY:

4. HB 1979 (Secretary reads title of bill)

5. 3rd reading of the bill.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Rock.

8. SENATOR ROCK:

9. Thank you Mr. President. This is the appropriation
10. for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Department
11. of Transportation. It has not been amended. I want to
12. point out it has the early effective date provision included
13. in the substance of the bill. And I would also point out
14. this bill passed the House by the requisite 3/5 vote, 131
15. to 5. I would urge a 3/5 vote, affirmative vote by the
16. Members on...of the Senate.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Is there discussion? Senator Clarke.

19. SENATOR CLARKE:

20. The sponsor said it had not been amended, you mean
21. in the House or in the Senate? There were a lot of
22. amendments in the House weren't there?

23. SENATOR ROCK:

24. There were I think, there were many offered, but I
25. think only 4 were adopted.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. It has not been amended in the Senate. I believe
28. it is four...Senator McBroom, was it not the case that
29. four amendments were adopted in the House? Senator Clarke
30. made the inquiry.

31. SENATOR MCBROOM:

32. That's right. Thirty were offered I understand or
33. thirty-one.

2. Is there further discussion or questions? The
3. question is shall HB 1979 pass. It requires 36 votes.

32. In House amendments to Senate Bills, Senator Swinarski

1. SENATOR McBROOM:

2. Well...Mr. President, I see Senator Swinarski going
3. through his file there. Maybe we could save some time
4. Mr. President. I'd like to move to non-concur in
5. Amendment No. 1 to SB 296 and to concur in Amendment
6. No. 2. Amendment No. 2 I believe is the pay plan. I
7. suggest that we appoint a conference committee.

9. Senator Swinarski.

10. SENATOR SWINARSKI:

11. I'd like to direct a question just for...to Senator McBroom.
12. The amendment that you're referring to to not concur in
13. is what amendment Senator?

17. ...explain it just for a second please.

18. SENATOR McBROOM:

19. Would I do what?

20. SENATOR SWINARSKI:

21. What is the substance of it?

22. SENATOR McBROOM:

23. The substance of it. It adds three new positions
24. Senator, about \$42,000.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator McBroom moves that the Senate non-concur
27. in Amendment No. 1 to SB 296 and requests the House to
28. recess. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
29. no. Motion carries. Motion to concur in Amendment No. 2
30. to SB 296, the Secretary will call the roll.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Is there leave to revert to the order of motions?
21. So ordered. Senator Shapiro.

22. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

23. Mr. President and Members of the Senate having
24. voted on the prevailing side by which the Senate refused
25. to concur in House Amendment No. 2 to SB 1178, I now move
26. that that vote be reconsidered.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Shapiro moves to reconsider the vote by
29. which we refused to recede..refused to concur on the
30. Amendment to ...SB 1198...78. All in favor of the motion
31. to reconsider signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
32. motion carries. The matter of concurrence is now before
33. ...the Senate. Senator Shapiro.

1. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

2. Mr. President, Members of the Senate the House
3. Amendment No. 2 to SB 1178 is an innocuous amendment.
4. It does not impair the operation of the Board of Higher
5. Education and their appropriation. I have cleared this
6. with the members of the conference committee, the leader-
7. ship and I would now like to move that the Senate concur
8. in House Amendment No. 2 to SB 1178.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Shapiro moves that the Senate concur in
11. Amendment No. 2 to SB 1178. On that question the
12. Secretary will call the roll. The vote required is
13. 36 votes.

17. Senator Bruce...

21. ...would you come to the podium Senator Bruce?

22. SECRETARY:

1. Senator Johns, aye. Senator Palmer, aye. Senator
2. Scholl, aye. Senator Romano, you wish...aye. ...question
3. the yeas are fifty-one, the nays are none. The motion
4. to concur in Amendment No. 2 to SB 1178 having received
5. the 3/5 constitutional majority and it being the intention
6. of the Senate that the bill be effective immediately is
7. declared passed and concurred in. ...Mitchler. Senator
8. Mitchler.

9. SENATOR MITCHLER:

10. Is this on SB 200?

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Yes, SB 200.

13. SENATOR MITCHLER:

14. Yes, SB 200 is coming back from the House with...I
15. believe it has two amendments on it, really the second
16. amendment. The first...the first amendment to SB 200
17. which I might say originally was an appropriation for
18. 3 1/2 million dollars for an overpass in North Farnsworth
19. Avenue and the Burlington Northern Railroad in Aurora,
20. Illinois. The House...Amendment No. 1 put on by the House,
21. amended the bill from 3 1/2 million down to \$100,000. It did
22. not change any of the substantive part of the bill. However,
23. a similar bill was introduced in the House by Representative
24. Jack Hill. We passed it out of the Senate at \$100,000.
25. Really House...SB 200 is not necessary if they passed it
26. it would be a duplicate. Now a bill was needed to incorporate
27. the sum, and this is what Amendment No. 2 to SB 200 in the
28. House was. It struck everything after the enacting clause,
29. and inserted the following: the following named sum or
30. so much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated from
31. the grade crossing protection fund to the Department of
32. Transportation for the construction of railroad grade
33. crossing separation upon any Federal, State, County

1. municipal or township highway. The amount of the appropria-
2. tion is \$3,600,000. Now that's sort of an omnibus bill
3. for all of the grade crossing overpasses, underpasses that
4. are grouped into one and that's the authority to cooperate
5. with the Federal funds for these programs. This is a
6. good amendment. It changes the original intent of SB 200
7. but it's a vehicle to accomplish this. I am agreeable to
8. it. It does not alter the...intent of the grade crossing
9. in Aurora that I wanted covered by another bill. And so
10. I would move for concurrence in Amendments 1 and 2 to
11. SB 200 as amended in the House.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Mitchler...would you mind taking the bill
14. out of the record momentarily and the staff would like
15. to consult with you on just a couple of questions that we...

16. SENATOR MITCHLER:

17. I'm agreeable to it, Mr. President.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Yes. All right. ...are you ready to proceed on
20. SB...HB 1045, Senator Bruce.

21. SENATOR BRUCE:

22. Yes Mr. President we have a message back from the
23. House on HB 1045. They have concurred in Senate Amendment
24. No. 1, but nonconcurred in Senate Amendment No. 3. I
25. now move that the Senate refuse to recede from Amendment
26. No. 3, and that a conference committee be...appointed.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Bruce moves that the Senate refuse to recede
29. from Amendment No. 3 to HB 1045 and request the House to
30. appoint a committee on conference. All in...in favor
31. signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries,
32. the House will be so informed. Conference committee
33. reports. Before we get to that order of business just one

1. minute. Senator Regner.

2. SENATOR REGNER:

3. Yes Mr. President, there is SB 84 on the Secretary's
4. desk. We've discussed this quite a few times in the last
5. couple of days and we think there may be some problems. So
6. I would with it in it's present form with the House amendment,
7. I would now like to move that SB 84 be recommitted to
8. committee and put on the exempt list.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Regner has moved to recommit SB 84. All in
11. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. Motion carries,
12. it is recommitted. Senator Mitchler.

13. SENATOR MITCHLER:

14. Yes, now on SB 200 Mr. President, I believe the
15. explanation has been given to both sides of the aisle
16. now and it's agreeable that my motion would prevail. The
17. motion is as follows. That the Senate concur in Amendment
18. No. 1 and Amendment No. 2 to SB 200 as amended in the House,
19. those are two Senate...two House amendments to SB 200.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. The...motion is to concur in Amendments 1 and 2 to
22. SB 200. The Secretary will call the roll. It requires
23. 36 votes.

8. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

9. Mr. President, Members of the Senate I would like
10. to have leave of the Senate to have SB 634 re-referred
11. to the Pensions and Personnel Committee for further study.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Shapiro moves to recommit SB 634 to the Committee
14. on Pensions and Personnel. All in favor signify by saying
15. aye. Contrary no. The motion carries, the bill is recommitted.
16. Senator Course.

17. SENATOR COURSE:

18. Yes, Mr. President on the order of 2nd reading appears
19. HB 1977. This bill was included in the omnibus bill which
20. we passed yesterday so I'll make the motion that HB 1977 be
21. Tabled Mr. President.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Course moves to Table HB 1977. All in favor
24. signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries,
25. the bill is Tabled. ...concurrence of Senate amendments
26. to House Bills.

27. SECRETARY:

28. ...Senator Scholl the Senate sponsor. The House
29. refused to concur in the Senate Amendments numbered 1 and 2.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Scholl.

32. SENATOR SCHOLL:

33. Make a motion...

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Scholl moves that the Senate refuse to recede
3. and requests the House to appoint a Committee on Conference.
4. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. Motion
5. carries. The House will be so informed.

6. SECRETARY:

7. HB 32, Senator Davidson. The House concurred in
8. Senate Amendments 1 and 6 and refuse to concur in Senate
9. Amendment No. 4.

10. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

11. Move to concur with the House.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Davidson moves that the Senate concur in
14. the House...the...the matter is Senator Davidson that
15. the House has refused to concur in Amendment No. 4.
16. All right, then your motion is that the Senate recede
17. from Amendment No. 4 to HB 32. On that motion Senator
18. Glass is recognized.

19. SENATOR GLASS:

20. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Davidson, if I'm
21. not mistaken you're moving to recede from the amendment
22. that includes Chicago in the bill. Is that correct?

23. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

24. That's correct.

25. SENATOR GLASS:

26. Well, I...I would just like to strenuously urge
27. opposition to this motion to recede and once again remind
28. the membership that this is the matter we debated at
29. great length. This issue being should Chicago be treated
30. the same...same manner as the rest of the State with regard
31. to the hearing officer. If Chicago is taken out of this
32. bill by our action on supporting Senator Davidson's motion
33. Chicago will have a hearing officer who advises the board

1. and the board makes final action on discharging teachers,
2. while the rest of the State school boards will have their
3. action subject to review by the hearing officer. I think
4. this is once again an attempt to vitiate the amendment put
5. on by Senator Knuepfer and I would urge all the Members to
6. oppose this motion.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. ...Sours.

9. SENATOR SOURS:

10. Mr. President just like to know why the Senator
11. from Springfield would be agreeable to...to agreeing
12. with excising that wonderful amendment which makes the
13. law absolutely uniform from the Wisconsin border down
14. to the confluence of the great Ohio and Mississippi.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Davidson.

17. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

18. Two reasons. One is, I...first let me ask a
19. parliamentary ruling from the Chair that if, since
20. we're running late, if I ask for a conference committee
21. and the conference committee does not get back is this
22. bill still alive for the fall Session?

23. PRESIDENT:

24. It has been procedure in the past that that is the case,
25. that the bill would remain in the committee on conference
26. during the interim when the Senate is not in Session. It
27. is subject to disposition by the respective Houses....Davidson.

28. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

29. On that parliamentary inquiry then I will change
30. my motion that we non-concur with the House and ask for
31. a conference committee.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Is there...did Senator Mohr seek recognition? Senator...

1. Senator Soper.

2. SENATOR SOPER:

3. Well, he wants to non-concur and he wants a conference
4. committee, that's all right.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. All right. Senator Davidson moves that the Senate
7. refuse to recede and request the House appoint a committee

3. Senator...Nudelman the understanding of the Chair for
4. your frustration and despair is absolute. I join you. The

7. leadership this morning. Much of the budget is involved in
8. conference committee activity. And while that conference is
9. proceeding it is not inappropriate for us to continue to be
10. productive and responsible, I think the record shows very

17. SENATOR GLASS:

18. Thank you Mr. President. I move that the Senate concur

20. Gentlemen this is the land trust bill sponsored by Represen-
21. tative Kempiners in the House which has passed this Body.
22. There are amendments to it, numbers 2 and 4 from...which
23. we recceed and the bill is, I think made a better bill by
24. a further provision in it which provides that if a party
25. who is an owner of a beneficial interest under land trust
26. cannot be located after deligent effort or if the party is
27. incompetent to file the required affidavits then the govern-
28. mental units shall procure the affidavit from the next of
29. kin or legal representative, but if the governmental unit
30. in any case cannot obtain the affidavit the governmental
31. official who executes the contract may file an affidavit
32. stating the reasons for the inability to obtain the
33. affidavit and that a good faith effort to procure the

1. affidavit was made. I think makes this as I said a
2. better bill and I therefore would urge at this time,
3. Mr. President, move that House concur in the conference
4. committee report on HB 757. ...concur.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Rock and then Senator Nudelman.

7. SENATOR ROCK:

8. Yes Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate,
9. I do not agree and I suggest to the members of this side
10. that we do not concur with the conference committee report,
11. HB 757 dealing with the subject of land trusts. We went
12. through the legislative history of that when we argued this
13. bill about a week ago or so, or four days ago. This bill
14. underwent seven amendments in the House. It came over
15. here and there were four or five additional amendments.
16. I had an amendment to gut the whole thing and start
17. over again. And now with this conference committee
18. report we are saying that the Senate recede from Amend-
19. ments 2 and 4 and that HB 757 in the Senate be further
20. amended, and we make two substitutive amendments. I do
21. not think this is appropriate at this time and place and
22. I would urge the members of this side to vote to non-
23. concur. Vote no.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Nudelman.

26. SENATOR NUDELMAN:

27. Mr. President not only is this a bad bill as Senator
28. Rock has pointed out and as I could additionally point
29. out given the time. But in fact there was no conference
30. committee. There was no conference and there was no
31. meeting and there was no decision made among the parties
32. to the conference. The members who signed the report in
33. the House told me there was no conference. Senator Palmer

1. and I who are supposed to have been involved in the
2. conference on this side of the aisle were not involved
3. in any conference, so I would therefore respectfully
4. request the Chair...having been appointed to the...as
5. I was saying Mr. President, there was in fact no
6. conference. The...House members have informed me
7. there was no conference. Senator Palmer and I who
8. were appointed to the conference committee from this
9. side of the aisle were not involved in any conference
10. or invited to any conference, so I would move you Mr.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Glass.

15. SENATOR GLASS:

16. Well, I...I submit Mr. President that that motion
17. is out of order. In the closing hours of the Session
18. it is of course extremely difficult to actually sit
19. down around a conference table on all of these matters
20. and the final report was drafted by the sponsor of the
21. bill in the House and was concurred in by eight of the
22. ten members assigned to the conference committee. And
23. I therefore would move...ask you to rule that motion
24. out of order.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Palmer and then Senator Bell.

27. SENATOR PALMER:

28. Mr. President, I would like to make a counter-motion
29. of non-concurrence. This bill originally was a very bad
30. bill and with the amendments it's now a very terrible bill.
31. It's not legal and it's very regressive.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Palmer your motion is not in order. The

1. motion before the Senate is to concur or adopt the committee
2. on conference report on HB 757, and on that motion we are
3. engaging in debate, the Chair...have you completed the
4. comments you want to make on the motion and the subject
5. matter?

6. SENATOR PALMER:

7. Well, I don't know how much I can emphasize that the
8. bill was bad in its original form and its worse now. Taking
9. the words of my friend Senator Ozinga it's now lousy.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Palmer.

12. SENATOR PALMER:

13. And if my motion...or counteremotion of non-concurrence
14. is not in order, I ask that this Body in the interest of
15. the people of the State of Illinois vote to non-concur, or
16. vote against the motion for concurrence.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Bell.

19. SENATOR BELL:

20. Well now, it seems to me what we're seeing taking place
21. here this afternoon in reference...specifically in reference
22. to this amendment regarding disclosure in land trusts which
23. we as a Body, the Senate here have made a definite statement
24. on, you are now seeking to abrogate our position. The
25. same technique Senator Nudelman was used in reference to
26. Senator Carroll's and Senator Sommer's bill with reference
27. to franchise, tightening up the franchise laws. And it
28. looks to me like your side of the aisle is now going to
29. make an attempt with 36 votes need and these concurrences
30. coming back to wipe out the legislation that has been...or
31. try to wipe out the legislation that's been enacted for
32. the benefit of the people of the State of Illinois. And
33. I would like to say Mr. President that I would be most

1. hopeful that the responsible members of this Body would
2. react to that, stand together, maintain our 36 votes on
3. those very positive pieces of legislation and get on with
4. the job.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Knuppel.

7. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

8. I just don't see, I agree with Senator Nudelman. I
9. don't see the point now. We're going to appoint some more
10. conference committees and I'm going to make a motion that
11. if...if there's a need...it's personal privilege. I don't
12. see any...any cause to appoint this...I'm willing to vote
13. on this. This is a motion on the Floor. But I don't see
14. any point in the Chair or the leadership appointing any
15. more conference committees to report back on bills on
16. non-budgetary matters. We'll wait till the fall Session.
17. Now here's...here's an example of what's happening and
18. another conference committee could be appointed to go out,
19. come back and...and I just think that's...that as Senator
20. Nudelman said it just prolongs the thing. And one other
21. comment as a matter of personal privilege, wouldn't now
22. be a hell of good time to adopt a unicameral legislature.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Is there...Senator Nudelman. The question is on the
25. adoption of the committee on conference on HB 757. And

12. is there any way that I can find out what the amendments do?

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Glass.

15. SENATOR GLASS:

16. Thank you Mr. President. Yes, I...I did explain the
17. amendment Senator Saperstein. These are not substantive
18. changes. We proceed from two...

19. PRESIDENT:

20. An objection has been raised, we are on roll call
21. Senator Saperstein. Do you wish to be recorded Senator

26. For what purpose does Senator Glass arise?

22. On that question the yeas are twenty-eight, the nays
23. are seven. The report of the committee on conference having
24. failed to receive a constitutional majority the bill is
25. declared lost. Senator Glass.

26. SENATOR GLASS:

27. Is it possible to request a second conference committee?

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Oh, that's right. I'm sorry. Yes. That's right.
30. This is a question of a conference committee report.

31. SENATOR GLASS:

32. Yes.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. The Senate refuses to adopt the committee on conference on
2. HB 757. And our procedure automatically requires the
3. appointment of a second committee on conference. Senator
4. Donnewald.

5. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

6. Yes Mr. President, maybe to help clear up everyone
7. and possibly you're already doing this but I was think
8. and possibly I think you believe the same way to consider
9. the money matters on a priority basis. I guess you're
10. doing that and I'd...

11. PRESIDENT:

12. The appropriation bills are in float between the
13. two Houses. I believe now there are 34 of those bills
14. in conference committee. Until they reach the Secretary's
15. desk there is...the paper work on them, there's nothing
16. we can do about the budget. Yes. Senator Donnewald.

17. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

18. My...my point being when they do arive they have
19. priority.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Amen. Senator Clarke.

22. SENATOR CLARKE:

23. A point of inquiry just in line with Senator Saperstein's
24. observation, that over the years I've been here it has seemed
25. to me that conference committee reports are printed and put
26. on the Senator's desk and these have been absent in the last
27. twelve hours and as a consequence I don't vote on a lot
28. of these, because I'm not going to vote on something I
29. don't know about and if some staff member just says vote
30. aye or vote no. And I'm a little distressed by this because
31. it was...this has been a normal procedure I thought.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator... Senator Partee.

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. Well, Senator Clarke I think probably...I know what
3. you're talking about there have been days when you did
4. get a chance to have a conference committee report and
5. let me suggest to you that if the House had followed the
6. cut-off dates as we did over here, the last two or three
7. entire days would have been devoted to that subject and
8. that subject alone. That was the plan when we set up those
9. cut-off dates. But I wish to point out to you that since
10. 1957 when you and I first came to the House, we...we have
11. dealt with bills without a written conference report being
12. on the members desks. I think probably that it is not
13. suggested that you have to take anything on faith. You
14. can ask a question about it and I'm sure that the member
15. will tell you truthfully what...what it's about. We try
16. to see them and I'm sure they...you do on your side of
17. the aisle to see these conference reports and I don't
18. think we're voting blindly if we could take the time to
19. ask the questions. The thing that bothers me is that
20. we are now dealing with matters other than appropriation
21. and I want you to know that we're going over there right
22. now to see if we can't get the appropriation matters in
23. here first. Now some of these conference committee reports
24. that are coming in are things that have been dealt with
25. before we talked to them this morning but, I think we'll
26. be all right.

28. Conference committee report on HB 620. Senator Knuepfer.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

30. Take it out of the record. Senator Hynes.

31. SENATOR HYNES:

32. What was the number that was just...

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

1. 620.

2. SECRETARY:

3. HB 620. HB 610, Senator Buzbee. Conference Committee

4. report on HB 610.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

6. Senator Buzbee.

7. SENATOR BUZBEE:

8. Yes Mr. President I believe there are, what Mr.

9. Secretary one or two House amendment?

10. SECRETARY:

11. There are no amendments. This is the conference

12. committee report on HB 610. It is an appropriation bill

13. for the Bureau of the Budget, to the Office of the Governor.

14. SENATOR BUZBEE:

15. Hold that one minute please.

16. SECRETARY:

17. HB 458, Senator Nimrod. Conference committee report

18. on HB 458.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

20. Senator Nimrod.

21. SENATOR NIMROD:

31. Yes Mr. President, 610 is the Bureau of the Budget

17. Mr. President, Members of the Senate I move that the

19. and the recommendation of the committee is that the Senate
20. recede from Senate Amendment No. 2 and that HB 856 be further
21. amended by inserting the single word variable immediately
22. after the word establish. This will allow junior college

30. go? Guess he's gone back to the House. Well, fine.

11. (Secretary reads Messages from the House)

13. Senator Partee. Senator Graham on the order of
14. resolutions.

15. SECRETARY:
16. Senate Joint Resolution 48 offered by Senator Graham.
17. (Secretary reads Resolution)

18. PRESIDENT:
19. Senator Graham.

20. SENATOR GRAHAM:
21. Mr. President I'm sure that every member in the Senate
22. ...listened to those dates specified but nonetheless I
23. do move the adoption of the Adjournment Resolution.

25. Senator Graham. Senator Graham moves that the Senate

17. This is a conference committee report on HB 1628
18. which provides for a student representation on university
19. governing boards. The Senate adopted several amendments
20. to clarify and improve the bill. The House at the request
21. of the sponsor - Senator Knuepfer on whose behalf I am
22. handling this today did not concur in those amendments
23. because it was found that there were technical defects
24. in the amendments. This conference report cleans up
25. those defects and in particular with respect to student
26. employment it clarifies what might have been a substantive
27. question. It provides that students may be employed as...
28. at the various schools and still be eligible for member-
29. ship on the boards. But essentially this is simply
30. clarifying language and an effective date of October 1st,
31. 1973 has been included. And I would ask for your support
32. for this conference committee report.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Donnewald.

28. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

29. Yes as to the conference committee report on SB 371,
30. which recommends the House recede from House Amendment 1
31. and the Senate concur in House Amendment 2. I move that
32. we concur with the conference committee report, and ask
33. for a favorable roll call.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Yeah. Is this a budget matter?
3. SENATOR DONNEWALD:
4. Yes.
5. PRESIDENT:
6. Yes. All right. Whose appropriation is this?
7. SENATOR DONNEWALD:
8. This is the appropriation for the commerce commission.

19. The Chair wants to make something perfectly clear here,
20. in response to Senator Saperstein's inquiry, I wanted
21. to...indicate that there will be a sense of the Senate
22. determination upon the time immediately preceding our
23. adjournment today. What will be the sense of the Senate
24. in connection with matters that are still involved in
25. not only conference committee but in committee and it
26. will be a determination of the Senate as to how those
27. matters will be disposed of. I do not mean to imply
28. at all any leadership attitude on this question. If
29. the Senate makes a...determination that these matters
30. shall be Tabled that will be the will of the Senate.
31. Now I did make reference earlier in the day to a
32. question of Senator Glass that custom and usage in the
33. past and our procedure has been that bills in conference

1. committee following adjournment during prolonged interim
2. periods have remained in those conference committees. But
3. that's subject to a reaffirmation of the Senate, and I
4. don't want to be misunderstood or I do not want to mis-

27. Yes thank you Mr. President. This HB 1790 was
28. amended in the Senate and what it provides for is quick
29. payment to those school districts that have a number
30. of wards of the Department of Children and Family Services
31. living within their school districts. There are certain
32. districts in.... this State that have more orphans, more
33. foster children, more wards of the State than do others.

1. The amendment was, we found out when it went back to the
2. House for concurrence technically deficient. That deficiency
3. has been corrected. This is a vitally important bill for
4. certain school districts in our State and I would urge
5. that we concur in the conference committee report.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. ...further discussion? Question is on the adoption
8. of the committee on conference on HB 1790. Requires a
9. 3/5 vote. The Secretary will call the roll.

33. Mr. President, in connection with a matter on HB 458

1. which we recently, a few minutes ago handled here. Having
2. voted on the prevailing side I would like to move to
3. reconsider the vote by which the conference committee
4. report was...defeated. It was Senator Nimrod - was the
5. Senate sponsor.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. What is the bill number, Senator?

8. SENATOR MERRITT:

9. HB 458. Senator Nimrod was the Senate sponsor.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Merritt moves to reconsider the vote by
12. which the conference committee report on HB 458 was
13. defeated. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
14. no. The motion carries. Now the conference committee
15. report is now before the Body. Senator Nimrod.

16. SENATOR NIMROD:

17. Mr. President, distinguished colleagues, the
18. conference committee report adopts an effective date
19. and all we're doing is adopting that item, and I have
20. spoken to...to the people who did not understand what
21. had happened there, and I feel that they're in a position
22. to vote for this bill and I would ask for its support
23. and its passage.

21. that I've instructed the Secretary to read no messages
22. except appropriation messages. This action came from
23. the Floor and I just want it understood that the will
24. of the Senate will always prevail. And I have instructed
25. the Secretary to read no messages from the Secretary's
26. desk except bills and conference committee reports deal-
27. ing with appropriations. Ok. All right. Messages
28. from the House. You want to do this one first Ed? Yeah.

29. SECRETARY:

33. This is the appropriation to the General Assembly.

1. The House amendments broke out the details of the...
2. House appropriation staff and...and added slightly

6. This is the appropriation to the General Assembly.
7. The vote requires 36 votes. On the question of

28. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

29. Yes, Mr. President, Members of the Senate, I think
30. you would be interested to know that so far I have
31. appointed 83 conference committees, and there are more
32. coming. And I just want to personally thank the Secretary's
33. staff and our staff and all ... of the members for their

1. cooperation. We're right up to the minute and have been
2. and it's just most unfortunate that we have to sit here
3. and wait for the House to act. Now, in effect what we
4. are doing are hearing another hundred, Lord knows, 150
5. bills once again due to all the...the delay, the amendments
6. that have been tacked on in the House. I just want to
