I would hope in the future Sessions 10. of the General Assembly we would go after those franchise 11. offerings that are the door to door type that are 12. bilking the smaller people of this State but this 13. seems to be as much as we can get out of this General 14. Assembly. It is the first step forward for this State 15. in model legislation and I would urge its adoption. 16. PRESIDENT: 17. Senator Sommer. 18. SENATOR SOMMER: 19. Yes, SB 200 is coming back from the House with...I believe it has two amendments on it, really the second amendment. The first...the first amendment to SB 200 which I might say originally was an appropriation for 3: 1/2 million dollars for an overpass in North Farnsworth Avenue and the Burlington Northern Railroad in Aurora, Illinois. The House... Amendment No. 1 put on by the House, amended the bill from 3 1/2 million down to \$100,000. It did not change any of the substantive part of the bill. However, a similar bill was introduced in the House by Representative Jack Hill. We passed it out of the Senate at \$100,000. Really House...SB 200 is not necessary if they passed it it would be a duplicate. Now a bill was needed to incorporate the sum, and this is what Amendment No. 2 to SB 200 in the House was. It struck everything after the enacting clause, and inserted the following: the following named sum or so much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated from the grade crossing protection fund to the Department of Transportation for the construction of railroad grade crossing separation upon any Federal, State, County

.1. municipal or township highway. The amount of the appropriation is \$3,600,000. Now that's sort of an omnibus bill 2. for all of the grade crossing overpasses, underpasses that 3. are grouped into one and that's the authority to cooperate 4. 5. with the Federal funds for these programs. This is a 6. good amendment. It changes the original intent of SB 200 7. but it's a vehicle to accomplish this. I am agreeable to 8. it. It does not alter the...intent of the grade crossing 9. in Aurora that I wanted covered by another bill. And so I would move for concurrence in Amendments 1 and 2 to 10. 11. SB 200 as amended in the House.
