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SENATOR ROCK:

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

We went to the order without objection and I would think
an explanation from the Senator from Rochelle would be satisfactory and time enough will be given, Senator, so we will know
what we're doing. The calendar is only a scoreboard and it's
not our...or really an official document. The only document
is our journal. I think it's in order, Senator. Senator Roe.
SENATOR ROE:

SENATOR ROE:

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The bill provides simply that the Secretary of State shall promulgate rules and regulations and develop procedures by April 1st of 1975 to afford reasonable notice to all people required to file Economic Interest Statements. There still is no provision providing notice in the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. I would think by this time that we would be willing to recognize that there should be a notice procedure developed in this bill as stands as I have just explained to it, that is the long and the short of the entire bill, and I would move that we concur in the House amendment to Senate Bill 8.
