2. The Senate will come to order. The prayer will be
3. offered by Reverend Bluford G. Dawson, Minister of the
4. First United Methodist Church of Springfield. Reverend
5. Dawson.

6. (Prayer by Reverend Dawson of
7. the First United Methodist Church,
8. Springfield, Illinois)

9. Reading of the Journal.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Monday, October 15, 1973,...

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Soper.

14. SENATOR SOPER:

15. Mr. President, Members of the Senate, I move that we
16. dispense with the further reading of the Journal of...Monday,
17. October 15th, 1973 and unless there's some corrections or
18. additions to be made that the Journal stand approved.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. You've heard the motion. Senator Soper moves...any
21. discussion? All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
22. no. The motion carries. So ordered.

23. SECRETARY:

24. Tuesday, October 16, 1973...

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Soper.

27. SENATOR SOPER:

28. Mr. President, I move that we dispense with the further
29. reading of the Journal of Tuesday, October 16th, 1973. Unless
30. there's some additions or corrections to be made, that the
31. Journal stand approved.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Soper moves to approve the Journal of October

1. 16, unless there are addition...or corrections. Is there
2. discussion? All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
3. no. The motion carries. So ordered. Yes. Communications
4. from the Secretary of State.

5. SECRETARY:
6. (Secretary reads letter from Secretary of State)

7. PRESIDENT:
8. Messages from the House.

9. SECRETARY:
10. (Secretary reads Message from the House)

11. PRESIDENT:
12. Mr. Secretary, would you read those numbers again
13. please.

14. SECRETARY:
15. HB's 203, 204, 1086, 1089, 1212, and 1517.

16. PRESIDENT:
17. The Chair will order those bills placed on the Calendar
18. in the order of Concurrence in House Action on Amendatory
19. Vetoes. That series of bills again in which the House has
20. concurred in the Amendatory Vetoes are HB's 203, 204, 1086,
21. 1089, 1212 and 1517. They will be placed on tomorrow's
22. Calendar on the order of Concurrence in House Action on
23. Amendatory Vetoes. In order to clarify the Journal, we're
24. not just certain last week whether the House adopted our...
25. Adjournment Resolution. Therefore, in order to make certain
26. there is...that there is no ambiguousness or dangling parti-
27. ciples involved, it would be appropriate for Senator Mohr
28. to move the adoption of the Adjournment Resolution from
29. the House that the Secretary will now read.

30. SECRETARY:
31. House Joint Resolution No. 76.
32. (Secretary reads Resolution)

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Mohr moves the adoption of the Resolution.
2. Is there discussion? All in favor signify by saying aye.
3. Contrary no. The motion carries. The Resolution is
4. adopted. Senator Harber Hall.

5. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

6. Mr. President, fellow Senators, in the President's
7. Gallery this afternoon you will see a rather large group
8. of distinguished looking gentlemen. These gentlemen have
9. come here to speak as loudly and as clearly as they can
10. for county government that they and some of us feel to be
11. a...an area of government that needs strengthening and
12. they will probably be contacting you, those that they know
13. personally about some matters of interest they have.
14. Vernon Strough, the Honorable Vernon Strough from Iroquois
15. County is the President of this group. And these gentlemen
16. are county treasurers from all parts of the State of
17. Illinois and I'd like to have them recognized. Would
18. you stand gentlemen, please?

19. PRESIDENT:

20. ...Is there anything further to come before the
21. Regular Session? Yes, is there anything further to
22. come before the...Senator Sours.

23. SENATOR SOURS:

24. Mr. President, Senators, perhaps I was inattentive,
25. what are we doing with the Senate Calendar? I happen
26. to have a couple of bills on...House Bills on 1st reading.
27. Do we want to wait until we have 30 here, is that the...
28. 55. Is that...is that the grand strategy? .

29. PRESIDENT:

30. I...I think it would have some affect. Yes.

31. SENATOR SOURS:

32. You think it might all right. All right.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Anything further, Senator Sours? Senator Walker.

2. SENATOR WALKER:

3. Thank you, Mr. President. Under the Amendatory Vetoes,
4. I have a SB 550 that I've properly explained to Senator
5. Partee and if we have the time, it only takes 30 votes,
6. I'd like to have that one called.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Partee.

9. SENATOR PARTEE:

10. To eliminate any confusion, let me simply say that
11. since the bill was called the other day, I have had a
12. conversation with Senator Walker. There was a question
13. in my mind which has now been clarified, and I propose
14. to support it. I...I'm certainly not in any way trying
15. to prevent its being overridden and I want him to know
16. that. And I think by the same token we had some con-
17. versation that he now understands a bill that I had
18. and I assume it will be called next.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. All right, the motion before the Senate then is,
21. Senator Walker's motion to concur in the Amendatory
22. Veto to SB 550. Is there discussion? The question is
23. ... The question is shall the Senate accept the specific
24. recommendations of the Governor as to SB 550, in the
25. manner and form indicated by Senator Walker. On that
26. question the Secretary will call the roll.

27. SECRETARY:

28. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
29. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,

5. PRESIDENT:

6. On that question the yeas are forty-five, the nays
7. are none. The specific recommendations of the Governor
8. as to SB 550 having received the required majority vote
9. of Senators elected are declared accepted. Senator Harber
10. Hall.

11. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

12. Mr. President, in the interest of reducing the size
13. of the Calendar if it would be any assistance...assistance
14. to you, I would like to...withdraw one and maybe others
15. would...other sponsors would like to do the same. I do
16. not intend to call SB 68 for...purposes of override if
17. these...some of these bills could be stricken we could
18. reduce the size of our Calendar.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Hall, would you approach the Secretary's
21. desk? I believe...that you can handle this, you see...
22. Senator Rock.

23. SENATOR ROCK:

24. Just a point of inquiry, has Senator Hall withdrawn
25. that motion? Is this the discussion we had about the
26. rules that...

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Hall has not filed a motion.

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. I see.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. But it is a bill that he was the sponsor of, now it's...

33. SENATOR ROCK:

1. This is day eight.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. That's correct. It is...it is the opinion of the
4. Chair that no disservice results by continuing to show
5. these bills on the Calendar. And even though we...we do
6. like to see it reduced in size, I think it's more appropriate
7. that the bills that were communicated to us by the Secretary
8. of State advising us of the Governor's action should remain
9. on our Calendar through the 15-day period. And, therefore,
10. I suggested on Senator Hall that no action on his part
11. was necessary since he intends to accept the ...veto as
12. Senator sponsor but in the meantime any other Senator
13. who might wish to respond has that privilege after today
14. in...in a...insofar as to question of priority is concerned.
15. That...that right always obtained under our rules...even
16. though we recently amended them, providing for an eight-
17. day priority relationship for the Senate sponsor. But
18. it seems to me it is a more appropriate course of procedure
19. for us to pursue to leave on the Calendar all bills involved
20. in the Message from the Secretary of State on our...day of
21. reconvention. Yes, Senator Rock.

22. SENATOR ROCK:

23. Yes, I have one other item of business, Mr. President.
24. Under...on the Calendar under the Item Vetoes, I don't see
25. Senator Walker here now, but you'll recall that at the end
26. of the last Session, Senator Walker was...otherwise occupied
27. and I picked up the sponsorship of SB...

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Board of Governor's appropriation. Yes.

30. SENATOR ROCK:

31. ...right, 443 and 591. I would just like the Journal
32. to reflect that Senator Walker is the sponsor and have the
33. Calendar so reflect.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Is there leave of the Senate to show Senator Walker
3. as the principal sponsor of the two bills referred to by
4. Senator Rock, the appropriation bills both operations and
5. capital for the Board of Governor's Institutions. So ordered.
6. Senator Partee.

7. SENATOR PARTEE:

8. I was just wondering if we could go to the order of
9. bills on Postponed Consideration while Senator Walker is
10. still here. I think he wants to evidence his support of
11. this bill today and this is the one I'd like to see if we
12. move to go to the order of Postponed Consideration for the
13. consideration of SB 894. This is the one that...

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Yes. Is there leave to revert to the order of bills
16. under Consideration Postponed? So ordered. Senator Partee
17. is recognized for consideration of SB 894.

18. SENATOR PARTEE:

19. Now this is a motion to accept the Governor's specific
20. recommendations for change in this particular bill. This
21. is a bill that relates to the Mobile Home Safety Code,
22. and the bill as originally written and passed made the
23. Department of Public Health, pardon me, the Department of
24. Local Government the department which enforced the regulations
25. involved. He suggested that since the Department of Public
26. Health has several other...things that they must do concern-
27. ing mobile homes that it be put in the Department of Public
28. Health and I move to accept the Governor's specific
29. recommendations.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Nimrod.

32. SENATOR NIMROD:

33. Would the sponsor yield to a question?

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. Of course.

3. SENATOR NIMROD:

4. In relation to this is this relates to safety practices,
5. does this in any way by moving it to the public health
6. does this in any way jeopardize the present State plan
7. that provides for safety standards or work conditions of
8. employees under...under the Occupational Safety and Health
9. Act of the State plan of the State of Illinois, does that
10. jeopardize that particular...

11. SENATOR PARTEE:

12. Absolutely not.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Is there further discussion? The question is shall
15. the Senate accept the specific recommendations of the
16. Governor as to SB 894 in the manner and form just indicated
17. by Senator Partee. And on that question the Secretary will
18. call the roll.

19. SECRETARY:

20. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
21. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,
22. Dougherty, Fawell, Glass, Graham, Harber Hall, Kenneth

30. PRESIDENT:

31. On that question the yeas are fifty-four, the nays are
32. none. The specific recommendations of the Governor as to
33. SB 894 having received the required majority vote of Senators

1. elected are declared accepted.

2. SECRETARY:

3. Senator Ozinga, Chairman of the Committee on Executive
4. to which was referred the Governor's Message of July 13 and
5. the Governor's Message of September 20 report the same back
6. in part with the recommendation that the Senate advise and
7. consent to the appointments contained in the Executive
8. Committee report.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. One...one minute. For what purpose does Senator Mitchler
11. arise?

12. SENATOR MITCHLER:

13. Mr. President, I was going to attempt to dispose of
14. SB 580, which is on there and accept the Governor's amendatory
15. veto.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Oh. All right. We...we'll return to that Senator.
18. All right. Let's proceed with this order of business.
19. Senator Ozinga, Chairman of Executive is recognized.

20. SENATOR OZINGA:

21. I would move that the Senate do arise for the purpose
22. of considering these...the Senate convene for the purpose of
23. considering these Messages.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Ozinga has moved that the Senate resolve
26. itself into Executive Session for consideration of the
27. Messages from the Governor just referred to by the Secretary.
28. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. Motion
29. carries. The Senate is in Executive Session. Senator Ozinga
30. is recognized.

31. SENATOR OZINGA:

32. Now, Mr. President, I would like to explain two things.
33. Number one, we had some thirty-nine names submitted to us

1. by way of two messages from the Governor. We have selected
2. two, and if...it would be my request of the Senate that I
3. shall make two motions. One with reference to the Message
4. of July 13th wherein there is but two...persons that are
5. suggested for confirmation and the other with reference to
6. the balance of the Message of persons that were heard on
7. September the 20th, 1973. Do I have permission from the
8. Senate to proceed along that line?

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Rock.

11. SENATOR ROCK:

12. I wonder, Mr. President, at the last Executive meeting
13. some of the nominations were, in fact, postponed. I...are
14. you going to read the list of names so we know exactly...

15. SENATOR OZINGA:

16. I am going to read the entire list of names except that
17. I will only read those that we acted upon Senator.

18. SENATOR ROCK:

19. That's fine. Thank you.

20. SENATOR OZINGA:

21. All right.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Is there leave for Senator Ozinga to proceed in the
24. fashion that he has indicated? So ordered. Proceed.

25. SENATOR OZINGA:

26. All right. Now, Mr. President, I would then move
27. that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of
28. Michael J. Brady to be a Member of the Board of Regents
29. for a term expiring on the third Monday in January of
30. 1979 and Mrs. Eleanor R. Suggs of Phoenix, Illinois to be
31. a Member of the Board of Regents for a term expiring on
32. the third Monday of January of 1979. All of these, or both
33. of these members being contained in the Governor's Message

1. of July 13th. And Mr. President, I would move that the
2. Senate do advise and consent to these nominations.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Is there further discussion? The question is does
5. the Senate advise and consent to the nominations just made?
6. And on that question the Secretary will call the roll.

7. SECRETARY:

8. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
9. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,
10. Dougherty, Fawell, Glass, Graham, Harber Hall, Kenneth
11. Hall, Hynes, Johns, Keegan, Knuepfer, Knuppel, Kosinski,

17. PRESIDENT:

18. For what purpose does Senator Sours rise?

19. SENATOR SOURS:

20. I have a situation, Mr. President. We're now acting
21. on two names, one of those two is absolutely incompetent,
22. and the other is satisfactory. I cannot possibly explain
23. my vote.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Well, Senator, Senator Ozinga proceeded to explain the
26. understanding that he was going to consider these as a group.
27. Your choice then is up to you. This is a single roll call
28. on the two nominations he has just referred to.

29. SENATOR SOURS:

30. Well, I'm going to have to vote no because I cannot
31. entrust a hundred and twenty million dollars to a zero.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Record...record Senator Sours no.

1. SECRETARY:
2. Swinarski, Vadalabene, Walker, Weaver, Welsh, Wooten,
3. Mr. President.
4. PRESIDENT:
5. Keegan, aye. Senator Soper, aye. The result of the
6. vote of the Senate on the question is forty-eight yeas,
7. and two nays. A majority of the Senators elected concurring
8. by record vote, the Senate does advise and consent to the
9. Governor's nominations. Senator Ozinga.
10. SENATOR OZINGA:
11. Now, Mr. President, there are sixteen names in this
12. next group that were heard by the committee. And in order
13. not to...to, what will I say, to...to raise any more con-
14. fusion, is there anybody that wishes to segregate these or
15. separate them. Otherwise, I'll...I'll proceed along one
16. motion, that they all be confirmed.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. Senator Ozinga has made clear again that he is going
19. to make a motion applying to all of the remaining nominations.
20. Is there anyone who objects to that procedure? Senator Sours.
21. SENATOR SOURS:
22. I do not...I do not propose to object because of the
23. time involved. But we've also got some rah-rah a vis
24. in that list too. So I'm going to have to vote a negative
25. vote on that list.
26. PRESIDENT:
27. Is there further discussion on the explanation of
28. procedure by Senator Ozinga? Senator Ozinga.
29. SENATOR OZINGA:
30. Maybe if I proceeded first to say who the nominees
31. are and then if there are objections...
32. PRESIDENT:
33. Proceed.

1. SENATOR OZINGA:

2. ...to certain nominees we'll withhold those. Okay.
3. Now, the first group or the first two in the Message of
4. September 20th are: Fred J. Beuckman of Collinsville,
5. Illinois to be a Member of the Bi-State Development Agency
6. to expire...his term to expire in 1978. Then, a Carmen
7. J. Moody also of the Bi-State Development Agency for
8. a term expiring in '78. Then, there's a James J. Cicero
9. of Chicago for the Board of Governor's of State Colleges
10. for a term to expire in January of '79. Then, Leon Davis
11. of Chicago, Board of Governor's, State Colleges, Universities,
12. to expire in '79. Then, a Mrs. Norma Relph of Peru,
13. Illinois, Board of Governor's, State Colleges and Universities
14. for the third Monday in January of 1979. Then, new category,
15. John Curtin, Stonington, Illinois, a Member of the Board
16. of State Fair Advisors for a term expiring in January of
17. 1975. Then, Douglas, new category again, Douglas Nelson
18. Kane of Springfield a Member of State Investment Board
19. term expiring in 1977. And, also, in that same classification
20. Charles W. Woodford of Springfield, Illinois for the State
21. Investment Board for the third Monday of January of 1976.
22. And, then in a new category, Charles E. Hayes of Arlington
23. Heights, Member, Illinois Health Facilities Authority, June
24. 30th of 1974. Another new category, Mrs. Carol R. Fordonski
25. of Lisle, Illinois, Illinois Industrial Pollution Control
26. Financing Authority, for a term expiring June 30th of
27. 1974. And, then on that same agency, David Ader of Chicago,
28. Member of the Illinois Industrial Pollution Control Financing
29. Authority, June 30th of 1975. And, again on that same commission
30. would be Norman M. Gelfand, Chicago, Illinois Industrial
31. Pollution Control Financing Authority for a term expiring
32. on June 30th, 1975. Now, a new category, Illinois-Missouri
33. Bridge Commission which is Charles R. Best of Chester,

1. Illinois for a term expiring on October 27th of '78.
2. Then in another new category for the Joliet Regional
3. Port District Board for a term expiring July 1st, of '79,
4. George a. Hartley of Lockport. Then again in a new
5. category, Clarence Schaefer of Valmeyer, Member of
6. the Mississippi-Illinois-Jefferson-Monroe Bridge
7. Commission, term expiring October 27th, 1978. And
8. then again in a new category, Harry R. Condon of
9. Pekin, a Member, Local Government Advisory Council,
10. third Monday of January, 1975. Now, I think those 16
11. names are the names that will be submitted, and if there's
12. no objection to any of those I would then move that the
13. Senate do advise and consent in all of the foregoing
14. authority...nominees.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Is there further discussion? The question is
17. does the Senate advise and consent to the nominations
18. just made. And as explained to the Senate by Senator
19. Ozinga, this will be on one roll call. Secretary will
20. call the roll.

21. SECRETARY:

22. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
23. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,
24. Dougherty, Fawell, Glass, Graham, Harber Hall, Kenneth
25. Hall, Hynes, Johns, Keegan, Knuepfer, Knuppel, Kosinski,
26. Latherow, McBroom, McCarthy, Merritt, Mitchler, Howard
27. Mohr, Don Moore, Netsch, Newhouse, Nimrod, Nudelman,

32. PRESIDENT:

33. The result of the vote of the Senate on the question

1. is forty-five yeas, three nays and one voting present.
2. A majority of the Senators elected concurring by record
3. vote, the Senate does advise and consent to the Governor's
4. nominations. ...advised that I misread the tally sheet.
5. It's forty-five yeas, three voting present and one nay.
6. Senator Ozinga.

7. SENATOR OZINGA:

8. Mr. President, I would announce at this time that all
9. of the rest of the nominees as received by the Executive
10. Committee are on call or on notice for hearing for Wednesday
11. at the regular time, 2:15 and we will hear all of the
12. nominees together with those that were postponed from
13. last Tuesday. And now, Mr. President, I would move you that
14. the Senate do arise.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Ozinga moves that the Senate arise from
17. Executive Session. All in favor signify by saying aye.
18. Contrary no. The motion carries. So ordered. Senator
19. Mitchler.

20. SENATOR MITCHLER:

21. Yes, Mr. President and Members of the Senate, SB 580
22. is listed on Calendar among the Amendatory Vetoes. I
23. would like to have that called at this time, Mr. President,
24. and the Secretary has on the desk a motion to the effect
25. that I move to accept the Governor's specific recommendations
26. for change with respect to SB 580 in the manner in which he
27. submitted it to the Members of the General Assembly.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there further discussion?

30. SENATOR MITCHLER:

31. Mr. President.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Mitchler.

1. SENATOR MITCHLER:
2. In conclusion I would point out that this bill, SB
3. 580 was introduced at the request of the Mayor of the
4. City of Aurora to include the City of Aurora in the
5. Metropolitan Exposition Auditorium and Office Building
6. Authority. And the language that we passed was the
7. language requested by the...Illinois Municipal League
8. and the Mayor of the City of Aurora, and the Mayor of
9. the City of Aurora now accepts the Governor's Amendatory
10. Veto and acting in his behalf I would ask for a favorable
11. roll call in accepting the Governor's Amendatory Veto of
12. SB 580.
13. PRESIDENT:
14. Is there further discussion? Senator Rock.
15. SENATOR ROCK:
16. I would just question if the Senator will yield.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. He indicates that he will. Proceed.
19. SENATOR ROCK:
20. My understanding is that if we sustain the gubernatorial
21. veto that the language that we then incorporate as a matter
22. of statute would then be applicable to all other such
23. authorities. I'm wondering for instance what the difference
24. is between this message and the message as relates to Senator
25. Sours' Peoria Civic Center bill. I frankly don't know and I'm
26. sorry I...I didn't realize you were going to call it today
27. and I just haven't compared the two. Do...do you happen to
28. know what the...why one was amended and the other was an
29. outright veto?
30. SENATOR MITCHLER:
31. Senator Rock, I believe the two bills are somewhat
32. different, in the basic content. Senator Sours would
33. care to explain the exact language of his bill that relates

1. directly to Peoria, I would yield to him.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Sours.

4. SENATOR SOURS:

5. Without making any comment, direct or indirect with
6. reference to Senator Mitchler's bill, the Peoria bill
7. could be effected by this bill, I'm sure. Now, realizing
8. we're not taking my bill, but drawing a distinction, the
9. Peoria bill, Senator Rock provides for a referendum for
10. every nickel to be spent, even in the seed money. In
11. other words, Representative Day's bill, for example, which
12. will be coming over here probably, permits the authority
13. to spend about \$300,000 plus without any referendum to
14. get the civic center matter in motion. My bill would not
15. permit that. My bill requires a referendum for every
16. nickel. Now, I think the Governor's man, whoever happened
17. to have prepared his veto, wasn't too attentive on the
18. day he recommended the veto, and that's...that's my
19. situation there.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall
22. the Senate accept the specific recommendations of the
23. Governor as to SB 580 in the manner and form indicated
24. by Senator Mitchler. And on that question the Secretary
25. will call the roll.

16. SB 1179, sponsored by Senator Merritt who indicates
17. acceptance of the specific recommendations of the Governor.
18. Senator Merritt.

19. SENATOR MERRITT:

20. Yes, Mr. President. SB 1179 authorized issuance of five
21. million in capitol development bond funds for containerization
22. facilities, Chicago Regional Port in Chicago. And...HB
23. 1952 which made the appropriation was reduced by the
24. Governor to 3.5 million dollars. Well, to make our
25. SB 1179 consistent with the appropriation it's necessary
26. for this change and I would...move at this time to accept
27. the Governor's specific recommendations for this change.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there further discussion? The question is shall the
30. Senate accept the specific recommendations of the Governor
31. as to SB 1179 in the manner and form just indicated by
32. Senator Merritt. On that question the Secretary will call
