33. SENATOR DON MOORE:

1. Thank you, Mr. President, Members of the Senate, SB  
2. 16 of the 3rd Special Session is legislation that is  
3. needed to implement our Public Aid Code to provide that  
4. on January 1st, 1974 the Federal government takes over  
5. the Old Age, Blind and Disabled Programs in the State of  
6. Illinois. It also provides for mandatory supplement by  
7. the State. It is legislation that we do need. It is  
8. of an emergency nature and at this time, Mr. President, I  
9. would move to suspend the rules and have this bill advanced  
10. to the order of 2nd reading without reference to a committee.  
11. I have talked to Senator Rock on the other side of the  
12. aisle and the other three Democratic members of the  
13. Legislative Advisory Committee on Public Aid.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Rock.

16. SENATOR ROCK:

17. Well, the only thing I would say with all deference to  
18. Senator Moore, he did mention that he was going to put the  
19. bill in and would like it moved to which we would have no  
20. objection ordinarily except for the fact that there are a  
21. series of eleven bills that we tried to move yesterday and  
22. there...I am sure that some if not all of them will be  
23. given that consideration. But I would just ask that that...  
24. your bill be held in the same posture as these others and  
25. then we can move them all at once.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Why don't we get to that question tomorrow, Senator  
28. Moore? We are going to be working Thursday of this week  
29. so that there is a possibility that we could take final  
30. action on these bills this week. Senator Moore.

31. SENATOR DON MOORE:

32. I would have no objection, Mr. President. This is  
33. an administration bill. I want that matter made clear on

1. the other side of the aisle, but if Senator Rock desires  
2. this matter to be put over for a day, I would have no  
3. objection and I will withdraw my motion.
