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SENATOR REGNER: 1. Yes Mr. President, members of the Senate, as we 2. know historically we've had appropriation bills introduced 3. very late in the Session, thus giving the General Assembly 4. 5. very little time to act judiciously on these bills and 6. give them consideration. This bill was prepared in con-7. junction with the Governor's office, and what it does, it requires that all appropriation bills pertaining to 8. the Governor's budget message, that all these bill 9. introduced or submitted to the legislative leaders no. 10. later than the first Friday of April and it is effective 11. 12. immediately so that when it's passed and when it's signed it will apply to next year's Session. And I'd ask for a 13. favorable roll call. 14. 15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR): 16. Senator Rock. SENATOR ROCK: 17. 18. I have a question if the Senator will yield. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR): .19. 20. He indicated he will. 21. SENATOR ROCK: 22. How is this, if at all, to be enforced? PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR): 23. 24. Senator Regner. 25. 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Thank you. Thank you Mr. President. The problem I have is that it seems to me, if in fact the Chief Executive is in somewhat of a time crunch would it not lead to, assuming some enforcement whether by public opinion or verbal brutalization by the members of the General Assembly or some such, would it not lead to the introduction of shell bills or dummy bills just to comply. Which then would be amended in the appropriations process. I just think we are in fact kind of cluttering up the State Finance Act with something that is totally unenforceable. I...I would assume that that could be done Senator Rock, that there could be shell bills introduced but I certainly think the General Assembly should show its belief that it should have something to work on earlier in the Session than has been in the past, as you know not just this past year but under the previous administration we had the transportation bill introduced extremely late in the Session, like in June one year if I'm not mistaken and also Mental Health. And I think it shows the intent of the General Assembly that we do want sufficient time to work on appropriations and not have the problems that we have had in the past.
