6. SENATOR SOPER:

7. Mr. President, I move that we dispense with the further  
8. reading of the Journal of November 6th, unless there are some  
9. additions or corrections to be made, the Journal stand ap-  
10. proved.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

12. I'm sorry, I precluded the Secretary. All in favor of  
13. the motion by Senator Soper will signify by saying aye.  
14. Opposed. The ayes have it, and the motion is carried. Mr.

15. SECRETARY:

16. Wednesday, November 7, 1973.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

18. Senator Soper.

19. SENATOR SOPER:

20. I move again, that we dispense with the further reading  
21. of the Journal of November 7th, unless there are some addi-  
22. tions or corrections to be made, that the Journal stand ap-  
23. proved.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

25. All in favor of the motion by Senator Soper will signify  
26. by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes have it, and the motion  
27. is carried. Mr. Secretary.

28. SECRETARY:

29. Thursday, November 8, 1973.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

31. Senator Soper.

32. SENATOR SOPER:

33. Mr. President, I move that we dispense with the further

1. reading of the Journal of November 8th, unless there are  
2. some corrections or additions to be made, the Journal  
3. stand approved.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

5. All in favor of the motion by the Senator from  
6. Cicero, will signify by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes  
7. have it and the motion is carried.

8. SENATOR SOPER:

9. Now, Mr. President, I move that we postpone the read-  
10. ing of the Journal of November 13th, pending the arrival  
11. of the printed Journal.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

13. You have heard the recent motion of Senator Soper. All  
14. in favor will signify by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes have  
15. it and your motion carried, Senator. We have some...We will  
16. now, be on the order of Resolutions. Mr. Secretary. Gentle-  
17. men. Senator Smith. I think that we are getting into the  
18. reading of some Death Resolutions. The Chair would be most  
19. appreciative if the Senators in paying tribute to the Depart-  
20. ed, would please be in your seats. We can stand the rest.  
21. There's a Congratulatory first while you're getting in...

22. SECRETARY:

23. Senate Resolution 290 by Senator Welsh. It's Congratula-  
24. tory.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

26. Senator Welsh, who are you congratulating?

27. SENATOR WELSH:

28. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Senate  
29. Resolution 290 is congratulatory and it congratulates Radio  
30. Station WBBM, who celebrates their 50th year of broadcasting  
31. to the listeners of Chicago and Illinois today. In addition  
32. to honor a very wonderful fellow that we all know, Allen  
33. Crane who was the full-time correspondent here reporting on

1. legislative activity in Illinois.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

3. Senator...You're Senator Scholl, are'nt you? The Chair  
4. recognizes the Senator from Chicago.

5. SENATOR SCHOLL:

6. Mr. President and members of the Senate, WBBM Radio, in  
7. Chicago, has done so much to make the real truth out of news.  
8. And they have really done an outstanding job. It's a constant  
9. program of news, there's no music on the program during the  
10. entire day. Allen Crane has done an outstanding job in pro-  
11. moting this type of a program, and I would like to join in  
12. this Resolution on their 50th anniversary.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

14. I think Senator Welsh, was getting ready to make a sug-  
15. gestion in that regard and I recognize, Senator Welsh. I'll  
16. be around to you latter, Charlie.

17. SENATOR WELSH:

18. Thank you, Mr. president, I would ask that all members  
19. of the Senate join me as co-sponsors of this Resolution.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

21. Any other Senators want to be mentioned by Allen Crane  
22. on the radio? Senator Chew.

23. SENATOR CHEW:

24. Yes, I'd like to be mentioned by Allen Crane on the  
25. radio. Actually Mr. Chairman WBBM, is an outstanding news  
26. station. It has some outstanding characters, as Senator  
27. Scholl said, 'it takes the news and makes the truth out of  
28. it', sorry, I can't say that about all other media. But  
29. WBBM is a radio station we are proud to have in our area,  
30. and I am very happy to join in co-sponsoring this Resolution  
31. with the other members of the Senate.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

33. Senator Partee.

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. 78.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

4. Do - 78 - Senator Welsh now moves, for unanimous consent  
5. to have the Resolution considered and adopted at this time.

6. All in favor of the suspension of the rules signify by  
7. saying aye. Opposed. The ayes have it. Senator Welsh now  
8. moves, for immediate consideration of 78's Resolution. All  
9. in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes have it.  
10. And your Resolution is adopted.

11. SECRETARY:

12. S.J.R. No 52 by Senators Partee, Donnewald and Rock.

13. (Secretary reads SJR No. 52)

14. Energy Crisis

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

16. Senator Partee.

17. SENATOR PARTEE:

18. This is a Resolution I think has no controversy. It  
19. talks about the energy crisis and the gasoline crisis. And  
20. it had been suggested in some quarters in Washington,  
21. that instead of having gasoline rationing; that we should have  
22. a premium to be paid on gasoline in addition to its current  
23. price of say, 50 or 75 cents a gallon instead of rationing.  
24. And this Resolution just addresses itself to the President,  
25. to Mr. Love, who is the Director of that Division and to the Con-  
26. gress, suggesting to them that if we have gasoline rationing,  
27. the gasoline rationing should be on an equitable basis and not  
28. at a premium price basis, because that would mean that people  
29. with lots of money could buy all of the gas that they wanted and  
30. not feel it, and people with little money could not be able to  
31. buy the gasoline....

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

33. Would the Senate be in order please?

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. ...And it's just a Resolution recommending that they  
3. take into consideration the aspect of putting rationing,  
4. if it must be, on an equitable basis for all citizens. And  
5. I'd move the suspension of the rules and adoption of this  
6. Resolution and ask that all Senate members be shown as co-  
7. sponsors.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

9. ...Senator Partee, I think as inasmuch as Senator  
10. Ozinga's having a meeting this afternoon, why don't we  
11. send it down to him? Save the debate. Do it tomorrow.

12. SENATOR PARTEE:

13. Pardon me.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

15. Why don't we send it down to Senator Ozinga's committee,  
16. and then consider it down there this afternoon, and debate it  
17. on the Floor tomorrow.

18. SENATOR PARTEE:

19. Do you consider to have any controversy - do you?

20. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

21. I'm not sure. President Harris, is not out here.

22. SENATOR PARTEE:

23. Why, you see, the only reason I want to get it out of  
24. here, it's a Joint Resolution and it has to go to the House  
25. and we fool around here with it it may not get heard over  
26. there.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

28. They'll be in there tomorrow, won't they? Could we...  
29. you want to take this out of the record for a moment?

30. SENATOR PARTEE:

31. I'm sorry, I did not hear you.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

33. Would you like to take this out of the record for a moment?

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. Yes, take it out of the record for a moment.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

4. All right, take it out of the record. We'll be at ease  
5. for...Senator Partee. Tell him we will be at ease for a  
6. couple of moments. We will read the Death Resolution.  
7. Senator Rock could I see you? Please? Senator Rock or  
8. Senator Partee. I am informed....Senator Partee....Senator  
9. Rock...I am informed that it is the desire of the President  
10. of the Senate to send the Resolution that was taken out of  
11. the record previously to Executive to be heard this after-  
12. noon. Now, Mr. Secretary, what was the number of the  
13. Resolution ...

14. SECRETARY:

15. Senate Joint Resolution No. 52, by Senators Partee,  
16. Donnewald and Rock.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

18. Executive. Senator Rock.

19. SENATOR ROCK:

20. Is it necessary Mr. President that a motion be made to  
21. suspend the rules so that that can in fact be heard this  
22. afternoon in Executive.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

24. Let's do that so we are safe.

25. SENATOR ROCK:

26. I would so move that the rules would be suspended and would  
27. ask leave that that joint Resolution be heard in Executive  
28. this afternoon at 2:15.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

30. Senator Ozinga did you hear...that....Senator Rock moves  
31. for the suspension of the six-day rule, so that the Reso-  
32. lution just read by the Secretary may be considered by the  
33. Committee in Executive this afternoon. All in favor of the

1. motion by Senator Rock will signify by saying aye. Opposed.  
2. the ayes have it. And the Resolution will be in Executive  
3. today....Joint Resolution 52...Now, gentlemen, we are al-  
4. most ready to adjourn this Session, but before we do we  
5. have a Death Resolution. Two of them. And it has been  
6. the practice of this Presiding Officer, that after the  
7. last Death Resolution is read that we adjourn. So if there  
8. is any further business to be brought before this Senate  
9. before the reading of this Death Resolution speak now or  
10. tomorrow will be your next opportunity in this Session.  
11. No suggestions by any Senators, Mr. Secretary, will read  
12. the first of two Death Resolutions. So the Senate will be  
13. in order and the Senators will be in their seats, and the  
14. visitors will be off the Floor.

15. (Senate Resolution 291  
16. by Senators Smith, Don  
17. Moore, Bartulis, Dougherty  
18. & Saperstein.)

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

20. Senator Fred Smith.

21. SENATOR SMITH:

22. Mr. President and members of the Senate, ....

23. PRESIDING OFFICER:

24. Gentlemen, again we are considering a Death Resolution...  
25. Please....

26. SENATOR SMITH:

27. I appreciate that Mr. Chairman, our present Mr. President.  
28. Come now when it will or when it does that that we are pleased  
29. to call Death is always sad. And to me personally the death  
30. of our late friend and co-worker, is extremely touching. The  
31. fact is that on November the 1st to be exact our friend de-  
32. parted this life...went forth into those realms from which  
33. no traveler has ever returned. Over a ...goodly period of  
a goodly number of

1. a goodly number of years he was actively connected in the  
2. Department of Public Aid, until very recent years until  
3. he resigned. That after he served as a part-time worker  
4. in that difficult field in which he had dedicated his  
5. life, or a goodly portion of his life. There are those  
6. of us you think it altogether need and proper that this  
7. Resolution should have been offered. And I now ask Mr.  
8. President that the rules be suspended for the immediate  
9. consideration and I trust the adoption of the Resolution.  
10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

11. Senator Fred Smith asks for suspension of the rules  
12. and the immediate consideration of the Resolution just  
13. read. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Fred  
14. Smith now asks that the members of the Senate desirous of  
15. joining him on Resolution as co-sponsors, please do so...  
16. all members of the Senate. And he asks for immediate con-  
17. sideration of the Resolution. All in favor of the consider-  
18. ation of the adoption of the Resolution indicate by rising.  
19. The Resolution is adopted. Mr. Secretary.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

25. Senator Kenneth Hall.

26. SENATOR HALL:

27. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate, I know  
28. that all of you have been touched by this, Mr. Foley, was  
29. indeed a great man, not only in our area but for the State  
30. of Illinois. I would like that all Senators join me in this  
31. Resolution and I move for its immediate adoption.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

33. Senator Hall requests that all Senators join him as co-



1. sponsors and asks for immediate suspension ...or suspension  
2. of the rules for the immediate consideration of the Reso-  
3. lution. Senator Berning.

4. SENATOR BERNING:

5. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Body. In be-  
6. half of the members on this side of the aisle, I want to ex-  
7. press the regret that I feel in learning of the passing of  
8. Red Foley. It was my distinct pleasure and honor to have  
9. known him and worked with him during many years as a county  
10. official. He was a man of integrity, sincerity and impeccable  
11. honesty. It is with a deep sense of shock that I learn of his  
12. passing. So as I said speaking for the members on this side  
13. of the aisle, we want to express our regrets to the family.  
14. Certainly would like to join as co-sponsors in this Resolution.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

16. All Senators have been requested to join. Is suspension  
17. of the rules granted at this time for immediate consideration.  
18. Leave is granted. Senator Hall now asks for immediate con-  
19. sideration of the Resolution. All in favor of its adoption,  
20. will signify by arising. The Resolution is adopted. Senator  
21. Weaver.

22. SENATOR WEAVER:

23. Mr. President, I would like to introduce to the Senate...  
24. a group from Political Science University of Illinois, in the  
25. Visitor's Gallery. There here as a group studying state govern-  
26. ment under Professor Joe Pashada, at the University of Illinois,  
27. in the Visitor's Gallery.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

29. They would rise, please...I thought he was going to make a  
30. motion...

31. SENATOR WEAVER:

32. Mr. President...I would also...if there is not further  
33. business in the Regular Session, I would like to move that

1. that we adjourn the Regular Session until 10:15, o'clock,  
2. November the 15th.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM:)

4. You've heard the motion from the Senator from Urbana.  
5. All in favor will signify by saying aye. Opposed. The  
6. ayes have it and the 2nd...the Regular Session now stands ad-  
7. journed until 10:15 o'clock a.m., tomorrow morning.

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
