20.	it had been suggested in some quarters in Washington,
21.	that instead of having gasoline rationing; that we should have
22.	a premium to be paid on gasoline in addition to its current
23.	price of say, 50 or 75 cents a gallon instead of rationing.
24.	And this Resolution just addresses itself to the President,

And this Resolution just addresses itself to the President,
to Mr. Love, who is the Director of that Division and to the Congress, suggesting to them that if we have gasoline rationing,
the gasoline rationing should be on an equitable basis and not
at a premium price basis, because that would mean that people
with lots of money could buy all of the gas that they wanted and
not feel it, and people with little money could not be able to
buy the gasoline....
