Yes Mr. President, I'm sure that this bill is within the call and...without the repealer. I know that it isn't the type of legislation that we're at all happy with over here but, long ago and early in my political life I learned that if you can't get a lunch take a sandwich. It is permissive, it's not mandatory. I would have preferred mandatory, but as I said, we'll have to take the sandwich. In order to do this we've got to act on it rapidly so that the various counties can do or not do as they so desire. I would then urge the downstate members on this side of the aisle to give this particular bill an aye vote.
