1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

2. The First Special Session of the 78th General
3. Assembly will come to order. Reading of the Journal.
4. Senator Soper.

5. SENATOR SOPER:

6. Mr. President, I move that we postpone the reading
7. of the Journals of Tuesday, November 27th and Wednesday,
8. November 28th pending the arrival of the printed Journals.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

10. You've heard Senator Soper's motion, all in favor
11. signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. Motion carries.
12. ...business. Senator Graham.

13. SENATOR GRAHAM:

14. Mr. President, I move you that the First Special
15. Session of the 78th General Assembly...

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

17. Senator Schaffer, for what purpose do you rise?

18. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

19. Initially a point of inquiry. HB 1, where is it
20. currently?

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

22. Senator Mohr, do you care to answer Senator Schaffer?

23. SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

24. Yes, that's on the Fifth Special and we were
25. waiting for Senator Davidson who was not on the Floor.
26. We recessed at the call of the Chair and we'll get
27. back to that order later...in the day.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

29. We're in the First Special Senator Schaffer at this
30. point. The Fifth Special stands at recess. Senator Graham,
31. do you know where HB 1 in the First Special is?

32. SENATOR GRAHAM:

33. It obviously isn't on the Calendar. I don't know where

1. it is.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

3. Senator Graham.

4. SENATOR GRAHAM:

5. Mr. President, I have been informed that HB number 1,

6. the First Special Session is in the Committee on Assignment

7. of Bills. What's the subject matter of that bill Senator?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

9. Senator Schaffer.

10. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

11. I then interpret that to mean that it has been read

12. once.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

14. Senator Graham.

15. SENATOR GRAHAM:

16. The...the...the real formality of it is that we get

17. a Message from the House indicating that it's over here.

18. The Message is read and the bill automotically then if

19. there's no legislative action goes to Committee on

20. Assignment of Bills, and that's where it is.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

22. Senator Schaffer.

23. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

24. Well, I'm not sure exactly what the status is but

25. in that case I'd like to move to discharge the Committee

26. on Assignment of Bills and advance it to 2nd reading with-

27. out reference to committee.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

29. Senator Graham.

30. SENATOR GRAHAM:

31. What...what is the subject matter of the bill Senator?

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

33. Senator Schaffer.

1. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

2. It's a campaign disclosure bill similar to HB 1620
3. in the last Session.

4. SENATOR GRAHAM:

5. It goes to committee. There is an objection.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

7. There is an objection. Senator Schaffer moves to
8. suspend the rules.. Senator Schaffer moves to suspend
9. the rules and requests a roll call. Senator Partee.

10. SENATOR PARTEE:

11. Two questions. This is a bill that provides for
12. a special commission outside of the Board of Elections
13. Commission, is it not? And this is a bill that would
14. require 30 votes to...to accomplish what Senator Roe
15. seeks to do, is that correct? Schaffer, I'm sorry.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR WEAVER):

17. Senator Schaffer, do you...

18. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

19. Well, I don't think my motion is debatable. I
20. think you're...you're basically correct.
