Joint Resolution which has its sponsorship both by Senator 14. Harris and myself, here, and by Speaker Redmond and Representative 15. Washburn on the other side of the rotunda. This is a resolution 16. which had its origin in Genesis, going out of a disclosure the 17. other day by the State Comptroller, that there are as many as 18. four electronic eavesdropping devices within a two to four block 19. radius of the State Capitol Building and possibly in the State 20. Capitol Building itself. We talked about this development and it is 21. our concerted view, of course, that this kind of act, certainly 22. without the approval of the court, is not only reprehensible, but 23. it is, of course, illegal inviolative of the Bill of Rights of our 24. Constitution. It occurs to us that a thorough investigation of 25. these disclosures is absolutly mandated by us, and this resolution 26. authorizes the selection of a committee to make the necessary 27. inquiry in the terms of electronics necessary to determine what 28. is taking place, and, if so, what can be done to curb this illegal 29. activity. It's a Senate Joint Resolution, and I would ask for the 30. suspension of the rules for the immediate consideration of this 31. resolution. I suspect that Senator Harris would like, also, to 32. talk before I make this motion. 33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR ROCK):
