10. Senator Rock. I think you'll find it increases the appropriation
11. by fifteen thousand. Is that the one you wanted to move the adoption
12. of that amendment?
13. SENATOR ROCK:
14. Yes, Mr. President, the amendment offered and adopted in committee
15. does, in fact, just change the amount of money appropriated. It raises
16. it, I think, some five thousand dollars. I would move its adoption.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. Any further discussion? Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amend-
19. ment No. 1 to Senate Bill 105. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed
20. Nay. The amendment is adopted. Senator Rock, did you say five? It's
21. fifteen, is it not? Fifteen thousand increase?

1. Senator Bell. The amendment. Do you move its adoption? Would
2. you explain it briefly?

3. SENATOR BELL:

4. I'm sorry, Mr. President, I didn't...I was...

5. PRESIDENT:

6. We're on your Senate Bill 121...

7. SENATOR BELL:

8. Yeah.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. ...a committee amendment is offered. Would you explain the amend-
11. ment and indicate your position on that...

12. SENATOR BELL:

13. Yes.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. ...amendment.

16. SENATOR BELL:

17. ...Thank you, Mr. President. The committee amendment allows a
18. wine manufacturer, class number 1, to increase the amount of wine
19. that he manufacturers from five to ten thousand gallons creates wine
20. manufacturer two that...allows wine manufacturer two to move from
21. ten thousand gallons to twenty thousand gallons, and finally, and
22. the thing that is most significant for the little winery in my dis-
23. trict, it allows them to sell at retail on their premises up to five
24. thousand gallons a year instead of the old law saying one thousand
25. gallons a year. It had support of the...of the various industries
26. that were looking at the bill. I believed it came out of committee
27. with no problems. And I would move its adoption.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there any further discussion? Senator Bell moves the adoption
30. of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill...1...Senator Rock, for what purpose
31. do you arise?

32. SENATOR ROCK:

33. Thank you...thank you Mr. President. I wonder, Senator, could we

1. hold this a minute? This is the amendment, is it not, which strikes
2. everything after the enacting clause.
3. PRESIDENT:..
4. Senator Bell.
5. SENATOR BELL:
6. Yeah, but that's right, Senator Rock. What...what happened was
7. we had the first bill that was put in addressed itself in a manner
8. that wasn't getting at the problem in the...in the direction that the
9. various industries affected were wanting to go and we, therefore,
10. had to reconstruct the bill by striking everything else and go back
11. ...it...it...it.puts everything, exactly, back as it was except__
12. for those three functions that I mentioned. I'll be happy to hold
13. it, though, Senator Rock.
14. SENATOR ROCK:
15. I would appreciate it if you'd...
16. SENATOR BELL:
17. Okay.
18. SENATOR ROCK:
19. ...hold it till tomorrow.
20. PRESIDENT:
21. Take it out of the record. Senate Bill 139, Senator Knuppel.
22. Senate Bill 207, Senator Philip. Senator Philip. Senator...Pate
23. Philip from DuPage County. Senate Bill 207. Senate Bill 247, Senator
24. Sommer. Senate Bill 284, Senator Soper. Read the bill.

30. Any amendments from the Floor? Senator Rock.
31. SENATOR ROCK:
32. Thank you, Mr. President. I wonder if we could...Senator, the bill
33. calls for fifty thousand, I think, does it not? Okay. Can we have

1. the Calendar reflect that please.
2. PRESIDENT:
3. It's a printers error. So for the benefit of the members it's
4. fifty thousand and not five thousand. Any amendments from the Floor?
5. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 290, Senator Fawell. Senate Bill 295,
6. Senator Dougherty. Senate Bill 301, Senator Regner. Senate Bill...
7. Senate Bill 302, Senator Buzbee. Read the bill.
8. SECRETARY:
9. Senate Bill 302..
10. (Secretary reads title of bill)
11. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Pensions and Personnel
12. and Veterans Affairs offers one amendment.
13. PRESIDENT:
14. Senator Buzbee.
15. SENATOR BUZBEE:
16. Yes. The amendment, Mr. President, cleans up some...some problems
17. dealing with military scholarships in the current act, and I would ask
18. the...I would ask the Secretary to...I'd move to...to accept the
19. amendment.
20. PRESIDENT:
21. Any further discussion? Senator Mitchler.
22. SENATOR MITCHLER:
23. Well, I would like to ask the sponsor to clear up...clears up
24. some of the problems. What are the problems? Explain what the bill
25. ...what the amendment does.
26. PRESIDENT:
27. Senator Buzbee.
28. SENATOR BUZBEE:
29. Yes. Unfortunately, I do not have a copy of the amendment in
30. front of me. That's the one piece of paper I am missing, however,
31. let me briefly explain what it does. As we discussed in Pensions
32. and Personnel Committee the other day at quite some length, as a
33. matter of fact. There are two or three different sections of the

1. statute-dealing-with the military scholarship and in some cases people
2. have to be residents of Illinois prior to their going into the service
3. to receive a military scholarship when they come back which is the
4. intent of the Legislation. In other cases they do not have to be,
5. in other sections of the Statute. So we're bringing all of these into
6. conformity and we're saying that a student who is attending on a
7. military scholarship if he is a half time student he gets a half time
8. scholarship for five years equivalency. Now, under the old statute
9. it was interpreted and, in fact, in...from university to university
10. and community college to community college, it was handled differently
11. because people interpreted the statute differently. But under the
12. new proposed legislation there would not have to be any interpretation
13. from institution to institution but it would be the same throughout
14. the statute which say they are eligible for a five year equivalency.
15. Again, if they're only going half time they only use half their
16. scholarship. Under the old statute if they went half time for four
17. years that's all they got. Under the new statute if they...if they
18. go half time they can get until the whole five year equivalency is
19. used up.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Nimrod.

22. SENATOR NIMROD:

23. Will the Senator yield?

24. SENATOR BUZBEE:

25. Certainly.

26. SENATOR NIMROD:

27. On...on that how does that go along with on the Federal GI Bill?
28. Do they have the same kind of provisions or is this just for those
29. guys from the war in Illinois?

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Buzbee.

32. SENATOR BUZBEE:

33. Yes, Senator Nimrod, the idea of my bill, originally, was to

1. bring the State of Illinois Military Scholarship Law into conformity
2. with the new...new Federal Legislation on...on the GI Bill...The only
3. difference in the proposed Illinois law and the GI Bill is that the
4. GI Bill, the five years I'm sure you're aware that they just recently,
5. within the past year, went from four years to five years. But that
6. five years is only for undergraduates. A graduate student can still
7. get a maximum of four years under the GI Bill. In the Illinois statute
8. we find that it's impossible to...to word it in such a manner to make
9. it equitable that same way so the Illinois Statute will say five year
10. equivalency for both graduates and undergraduates.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Nimrod.

13. SENATOR NIMROD:

14. Yeah, this...this means then...this...this gives us far greater
15. expansion...freedom of use of the scholarship then the Federal Bill
16. does?

17. SENATOR BUZBEE:

18. Well, yes it does but what...but what it also does is that it
19. cleans up a lot of problems that currently exist under the Illinois
20. because, again, as I said in different sections of the statute it's
21. written in different manners so that in some institutions students
22. if they have gone half time or even a quarter time for four years
23. that's all the military scholarship they get even though they've
24. only used up a quarter or a half of the tuition. So this will
25. liberalize it in that those students who are half time only use up
26. half of their scholarship when they're going on a...on a half time
27. for a semester. Plus the fact that it does bring us into the five
28. year conformity with the GI Bill of Rights.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. We will...we will have copies of this amendment when it comes
31. out?

32. SENATOR BUZBEE:

33. Certainly. I...I...I'm...yes.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Any further discussion? Senator Buzbee moves the adoption of
3. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 302. All in favor will say Aye.
4. Opposed Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?
5. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 318, Senator
6. Bruce. Senate Bill 319, Senator Lane. Read the bill.
7. SECRETARY:
8. Senate Bill 319.
9. (Secretary reads title of bill)
10. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

1. Savickas on the Floor? Senator Buzbee, Senator Savickas has indicated
2. ...you're not moving it? Pardon... 342?
3. SENATOR BUZBEE:
4. No.
5. PRESIDENT:
6. You're not moving it. All right. Senate Bill 343, Senator
7. Palmer.
8. SECRETARY:
9. Senate Bill 3...
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Senator Rock. Senator Rock. For what purpose do you arise?
12. SENATOR ROCK:
13. Senator, I think that there...there was discussed in committee
14. an amendment for this bill, also, emanating from Senator Savickas.
15. I wonder if we could just pass this by for the moment.
16. PRESIDENT:
17. Take it out of the record. Senate Bill 346, Senator Vadalabene.
18. Senate Bill 370, Senator Bell. Call the bill.
19. SECRETARY:
20. Senate Bill 370.
21. (Secretary reads title of bill)
22. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on...Insurance and Licensed
23. Activities offers one amendment.
24. PRESIDENT:
25. Senator Bell. Explain the amendment. Want to explain the amend-
26. ment?
27. SENATOR BELL:
28. Yes. Mr. President, this is the Counter Signature Bill, the
29. amendment offered before the committee was found acceptable to the
30. committee. It dealt with the fact that there would be on the declara-
31. tions page of an insurance policy or somewhere else readily visible
32. on the insurance policy, the name stamped, typed or printed of all
33. of the resident agent or the resident broker so that the person buying

1. the insurance policy will have a direct recourse through the agency
2. or agent or broker involved. That constitutes the amendment. I think
3. it's as simple as that.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Any further discussion on the amendment? Senator Bell moves the
6. adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 370. All in favor will
7. say Aye. Opposed Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any further amend-
8. ments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 375,
9. Senator Howard Mohr. Read the bill.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Bill 375.

12. (Secretary reads title of bill)

13. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

16. SENATOR MOHR:

17. Yes, Mr. President, I'm moving this there's probably an amendment
18. going to be offered, I just wanted to let it be known that I would
19. bring it back for purpose of an amendment if somebody so desires.

23. Well, I...I...I was going to ask the Senator to hold it but with
24. that understanding I suppose it's all right.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. With the understanding it will be moved back. Any further amend-
27. ments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 377,
28. Senator Davidson. Read the bill.

30. Senate Bill 377.

2. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

3. Oh...no...there was no amendment.

14. SENATOR BUZBEE:

15. Yes, Mr. President, the effect of this amendment is, under the

16. current statutes State employees who have left State retirement and

17. where they have left State service and have been retired and drawing

18. their retirement pay, upon re-entry into the Illinois State Service

19. they can then pay back all their retirement pay and start accruing

20. additional and greater benefits. The affect of this amendment is

21. that on that pay back they have to pay a five percent interest charge

22. per annum on their pay back. At the current time they don't have to

23. pay any interest charge on the pay back.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Any further discussion? Senator Buzbee moves the adoption of

26. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 386. All in favor will say Aye.

31. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
32. PRESIDENT:
33. Any amendments from the Floor? Senator Rock.

1. SENATOR ROCK:

2. Thank you, Mr. President, there is one amendment to be offered
3. from the Floor.

4. SECRETARY:

5. One Floor Amendment offered by Senator Rock.

6. SENATOR ROCK:

7. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the...Senate. I under-
8. stand that in the Education Committee, Senator Partee the chief
9. sponsor did...did agree to put the...this amendment on on the order
10. of 2nd reading. The amendment was drafted by the...our staff in con-
11. junction with the Illinois Office of Education. It makes several
12. non-substantive technical changes providing taking out, for instance,
13. the Superintendent of Public Instruction and inserting the Office
14. of Education. In addition it provides for a one time reimbursement
15. to a limit of six thousand dollar or half the cost of materials for
16. establishing a program of nuclear energy education at a high school
17. offering an improved program. I would move adoption of Amendment
18. No. 1.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Any further discussion? Senator Rock moves the adoption of
21. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 402. All in favor will say Aye.
22. Opposed Nay. The amendment is adopted. Senate Bill 40...oh, any
23. further amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
24. Senate Bill 403. Read the bill.

25. SECRETARY:

26. Senate Bill 403.

27. (Secretary reads title of bill)

28. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 407,
31. Senator Morris. Senate Bill 418, Senator Demuzio. Senate Bill 425,
32. Senator Fawell. Senate Bill 427, Senator Rock. Read the bill.

33. SECRETARY:

1. Senate Bill 427.
2. (Secretary reads title of bill)
3. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive offers one
4. amendment.
5. PRESIDENT:
6. Senator Rock. Would the Secretary read the amendment.
7. SENATOR ROCK:
8. Yeah. I got it.
9. PRESIDENT:
10. You have it.
11. SENATOR ROCK:
12. Thank you, Mr. President. The Amendment No. 1 was offered in
13. committee by myself, it's an amendment that was given...given to me
14. by the Department of Agriculture at the request of the Comptroller,
15. and it merely clarifies the language with respect to the working
16. cash fund, and provides that the...there shall be...it shall...the
17. fund shall be in existence no longer than two days after it's actually
18. necessary, and I would move adoption of Amendment No. 1.
19. PRESIDENT:
20. Any further discussion on this amendment? Senator Rock moves the
21. adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 427. All in favor will say
22. Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it and the amendment is adopted.
23. Any further amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
24. Oh, Senator Harris, I did not...are you asking...seeking recognition?
25. Senate Bill 428, Senator Rock.
26. SECRETARY:
27. Senate Bill 428.
28. (Secretary reads title of bill)
29. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One Floor amend-
30. ment offered by Senator Harris.
31. PRESIDENT:
32. One moment, Senator Harris. Will those not entitled to the Floor
33. please leave the Floor. Will the Pages take their conversation into

1. the well. Lets have some attention please and some order. We're on
2. Senate Bill 428. Senator Harris offers Amendment No. 1. Senator
3. Harris.

4. SENATOR HARRIS:

5. Mr. President, the affect of this amendment is to limit the
6. authorization for pari-mutuel betting to just DuQuoin State Fair.
7. It would eliminate the authorization of pari-mutuel betting from
8. the State Fair. Now, I personally feel strongly about this. That
9. there and I..I don't want to be misunderstood, I'm an advocate of
10. pari-mutuel betting at regulated tracks operating under licenses
11. issued by the Illinois Racing Board. That's just fine, and DuQuoin
12. State Fair fits the description of the associations that are licensed
13. by the Illinois Racing Board. It's a privately owned act of an
14. entrepreneur. Mr. Whitney, I'm sorry you are interfering. DuQuoin
15. is privately owned, they have their real estate and if they want to
16. file for a license, fine and dandy. That makes sense to me but it
17. does not make sense to me to authorize pari-mutuel betting at the
18. Illinois State Fair. The Illinois State Fair is a marketing and
19. breed producing activity to encourage the development of all of the
20. agriculture endeavors of the business of agriculture and homemaking
21. in Illinois. I'm disturbed that this administration would apply the
22. pari-mutuel business to the Illinois State Fair. This amendment is
23. very simple. It excludes from the present prohibition in the racing
24. act, in the harness racing act, the issuing of licenses to the DuQuoin
25. State Fair and that's all. Senator Rock's bill would exempt from the
26. present exclusion of all county fairs and the State Fair, the Illinois
27. State Fair and DuQuoin. I don't think there is a place for pari-mutuel
28. betting at the Illinois State Fair and thus is the sense of this
29. amendment that's under consideration. I would be happy to respond to
30. any questions, otherwise I would move the adoption of the amendment.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Is there further debate? Senator Mitchler.

33. SENATOR MITCHLER:

1. Mr. President and members of the Senate, if I may make some
2. comments on this amendment... When I first heard that Senate Bill
3. 428 was introduced I reviewed the bill, and I can only say that
4. Senate Bill 428 is a bill that is introduced to wipe egg off the
5. face of the Governor of the State of Illinois and the State Fair
6. Manager. In 1974 the Governor of the State of Illinois and the
7. State Fair Manager issued through press releases announcing dates
8. that they were going to have...

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Senator Rock, state your point.

11. SENATOR ROCK:

12. I wonder how this relates to the proposed amendment which would
13. limit the issuance of a harness racing pari-mutuel license to the
14. DuQuoin State Fair?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Would the Senator please confine himself to the point.

17. SENATOR MITCHLER:

18. If I may proceed I will explain how it relates.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER:

20. You may proceed.

21. SENATOR MITCHLER:

22. The...the actual racing dates to be held at the Illinois State
23. Fair were announced publicly, not only that but they were published
24. in a printed brochure distributed by the State Fair Manager throughout
25. the State and throughout the country. This was done, even after, it
26. was called to the attention of the State Fair Manager and the office
27. of the Governor by members of the State Fair Advisory Board that pari-
28. mutuel betting at the Illinois State Fair was not provided for in the
29. Illinois State statutes. During an inspection tour at the Illinois
30. State Fair by the State Fair Board it was observed that there was equip-
31. ment brought in from out of state, I believe Massachusetts or Maryland,
32. to have pari-mutuel betting at the Illinois State Fair. I don't know
33. what would prompt this move but I also know that in the rehabilitation

1. of the...well, I won't go into that...that...I...this relates only
2. to the Illinois State Fair and that's what I'm addressing it to. I
3. would like this amendment adopted, to exclude the Illinois State Fair
4. held at the State Fairgrounds in Springfield from conducting pari-mutuel
5. betting. Because I think there is more behind to the desire of some
6. people to have pari-mutuel betting installed out here at Springfield
7. at the State Fair then we realize. We found an attempt to bring in
8. motorcycle racing and a lot of other things into the State Fair with
9. all of the problems that they have had out at that State Fair, I think
10. they've got things to clear up before they try to get into pari-mutuel
11. betting and get more egg on their face.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Is there further debate? Senator Rock.

14. SENATOR ROCK:

15. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
16. This is Amendment No. 1, I take it, Mr. Secretary. I rise in opposi-
17. tion to Amendment No. 1. This amendment was, in fact, offered in its
18. same form in the Committee on Executive. It...it was, in fact, de-
19. feated in that committee on a close vote. The purpose of the bill is,
20. as was rightly stated by Senator Harris, to allow pari-mutuel betting
21. at two functions in our State which gained nationwide attention. That
22. is to say to allow pari-mutuel betting at the Illinois State Fair and
23. at the DuQuoin State Fair which, as everybody knows, runs the Hamiltonian.
24. I said in committee and I will say here - that it's the request of
25. the administration and that in the best interest of the people insofar
26. as we feel that the Fair and the DuQuoin State Fair will be better
27. attended and will provide a better program for the people. To limit
28. this merely to the DuQuoin State Fair I think is a mistake and I would
29. urge opposition to Amendment No. 1.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Is there further discussion? Senator Merritt.

32. SENATOR MERRITT:

33. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I certainly arise in

1. support of this amendment. I think it's the right thing to do. It
2. has the proper concept DuQuoin's Fair although known as the State
3. Fair is a private institution like our other tracks. Now, I'll just
4. submit to you should this amendment fail then I think the road is paved
5. to go right ahead with providing the same thing at county fairs and
6. downstate, at least, in the area in which I reside, it would be totally
7. unacceptable to the people in those areas. So, I rise in support of
8. this amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Is there further debate? Senator Knuppel. Senator Rock, state
11. your point.

12. SENATOR ROCK:

13. My point is that the statement made by Senator Merritt, while in
14. good conscience, I'm sure, was in fact inaccurate. The...the bill as
15. introduced limits solely the discretion of the board to issue a pari-
16. mutuel license only to those two fairs, the Illinois State Fair and
17. the DuQuoin State Fair. It does in no way affect the other hundred
18. and one county fairs.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Senator Knuppel.

21. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

22. Before voting I want to point out that I'll not be voting on
23. this proposition because I just happen to own harness horses and
24. I want to call attention to the fact that I have a conflict of
25. interest. I don't think that conflict, however, is any worse than
26. the conflict that exist with those people who say that they're aggrieved
27. because they run a fair and pass out premiums gathered from pari-mutuel
28. betting and they're aggrieved to let pari-mutuel betting go into the
29. State Fair. That's far more inconsistent then my position if I voted
30. on this. I've never seen anybody at the county fairs or the State Fair
31. or anybody else that didn't walk up there with their hand out when it
32. come time to take the prize money that was raised by harness racing and
33. other kinds of racing in this State, and that's just not consistent. If

1. you, personally, are opposed to betting, fine. But don't say...don't
2. put that inconsistency of county fairs and other people off that are
3. glad enough to take that money and give it to their little boys and
4. girls for prize steers and sheep and everything else, and say that
5. they're too good to...to take money like that. There's a terrible in-
6. consistency there but I did want to point out why I wouldn't be betting
7. and I think it is kind of ridiculous to say - take the money on the
8. one hand and say - we're so good on the other.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Senator Davidson.

11. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

12. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I would like to rise in
13. support of this amendment, and for the very fact that Springfield is
14. the home of the State Fair. The vast majority of response I have in
15. relation to the news articles that pari-mutuel betting would be allowed
16. last year and response to the news items of introduction of this
17. bill that they'll allow pari-mutuel betting both in Springfield State
18. Fair and at DuQuoin this year. The overwhelming response of these
19. people who live in this central Illinois area has been in opposition
20. to this, and I urge all of you to vote in favor of this amendment
21. which would remove the State Fair from the pari-mutuel betting. Thank
22. you.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Senator Merritt for what purpose do you arise?

25. SENATOR MERRITT:

26. Just to...clarify a statement of Senator Rock's. Senator Rock,
27. I am well aware that your bill would provide a new concept, that being
28. of the Illinois State Fair to conduct pari-mutuel betting. The same as
29. prohibition currently is in the law on county fairs. I only mentioned
30. if...if your bill in its present form without amendment were to pass
31. then I still say that the road is somewhat paved to go right ahead
32. with county fairs with another bill for that purpose. I merely made
33. the statement that downstate this would be totally unacceptable to the

1. people - just as it was by the heavy mail I had on the State Fair.
2. Thank you.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. Is there further debate? Senator Harris may close the debate.

5. SENATOR HARRIS:

6. Well, I think the issue is perfectly clear. I would hope that
7. a majority of those voting on the question would join me in limiting
8. the effect of this bill just to DuQuoin, and to eliminate from the
9. provisions of the bill the Illinois State Fair. Pari-mutuel betting
10. at the State Fair has no place as far as I'm concerned and I hope the
11. majority of you will join me in that position. I move the adoption
12. of the amendment.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Senator Harris moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate
15. Bill 428. I'm sorry, Amentment No. 1. Those in favor say...roll
16. call? Roll call is requested by, I presume, more than five. All
17. those in favor vote Aye, all those opposed no. The voting is open.
18. Would the members please turn their keys on. (Machine cut-off)...
19. have all voted who wish? Take the...take the record. The Ayes are
20. 23, the No...the Nays are 27. The amendment fails. (Machine cut-
21. off)...further amendments. There is a request of the verification of
22. the roll call. (Machine cut-off)...did you request a verification of
23. the nos? Secretary will read the Nay votes.

24. SECRETARY:

25. Those voting in the negative are: Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll, Chew,
26. Course, Donnewald, Dougherty, Kenneth Hall, Hickey, Johns, Joyce,
27. Kosinski, Mc Carthy, Morris, Netsch, Newhouse, ...Palmer, Rock, Romano,
28. Savickas, Smith, Soper, Lemke, Vadalabene, Welsh, Wooten and Mr.
29. President.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Following verification the vote is, 23...23 Ayes, 27 Nays and
32. the amendment fails. Any further amendments?

33. SECRETARY:

1. Yes. Yes. Amendment No. 2...

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. Amendment No. 2.

4. SECRETARY:

5. ...offered by Senator Mohr. Senator Howard Mohr.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7. Senator Mohr.

8. SENATOR MOHR:

9. Yes, Mr. President, Amendment No. 2 would provide taking care of
10. the downstate counties. Not being a downstater I don't know of the
11. interest in this amendment, however, I thought that if we were going
12. to provide racing at the...pari-mutuel betting at the State Fair and
13. the selective DuQuoin Fair, I thought if the other downstate county
14. fairs wanted to have it they should have that opportunity, also, so
15. it would include any state fair that wanted to opt in.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Senator Rock.

18. SENATOR ROCK:

19. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen
20. of the Senate. I rise in opposition to Amendment No. 2. This, also,
21. was discussed in the Senate Committee on Executive. It was suggested
22. at that point and I think the suggestion was valid that if, in fact,
23. Senator Mohr and others wished to authorize the pari-mutuel betting
24. at the hundred and one county fairs that they ought to put in a bill
25. to that affect. The way these two companion bills now read the State
26. Fair Agency will be responsible for the pari-mutuel betting at the
27. State Fair and DuQuoin will handle its own. There is no provision,
28. of course, for who is going to handle the pari-mutuel betting at these
29. other hundred counties. And I'm surprised at the inconsistency of
30. Senator Mohr and others who would on the one hand vote to opt out the
31. Illinois State Fair and then offer an amendment to opt in everybody
32. else. I urge opposition to this amendment.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

1. Is there further debate? Senator Mohr may close the debate.

2. SENATOR MOHR:

3. Well, Mr. President, I would just say...

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. I'm sorry, Senator Mohr, I understand...Senator Mitchler wishes
6. to address himself to this issue. Senator Mohr...Senator Mitchler.

7. SENATOR MITCHLER:

8. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. On...on this I
9. rise in support of this amendment because if we're going to acknowledge,
10. and I don't know what the special interest of somebody has...has or
11. who they are in the Illinois State Fair and the DuQuoin State Fair but
12. I do know that when they had the rebuilding of the DuQuoin State Fair
13. stands down there several years ago that they even went to the point
14. of wiring the State Fair stands...fairground stands at that time for
15. pari-mutuel betting. You see, this has been a long time coming and
16. if you're on the State Fair Board you would have watched it and seen
17. it grow until, now, we want to turn the State of Illinois into a
18. gambling state. We've got lottery, we've got bingo and now were going
19. to have pari-mutuel betting at the State Fair, DuQuoin State Fair.
20. Lets open it wide open and lets go along with Senator Mohr's amendment
21. here and let all the county fairs have it.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Is there further debate? Senator Howard Mohr may close the debate.

24. SENATOR MOHR:

25. Well, Senator Rock the sponsor of the bill, being from Cook County
26. and I'm from Cook County also, and we're both down here defending the
27. people and just...just out of fairness if...if, again, the feeling is
28. that if one fair should have it it should be available to the others.
29. Pure and simple. I would encourage an Aye vote.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. All those in favor of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 428 indicate
32. by saying Aye. All those opposed. Did I hear a request for a roll
33. call? All right. All those in favor vote Aye, all those opposed vote

1. No. The voting is open. On that question the Ayes are 11, the Nays
2. are 31 and Present 2. The amendment fails. Any further amendments?
3. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 432, Senator Partee. Move it. Senate Bill
4. 432.
5. SECRETARY:
6. Senate Bill 432.
7. (Secretary reads title of bill)
8. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive offers one amend-
9. ment.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
11. Senator Partee.
12. SENATOR PARTEE:
13. The amendment I don't have before me. Would you read it?
14. SECRETARY:
15. Effective...the effective date.
16. SENATOR PARTEE:
17. The effective date. That's correct and I move the adoption
18. of the amendment.
19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
20. Senator Partee has moved for the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to
21. Senate Bill 432. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed. The
22. Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there any further amend-
23. ments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 442, Senator Buzbee. Move it.
24. SECRETARY:
25. Senate Bill 442.
26. (Secretary reads title of bill)
27. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
29. Are there any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
30. Bill 445, Senator Buzbee.
31. SECRETARY:
32. Senate Bill 445.
33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 2nd reading of the bill. ...Committee on Pensions, Personnel and
2. Veterans Affairs offers one amendment.
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
4. Senator Buzbee.
5. SENATOR BUZBEE:
6. Yes, that amendment is from the Floor, Mr. Secretary.
7. SECRETARY:
8. Committee amendment.
9. SENATOR BUZBEE:
10. Is that the same amendment I'm talking about then?
11. SECRETARY:
12. No. No. No.
13. SENATOR BUZBEE:
14. I just brought you down. Take it out of the record for
15. a second until I get...
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
17. Take it from the record. Senate Bill 449, Senator Welsh. Senate
18. Bill 454, Senator Wooten. Senator Wooten. Secretary will read the
19. bill.
20. SECRETARY:
21. Senate Bill 454.
22. (Secretary reads title of bill)
23. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health and Welfare
24. offers one amendment.
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
26. Senator Wooten.
27. SENATOR WOOTEN:
28. The amendment offered by the committee is to correct some...an
29. error in language. One word.
30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
31. Is there further debate? All those in favor...you may close the
32. debate if you wish, Senator Wooten.
33. SENATOR WOOTEN:

1. I just move the adoption of the committee amendment.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER:

3. All those in favor of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 454 say

4. Aye.

5. SENATOR WOOTEN:

6. Aye.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is

9. adopted. Are there further amendments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill

10. 457, Senator Buzbee. Move the bill, read the bill.

11. SECRETARY:

12. Senate Bill...Senate Bill 457.

13. (Secretary reads title of bill)

14. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senator Bell,

17. Senate Bill 470. Read the bill.

18. SECRETARY:

19. Senate Bill 470.

20. (Secretary reads title of bill)

21. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health and Welfare

22. offers one amendment.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Senator Bell.

25. SENATOR BELL:

26. Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. The

27. amendment changes from the original bill where it dictated that

28. emergency rate treatment centers would be in every hospital that

29. serviced a community of fifty thousand or more. The amendment changes

30. that to communities and to areas, whereby, they're able to have

31. certain hospitals designated as emergency rate treatment centers, does

32. no longer specify that every hospital in a community of more than

33. fifty thousand. The amendment is better than the original bill be-

34. cause it allows for the...allows for the treatment centers to be

1. placed in areas where they are badly needed, it allows for treatment
2. centers to be placed into counties or areas where there is less than
3. fifty thousand and yet there should be such a treatment center. It
4. does tie into the...to the present trauma program that's placed Illinois
5. in the forefront of this type of program. It is supported by the
6. Department of Public Health. It was their amendment and I think it's
7. a good...amendment and I recommend that it be approved.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Senator Rock.

10. SENATOR ROCK:

11. Thank you, Mr. President, I'm...I'm, frankly, a little bit lost
12. again. It seems to me, again, we are striking virtually everything
13. after the enacting clause and putting in another bill. Is that
14. correct?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Senator Bell.

17. SENATOR BELL:

18. Now...well, Senator Rock, it's a very short bill. Very few lines
19. involved. Actually the...the amendment...

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. It used...it used to be a short bill...

22. SENATOR BELL:

23. Right. Well...

24. SENATOR ROCK:

25. ...you've swept...you've swept lines 8 through 12 and now you
26. have lines 5 through 24.

27. SENATOR BELL:

28. Right.

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. Numerically it's getting longer everytime you put an amendment
31. on it.

32. SENATOR BELL:

33. Well, the amendment takes a rather simple...

1. SENATOR ROCK:
2. What I...what I.....
3. SENATOR BELL:
4. It takes a rather simple...
5. SENATOR ROCK:
6. ...suggest...could you just hold this another...just give me a
7. chance to look at it again. Thank you.
8. SENATOR BELL:
9. Surely.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
11. Take it from the record. Senate Bill 487, Senator Johns. Oh,
12. I'm sorry. 484 is the correct number. Senate Bill 484, Senator Johns.
13. SECRETARY:
14. Senate Bill 484.
15. (Secretary reads title of bill)
16. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One Floor Amend-
17. ment offered by Senator Johns.
18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
19. Senator Johns.
20. SENATOR JOHNS:
21. Mr. President, before some of my colleagues on both sides of the
22. aisle might get concerned. Even though I do offer this amendment
23. today, Amendment No. 1 and I will have another one on reclamation
24. coming forth, I want to explain this amendment. The amendment has
25. been offered to the leadership on the other side of the aisle. It's
26. very explanatory and that we want to place within this bill, Senate
27. Bill 484, ten thousand dollars for enabling the State of Illinois
28. to participate in the interstate mining compact; and second is to
29. recover or to maintain or to hold on to a hundred and twenty-five
30. thousand dollars in Federal funds. This bill has no hidden problems.
31. I think the leadership on that aisle, on the other side of the aisle
32. is very much aware of it and I would ask for a favorable approval
33. of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 484.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
2. Is there further debate? Senator Latherow.
3. SENATOR LATHEROW:
4. Well, Mr. President, I just wonder if the sponsor of this amend-
5. ment will yield to a question.
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
7. He indicates he will.
8. SENATOR LATHEROW:
9. What is the object of this interstate compact?
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
11. Senator Johns.
12. SENATOR JOHNS:
13. The object, Senator Latherow, is a very, very good one, in that it
14. will let us participate with our sister states and let each of these
15. states move back and forth with ideas on mining problems, reclamation
16. ...probably EPA standards. It'll let us, more or less, attend a
17. group on committee hearings between the states so that we will be
18. able to save countless thousands of dollars by those that have had
19. problems delineating those problems to us and, thereby, probably saving
20. us some pitfalls. I do not anticipate the total use of the ten thou-
21. sand. We set it there, it's an arbitrary figure, I would probably
22. suspect that we'll probably utilize close to seventy-five hundred
23. dollars.
24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
25. Senator Latherow.
26. SENATOR LATHEROW:
27. I...I understood you to mean that we paid ten thousand dollars
28. into this organization as a contribution for the...for the compact.
29. If that's not correct then...
30. SENATOR JOHNS:
31. Well...
32. SENATOR LATHEROW:
33. ...expenses of participation.

1. SENATOR JOHNS:

2. The expenses of participation is based on the tonage of our
3. particular state, I think it...that has a figure or formula or
4. part of that is a formula. But, basically, we want to be able to
5. tend and offer ideas and exchange ideas with other sister states.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7. Senator Buzbee.

8. SENATOR BUZBEE:

9. Yes, Mr. President, I wanted to inquire of the sponsor if the
10. bill had moved on to 3rd today will he bring it back for amendments
11. ...for...bring it back to 2nd tomorrow or some other time....

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Senator Johns.

14. SENATOR JOHNS:

15. Senator Buzbee, I...I think you might have missed my first state-
16. ment. This is just an amendment, this is sort of a putting the bill
17. in order. I don't want to have anyone get confused with these figures
18. and there are other amendments. I do want this to be a particular
19. part of the bill. And, yes, if...I was going to hold it after this
20. amendment if possible. But you can't do it so I will move it to 3rd
21. and I give you my promise I...is...I have an amendment on reclamation.
22. I think Senator Roger Sommer has an amendment he wants to offer. Do
23. you have one you want to offer? I'll bring it back from 3rd to 2nd
24. for the purpose of amending it, as you've requested.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Senator, your word is good. Senator Rock. Senator Rock.

27. SENATOR ROCK:

28. No, I have nothing further. Senator Latherow's question had
29. been answered in committee and really had nothing to do with this
30. amendment as offered. That's the only point I was going to make.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of Amendment
33. 1 to Senate Bill 484, say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have

1. it. 3rd reading - with the understanding that it will be recalled at
2. the request of any member: Senate Bill 490, Senator Buzbee. Move it.

3. SECRETARY:

4. Senate Bill...Senate Bill 490.

5. (Secretary reads title of bill)

6. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Pensions, Personnel and
7. Veterans Affairs offers one amendment.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Senator Buzbee.

10. SENATOR BUZBEE:

11. Mr. Secretary, is that the amendment I just sent down?

12. SECRETARY:

13. Now, wait just a minute, Senator, and let me read this. Just
14. a minute. Yes, it is. Identical.

15. SENATOR BUZBEE:

16. Okay. All right. The amendment what it does is...by putting in
17. ...by deleting in the...in the bill it says at least one-half time
18. and we are deleting that and making it full-time and then going on and
19. inserting in lieu thereof the following: "retirement fund of Chicago
20. the governmental service shall be applicable only to the calculation
21. of the benefits. It shall not be considered in determining whether the
22. person has met the minimum service requirement to qualify for benefits
23. under this article, the maximum service of ten years which is, et
24. cetera." This is to bring this bill into conformity with the wishes and
25. desires of the Pension Laws Commission, and I would move its adoption.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. Any discussion? All those in favor of Amendment No. 1 to Senate
28. Bill 490, say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The
29. amendment is adopted. Senator, I believe that that was the committee
30. amendment and I understand that the Floor Amendment is identical to
31. the committee amendment. Is that correct? Senator Buzbee.

32. SENATOR BUZBEE:

33. Yes. Mr. President. Thank you for - Senator Rock, for pointing

1. out the...the difference. The committee we had...the amendment we
2. had in committee had an underline missing, and so in reality we

16. Right on.

18. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes
19. have it. The amendment is reconsidered. Now, the question is shall
20. we adopt...oh, you moved to table Amendment No. 1. All those in
21. favor of tabling Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 490, say Aye. All
22. those opposed No. The amendment is tabled. Amendment No. 2.
23. Senator Buzbee moves for the adoption of Amendment No. 2. All those
24. in favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 512,
33. Senator Dougherty. Move the bill.

1. SECRETARY: ...

3. (Secretary reads title of bill)
4. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

19. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment does
20. several things. In the operations it reduces the bill as originally
21. put in by eighty eight thousand six hundred dollars. That's for
22. additional people and that eighty eight thousand six hundred dollars
23. is broken down in personal services, retirement, social security,
24. contractional service, travel and commodities. Although it does allow
25. a twenty-five thousand seven hundred dollar increase for standard cost
26. of living adjustments. The second thing that the amendment does, it
27. relates to the grants and aids which it reduces it by three hundred
28. twenty thousand dollars to the current level of grants. I would like
29. to point out that in fiscal year 1975 the appropriation was six hundred
30. and eighty thousand dollars in the grants and aids category. Fiscal
31. year 1976 the request was for one million dollars, representing a forty
32. seven percent increase. Now, this amendment that I propose would re-
33. duce the grants and aid back to the six hundred and eighty thousand

1. dollars as provided for during fiscal year 1975. The third item that
2. the amendment does also refers to grants and aid and it divides the
3. lump sum amount into the general category. Instead of having a lump
4. sum appropriation there is a line category special project for one
5. hundred fifty three thousand dollars, a line item for performing arts
6. for three hundred thirty three thousand dollars, a line item for visual
7. arts, one hundred ninety four thousand dollars which gives a total
8. grant of six hundred eighty thousand dollars. Now, the total reduction
9. for this amendment would amount for operations - eighty eight thousand
10. six hundred dollars; grants - three hundred twenty thousand dollars
11. for a total of four hundred eight thousand six hundred dollars. The
12. reason for submitting these reductions from the original appropriation
13. requested for the Illinois Art Council for fiscal year 1976 is because
14. of many of us have had a close look at how the Art's Council has ex-
15. panded. Not only in the appropriation when they originally started
16. out a few years ago. I believe it was in the year 1965 but also in
17. the expanding of their performance. Originally the Illinois Arts
18. Council was to act as seed money to generate local funding and sponsor-
19. ship by local art groups that were interested in the performing art
20. and to expand the culture throughout the State of Illinois.

22. Just...just a moment. For what purpose does Senator Partee arise?
23. SENATOR PARTEE:

24. Well, Mr. President, obviously this bill is going to take a great
25. deal of time. We are going to be on a 1:30 to 2:30 luncheon schedule,
26. and I've asked Senator Vadalabene if he would mind taking it out of
27. the record and he says he would not.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29. He would not mind taking it out? Take it out of the record.
30. Senator Partee, it is the hour of 1:30 has arrived...

31. SENATOR PARTEE:

32. Yes. There is one bill I had promised the Auditor General we
33. would not lose a legislative day on is Senator Clarke has. I don't

1. think there is any argument on it. If there is we won't bother with
2. it. -If there isn't we can move it.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. That would be House Bill 639? Senator Clarke. Read...House
5. Bills on 2nd reading. Read the bill.

6. SECRETARY:

7. House Bill 639.

8. (Secretary reads title of bill)

9. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers one
10. amendment.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12. Senator Clarke. Senator Clarke moves the adoption of Amendment
13. No. 1 to House Bill 639. All in favor say Aye. All opposed No.
14. The Ayes have it. 3rd reading. Are there other amendments from the
15. Floor? 3rd reading. Senator Buzbee. 44...Senate Bill 445. Read
16. the bill. 2nd reading.

18. Senate Bill 445.

19. (Secretary reads title of bill)

20. 2nd reading of the bill: Committee on Pensions and Personnel offers

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Senator Buzbee.

24. SENATOR BUZBEE:

25. Yes. Amendment No. 1 brings the bill into conformity with the
26. desires of the Pension Laws Commission. I would move its adoption.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Is there further devote...debate? All those in favor say Aye.
29. All those opposed No.

30. SENATOR BUZBEE:

31. Aye.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Senator Buzbee.

1. SECRETARY:

2. One Floor Amendment offered by Senator Buzbee.

3. SENATOR BUZBEE:

4. Amendment No. 2 says that deleting the extra appointment by

10. Is there a leave. Leave is granted. Senator Partee, my under-
11. standing...Senator Partee, my understanding is that we will convene
12. tomorrow at 11:30.

2. This Gentleman's accomplishments are far too many to be mentioned
3. here. Let me just say that we are memorializing by this resolution,
4. a resident of my district, a resident of Oak Park, and so I have
5. asked that Senator Mohr and Senator Welsh and myself and Senator
6. Partee be shown as the chief cosponsors and I would ask leave of the
7. Body to show all members as cosponsors of this resolution. It
8. memorializes the death of Dr. Julian, one of the foremost scientist
9. in the United States, who died recently in Oak Park, Illinois. His
