7. SECRETARY:

8. Senate Bill 404.

9. (Secretary reads title of bill)

10. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Education offers one amend-  
11. ment.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Senator Palmer moves the adoption of the committee amendment. All  
14. those...any discussion? All those in favor say Aye. All opposed. The  
15. amendment is adopted. 3rd reading. Senator Palmer.

16. SENATOR PALMER:

17. Senate Bill 343.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Senate Bill 343. Read the bill.

20. SECRETARY:

21. Senate Bill 343.

22. (Secretary reads title of bill)

23. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers one  
24. amendment.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Senator Palmer moves the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1.  
27. Any discussion. All those in favor say Aye. All opposed. The amend-  
28. ment is adopted. 3rd reading. Senator Donnewald.

29. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

30. Yes, Mr. President if the...if we've disposed of all the 2nd reading  
31. bills, I think this would be as appropriate time as any to a transfer  
32. an innocuous bill, Senate Bill 1250 from Executive to Elections and  
33. Reapportionments, and I would ask leave of the Body to do this. And

1. then I would ask that Senator Kosinski be recognized. There was...it  
2. was inadvertently assigned to the wrong committee.  
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
4. It's in what committee Senator Donnewald?  
5. SENATOR DONNEWALD:  
6. It...it presently lives in Executive.  
7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
8. And it's to go to...  
9. SENATOR DONNEWALD:  
10. I want...I want it to be re-referred to the Committee on Elections.  
11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
12. Yes, Senator Donnewald moves that Senate...Senate Bill 1250 be  
13. discharged from further consideration by the Senate Executive Committee.  
14. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Donnewald moves that Senate  
15. Bill 1250 be referred to the Committee on Elections. Is there leave?  
16. The bill is so re-referred. Senator Kosinski.  
17. SENATOR KOSINSKI:  
18. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I would like to announce  
19. that the bill will be heard on Thursday, May 1st, at 2:30 in Room 212.  
20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
21. You've heard the announcement. Senator McCarthy.  
22. SENATOR MC CARTHY:  
23. Yes, Mr. President I'd like to make a motion to recommit Senate  
24. Bill 327 to the Executive Committee.  
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
26. Yes. Senate Bill 327...  
27. SENATOR MC CARTHY:  
28. Recommitted to the Executive Committee.  
29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)  
30. Where is the bill Senator...  
31. SENATOR MC CARTHY:  
32. What the bill is...  
33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)



1. No, Senator...
2. SENATOR MC CARTHY:
3. ...with the Department of Revenue...
4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
5. No, Senator McCarthy where is the bill presently located?
6. SENATOR MC CARTHY:
7. It's on the Table.
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
9. Senator McCarthy has asked that Senate Bill 327 that's on the
10. Secretary's Table be re-referred to the...
11. SENATOR MC CARTHY:
12. Sent to the Executive Committee.
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
14. Be recommitted to the Executive Committee. Is there leave? Leave
15. is granted. Senator Ozinga.
16. SENATOR OZINGA:
17. Mr. President, basking on the Secretary's Desk are two House
18. Joint Resolutions. Namely, House Joint Resolution No. 16 by Senate...
19. by Representative Yourell. I'd like to be shown as a sponsor on that
20. one and have it assigned to the proper committee, which I believe is
21. the Executive. And also House Joint Resolution No. 42 which is sponsored
22. by Representative Palmer. I'd like to be shown as sponsor on that one
23. and have it assigned to the proper committee.
24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
25. House...Senator Ozinga moves that House Joint Resolution 16 and
26. House Joint Resolution 14...42 be referred to the Executive Committee.
27. Is there leave? So ordered. Senator Vadalabene.
28. SENATOR VADALABENE:
29. Yes, the announcement hasn't been out yet but the Executive Committee
30. on Appointments and Administrations, I understand will meet at 2:30 on
31. Monday till...till 5:00 o'clock. However I'm up here on another point
32. of business, that I would like to have leave to discharge the Committee
33. on Personnel, Pensions and Veterans Affairs for consideration of Senate

1. Bill 492 for the purpose of Tabling.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Senator Vadalabene moves that the Committee on Personnel and Pensions  
4. be discharged for further consideration of Senate Bill 492. Is there  
5. leave? Leave is granted. Senator Vadalabene moves to Table Senate  
6. Bill 492. Is there leave? Leave is granted. The bill is Tabled.  
7. Senator Partee.

8. SENATOR PARTEE:

9. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I'd like your attention  
10. because this is something that you have inquired about that we are  
11. now prepared to tell you. It relates to...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Could we have some attention, please...Senator Partee.

14. SENATOR PARTEE:

15. It relates to the schedule and I wish the Pages would commence to  
16. pass them out, the schedule between now and the 2nd week in May. The  
17. schedule will require our starting Monday the 28th of April at 9:00 a.m.  
18. We will have committee hearings three times that day, the morning com-  
19. mittee hearings will meet 10:30 to 1:30, the afternoon from 2:30 to  
20. 5:00 and then there are some scheduled to meet in the afternoon. We  
21. will be here Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and Friday the  
22. committee hearings will be in the morning and the Session will be at  
23. 7:00 p.m. , but we will not be in Session on Saturday May 3rd as will  
24. the House. So we will finish in the evening on Friday of next week and  
25. then we will not come back either Saturday or Sunday or Monday. We will  
26. come back Tuesday at noon, which is May 6th and we will work Tuesday,  
27. Wednesday and Thursday of that week. We will not be here on the 9th,  
28. which is Friday. The Sessions are being...the...these are being passed  
29. out for your further edification. We recognize that the hours have been  
30. long and the duties have been arduous and we hope to accommodate the  
31. health situation for everybody and we are certainly going to take these

33. days so that we can get home to our families for those extended periods.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Any further announcements? We'll now go to the order of Senate  
19. Bills, 3rd reading. Senate Bill 342, Senator Buzbee. Senator Mitchler.  
20. SENATOR MITCHLER:

21. Mr. President, I believe arrangements were made with President  
22. Partee for the introduction of a distinguished and honored guest.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. Senator Partee if you will come to the rostrum.

25. SENATOR PARTEE:

26. As is a constantly recurring custom of Senator Mitchler. He has  
27. brought today additional pulchritudinous femininity from his district.  
28. Senator Mitchler is recognized for the purpose of an introduction.  
29. Senator Mitchler.

30. SENATOR MITCHLER:

31. Mr. President and members of the Senate. The guest that we are  
32. about to honor in the Senate Chambers today is a product of a very  
33. fine, beautiful talented lady from my district in Aurora, JoAnne Salerno.  
34. Who with her husband, Attorney Tony Salerno, conduct many of the out-

1. standing beauty pageants. It gives an opportunity for young girls to  
2. elevate themselves to places of prominence, not only in the State of  
3. Illinois but throughout the United States and the World. But in as  
4. much as the distinguished quest today is from the legislative district  
5. of our colleague Senator Brad Glass, Mr. President and members of the  
6. Senate, I would yield to Senator Glass.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Glass is recognized.

9. SENATOR GLASS:

10. Thank you Mr. President and thank you Senator Mitchler. Ladies  
11. and Gentlemen of the Senate it is my distinct privilege this morning  
12. to introduce to the membership the very beautiful Constance D. Reif  
13. of Wheeling, Illinois. A sophomore student at William Harper College  
14. and she has won many awards...in her yet brief career, many beauty  
15. contests, and we are honoring her today as the Illinois winner and  
16. and entry of the Illinois Miss Universe Contest. The resolution  
17. which I am to offer I would request that the clerk read and then I  
18. would...

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Could we...could we hold the resolution till after she has had a  
21. chance to present herself and then we'll get back to the resolution.

22. SENATOR GLASS:

23. Yes, thank you Mr. President, and...and I do accede to that. I  
24. will stop talking and introduce Miss Reif.

25. MISS REIF:

26. Thank you. I would like to thank you Mr. President, members of  
27. the Senate, Senator Glass and Senator Mitchler, for allowing me the  
28. pleasure of speaking before you today. This is truly an experience  
29. that is thrilling to me personally in the highlight of my reign, I'm  
30. sure. I will be leaving two weeks from today for the Miss USA Pageant  
31. in Niagara Falls, New York and I hope that all of you will be watching  
32. your television sets and hoping with me that I will bring back to  
33. Illinois a third consecutive Miss USA crown. I certainly am proud to  
34. represent this fine State of Illinois. I am so proud to be represented

1. ...representing this State and my home town of Wheeling. The Miss  
2. Illinois Universe Pageant was held in St. Charles in the district of  
3. Senator...I'm sorry...Senator Grassberg and I would also like to  
4. take this opportunity to thank JoAnne and Tony Salerno for all the  
5. help, understanding and patience they've had with me while training  
6. for this pageant. Thank you.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. If I could take the liberty to speak on behalf of the Senate, I  
9. would say to Miss Reif that if the members of the Illinois Senate could  
10. record the votes for the selection of the queen, she's in already.  
11. Senator Graham.

12. SENATOR GRAHAM:

13. Mr. President and our honored queen and members of the Senate, it's  
14. only by a strange coincidence that I got reapportioned out of Wheeling.  
15. I had the privilege of being their Senator one time. But I do have the  
16. privilege of having within the...the...second senatorial district, William  
17. Rainey Harper College and we're proud of you dear.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. ...Howard Mohr.

20. SENATOR MOHR:

21. Yes, Mr. President, you know Senator Mitchler puts all kinds of  
22. propoganda on our desk, Mr. President, from time to time we're getting  
23. Fourth of July speeches and no smoking warning...brochures and all kinds  
24. of this stuff, now the point has been raised a couple times that we don't  
25. all need this advise and I think he'd be doing all of us a service if  
26. he would put something on our desk like a photograph that's been taken  
27. of this young lady.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. The point is well taken, Senator. Senator Nudelman. You want to  
30. proceed with the resolution now? Fine. As...as the Chair leaves to go  
31. to the order of resolutions, out of order. Leave is granted. Would you  
32. like to explain it.

33. SENATOR GLASS:

1. Yes, I would like to ask for waiver of the rules Mr. President,  
2. for the immediate consideration and adoption of this resolution honoring  
3. Connie Reif and wishing her well in the Miss USA crown and the Miss  
4. Universe Contest. I...I do so move at this time.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Glass moves for the immediate...for the suspension of the  
7. rules for the immediate consideration of Senate Resolution No. 59. All  
8. in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The rules are suspended. Senator Glass  
9. now moves for the immediate adoption of Senate Rule 59. All in favor  
10. will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopted. Senator...

11. SENATOR NUDELMAN:

12. Mr. President, I would ask leave of this Body to Table the following  
13. Senate Bills I have...I'm going to list now. I have given you the proper  
14. notice, I believe. Senate Bills 1190 and 1191, Senate Bills 1193 through  
15. 1246 inclusive, Senate Bills 1261 through 1281 inclusive and Senate Bill  
16. 1482. And I'll give a clerk a copy of this list so they'll be no  
17. mistake as to the numbers.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Nudelman moves to Table the following bills; Senate Bills  
20. 1190 and 1191, 1193 through 1246 inclusive, 1261 through 1281 inclusive  
21. and Senate Bill 1482. They are in what Committee? They're all in Rules.  
22. The motion is to discharge Rules Committee of the bills just alluded to.  
23. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The bills  
24. are discharged. Senator Nudelman now moves to Table those bills. All  
25. in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. Those bills are Tabled. The  
26. Secretary has the list. Senate Bills on 3rd reading. Senate Bill 386,  
27. Senator Buzbee.

28. SECRETARY:

29. Senate Bill 386.

30. (Secretary reads title of bill)

31. 3rd reading of the bill.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Buzbee.

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. Thank you Mr. President. Senate Bill 386 extends from two years  
3. to five the time in which an annuitant who reenters State service within  
4. one year of retiring may refund his retirement allowance received in  
5. order to have his retirement annuity figured as though he or she had  
6. never left State service. Now that's a...kind of a complicated way of  
7. saying that in some cases there are State employees who retire and then  
8. for some reason or another a few years later they reenter State service,  
9. they've been drawing their pension and they decide at that point that  
10. they want to pay back their pension that they have drawn and start build-  
11. ing additional retirement credit. Now the present law says that if they  
12. have reentered State service within one year after retiring they can do  
13. that, but they only have two years after they reenter the State service  
14. to decide to do it. This would extend that time period to five years.  
15. Now there's one other thing that we have done. There's an amendment  
16. on this bill which I think makes the present statute much, much,  
17. better. Under the present law any State employee who reenters State  
18. service does not - and wants to pay back their retirement fund - they  
19. do not have to pay any interest on the payback. We have amended my  
20. bill in committee which I believe is a...Mr. Secretary do you have a  
21. Committee Amendment, no, I'm sorry...it's...we did it the other day  
22. ...I...it's been a long day.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. It's been a long week Senator.

25. SENATOR BUZBEE:

26. Yes.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. We all understand.

29. SENATOR BUZBEE:

30. We have now said that that employee who does reenter has to pay the  
31. payback plus five percent interest. And I would ask for a favorable roll  
32. call. This bill did have I think unanimous endorsement of the...of the  
33. committee the other day.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 386 pass.  
3. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.  
4. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the Ayes  
5. are 42, the Nays are none, one Voting Present. Senate Bill 386 having  
6. received a constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 388,  
7. Senator Fawell. Read the bill.

8. SECRETARY:

9. Senate Bill 388.

10. (Secretary reads title of bill)

11. 3rd reading of the bill.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Fawell.

14. SENATOR FAWELL:

15. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Just as the Calendar  
16. indicates this provides for a porportionate reimbursement for home or  
17. hospital instruction of physically handicapped children where you have  
18. the physican certifying that the child should not have five hours per  
19. week in determining the reimbursement to local school districts. If  
20. it's less than five as certified by a physican there will a porportionate  
21. reduction then, I know of no opposition. I believe it had a unanimous  
22. approval by the Education Committee.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 388 pass.  
25. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.  
26. Have all voted who wished? Take the record. On this question, the  
27. Ayes are 52, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 388 having received a  
28. constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 390, Senator  
29. Rock.

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Bill 390.

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 3rd reading of the bill.



1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Rock.

3. SENATOR ROCK:

4. Thank you...thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of  
5. the Senate. Senate Bill 390 is an amendment to the Private Employment  
6. Agency's Act. This is the Act that you all know is administered by  
7. the Department of Labor. And what this bill does, it tightens up the  
8. existing exemptions under the Act. There are certain employment agencies  
9. who are in fact exempt from the Act as it currently operates and what  
10. we have attempted to do here and I think successfully is tighten up the  
11. language as...as respects exemptions. In such a way that all the firms  
12. which charge a fee to the job seeker or potential employer are now  
13. covered by the law. The bill came out of committee twelve to nothing  
14. it's sponsored by Senator Savickas and Howard Mohr and myself and I  
15. would like Senators Mohr and Savickas to know that the Illinois State  
16. Chamber of Commerce is in favor of this bill and I think it's the first  
17. time that the three of us have been standing shoulder to shoulder with  
18. the Illinois State Chamber. I would ask a favorable roll call.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Wonders never cease. Any further discussion? The question is  
21. shall Senate Bill 390 pass. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will  
22. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the  
23. record. On this question the Ayes are 55, the Nays are none. Senate  
24. Bill 390 having received a constitutional majority is declared passed.  
25. Senate Bill 391, Senator Harber Hall.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Bill 391.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 3rd reading of the bill.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Harber Hall.

32. SENATOR HALL:

33. Mr. President and fellow Senators. Senate Bill 391 is an identical  
34. bill with a bill that was passed last year in the Senate and in the

1. House which was vetoed by the Governor for the reason of the cost  
2. to the State. This bill provides for the Counties to retain twenty-  
3. five percent of the proceeds of the inheritance tax. At present the  
4. Counties receive nothing. I have for several years advanced the idea  
5. that of all the taxes we impose on the citizens, the inheritance tax,  
6. while I agree with it and think we should have an inheritance tax and  
7. also a Federal Estate Tax, I believe that in the case of the inheritance  
8. tax imposed by the State, the citizens would appreciate the concept of  
9. retaining some of the proceeds of that tax in the County in which the  
10. estate was accumulated for the benefit of the County instead of...  
11. sending all of it to the State to be placed in the General Revenue.  
12. This bill is a simple bill. The concept I believe is sound. I think  
13. the apportionment, although I had originally introduced it at fifty  
14. percent to be retained by the Counties, I have since reduced that to  
15. twenty-five percent, and I believe that's very reasonable. It will  
16. impose a loss in our State General Revenue Fund of only eighteen  
17. million dollars. This compared with a proposed budget of upwards of  
18. ten point eight billion dollars, should be affordable at this time.  
19. I know there was objection, even from the Floor of the Senate last  
20. year, because of the drain on the State Treasury. However, I believe  
21. now that we've shown that there is certainly more money available.  
22. That this minor cost of eighteen million dollars estimated, is reasonable  
23. and can be well afforded. I also would point out, although this is  
24. not the principle reason for the introduction of this bill and never  
25. has been, that the Counties do need money very badly. They...we have  
26. preempted their right to charge fees for their services and thereby  
27. deprive them of a great source of previous revenue that they operated  
28. County Government with. So I think all things considered this is a  
29. good bill and I would solicit your support for it.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 39 pass.  
32. All in favor will say Aye, vote Aye. Pardon me...391. Senate Bill 391.  
33. The question is shall Senate Bill 391 pass. All in favor will vote Aye.

Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?

1. Take the record. On this question the Ayes are 49, the Nays are 3.  
2. Senate Bill 391 having received a constitutional majority is declared  
3. passed. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise.

4. SENATOR ROCK:

5. Could I have a verification of the negative votes?

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Didn't hear you. The Chair recognizes Senator Harris.

8. SENATOR HARRIS:

9. Mr. President...President, it's with a great deal of pleasure and  
10. enthusiasm that I call attention to the members of the Senate that  
11. sitting in his old seat is former Senator and as we all appreciate, once  
12. a Senator, always a Senator, Fred Hart, my neighbor from Streator, Fred  
13. stand up.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Hart, would you like to take the mike there and give us  
16. a few words of wisdom, we need it.

17. EX-SENATOR HART:

18. (Speech given by Ex-Senator Hart)

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Vadalabene.

21. SENATOR VADALABENE:

22. Yes, thank you Mr. President and members of the Senate. I was  
23. off the Floor when Senate Bill 391 was called and I wanted to be  
24. recorded as voting Aye. Would you please have that show in the  
25. record.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. The record will show your affirmative intention. Senator Buzbee.

28. SENATOR BUZBEE:

29. Mr. President, I have a similar request, I was off the Floor and  
30. I would request that the record would show that my intent was to vote  
31. Yes on this bill.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. The record will show on Senate Bill 391, Senator Buzbee's intent  
to vote Aye. Senator Hynes.

1. SENATOR HYNES:

2. Mr. President, I was on the Floor and I did not vote, I wish the  
3. record would show that I was on the Floor and didn't vote.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. It will so reflect it. Senate Bill 398, Senator Palmer. Senate  
6. Bill 401, Senator Chew.

7. SECRETARY:

8. Senate Bill 401.

9. (Secretary reads title of bill)

10. 3rd reading of the bill.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Chew.

13. SENATOR CHEW:

14. Yeah, Mr. President, this is the Department of Transportation's  
15. bill and at the present time we only require all contracts to be  
16. bidden out if they're Federally aided and this bill clarifies that  
17. were all contracts to be bidden out and I would ask for a favorable  
18. roll call.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 401  
21. pass. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting  
22. is open. Have all voted who wished? Take the record. On this question  
23. the Ayes are 53, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 401 having received  
24. a constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 402, Senator  
25. Rock.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Bill 402.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 3rd reading of the bill.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Rock.

32. SENATOR ROCK:

33. Thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.  
34. Senate Bill 402 sponsored by the President of the Senate is an amend-

1. ment to the school code and it provides as amended for reimbursement  
2. to local school districts participating in programs for nuclear energy  
3. education. The bill is supported by the office of Illinois Education.  
4. It did receive a thorough committee hearing. There was an amendment  
5. put on on the Floor which solved some of the problems. It also included  
6. solar energy. It provides for a one time reimbursement for the estab-  
7. lishment of these kinds of educational programs at high school offering  
8. programs that are in fact approved. The bill is a good one and I would  
9. ask your favorable support.

11. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 402 pass.  
12. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.  
13. Have all voted who wished? Take the record. On this question, the  
14. Ayes are 53, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 402 having received a  
15. constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 403, Senator  
16. Rock:

17. SECRETARY:

18. Senate Bill 403.

19. (Secretary reads title of bill)

20. 3rd reading of the bill.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Rock.

23. SENATOR ROCK:

24. Thank you Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.  
25. Senate Bill 403 is the companion to 402 which just passed. It calls  
26. for an appropriation of four hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars  
27. to the Illinois Office of Education for the purposes stated in Senate  
28. Bill 402 and I would ask your favorable support.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 403 pass.  
31. All in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.  
32. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the Ayes  
33. are 48, the Nays are none. This bill having received a constitutional  
34. majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 407, Senator Morris.

1. SECRETARY:

2. Senate Bill 407.

3. (Secretary reads title of bill)

4. 3rd reading of the bill.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Morris.

7. SENATOR MORRIS:

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is a bill to protect  
9. the consumer in his home on sales that are made in the home or people  
10. who come selling carpeting or whatever it may be. It gives the consumer  
11. a three day cooling off period in which to cancel the contract. Two  
12. days ago we amended this bill so as to protect the Avon Ladies and people  
13. like this who sell door to door so that their one hundred percent un-  
14. conditional money back guarantee will be as acceptable as our form of  
15. notice of cancellation. I would welcome questions and I would appreciate  
16. a favorable roll call.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Latherow.

19. SENATOR LATHEROW:

20. I wonder if the Senator would yield to a question. Does this affect  
21. the sale of feeds and so forth?

22. SENATOR MORRIS:

23. The sale of what?

24. SENATOR LATHEROW:

25. Feed.

26. SENATOR MORRIS:

27. Agriculture feed.

28. SENATOR LATHEROW:

29. Yes.

30. SENATOR MORRIS:

31. I would assume that it would if it was over twenty-five dollars.

32. SENATOR LATHEROW:

33. I don't think you can buy one seed for that any more.

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1. SENATOR MORRIS:

2. Right. Okay. They've done the exemptions that we provided in  
3. the amendment, it would...would cover that, it would cover feed.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Latherow.

6. SENATOR LATHEROW:

7. I just wonder if he'd hold it. I don't seem to be able to find  
8. the bill in my book. I looked for it, and I don't find it or the  
9. amendment either and I'd like to take a look at it before...

10. PRESIDENT:

11. He indicates he will. Take it out of the record. Senate Bill 416,  
12. Senator Wooten.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Senate Bill 416.

15. (Secretary reads title of bill)

16. 3rd reading of the bill.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Wooten.

19. SENATOR WOOTEN:

20. Yes, Mr. President and colleagues. The summary of the bill tells  
21. everything there is to tell about it. It was a Democratic Platform  
22. Bill but it received unanimous support in committee. And I think one  
23. of the things that helped elicit that unanimous support was the support  
24. of the Pharmacist Association. I think they realized the the potential  
25. damage to their own profession if fee-splitting is permitted and so  
26. they backed the bill. I don't believe there's any real opposition to  
27. it. I'd be happy to answer questions and request a favorable roll call.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29. Is there further debate? The question is shall Senate Bill...Senator  
30. Berning...excuse me.

31. SENATOR BERNING:

32. Just...just one question. Are there any penalties involved as  
33. the result of noncompliance and how do you impose this.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Senator Wooten.

3. SENATOR WOOTEN:

4. Yes. The penalty is in Section seven point six. Refusal...refuse  
5. to issue or renew or revoke or suspend a license. The matter of a  
6. license is involved.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. Is there further debate? The question...the question is shall  
9. Senate Bill 416 pass. Those in...those in favor vote Aye. Those  
10. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?  
11. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 48, the Nays are 1,  
12. one Present. The Senate Bill 416 having received the constitutional  
13. majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 421, Senator Vadalabene.  
14. Read the bill.

15. SECRETARY:

16. Senate Bill 421.

17. (Secretary reads title of bill)

18. 3rd reading of the bill.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Senator Vadalabene.

21. SENATOR VADALABENE:

22. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate Bill  
23. 421 amends Section 21 of the State Comptroller's Act to authorize  
24. the establishment of imprest funds for the operation of overseas  
25. offices established and operated by the Department of Agriculture  
26. and Business Economic Development. Briefly the imprest authority  
27. will empower the State Treasurer to transfer State monies as in an  
28. advance to be expended by the Department for the purposes specified  
29. in an appropriation and as agreed to by the agencies, the Comptroller  
30. and the Treasurer. And I would appreciate a favorable vote.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Is there further debate? Senator Merritt.

33. SENATOR MERRITT:



1. Yes, I wonder Mr. President and members of the Senate if sponsor  
2. would yield to a question.

3. SENATOR VADALABENE:

4. I'll try Senator Merritt if I can answer the question, I'll try.

5. SENATOR MERRITT:

6. Well...

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Senator Merritt.

9. SENATOR MERRITT:

10. ...as you know the commission of which I'm Chairman, Commission for  
11. Economic Development is advisory to the department and at no time  
12. had I ever heard in any of our discussions or with the Director...  
13. what...what really brings about the necessity of this legislation.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Senator Vadalabene.

16. SENATOR VADALABENE:

17. Well, the departments have found in the past and currently find  
18. it very difficult to secure the necessary services and supplies from  
19. foreign vendors because of the present six weeks to three months for  
20. them to get paid for their services. And with this imprest fund they  
21. can draw the money out of the Treasurer's office and pay these vendors  
22. immediately. And with the current escalation of things and the...and  
23. the foreign exchange money, this is very important to the State of  
24. Illinois.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Senator Merritt.

27. SENATOR MERRITT:

28. It's...it's okay.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill 421 pass.  
31. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.  
32. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes  
33. are 47, the Nays are none, none Voting Present. Senate Bill 421 having

1. received a constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 427,  
2. Senator Rock. Senate Bill 428, Senator Rock. Senate Bill 432, Senator  
3. Partee. Senator Merritt.

4. SENATOR MERRITT:

5. Trying to explain Mr. President some of my colleagues concerning  
6. that imprest fund when the voting was going on. Senator Weaver and  
7. I are both members of that commission. We'd like to be at least shown  
8. on the record as having been voting for it had we had the opportunity.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senator Merritt and Senator Weaver will be shown on the Journal as  
11. desiring to wish to vote for...on the recorder that you wish to be  
12. recorded to vote in favor of 421. Senator Graham.

13. SENATOR GRAHAM:

14. I was caught in the middle of that conversation, I'd like to be  
15. recorded Aye too.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17. The record will show. The transcript will show so. Senator Partee.

18. SENATOR PARTEE:

19. I want those gentlemen to know that I'm impressed with their position  
20. on the Imprest Bill. Read the bill please.

21. SECRETARY:

22. Senate Bill 432.

23. (Secretary reads title of bill)

24. 3rd reading of the bill.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Senator Partee.

27. SENATOR PARTEE:

28. The necessity for this bill is to correct an error which we...made  
29. last year. The salaries came out wrong and this only gives the Chairman  
30. a twenty-five hundred dollar amount in...additional to the other members.  
31. The bill came out of committee fourteen to nothing, there is no problem  
32. with it, I'd appreciate a favorable roll call.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1. Is there any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill  
2. 432 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting  
3. is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question  
4. the Ayes are 48, the Nays are 1, 2 Voting Present. Senate Bill 432  
5. having received a constitutional majority is declared passed. Senator  
6. Bloom on Senate Bill 434.

7. SECRETARY:

8. Senate Bill 434.

9. (Secretary reads title of bill)

10. 3rd reading of the bill.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Senator Bloom.

13. SENATOR BLOOM:

14. Thank you Mr. President. This bill does create an Electronic  
15. Funds Transfer Study Commission and there are those that feel in  
16. banking circles that perhaps this will make our present controversy  
17. over branching out of date. In essence it creates a commission of  
18. four, four and four public members, to look into and conduct a thorough  
19. study of electronic funds transfer which take a variety of forms,  
20. bank to bank, bank to corporate customer, bank to individual, individual  
21. through the retailer. And to report back to the General Assembly to  
22. see what guide lines if any the State should impose. I...ask for a  
23. favorable roll call and I'll accept questions.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Latherow.

26. SENATOR LATHEROW:

27. Would the sponsor yield to a question?

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29. He indicates that he'll yield.

30. SENATOR LATHEROW:

31. Would you in this investigation with this commission be going  
32. about from financial institution to financial institution to discover  
33. whether or not their...what is it electronical transactions are proper,

1. is that what you're trying to do. Trying to find out what they pay  
2. for those particular services or what will they be looking for?

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Bloom.

5. SENATOR BLOOM:

6. No, it will not be doing that. It...it will be looking into a  
7. whether you should protect your smaller banks, proprietary atmosphere,  
8. to examine the various kinds of electronic funds transfer, this is in  
9. its infancy right now. There are one, two, three, four, five, six.  
10. There are about seven existing systems being tested. It would hear  
11. testimony from interested members of the financial community and the  
12. retailing community. We wouldn't be interfering with the operation...  
13. day to day operation of a bank.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Senator Latherow.

16. SENATOR LATHEROW:

17. How large an appropriation are you going to need for this study  
18. commission?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. Senator Bloom.

21. SENATOR BLOOM:

22. Twenty thousand.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. Senator Latherow.

25. SENATOR LATHEROW:

26. I...I might just think that wouldn't even get you out of Springfield  
27. in this job the way it sounds to me. I...

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Senator Schaffer

30. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

31. Would sponsor yield for a question?

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. He indicates he'll yield.

1. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

2. Who wants this bill?

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Bloom.

5. SENATOR BLOOM:

6. All the leading bankers in your district. No, I do.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Senator Schaffer.

9. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

10. Why?

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Senator Bloom.

13. SENATOR BLOOM:

14. Well, when I was taken off Insurance and put on Finance and Credit  
15. Regulations, you know you hear that thing about every day a quarter  
16. million kids are dying of a disease you've never heard of and I started  
17. reading about something called EFTS and I thought it was one of those  
18. diseases. And so I felt that, you know, we should be getting into this  
19. area, so I read the literature in the banking journals.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Senator Schaffer.

22. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

23. This bill has something to do with a child's disease?

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Bloom.

26. SENATOR BLOOM:

27. Well, no...no...I said...I didn't say it had anything to do with  
28. a child's disease. I said when I first saw that acronym I thought it  
29. you know, was one of those diseases I never heard of, now on research  
30. I find that it's a very viable, it may replace your paper base trans-  
31. actions. Five, ten years down the road there are those that may think  
32. it is a child's disease.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1. Senator Schaffer.

2. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

3. Well, I'm for children but I'm not sure about this bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Savickas.

6. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

7. Mr. President, Senator Bloom, would this...I don't know if I  
8. heard correctly when Senator Latherow was questioning you, would  
9. this lead to the creation of this Electronic Branch Banking too?

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. Senator Bloom.

12. SENATOR BLOOM:

13. Well I might suggest Senator Savickas that if we don't have a  
14. commission, you may get branch banking without it. We're to look in  
15. and try and regulate and with the idea to protecting the a consumer  
16. and the smaller banks.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Senator Savickas.

19. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

20. Well, that really didn't answer my question. Is this for the  
21. purpose of...or is this involved with Electronic Branch Banking?

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. Senator Bloom.

24. SENATOR BLOOM:

25. It will look into...it's...it's not involved with electronic branch  
26. banking, although I understand that Chicago Continental plans to install  
27. their own terminals with or without this commission. This will not  
28. affect what they do, but it's to look into and perhaps in the future  
29. regulate what's being done to protect the smaller people. Does that  
30. answer your question Sir?

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. Senator Savickas.

33. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

1. That answers my question.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Senator Ozinga.

4. SENATOR OZINGA:

5. Well, I didn't have any questions, I was just intrigued a little  
6. bit with the answer that Senator Bloom was giving here and I... it had  
7. just been suggested that he hold the bill for a day that there's a  
8. possibility of a couple of amendments that are coming out, however I  
9. was more trying to aid and abet the Senator in his attempt to pass  
10. this commission bill. I think it's a good attempt to look into this  
11. electronic fund transfer. This is a new matter that has come up in  
12. the banking field and as most of you fellows that have been here for  
13. more than two or three sessions know that constantly we have this  
14. Branch Banking Bill come up and this is one way of studying the issue  
15. both pro and con and this is one of the answers that may be an answer  
16. to both sides of that picture. It is I believe a good thing, but as  
17. the Senator said, I think the twenty thousand dollars that he asked  
18. for to touch the...just merely scrapes the surface, when we get into  
19. looking at it that most of this is being done on the West Coast right  
20. now. So I think Senator, it might be a good idea to hold it for a day  
21. or two just to see what we can do with it by way of an amendment that's  
22. been asked for by some of the fellows on this side of the aisle.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. I have Senator McCarthy, Senator Hall, Senator Chew and Senator  
25. Sommer. Senator McCarthy.

26. SENATOR MC CARTHY:

27. Well, thank you Mr. President and members of the Senate. I don't  
28. know whether or not the suggestion to hold the bill has been deliberated  
29. by the sponsor but the bill is still in front of us and I rise in  
30. support of it. I rise in support of this commission because there is  
31. nothing more occult, nothing more mysterious to the members of the  
32. legislature than new developments and this EFTS. It is true, I think,  
33. that Continental does have a contract with Dominick's Stores in Chicago

1. to implement this system in the Chicago area this fall and if there's  
2. anything that the legislature needs, it's knowledge, and I certainly  
3. don't draw any...point any criticism against the modest appropriation  
4. of twenty thousand dollars. I think that's to be commended rather  
5. than...rather than be ridiculed. The terminals that we understand  
6. that are going to be set up will provide for a system where it will  
7. connect with the person's bank account. It's important I think, that  
8. the legislature who...which is the originator of the legislation affect-  
9. ing this industry know about this so I certainly would encourage the  
10. people to support this most meritorious commission.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Senator Kenneth Hall. Senator Hall.

13. SENATOR HALL:

14. Thank you Mr. President and members of the Senate. I rise in  
15. support of this bill and I see no need why we should hold this bill  
16. at this time. I would urge...move that we vote on this bill today.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Senator Sommer.

19. SENATOR SOMMER:

20. Mr. President, would the sponsor yield for a question?

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. He indicates he'll yield.

23. SENATOR SOMMER:

24. Senator Bloom, does this bill have merit?

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Senator Bloom.

27. SENATOR BLOOM:

28. We shall soon find out.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Senator Chew.

31. SENATOR CHEW:

32. Yeah, Mr. President, I'm not confused on...on 4...434 but I...I do  
33. have an amendment that I'd like to attach onto the bill if the sponsor



1. will accept the amendment. I can explain the amendment Mr. Sponsor  
2. if you want...it knocks out the - be it - enacted by the people of  
3. the State of Illinois.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Bloom do you accept the amendment?

6. SENATOR BLOOM:

7. I'd have to...I'd have to study it a little bit.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. All right. Is there any further debate? The question is shall  
10. Senate Bill 434 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed...  
11. Senator Merritt.

12. SENATOR MERRITT:

13. Just briefly, because they've been talking about all the dead  
14. bills with my name on it here, I just might suggest to the membership  
15. it might have more merit if we studied it a little bit longer maybe.  
16. ...support such a concept.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Is there any further discussion? The question is shall Senate Bill  
19. 434 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting  
20. is open. Apparently the bill does not have Merritt. ...(Machine cut-off)  
21. ...voted who wished? Have all voted who wished? Take the record. On  
22. that question the Ayes are 55, the Nays are none. Four Voting Present.  
23. Senate Bill 434 having received the constitutional majority is declared  
24. passed. The hour of 1:30 having arrived, the...Senator Mitchler for  
25. a resolution...a brief resolution. Senator Chew.

26. SENATOR CHEW:

27. The Committee on Transportation...

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Senator Chew, if you'll wait one moment, we have one resolution  
30. then I'll get to your announcement.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. Senator Mitchler.

33. SENATOR MITCHLER:

1. . Very, very brief, Mr. President and members of the Senate. On  
2. the Senate...on the Desk of the Secretary is a Senate Resolution  
3. congratulating Steve Furgell of Aurora, Illinois who has been serving  
4. as a page the last two days. He is the student DE Student of the Year.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. Senator Newhouse moves for the...suspension of the rules and the  
33. immediate consideration of the resolution. All th e in favor say Aye.

1. All opposed. The resolution is adopted.
2. SECRETARY:
