17 PRESIDENT:

18 Senator Johns.

19 SENATOR JOHNS:

20 Mr. President, I move that the Journals just read by the
21 Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or
22 corrections to offer.

23 PRESIDENT:

24 You heard the motion. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed
25 Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. Committee reports.

26 SECRETARY:

27 Senator Donnewald, Chairman of the Assignment of Bills, assigns
28 the following bills to Appropriations Committee: Senate Bill No.
29 1867, 1868, 1869, 1888 and 1889.

30 PRESIDENT:

31 Resolutions.

32 SECRETARY:

33 Senate Resolution 298, introduced by Senator Kosinski and all

1 Senators. It's congratulatory. Kosinski.

2 PRESIDENT:

3 Senator Kosinski is recognized. Senator Bruce...Senator
4 Kosinski is recognized.

5 SENATOR KOSINSKI:

6 Mr. President and members of the Senate, this is a congratula-
7 tory message to...for our Post 72 of the Polish Legion of American
8 Veterans who have done an outstanding job in their community, for
9 both the orphanages and many, many other programs that they have
10 instituted and done very good for the community. And I move, Mr.
11 President that we suspend the rules in the adoption of the
12 resolution.

13 PRESIDENT:

14 Senator Kosinski moves for the suspension of the rules for
15 the immediate consideration of this resolution. All in favor will
16 say Aye. Opposed Nay. The rules are suspended. Senator Kosinski

22 PRESIDENT:

23 Rules Committee. Are there messages from the House? Senate
24 Bills on 2nd reading. Senate Bill 1543, Senator Rock. Read the
25 bill.

26 SECRETARY:

27 Senate Bill 1543.

28 (Secretary reads title of bill)

29 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive offers one
30 amendment.

31 PRESIDENT:

32 Senator Rock.

33 SENATOR ROCK:

1 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
2 Senate. Senate Bill 1543 is one of a series of five bills proposed
3 by the State Treasurer in accordance with recommendations made
4 by the Auditor to hopefully improve the administration of that
5 office with respect to the handling of certain funds. This bill
6 concerns itself with the Public Assistant Emergency Revolving
7 Fund. Amendment No. 1 is offered by the committee would remove
8 from under the ambient of that fund emergency administrative
9 expenses as determined by the Illinois Department. It came to
10 the attention of the committee...the Executive Committee that
11 there were certain expenditures that were made out of this fund
12 which the committee felt should rightfully have come out of some
13 other funds, so we are just removing that authority. I would
14 ask for the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1.

15 PRESIDENT:

16 Any further discussion? Senator Rock moves the adoption
17 of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1543. All in favor will say
18 Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.
19 Any further amendments? 3rd reading. House Bill 1540...Senate
20 Bill...Senate Bill 1545...oh, 1544, you're going with, Senate
21 Bill 1544, Senator Rock.

22 SECRETARY:

23 Senate Bill 1544

24 (Secretary reads title of bill)

25 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

26 PRESIDENT:

27 Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill
28 1545, Senator Rock.

29 SECRETARY:

30 Senate Bill 1545

31 (Secretary reads title of bill)

32 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive offers one
33 amendment.

1 PRESIDENT:

2 Senator Rock.

3 SENATOR ROCK:

4 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
5 Senate. This is another in the series of bills proffered by
6 Office of State Treasurer, and this bill is intended to relieve
7 our Illinois banks of unnecessary expenses for transporting and
8 insuring securities between New York and Illinois banks with
9 respect to the collateralizing of state-time deposits. Amendment
10 No. 1 is offered by the Executive Committee was at the request
11 of the Reference Bureau, and really just includes or adds the
12 words "or depository trust company", so that there will be no
13 mistake about the availability of this...this vehicle for the
14 State Treasurer's Office. I would move the adoption of Committee
15 Amendment No. 1.

16 PRESIDENT:

17 Any discussion? Senator Rock moves the adoption of Committee
18 No. 1 to Senate Bill 1545. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed
19 Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any further
20 amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
21 Bill 1546, Senator Rock. Read the bill.

22 SECRETARY:

23 Senate Bill 1546.

24 (Secretary reads title of bill)

25 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Executive offers one
26 amendment.

27 PRESIDENT:

28 Senator Rock.

29 SENATOR ROCK:

30 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
31 Senate. This amendment merely establishes an immediate effective
32 date. I would move the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1.

12 1551, Senator Howard Mohr. Senate Bill 1560, Senator Dougherty.

13 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

14 I haven't...

15 SECRETARY:

16 Senate...Senate Bill 1560
17 (Secretary reads title of bill)

18 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers
19 two amendments.

20 PRESIDENT:

21 Senator Dougherty.

22 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

23 I have Senate...Amendment No. 1 has to do with the...the penalties
24 for those clerks of the circuit court who may have been convicted
25 of a...of a felony, and it is outlined what the convictions are.

26 PRESIDENT:

27 Any further discussion? Senator Dougherty moves the Committee
28 Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1560. All in favor will say Aye.
29 Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any
30 further amendments? Amendment No. 2, Senator Dougherty.

31 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

32 I do not have the second amendment at this time, Sir. I'll
33 have to hold it.

2 Is there committee...it's...there's...it's committee amend-
3 ment, I think.

4 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

5 I would imagine so. I have not yet seen it, Sir. Well, I
6 just arrived in town a few moments ago, so I'm a bit derelict.
7 We will find that amendment. We'll put it on tomorrow. Do you
8 have it?

9 PRESIDENT:

10 It's right here.

11 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

12 All right. Fine, go ahead. I offer the amendment.

14 Senator Dougherty offers Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1560.
15 All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.
16 Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments? Senator
17 Dougherty.

18 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

19 I have not seen these two amendments, but I believe Senator
20 Soper may be familiar with them. They are committee amendments.
21 Amendment No. 1, I offered on myself on the...on the purpose of
22 providing for penalties for conviction of a felony.

23 PRESIDENT:

24 Well, to this point, we have adopted Amendments No. 1 and
25 Amendments No...No. 1 and 2. There is a another proffered amend-
26 ment here. Suppose we move the bill to 3rd reading with the
27 understanding...

28 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

29 If you call it back...

30 PRESIDENT:

31 ...that tomorrow you can bring it back and determine if you
32 put that one on.

33 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

1 Thank you.

2 PRESIDENT:

3 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1564, Senator Harris. Read the
4 bill.

5 SECRETARY:

6 Senate Bill 1564

7 (Secretary reads title of bill)

8 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers
9 one amendment.

10 PRESIDENT:

11 Senator Harris.

12 SENATOR HARRIS:

13 I move the adoption of the amendment. The effect of it is
14 technical in that when the bills were introduced, the language
15 that we added to this Act in the bill in the last Session was in-
16 cluded in such a way as to not really be a clean bill. After the
17 bill was prepared by the Reference Bureau, we had some further
18 discussions from them...with them, and they recommended that this
19 form be pursued. It's only technical. It does not change the
20 substance of the bill. I would just point out that the whole
21 purpose of these two bills is that Bond Council recommended that
22 the bill that passed last Session making amendments to these
23 two separate Acts raised some question and so they...Bond Council
24 suggested that we had to come at the problem again into separate
25 bills. That's the whole purpose of this legislation, and this
26 amendment is merely technical in cleaning up the bill. I move
27 its adoption.

28 PRESIDENT:

29 Any further discussion? Senator Harris moves the adoption
30 of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1564. All in favor
31 will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1
32 is adopted. Any further amendments? Any amendments from the
33 Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1565, Senator Harris.

1 SECRETARY:

2 Senate Bill 1565

3 (Secretary reads title of bill)

4 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers
5 one amendment.

6 PRESIDENT:

7 Senator Harris.

8 SENATOR HARRIS:

9 Yes, this committee amendment is just exactly the same as
10 the other one adopted to 1564. I move its adoption.

11 PRESIDENT:

12 Any further discussion? Senator Harris moves the adoption of
13 Committee Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1565. Pardon...I'm sorry.
14 Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1565. All in favor will
15 say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.
16 Any further amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
17 The Chair recognizes Senator Netsch.

18 SENATOR NETSCH:

19 Thank you, Mr. President. I would like the record to show...

20 PRESIDENT:

21 Just a moment, just a moment. May we have the attention of
22 the membership, please, and will the members be in their seats.
23 Senator Netsch.

24 SENATOR NETSCH:

25 Thank you, Mr. President. I wanted the record to show that
26 Senator Hickey will be out for several weeks. As some of you may
27 know, she had...excuse me...major surgery the...right after we
28 went out of Session. She's in very excellent condition. She will
29 have no postoperative complications at all, but she is required
30 to recuperate and will probably not return until approximately
31 the 11th of May.

32 PRESIDENT:

33 The record will so show, and we certainly wish for her a

1 speedy recovery. Senate Bills on 2nd reading. 1601, Senator
2 Netsch. Do you desire to move it, or do you want to wait till
3 tomorrow? Senate Bill 1605, Senator Joyce. Do you want to call it?
4 Read the bill.

5 SECRETARY:

6 Senate Bill 1605

7 (Secretary reads title of bill)

8 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
9 one amendment.

10 PRESIDENT:

11 Senator Joyce. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

12 SENATOR ROCK:

13 I was just...the amendment was offered, if you will recall,
14 by you and I. I was going to move its adoption...

15 PRESIDENT:

16 Senator Rock...

17 SENATOR ROCK:

18 ...however...however, you wish to proceed.

19 PRESIDENT:

20 Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate
21 Bill 1605. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes
22 have it. The amendment is adopted. Any amendments from the Floor?
23 3rd reading. 160...Senate Bill 1609, Senator Knuppel. Read the
24 bill.

25 SECRETARY:

26 Senate Bill 1609

27 (Secretary begins to read title of bill)

28 PRESIDENT:

29 Senator Donnewald.

30 SECRETARY:

31 (Secretary reads title of bill)

32 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
33 one amendment.

1 PRESIDENT:

2 Senator Knuppel.

3 SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

4 The adoption of the amendment.

5 PRESIDENT:

6 Any further discussion? Senator Knuppel moves the adoption
7 of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1609. All in favor will say
8 Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.
9 Any further amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd
10 reading.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12 Senator Partee.

13 SENATOR PARTEE:

14 Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I'm
15 going to have to be leaving in a few moments to fulfill an obliga-
16 tion that I made some months ago, but I wanted to make certain
17 that the Body knew that there will be a meeting of the Rules
18 Committee, a meeting of the Rules Committee, a meeting of the Rules
19 Committee tomorrow at 8:30 in the President's Office and at ten
20 o'clock tomorrow in the President's Office there will be a
21 meeting of the Senate Operations Committee, and the Legislature
22 will be in Session tomorrow at eleven o'clock. And I would suggest
23 to the members, there are about a hundred bills in the Rules
24 Committee that if you desire hearings on your bills, that you may
25 certainly feel free to be there to make the presentation that you
26 deem necessary. Thank you, very much.

27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28 Senate Bill 1617. Senate Bill 1611, I'm sorry, Senator Johns.

29 SENATOR JOHNS:

30 Mr. President...

31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32 Read...read the bill.

33 SECRETARY:

1 Senate Bill 1611

2 (Secretary reads title of bill)

3 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
4 one amendment.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6 Senator Johns.

7 SENATOR JOHNS:

8 Mr. President, I'd like to Table the Amendment No. 1, it's
9 a committee amendment, and then I'd like to...

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11 Do you wish to explain the...

12 SENATOR JOHNS:

13 Well, the first amendment, No. 1, is technically in error,
14 and it's a technical change only, and I wish to Table that one,
15 and I have submitted a proper technically correct, Amendment No.
16 2.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18 Senator Rock.

19 SENATOR ROCK:

20 Thank you, Mr. President, this was the amendment that was
21 offered in committee by Senator Partee and myself. This is the one
22 that which restricts the expenditures to no more than fifty percent
23 during the first six months. We found later that one of the
24 numbers was misplaced or transposed. Senator Johns is quite correct.
25 I think the proper action would be to Table the proposed Committee
26 Amendment No. 1 and substitute the Amendment No. 2, and I'd
27 be happy to offer that amendment.

28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29 The motion is, to Table Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1611.
30 All those in favor say Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have it.
31 The amendment is Tabled. Now, Senator Johns moves that Amendment
32 No. 2...just a moment, you have to read the amendment...no. Senator
33 Johns moves that Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1611 be adopted.

1 All those in favor say Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have
2 it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?
3 Are there any amendments from Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill
4 1617, Senator D'Arco. Read the bill.

5 SECRETARY:

6 Senate Bill 1617

7 (Secretary reads title of bill)

8 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10 Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
11 Bill 1618, Senator Egan. Read the bill.

12 SECRETARY:

13 Senate Bill 1618

14 (Secretary reads title of bill)

15 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17 Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
18 Bill 1632, Senator Dougherty. Read the bill.

19 SECRETARY:

20 Senate Bill 1632

21 (Secretary reads title of bill)

22 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24 Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate
25 Bill 1634, Senator Rock. Read the bill.

26 SECRETARY:

27 Senate Bill 1634

28 (Secretary reads title of bill)

29 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
30 two amendments.

31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32 Senator Rock.

33 SENATOR ROCK:

1 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
2 Senate. Amendment No. 1 is the Partee Amendment which restricts
3 the expenditure to no more than fifty percent during the first
4 six months. I would move the adoption of Committee Amendment No.
5 1.

6 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7 Is there further discussion? Those in favor of Amendment
8 No. 1 to Senate Bill 1634 indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed
9 No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Senator Rock
10 as to Amendment No. 2.

11 SENATOR ROCK:

12 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
13 Senate. Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1634 in substance cuts
14 fifty-five thousand dollars out of this appropriation. When the
15 commission met some six weeks ago to propose its FY '77 budget, we
16 incorporated a proposed seven percent cost of living increase
17 for the employees of the commission. This is a policy matter,
18 subsequent to the Governor's budget recommendation, will not be
19 allowed in any agency, so it will not be allowed in this one,
20 and that's the reason for the cut, and I would move the adoption
21 of Amendment No. 2.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23 Is there further discussion? All those in favor of the
24 Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1634 indicate by saying Aye. Those
25 opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are
26 there further amendments? Are there amendments from the Floor?
27 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1635, Senator Fawell. Read the bill.

28 SECRETARY:

29 Senate Bill 1635

30 (Secretary reads title of bill)

31 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriation offers
32 one amendment.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

1 Senator Fawell. Just a moment. Senator Rock, Senator
2 Hynes is absent. There was a ...committee amendment...from the
3 Committee on Appropriations to Senate Bill 1635. Are you...
4 should we consider this, or do you wish to hold it until tomorrow?
5 It's the Partee Amendment.

6 SENATOR ROCK:

7 Oh, I...that's the one we talked about, about expending more
8 than fifty percent, yes, I would move the adoption of Amendment
9 No. 1.

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11 The motion is, to adopt Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1635.
12 All those...is there discussion? All those in favor say Aye. Those
13 opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are
14 there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1638,
15 Senator Hynes. Senate Bill 1639, Senator Regner. Senator...
16 Senate Bill 1648, Senator Harber Hall.. Read...read the bill.

17 SECRETARY:

18 Senate Bill 1648

19 (Secretary reads title of bill)

20 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
21 two amendments.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23 Senator Rock.

24 SENATOR ROCK:

25 Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 is again the Partee
26 amendment which restricts the expenditure to no more than fifty
27 percent during the first six months of the fiscal year. I would
28 move the adoption of Amendment No. 1.

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30 Is there further discussion? Those in favor indicate by
31 saying Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment
32 is adopted. Amendment No. 2, Senator Rock.

33 SENATOR ROCK:

1 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
2 Senate. Amendment No. 2 was offered in the Committee on Appropria-
3 tions and it effects a net reduction of some sixty-five hundred
4 dollars by deleting a request in the Personal Service line for
5 a typist position for FY '77. There was, in fact, as I recall,
6 no justification for this request. The committee thought that
7 this should be cut out, and I would move the adoption of Amendment
8 No. 2.

9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10 Is there further discussion? Those in favor indicate by
11 saying Aye as to Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1648. Those
12 opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are
13 there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1680,
14 Senator Carroll. Senate Bill 1681, Senator Dougherty. Read
15 the bill.

16 SECRETARY:

17 Senate Bill 1681

18 (Secretary reads title of bill)

19 2nd reading of bill. No committee amendments.

20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21 Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senator
22 Dougherty.

23 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

24 1632, I'd like to place that on the order of 3rd reading, also.

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26 1632, we read the bill, Senator. It has been advanced.

27 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

28 It has, thank you.

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30 The next order of business will be House Bills on 1st
31 reading. If the Senators would indicate if they wish to be the
32 Senate sponsors of these bills, I refer to Page 4 of the Senate
33 Calendar. The first bill would be 1137. 592 has already been

1 picked up by Senator Egan. 1476, Page 4. Senator Rock.
2 SENATOR ROCK:
3 Inquiry of the Chair. It...once the bill is picked up, is
4 it not then go to the Committee on Rules?
5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
6 That is correct. 2529. 3099. 3155. 3273. 3338. Senator
7 Buzbee. Read the bill.
8 SECRETARY:
9 House Bill 3338
10 (Secretary reads title of bill)
11 1st reading of the bill.
12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
13 3357. Senator Bruce. Read the bill.
14 SECRETARY:
15 Senate Bill...or House Bill 3357
16 (Secretary reads title of bill)
17 1st reading of the bill.
18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
19 Senator Rock.
20 SENATOR ROCK:
21 Again, Mr. President, parliamentary inquire. When an
22 appropriation bill comes over from the House and is picked up,
23 what is its destiny once having received a Senate sponsor?
24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
25 The...the...the...it is an administration bill and they are
26 referred to the Committee on Appropriations.
27 SENATOR ROCK:
28 Assignment of Bills.
29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
30 On the Assignment on Bills and turned then to the Committee
31 on Appropriations. Resolutions.
32 SECRETARY:
33 Senate Resolution 299, introduced by Senators Rock, Welsh,

1 Howard Mohr, and all members.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3 Senator Rock.

4 SENATOR ROCK:

5 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
6 Senate. This resolution introduced by Senators Welsh, Howard
7 Mohr, and I would ask leave of this Body that all members be
8 shown, congratulates the Village of Oak Park, which, as I'm
9 sure that everybody has read about in the newspaper, has been
10 designated by the National Municipal League as an All America
11 City, one of only ten in the country. Oak Park has...was Gaul
12 of old, is divided into three Legislative districts, the 18th,
13 the 21st and the 5th. They are ably and well served, and I wish
14 that all members would be shown on the resolution and I would
15 ask for the suspension of the rules for the immediate considera-
16 tion and adoption of this resolution.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18 The motion is to suspend the rules for the immediate
19 adoption of this resolution. All those in favor indicate by
20 saying Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have it. Senator Rock
21 moves for the adoption of the amendment...of the adoption of
22 the resolution. All those in favor indicate...Senator Bell. All those
23 in favor of the adoption of the resolution indicate by saying Aye. Those
24 opposed No. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.
25 Senator Bell, for what purpose do you arise?

26 SENATOR BELL:

27 Mr. President, I am inquiring as to whether it's proper
28 to make a motion at this time. Are we to the business of Motions?

29 PRESIDING OFFICER:

30 We will be for you, Senator.

31 SENATOR BELL:

32 Well, I thank you. Reference to Senate Bills 1849 and 1850, I
33 ask leave of this Body for the cosponsorship of those particular

1 bills of Senator Harris, Senator Graham, Senator Moore, and
2 Senator Philip.

3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4 Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Don Moore.

5 SENATOR DON MOORE:

6 Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate, before
7 we adjourned ten days ago, I spoke to Senator Hynes as far as the
8 appropriation bill for the Legislative Advisory Committee on
9 Public Aid and he informed me it would be set for hearing
10 tomorrow at one o'clock. Through some inadvertent, Senate Bill
11 1744 was not posted, and I would ask at this time for unanimous
12 consent to waive the appropriate rule of posting, so that Senate
13 Bill 1744 can be heard in committee tomorrow at o'clock,
14 Appropriations Committee.

15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16 You...you've heard the motion. Senator Soper.

17 SENATOR SOPER:

18 He gets through, that's all.

19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20 Is there leave? You heard the motion. All those indicate
21 by saying Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The rules
22 are suspended insofar as the hearing of the Senate Bill 1744.
23 Senator Soper, for what purpose do you arise?

24 SENATOR SOPER:

25 Well, just a matter of inquiry. Senator Bell, those bills
26 you spoke of, are they Graham's bills on workmen's comp and un-
27 employment compensation?

28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29 Senator Bell.

30 SENATOR BELL:

31 Senator Soper, those bills are in reference to hazardous
32 substance legislation.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

1 Is there further business to come before the Senate? Senator
2 Egan.

3 SENATOR EGAN:

4 Yes, Mr. President. I was lead to believe that House Bills
5 on 1st reading that are appropriation bills are referred to the
6 Assignment Committee on the day that they are picked by the sponsor.
7 Now...by the Senate sponsor...now, I...my name is listed, so
8 obviously, you've known since the last time that the bill was listed
9 on 1st reading, that it has been assigned to me for sponsorship
10 in the Senate. My question is, today will it go to the Committee
11 on Assignments or will it be back on 1st reading again tomorrow?

12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13 What...what we'll do, Senator, we'll read the bill.

14 SENATOR EGAN:

15 Thank you.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17 House Bills on 1st reading. House Bill 592, Senator Egan.

18 SECRETARY:

19 House Bill 592

20 (Secretary reads title of bill)

21 1st reading of the bill.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23 Is there further business to come before the Senate?

24 Senator Daley.

25 SENATOR DALEY:

26 Mr. President and fellow Senators, Senate Judiciary Committee
27 will meet in Room 400 immediately after the Session instead of
28 6:30 tonight.

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30 Senator Fawell.

31 SENATOR FAWELL:

32 Mr. President, I'd like to ask unanimous consent to have
33 Senators Netsch and Wooten put as joint cosponsors to Senate Bill

1 635, the Children's Commission Bill.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3 Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Harber Hall.

4 SENATOR HARBER HALL:

5 Mr. President, I'd like to ask leave of the Senate to be
6 shown as cosponsor on Senate Bill 1833.

7 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8 Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Mitchler.

9 SENATOR MITCHLER:

10 Mr. President and members of the Senate, I would ask leave
11 to be added as a cosponsor to Senate Bill 1833.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13 Is there leave? Leave is granted. Is there further business
14 to come before the Senate? Senator Rock.

15 SENATOR ROCK:

16 Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
17 Senate. The Session is apparently going to be a little shorter than
18 we had anticipated. There is in the process of drafting a
19 resolution, but before we leave and before we come back here at
20 eleven o'clock tomorrow morning, as announced by the President,
21 I would like to apprise the membership so they may....that we
22 may collectively and individually congratulate one of our senior
23 members. Today is his birthday. I will not ask him how old he
24 is. I'm sure that he would rather not say, but if we were all
25 as young in spirit and had as much wisdom or at least knew most
26 of what he had forgotten, we would all be better off, and I
27 would like everybody to congratulate Senator Daniel Dougherty
28 on his birthday.

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30 Senator Dougherty.

31 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

32 Just like to inform my colleagues that today is my seventieth
33 birthday, so on time.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2 Senator Netsch will sing Happy Birthday to you. Is there
3 further business to come before the Senate in the Regular
4 Session? Senator Rock moves we adjourn until eleven o'clock
5 tomorrow, Tuesday, the 27th of April. All in favor indicate
6 by saying Aye. Those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The
