2. Senator Rock has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to  
3. Senate Bill 134. Any discussion? Senator Bell:

4. SENATOR BELL:

5. Yes, Mr. President, might I ask Senator Rock or yourself what  
6. that amendment does or what that committee amendment is?

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Rock, would you come to the podium so I can come to  
9. the Floor on this one? Senator Rock can answer it for you. Senator  
10. Rock.

11. SENATOR ROCK:

12. Yes. Committee Amendment No. 1 which was offered and adopted  
13. in the Senate Health and Welfare Committee provides three...three  
14. following changes. It minimizes the number of specialized living  
15. centers to five. It make the Department of Mental Health responsible  
16. for...for providing care to the developmentally disabled patients  
17. if the center is reverted to the CDB, and it makes any administrative  
18. decision of the...Capital Development Board or the Department of  
19. Mental Health subject to judicial review. I'd move the adoption  
20. of Amendment No. 1.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Bell.

23. SENATOR BELL:

24. Well, Senator Rock, might you...might you be able to tell me  
25. where those five centers are going to be located?

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Rock.

28. SENATOR ROCK:

29. No, I would not because it provides, as I understand it, that...  
30. that requests have to be made by sponsoring authorities, and...and those  
31. ...there are, I'm told, of between sixty and seventy requests already  
32. in, and the...the Department is then given the option to review the re-  
33. quests and pick a place. They just haven't made that decision yet.

2.       Okay. Thank you very much.

4.       Senator Weaver.  
5. SENATOR WEAVER:  
6.       Well, Mr. President, Senator Rock, I...it was my understanding  
7. that you were going to hold this bill until we got some further  
8. information from the Department. Is...am I correct in that assumption?  
9. PRESIDENT:  
10.       Well, let me just say, and I hate to do it from this vantage  
11. point, I am the sponsor of the bill. I did not know that. If  
12. there is some...other information that you want, we'll certainly  
13. hold the bill on 3rd reading until that...that...information is  
14. available to you.  
15. SENATOR WEAVER:  
16.       Well, just as long, Mr. President, as we may bring it back to  
17. 2nd for a possible amendment, I have no objection.  
18. PRESIDENT:  
19.       Of course. Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to  
20. Senate Bill 134. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes  
21. have it. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments? Any amend-  
22. ments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 135. Senate Bill 137.

2. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary offers one
3. amendment.
4. PRESIDENT:
5. Senator Hynes. Committee on Judiciary offers one amendment.
6. You move the adoption of the amendment?
7. SENATOR HYNES:
8. I...move the adoption of the amendment. It reduces the...the
9. penalties and clarifies the...the language of the Act.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Any further discussion? Senator Bell.
12. SENATOR BELL:
13. Yes, Senator Hynes, you say it reduces...reduces the penalties
14. and clarifies provisions of the Act. Might you just elucidate a
15. little bit on those points.
16. PRESIDENT:
17. Senator Hynes.
18. SENATOR HYNES:
19. There are several categories within the Act. And the penalties
20. in the original bill range from a Class 4 felony to a Class B mis-
21. demeanor, and each one of those have been reduced by one so that now
22. the highest penalty is a Class A misdemeanor. Secondly, because of
23. a possible ambiguity in the bill with respect to its impact on rodeos
24. and other animal shows, a clarifying language was included to specifi-
25. cally exclude those exhibitions from the operation of the statute.
26. PRESIDENT:
27. Senator Bell.
28. SENATOR BELL:
29. Well, why is it that...why is it that the committee felt it
30. should be changed from a Class 4 felony down to a misdemeanor?
31. PRESIDENT:
32. Senator Hynes.
33. SENATOR HYNES:

1. Well, this was the product, the work product of a subcommittee.  
2. They felt that a imprisonment up to one year...would be a sufficient  
3. punishment. I...I did not mention by the way that on a second offense,  
4. it is a...it is returned to a felony.

5. SENATOR BELL:

6. Right now the law says Class 4 felony is one to three years...

7. SENATOR HYNES:

8. No, no. Right now, the law says a petty offense which means  
9. only a monetary fine of a nominal amount, so that the bill is amend-  
10. ing the law to significantly increase the penalties that are involved.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Mitchler.

13. SENATOR MITCHLER:

14. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I...I do not have a copy  
15. of this amendment. I know the several bills on this related subject  
16. were in the subcommittee. I wonder if we couldn't hold this until we  
17. each got a copy of the amendment on our desk so that we could actually  
18. see what the subcommittee did to this particular bill. I believe they  
19. incorporated some of the language that were in the other bills. Could  
20. we hold that till we get a copy of the amendment?

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Hynes. Well, just a minute, Senator Hynes. Just a  
23. minute, Senator Hynes. It's been the Chair's observation that the  
24. juices flow strongly the first day back. Everybody has been rested  
25. up, but let's be in our seats. Let's keep our voices at a lower  
26. decimal so that what everybody has to say can be heard. Senator  
27. Hynes.

28. SENATOR HYNES:

29. There's a request for the copy of the amendments. I'll hold  
30. the bill until the amendments can be reproduced and distributed.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Take it out of the record. Senate Bill 184, Senator Schaffer.  
33. Senate Bill 193, Senator Sommer. Senate Bill 214, Senator Glass.

1. Senator Glass, if I could divert your attention from your illustrious  
2. colleague. You...read the bill. Oh, hold it. All right. Senate  
3. Bill 231, Senator Roe. Senate Bill 247, Senator Sommer. Senate Bill  
4. 248, Senator Sommer. Senate Bill 266, Senator Glass. Senate Bill  
5. 285, Senator McCarthy. Senate Bill 286, Senator Rock. Read the bill.

22. SENATOR GLASS:

23. Well, thank you, Mr. President. I've now discussed this  
24. with Senator Demuzio. I...I don't believe there's any objection  
25. on his part, and I would, therefore, move the adoption of the amend-  
26. ment.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Glass moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate  
29. Bill 357. Senator Bell.

30. SENATOR BELL:

31. I'd like...I'd like to address a question to the sponsor of  
32. the amendment, Senator Glass.

33. PRESIDENT:



1. Senator Bell.

2. SENATOR BELL:

3. Senator Glass, you really didn't explain what the amendment  
4. does to the bill. Would you please do so?

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Glass, will you do that again please?

7. SENATOR GLASS:

8. Yes, Mr. President. I apologize to you and Senator Bell also,  
9. because I...we did debate this at some length a couple of days ago.  
10. That's why I didn't explain it, but one of the things the bill does  
11. is strike language which would allow the ICC Commission hearings to  
12. be held in the county where the subject matter is located. Striking  
13. that language would have permitted the ICC not to be required to  
14. hold them in those counties, and the dialogue was held last week on  
15. it. We indicated that, I think, it is desirable to retain that  
16. right for local citizens to have hearings held close to home so they  
17. won't have to travel either to Springfield or Chicago. So that's  
18. what the amendment would retain.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Appreciate your second explanation. Any further discussion?  
21. Question is shall Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 357 be adopted.  
22. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. Amendment is adopted.  
23. Any further amendments? Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd  
24. reading.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. put into service, not just taken and returned. I would move

24. SENATOR FAWELL:

25. Yes, Mr. President...members of the Senate, the amendment that  
26. I am presenting is one requested by Senator Hynes and pertains to  
27. the...the bond issue which is authorized to support building programs  
28. for joint agreement capital projects for handicapped children. This  
29. would limit the bonds to be amortized over a given period of years  
30. as requested by Senator Hynes. I move the adoption of the same.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of Amendment  
33. 1 to Senate Bill 425 indicate by saying Aye. All those opposed No.

1. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further  
2. amendments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 429, Senator Fawell. Senate  
3. Bill 433, Senator Course. Senate Bill 451, Senator Berning. Move  
4. the bill.

6. Senate Bill 451.

7. (Secretary reads title of bill)

8. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Are there amendments from the Floor?

11. SECRETARY:

12. One...one Floor...two Floor Amendments offered by Senator  
13. Berning.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Senator Berning, Amendment No. 1.

16. SENATOR BERNING:

17. Thank you, Mr. President. By way of explanation and apology,  
18. let me say that Senate Bill 451 was to be not heard in committee until  
19. the day after the day on which it was heard, but in a moments relaxation,  
20. the committee said okay, let's hear it, and let's...and zing, zing,  
21. zing it went out and I did not have the opportunity to present these  
22. two amendments...

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Just...just a moment, Senator. Proceed.

25. SENATOR BERNING:

26. Consequently, these two amendments which should have been  
27. offered in committee are now offered on the Floor. The first amend-  
28. ment is a technical amendment which came to me from the Reference  
29. Bureau with their apologies. It makes corrections on Page 5, Lines  
30. 14 and 15. It's purely a correction that the Legislative Reference  
31. Bureau requests.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. Is there further discussion on Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill

1. 451? All those in favor of Amendment 1 indicate by saying Aye.  
2. All those opposed No.. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.  
3. Now we address ourselves to Amendment No. 2.  
4. SENATOR BERNING:  
5. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 is clarification  
6. also. It defines more specifically what a paramedic is and was  
7. brought to be...to me by Mr. Bogard of the Department of Public  
8. Health with their request that this be included so as to leave no  
9. question as to what a paramedic is. I apologize for the inadvertence  
10. of not having these amendments offered at the time of the committee,  
11. and I will take copies to the leadership on the other side, just so  
12. there is no question.

7. Mr. President or Mr. Secretary, which is the first one? The
8. short one or the long one?
9. SECRETARY:
10. The long one.
11. SENATOR WOOTEN:
12. Okay. The first amendment changes the composition of the
13. State Certification Board to admit one private school member as
14. part of an...an attempt to get an agreement on the entire bill.
15. I move its adoption.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
17. Is there further discussion? Senator Hynes.
18. SENATOR HYNES:
19. Mr. President, you're going to move...you're going to adopt
20. all the amendments and move the bill? Well, you will bring it back,
21. then, if there are any further...okay.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
23. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of Amendment
24. No. 1 to Senate Bill 4...546 indicate by saying Aye. All those

3. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is

4. It's...it's...it's in the file. It wasn't marked on the  
5. outside cover. You can...you can address yourself to that amend-  
6. ment, Senator. Proceed.

8. Right. I...I ask that it be approved, and...and adopted.

10. You're moving that the Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 564 be

29. I move...I move that it be adopted.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Senator Shapiro. Senator Wooten, do you wish to explain the  
25. amendment?

26. SENATOR WOOTEN:

27. Yes. The amendment provides for an optional review by the  
28. State Board of Education, if a decision by the State Certification  
29. Board is judged by aggrieved parties to be in error or against  
30. their best wishes they may now seek a review from the State  
31. Board of Education. I move the adoption of the amendment.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. Senator Shapiro.

1. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

2. Mr. President, it is brought...it's just been brought to my  
3. attention that that amendment is not in proper form. I believe it  
4. adds an entirely new section to the code without making reference  
5. that a new section is being added in the Preamble or in the...  
6. on Page 1 of the bill.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. Senator Wooten.

9. SENATOR WOOTEN:

10. If that is the case, I withdraw the amendment and move  
11. the bill on to 3rd reading without amendment.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Are there amendments from the Floor? Well, do you wish to...  
14. Well, some disposition must be made, I've been advised. Senator  
15. Wooten.

16. SENATOR WOOTEN:

17. Yes, and I move we Table the committee amendment, and we'll  
18. pull this back on 3rd and because this is something I want on the  
19. bill.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. It's on 2nd now, Senator.

22. SENATOR WOOTEN:

23. I know, but I do not want to leave it on 2nd because I'd  
24. like to think the quicker we can move through, the better off  
25. we'll be. I move to Table the committee amendment.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. The motion is to Table the Committee Amendment No. 1 to  
28. Senate Bill 863. All...all those in favor say Aye. All those...  
29. all those opposed No. ... (Machine cut-off)...Senator Soper, for what  
30. purpose do you arise?

31. SENATOR SOPER:

32. Well, Mr. President, if there's a committee amendment that's  
33. offered, I think you've got...you've got to take that committee

1. amendment and either pass it or not pass it, but you can't move this  
2. to 3rd without going back to that committee for that amendment.  
3. There's a reason for it.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Wooten.

6. SENATOR WOOTEN:

7. Senator, it was an amendment that I offered, and I'm told by  
8. Senator Shapiro he finds something objectionable in the form. I'm  
9. perfectly willing to withdraw it. The bill can stand on its own  
10. merits without the amendment, and I move to Table the committee  
11. amendment.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Well, the Chair rules that he does have a right to Table the  
14. amendment, Senator. The motion is in order. All those in favor of  
15. Tabling Amendment No. 1...Senator Hynes.

16. SENATOR HYNES:

17. Point of inquiry. Is the committee amendment the appellate  
18. provision? I'm sorry. I was distracted.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Senator Wooten. I can believe that you were distracted,  
21. Senator, because there's an awful lot of noise in here.

22. SENATOR WOOTEN:

23. Senator Hynes, the amendment is one I offered to offer an  
24. optional review. Senator Shapiro has an objection to the amend-  
25. ment. I want to Table the amendment to move it on to 3rd. We  
26. have a compromise to go through. This will be part of the final  
27. package. I simply don't want to have it sitting on 2nd. I'd like  
28. to get it up on 3rd, so we do get to our agreement. We can move it  
29. back and pass it out. I'd like not to lose a legislative day.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Senator Hynes.

32. SENATOR HYNES:

33. Well, I...I take the contrary position. I'm...I oppose the



1. motion to Table, and I believe that this bill ought to be  
2. held here if we can't adopt the amendment. I don't think it  
3. ought to go to 3rd reading without it.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Wooten.

6. SENATOR WOOTEN:

7. Okay. I was attempting not to lose a legislative day.  
8. I will lose one. My intention is that that amendment will  
9. be on the bill, will not pass without it. It will not be offered  
10. for...for final vote without it. Senator Shapiro wants to delay,  
11. and I don't want to delay, but I will delay one more day. Take  
12. it out of the record.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Take it out of the record. Senator Shapiro, for what purpose  
15. do you arise?

16. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

17. Well, Mr. President, I also want to point out that we have  
18. some amendments for this particular bill also.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Well, it's taken out of the record. It'll be back tomorrow.  
21. Senate Bill 879, Senator Fawell. Senate Bill 881, Senator Fawell.  
22. Senate Bill 882. Senate Bill 883. Move it. Will the Sergeant-  
23. at-Arms clear the aisles.

24. SECRETARY:

25. Senate Bill 883.

26. (Secretary reads title of bill)

27. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate  
30. Bill 911, Senator Philip. Move the bill.

31. SECRETARY:

32. Senate Bill 911.

33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.  
2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)  
3. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senate  
4. Bill 932, Senator Mitchler. Move the bill.  
5. SECRETARY:  
6. Senate Bill 932.  
7. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
8. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers  
9. two amendments.  
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)  
11. Senator Mitchler.  
12. SECRETARY:  
13. Amendment...Amendment No. 1...  
14. SENATOR MITCHLER:  
15. If the Secretary will show which amendment is which...  
16. SECRETARY:  
17. No. 1 is the longer...amendment.  
18. SENATOR MITCHLER:  
19. The longer one. Thank you. When the bill was prepared, the  
20. exact amount of the tax levy was unknown and it was put in at  
21. .075. The amendment changes the tax levy to .15 percent and  
22. not to exceed .10 percent for the first year that it would be  
23. leveled by the county board. I would move for the adoption of  
24. the amendment.  
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)  
26. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of adopting  
27. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 932 indicate by saying Aye. All  
28. those opposed No. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2. Senator  
29. Mitchler.  
30. SENATOR MITCHLER:  
31. Mr. President and members of the Senate, Amendment No. 2 puts  
32. a front door referendum on the bill. This would authorize a  
33. separate tax levy for county sheriffs in the one hundred and two

1. counties other than Cook County, and I would move for adoption  
2. of this amendment.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. Is there further discussion? 3rd reading. Are there further  
5. amendments? Oh, all those in favor of adopting Amendment No. 2  
6. indicate by saying Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it.  
7. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments? 3rd read-  
8. ing. Senator Demuzio, 935. Senate Bill 942, Senator Harber Hall.  
9. Senate Bill 955, Senator Glass. Senate Bill 956, Senator Glass.  
10. Senate Bill 957. Senate Bill 978, Senator Roe. Move the bill.

11. SECRETARY:

12. Senate Bill 978.

13. (Secretary reads title of bill)

14. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One Floor  
15. Amendment offered by Senator Roe.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Senator Roe.

18. SENATOR ROE:

19. Mr. President and members of the Senate, the purpose of Amend-  
20. ment No. 1 is in one instance to change a typographical error. It  
21. changes the word comprehension to the word comprehensive in Line 13 of  
22. Page 2, and the other purpose of the amendment is to change the word  
23. officer to the word employee modified by correctional, and I would  
24. move adoption of this amendment.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of adopting  
27. Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 978 indicate by saying Aye. All those  
28. opposed No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there  
29. further amendments? 3rd reading. 9...we're getting close to the  
30. 2:30...the hour of 2:30, and I would now...Senator Hynes. Senator  
31. Hynes. Senate Bill 17...Senator Hynes. Senate Bill 173, you had...you  
32. requested that we return to that order on 2nd reading?

33. SENATOR HYNES:

1. There was an objection, on the ground that the amendment  
2. had not been distributed. It is Committee Amendment 1 which is  
3. the work product of a subcommittee that studied this matter, and  
4. I move the adoption of the amendment. It, as I explained earlier,  
5. reduces the penalties...

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7. Read...I think they have to read the bill, Senator, first.  
8. It was taken out of the record. Now, we'll read the bill and then  
9. you can address yourself to the amendment.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Bill 173.

12. (Secretary reads title of bill)

13. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary offers one  
14. amendment.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Senator Hynes.

17. SENATOR HYNES:

18. The amendment reduces the penalties by one notch in each cate-  
19. gory. There's seven categories in the bill. It also clarifies  
20. the bill to make...it's clear and certain that...it does not apply  
21. to...the rodeos and other like exhibitions. It does provide that a  
22. second offense is a Class 4 felony. I would move the adoption of  
23. the amendment.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. Is there further discussion? Senator Mitchler.

26. SENATOR MITCHLER:

27. Mr. President, I'd like to ask the sponsor of the amendment,  
28. if the amendment in anyway relates to the patrons of a dogfight  
29. or is it...is this only directed at the person who stages a dog-  
30. fight?

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Senator Hynes.

33. SENATOR HYNES:

1. The bill itself relates to patrons, to the person that  
2. stages and promotes it, to the person who trains animals, to  
3. anyone who provides equipment and supplies and so on, and the  
4. amendment addresses itself to each of those categories.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of Amendment  
7. No. 1 to Senate Bill 173 indicate by saying Aye. All those opposed  
8. No. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there  
9. further amendments? 3rd reading. I've been advised that I have...  
10. I have some constituents from the great town of Salem, Illinois,  
11. the Political Science class of Salem Community High School. Would  
12. they please rise and be...and be recognized. There are...Senator  
13. Merritt, for what purpose do you arise?

14. SENATOR MERRITT:

15. Mr. President, while we're on that same order, and Senators,  
16. we're privileged to have with us today the Director of our Depart-  
17. ment of Business and Economic Development, Joe Pisciotte, and ac-  
18. companying him is Arthur Compton, who heads up our Illinois office  
19. in Brussels that has been quite successful...recent years together  
20. with his lovely wife, Mrs. Compton. They're at the rear of the  
21. Senate. I would hope they would wave their hands so that we might  
22. all recognize him for the great job he's done for the State of  
23. Illinois in Brussels.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. We have several Motions in Writing that were to be argued  
26. today by Senator Morris, Bruce, Senator Netsch...that's tomorrow.  
27. We will not have the opportunity to argue those Motions today and...  
28. and with the understanding that we will reset them for tomorrow.  
29. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Are there further announcements?  
30. Senator Kosinski.

31. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

32. Mr. Chairman, my dear colleagues, when a man sits back in bed  
33. and sees and hears and receives so many bits of news wondering how

1. he's making out, you begin to say to yourself - God, thank you  
2. for so many friends. I'd like to thank all the Senators who had  
3. made inquiries about me, the Clerks and the Pages, the secretaries  
4. and if I have missed anyone else, please forgive me. I have a  
5. little cake coming in here and with the word - thank you - and  
6. thank you, God bless you and keep all of you well. Thank you.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. We're glad to have you back, Norbie. Senator Glass, for what  
9. purpose do you arise?

10. SENATOR GLASS:

11. For an announcement, Mr. President.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Make the announcement.

14. SENATOR GLASS:

15. The...the announcement is that I hope all of the softball  
16. players are listening. The Senate softball team will have a  
17. practice this afternoon. Repeat - will practice this afternoon  
18. at 5:00 o'clock and the directions to the location of the practice  
19. are being circulated right now. Five...the directions say 5:30  
20. but we're moving it up 5:00 p.m. Thank you.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

22. Senator Bruce.

23. SENATOR BRUCE:

24. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I ask leave of  
25. the Senate to be joined as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 892.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. Do we have leave? Leave is granted. Introduction of bills.

28. SECRETARY:

29. Senate Bill 1494 introduced by Senators Regner, Welsh, Graham,  
30. McCarthy.

31. (Secretary reads title of bill)

32. 1st reading of the bill.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

1. Motions. Senator Rock.  
2. SENATOR ROCK:  
3. Thank you, Mr. President. In the absence of our caucus  
4. chairman, Senator Welsh, is off the Floor, there will, in fact,  
5. be a Democratic Caucus tomorrow morning at 10:00 o'clock in  
6. the President's office. Tomorrow morning, 10:00 o'clock in  
7. the President's office. I'm told we go on the Floor...we...  
8. Session commences at 10:30, so we'd ask everybody to please be  
9. timely. 10:00 o'clock in the President's office.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11. Motions. ...Senator Moore.

12. SENATOR MOORE:

13. Yes, Mr. President, I'd like leave of the Body to discharge  
14. the Committee on Finance and...Credit Regulations from hearing  
15. House Bill 703, and would ask that it be...reassigned to Local  
16. Government. It's a companion bill. 704 is in Local Government.  
17. They're both matters on...

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

19. Do we have leave? Leave is granted. Senator Bloom.

20. SENATOR BLOOM:

21. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would ask leave to be added  
22. as a cosponsor of Senate Joint Resolution 26.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Partee.

25. SENATOR PARTEE:

26. Yes, you called.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. The...the...the hour is 2:30. What are your wishes?

29. SENATOR PARTEE:

30. Well, very honestly, it proves that we're not perfect. We  
31. are really not certain whether the Session calls for 10:00 or  
32. 10:30 tomorrow. It's in two places. One says...

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

1. 10...10:30 apparently, Senator.

2. SENATOR PARTEE:

3. It is 10:30, then if it...the Session commences at 10:30,  
4. there will be a Democratic Caucus in President's office at 10:00  
5. o'clock in the morning. 10:00 sharp. Thank you.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7. Senator Partée moves we adjourn until 10:30 tomorrow  
8. morning, Wednesday, May 7th. Senate stands adjourned. Senator  
9. Palmer.

10. SENATOR PALMER:

11. I'd like to announce that the Education Committee will meet
