14. adoption of all of them in order except for one, and I would move the
15. adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1.

16. PRESIDENT:
17. Any discussion? Senator Egan moves the adoption of Committee
18. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 477. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay.
19. The Ayes have it. The Amendment is adopted. Amendment No. 2, Senator
20. Egan.

21. SENATOR EGAN:
22. Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. Amendment No.
23. 2 placed on Senate Bill 477 in Committee, I move for its adoption.

24. PRESIDENT:
25. Any discussion? Senator Wooten. Senator Wooten, please.

26. SENATOR WOOTEN:
27. Could we just have some brief reference made as to what the amend-
28. ment does? We are having amendments passed out, and I'm not sure which
29. one applies, or why?

30. PRESIDENT:
31. I understand that. That's a good point. Senator Egan, you can give
32. us a brief explanation of each amendment please or...the amendment...
33. and the explanation...as required. Senator Egan, Amendment No. 2.

1. SENATOR EGAN:

2. ...Committee Amendment No. 2, Senator Wooten,...eliminates a
3. standard unit proposed for the Materials Procurement Division. The
4. rationale behind the cut...is two good reasons...if...the...the...
5. Department...wanted to initiate the task of rewriting specifications
6. and...most of the positions proposed for the new unit are the personnel
7. with...the...which the division already has available. So that was
8. part of the cut...to eliminate the standard unit proposed for the
9. Materials Procurement Division...

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Any further discussion...

12. SENATOR EGAN:

13. ...which was adopted unanimously.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill
16. 477. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Amendment is adopted.
17. Amendment No. 3, Senator Egan.

18. SENATOR EGAN:

19. Yes, Amendment No. 3 eliminated all of the funding for the IIS, and
20. that was adopted unanimously. I move for its adoption.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Any further discussion? Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amend-
23. ment No. 3 to Senate Bill 477. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay.
24. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Amendment No. 4, Senator Egan.

25. SENATOR EGAN:

26. Thank you, Mr. President, Amendment No. 4...maintains the level of
27. the messenger service in the Department to its current level. There was
28. an anticipated increase in the service by the Department. This would
29. keep the...the level of service at the present level and I move for the
30. adoption of Committee Amendment No. 4.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Any discussion? Senator Egan moves the adoption of Committee Amend-
33. ment...Amendment No. 4 to Senate Bill 477. All in favor will say Aye.

1. Opposed Nay. Amendment No. 4 is adopted. Amendment No. 5, Senator

2. Egan.

3. SENATOR EGAN:

4. Yes, Mr. President. Thank you...Amendment No. 5, Committee Amend-
5. ment No. 5 removed the Office of the Supervising Architect from the
6. Department, and I motion...I...move to Table that Amendment.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Weaver.

9. SENATOR WEAVER:

10. Thank you, Mr. President. Well, I...I would hope that we would
11. adopt this amendment and not Table it, Senator. This would remove
12. these from General Services, the Office of Supervising Architect,
13. about 70 people. Now, when this office was in General Services prior to
14. '74, the service to the using agencies was no better than it is under
15. the Capital Development Board right now, and I would hope that we would
16. not put them back in General Services where we wouldn't be able to
17. keep track of who's responsible for the slow downs and...not approving
18. plans and getting work done. I would...I would hope that we'd adopt
19. Amendment No. 5, rather than Table it, Senator Egan.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Egan. Just a moment, just a moment. Will the members be
22. in their seats and those not entitled to the Floor, please leave the
23. Floor? We've reached a point where I think you want to listen. Senator
24. Egan.

25. SENATOR EGAN:

26. Thank you, Mr. President. Well, Senator Weaver, we did discuss
27. this...at...at considerable length, and...we feel...that the...if...if
28. ...the...that part of the Architect's office were to remain in the...
29. Department of General Services for those contracts under fifty thousand
30. dollars, that...they would be more readily available for that type of
31. work and...the consensus is...is that...it they...they are there now...
32. they're geared for the...the activities for which they have been designed
33. and we hope that...that they would stay there.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Weaver.

3. SENATOR WEAVER:

4. Senator Egan, they're not there now. They're over at Capital

5. Development Board now. You are going to be putting them back into

6. General Services. They're not in General Services now; we took them

7. away back in '74, now you're going to put them back.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Egan, he is correct. They are not...they are...they are...

10. they are over at CDB...this is to move them back. Is that right?

11. SENATOR WEAVER:

12. This...they were moved over by Executive Order, not by our orders,

13. you remember.

14. SENATOR EGAN:

15. That's correct.

16. SENATOR WEAVER:

17. I think this Amendment should be adopted, not Tabled, Senator Egan.

18. SENATOR EGAN:

19. Well...I'm moving for the...I...my motion is to Table the Amendment.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Any further discussion? Senator Wooten.

22. SENATOR WOOTEN:

23. ...This Senator, at least needs some clarification as to what we're

24. trying to do...Do I understand we have a unit of architects nobody wants?

25. Is...that the...seems to be the problem? They are now...where are they

26. now, Senator?

27. SENATOR WEAVER:

28. They are now with the Capital Development Board. Do I...

29. PRESIDENT:

30. If the Chair might make an explanation, they are now with the

31. Capital Development Board as Senator Weaver said by virtue of Executive

32. Order. The motion is to...the sense of Senator Egan's motion is to have

33. them brought back to GSA.

1. SENATOR WOOTEN:

2. What...what is...what does the Amendment say?

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Let's start over.

5. SENATOR WOOTEN:

6. Yeah...

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Here. Senator Hynes, for what purpose do you...

9. SENATOR HYNES:

10. Well, perhaps, just to engage in the discussion. The Amendment is
11. a relatively simple one. In the Committee, it removed...slightly more
12. than one million dollars from this budget which in effect removed the
13. Office of the Supervising Architect from General Services. If this
14. Amendment is adopted, the same amount of money will be put back into
15. the budget of the Capital Development Board; so the issue here is not
16. the money, it's a question of where the Supervising Architect's Office
17. for small contracts should be, either in the Capital Development Board,
18. or in the Office of Supervising Architect. Previously,...in the last
19. year's Session, we transferred the...the Architect's Office to the
20. Capital Development Board. This would in part undo that...and...and
21. return it to the...General...Department of General Services for small
22. contracts.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator...Senator Wooten.

25. SENATOR WOOTEN:

26. Well that...that's what I wanted to sort out. These are for
27. small jobs and that's why I think Capital Development Board would
28. prefer that they be in General Services. Am...am I not correct on
29. that? Ok, thank you.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Regner.

32. SENATOR REGNER:

33. Yes,...I will speak against the motion to Table. A couple

1. of years ago, when we formed the Capital Development Board, the idea
2. behind it was that to have one agency in charge of all construction;
3. mainly, so that the agencies, if there were two, couldn't pass the buck
4. and blame each other, and I do believe that the Supervising Architect
5. does belong in Capital Development Board which was the initial intent...
6. intent of the CDB.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Egan moves that Amendment No. 5 to Senate Bill 477 be
9. Tabled. Those in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The roll call is
10. indicated. On Senate Bill 477, the...question is, shall Amendment
11. No. 5 be Tabled? Those in favor of Tabling that Amendment will vote
12. Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who
13. wished? Take the record. On this question, the Ayes are 32, the Nays
14. are 25. Amendment No. 5 is Tabled. Amendment No. 6, Senator Egan.

15. SENATOR EGAN:

16. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Amendment No.
17. 6 which...which was adopted in Committee, is a housekeeping amendment.
18. I would move for its adoption.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Egan moves for the adoption of Amendment No. 6 to Senate
21. Bill 477. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. Amendment No. 6 is
22. adopted. Amendment No. 7, Senator Egan.

23. SENATOR EGAN:

24. Committee Amendment No. 7 was adopted unanimously; it is also a
25. ...housekeeping amendment...

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Any further discussion...

28. SENATOR EGAN:

29. ...separates funds for the purchase of the warehouse stock...and
30. it merely is housekeeping. I would ask for its adoption.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 7 to Senate Bill
33. 477. Those in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.

1. Amendment No. 7 is adopted. Amendment No. 8, Senator Egan.

2. SENATOR EGAN:

3. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. My motion on...
4. Committee Amendment No. 8 is to Table that Amendment which will be re-
5. placed by Amendment No. 11 which...will...I will subsequently offer,
6. and I would ask that we...the motion is to Table Committee Amendment No.
7. 8.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. The question is, shall Amendment No. 8 be Tabled? All in favor
10. say Aye. Opposed Nay. Amendment No. 8 is Tabled. Amendment No. 9,
11. Senator Egan.

12. SENATOR EGAN:

13. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Amendment No. 9
14. adopted by the Committee does four...separate things: it separates
15. into a separate division the Electronic Data Processing Division, it
16. breaks up the EDP lump sum appropriation into a standard set of accounts,
17. it eliminates two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for the revision
18. and improvement of the EDP service, specifically the money is for a new
19. bookkeeping system for the Vehicle Revolving Fund and it cuts out four
20. of the new jobs required by the EDP Division. I move to adopt Senate...
21. Committee Amendment No. 9.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Any further discussion? Senator Egan moves for the adoption of
24. Amendment No. 9 to Senate Bill 477. Those in favor will say Aye.
25. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 9 is adopted. Amendment
26. No. 10, Senator Egan.

27. SENATOR EGAN:

28. Committee Amendment No. 10 does four things. It cuts sixty
29. thousand six hundred and seventy dollars from the Real Estate Manage-
30. ment Division, which was so unnecessary. It eliminates a new position
31. of Methods and Procedures Advisor requested for the Real Estate Manage-
32. ment Division, it cuts the commodities in the Real Estate Division, and
33. cuts a hundred thousand dollars in contractual services in the Vehicle

1. Division. The...the Amendment No. 10 in the Committee was adopted
2. unanimously. I move for its adoption on the Floor.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Any discussion? Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amendment No.
5. 10 to Senate Bill 477. Those in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The
6. Ayes have it. Amendment No. 10 is adopted. Amendment No. 11.

7. SENATOR EGAN:

8. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. I move for the adoption
9. of Amendment No. 11...which does a few things which I will explain.
10. The second...this...this Amendment replaces Tabled Amendment No. 8,
11. and the only difference between...this and...and...the...well, what it
12. does is...it...it picks up all of the technical errors and...and
13. specifically, it will eliminate the two hundred and fifty thousand dollars
14. for the revision and improvement of the EDP service, and I would move
15. for its adoption.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 11 to Senate Bill
18. 477. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amend-
19. ment No. 11 is adopted. Any further amendments from the Floor? 3rd
20. reading. Pardon me, are there other amendments? For what purpose
21. does Senator Berning, rise?

22. SENATOR BERNING:

23. For a point of personal privilege. I assume I was not able to
24. identify these amendments as they went by, but I just wondered if the
25. sponsor would answer one question about an amendment which...

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Hold it just a minute, Senator. We're now on Senate Amendment
28. No. 11, we'll get back to that point. We've adopted No. 11. Senator
29. Regner is offering Senate Amendment No...Amendment No. 12. Senator
30. Regner.

31. SENATOR REGNER:

32. Yes, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. Amendment No. 12
33. deletes some new employees requested by the Department. One is a public

1. information officer, technical advisor, and two clerks. It also re-
2. duces the contractual services which is 85% higher than last year by
3. reducing professional technical services by twenty-two hundred and
4. subscriptions by five hundred dollars...With the reduction in new
5. personnel, reductions can be made in both commodities, equipment and
6. travel, so this Amendment has a total reduction of fifty-one thousand
7. four hundred dollars, deleting some of the new employees requested by
8. the Department.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Egan.

11. SENATOR REGNER:

12. I move for its adoption.

13. SENATOR EGAN:

14. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I rise in opposition
15. to this Amendment. We have studied the budget...with excruciating
16. minuteness...and...this gets down to the pebbles and...the grains in
17. the beach...and I must say...that...I...appreciate your attempt, but
18. I'm going to oppose it. Thank you.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Graham.

21. SENATOR GRAHAM:

22. Mr. President,...if the appropriation bills that deal with the
23. budget of this State have no more importance than to stimulate the kind
24. of noise that we're enjoying in here today, I think we ought to give
25. up. You absolutely cannot hear the debate, and I think it is important
26. that we do.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Graham, your point is well taken. Will the members be
29. in their seats, lower their voice levels? Any further discussion on
30. this Amendment? We're on the...Amendment No. 12 offered by Senator
31. Regner, Senator Egan opposes it. The question is, shall Senate Amend-
32. ment No. 12 be adopted. Those in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay.
33. It's indicated a roll call...Question is, shall Amendment No. 12 be

1. adopted? Those in favor will vote Aye, opposed will vote Nay. The
2. voting is open. Is there any misunderstanding about what the question
3. is? I have been asked to restate the question. Senator Regner moves
4. the adoption of Committee Amendment...of Amendment No. 12. Those in
5. favor of the adoption of that Amendment, which Senator Egan opposed,
6. will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is still open.
7. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question, the Ayes
8. are 30, the Nays are 25. Amendment No. 12 is adopted. Would you care
9. to explain the Amendment? Amendment No. 12 is adopted. Amendment No.
10. 13 offered by whom? Senator Regner.

11. SENATOR REGNER:

12. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Amendment No. 13
13. reduces the commodity lines by twenty-two thousand two hundred dollars
14. in vehicle management...the Department used the buying of revenue stamps
15. as justification for the requested amount. ...However, these stamps
16. are used only by the Department...of Revenue, therefore, the Department
17. of General Services has no need for them. I move for the adoption of
18. Amendment No. 13.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Egan.

21. SENATOR EGAN:

22. Mr. President,...members of the Senate. I rise in opposition to
23. Amendment No. 13. It cuts out twenty-two thousand dollars and...I am
24. opposed to the amendment. We didn't see any need for this cut...in...
25. in our deliberations. I would ask for a no vote on the motion.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Any further discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 13
28. be adopted? Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting is
29. open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question,
30. the Ayes are 27, the Nays are 22, with none Voting Present. Amendment
31. No. 13 is adopted. Any further amendments? Amendment No. 14, Senator
32. Regner.

33. SENATOR REGNER:

1. Mr. President, members of the Senate, ...this Amendment...reduces
2. the budget by a total of forty-five thousand dollars. The Department
3. of General Services has requested to justify forty thousand dollars...

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Just a minute, Senator. You'll get drowned by the adrenalin in
6. here this morning. Senator Regner.

7. SENATOR REGNER: ...

8. It's a total reduction of forty-five thousand dollars in...con-
9. tractual services and...items that we did not...feel they were able to
10. justify such as the amount they needed for...snow removal and upkeep
11. on air conditioners and...various other professional technical services
12. and...I would move the adoption of Amendment No. 14 to Senate Bill 477.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Egan.

15. SENATOR EGAN:

16. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Well, as in the
17. other...amendments, Senator Regner, we...we've looked at the problem
18. and we didn't see the same need that you see. ...These are very small
19. amounts that you are cutting. They're amounts if they're not used,...
20. the money will be returned to the General Fund and...if...if the need
21. is there...as has been requested for these little items, I feel very
22. strongly that they ought to be kept in the budget and I'm...I rise in
23. opposition to the motion to adopt this Amendment. I would ask for a
24. no vote.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Hynes.

27. SENATOR HYNES:

28. I would concur that we have already reduced the appropriation in
29. all of these areas by an amount that in the judgment of the majority
30. of the Committee, was more than...than substantial and I believe that
31. the budget with the amendments proposed,...is in good shape...these
32. amendments are unnecessary and I think they ought to be opposed.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Any further discussion? The discussion is, shall Amendment No.
2. 14 be adopted? Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting
3. is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question,
4. the Ayes are 23, the Nays are 27. The Amendment fails. Any further
5. amendments? Any further amendments? Amendment No. 15, Senator Regner.
6. SENATOR REGNER:

7. Mr. President, members of the Senate. This...Amendment solves
8. one of the problems that Senator Egan mentioned in debating Amendment
9. No. 14. ...That...that is a problem of minuteness...this one isn't...
10. not minute. It takes four hundred sixty-two thousand three hundred
11. dollars out of the budget. ...Last year this General Assembly took
12. the money out of the General Services' budget for the centralized mail
13. services indicating that we did not think that this was an efficient
14. well-run, or even an operation...that could be helpful. So again, we
15. ...and then the Department went ahead and did operate...in a partial
16. manner on the centralized mail service. This Amendment does the same
17. thing that was adopted last year, taking out the entire centralized
18. mail service from General Services. I move for the adoption of
19. Amendment 15.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Egan.

22. SENATOR EGAN:

23. Well, Mr. President, members of the Senate. We have already cut
24. back this fund to the current level. What you're...what you are going
25. to do with this Amendment, is eliminate the mail service entirely. The
26. study has shown, Senator Regner, that the mail service has saved the
27. State of Illinois a considerably amount of money. We don't want to
28. increase it at this time, only because we felt it would...that the
29. State can't afford it. However, it is working, it is saving money,
30. and the feeling is...through the scrutiny of the Committee, that...the...
31. it is totally justified, and I ask that you vote no on a motion to
32. adopt this Amendment.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Any further discussion? Senator Regner.

2. SENATOR REGNER:

3. Just in...closing, there has been no proof that any of the
4. other Departments reduced the help they had for carrying mail. All
5. the inner office mail messengers are still on the various other payrolls
6. and added in hereto for their...their own centralized service and I
7. again move the adoption of Amendment 15.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Egan.

10. SENATOR EGAN:

11. I didn't say that there was any reduction in the service. What
12. I did say was we reduced the budget request to the present level to
13. maintain the present service, and it is felt that the present service
14. is justified, and...I'd ask no on a motion...no vote on a motion to
15. adopt this Amendment.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. The question is shall Amendment No. 15 be adopted? Those
18. in favor will vote Aye, opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all
19. voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the Ayes are 26,
20. the Nays are 27. Amendment No. 15 is lost. Amendment No. 16,
21. Senator Regner.

22. SENATOR REGNER:

23. ... Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment
24. establishes a separate line item for payment of Telecommunication
25. bills. The way the line is presently written the money can be legally
26. transferred into other lines in General Services. In fact, over
27. one hundred thousand dollars was transferred into Contractual Ser-
28. vices for fiscal year '75. This is the same type of amendment that
29. was offered and adopted in Committee regarding warehouse stock and
30. I would move for the adoption of Amendment 16.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Egan.

33. SENATOR EGAN:

1. Well, Senator Regner, ... 10 and behold, this is one thing that
2. we feel very strongly is a fine amendment. Now we didn't have it
3. ourselves, as long as you have prepared it, I thought we'd
4. approve your amendment and we

5. PRESIDENT:

6. The question is shall Amendment No. 16 be adopted? Those
7. in favor will vote Aye, opposed Nay. Have all voted who wish?
8. Take the record. On this question the Ayes are 41, the Nays
9. are 1. Amendment No. 16 is adopted. Amendment No. 17, Senator
10. Regner.

11. SEANTOR REGNER:

12. Mr. President, members of the Senate, 10 and behold this
13. amendment adds sixty-three thousand six hundred and fifty dollars
14. to the Department of General Services' budget ... as an appro-
15. priation for the Dirksen Memorial Bus which was eliminated this
16. year. I move for its adoption.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Egan.

19. SENATOR EGAN:

20. Senator ... Regner, in the memory of Everett McKinley
21. Dirksen, I will support your amendment.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. All in favor say Aye, opposed Nay. Amendment No. 17 is
24. adopted. Any further amendments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill
25. 510, Senator Kenneth Hall.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senator Bill 510.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
30. 2 amendments.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Kenneth Hall.

33. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

1. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Senate
2. Bill 510 is the appropriation for the Department of Labor. ...
3. Amendment No. 1 is the weasel clause and Amendment No. 2 is ...
4. reduces it by the amount of seven hundred and five thousand,
5. three hundred dollars, so I would

6. PRESIDENT:

7. ... Senator Hall moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1. Those
8. in favor say Aye, opposed Nay. Amendment No. 1 is adopted.
9. Senator Hall moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2, any further
10. discussion? Those in favor say Aye, opposed Nay. Amendment
11. No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendment? 3rd ... Any further
12. amendments?

13. SECRETARY:

14. (Machine cut off) by Senator Regner. Amendment No. 3.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Regner is recognized.

17. SENATOR REGNER:

18. Mr. President, members of the Senate, ... here again is
19. another instance where the Governor thumbed his nose at the
20. General Assembly. For fiscal year '75 the office of Collective
21. Bargaining was removed from the Department of Labor Budget. It
22. operated in partial form anyway in that year. Although the
23. O.C.B. supposedly has the power to conduct labor relations for
24. State employees, it is important to note that it was completely
25. by-passed when the Senate employees received ... when the State
26. employees received their one ... one hundred dollar a month
27. raise in fiscal year '75. There is no reason to expect that
28. it will be either useful or effective in fiscal year '76 and ...
29. Amendment ... No. 3 does again remove O.C.B. from the Department
30. of Labor Budget and I would move for its adoption.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Hall.

33. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

1. Thank you, Mr. President. I rise in opposition to this
2. amendment. We have cut this Budget by the tune of seven hundred
3. and five thousand dollars. We need this collective bargaining
4. in here, so I would ask my colleagues to vote no on this amendment.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Any further discussion? Senator Regner moves the adoption
7. of Amendment No. 3 to Senate Bill 510. Those in favor will vote
8. Aye, opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. (Machine cut
9. off) all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the
10. Ayes are 25, the Nays are 29, 1 Voting Present. Amendment No. 3
11. is lost. Any further amendments? 3rd reading. Senator Bill
12. 556, Senator Palmer. Senate Bill 633, Senator Hynes.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Senate Bill 633.

15. (Secretary reads title of bill)

16. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
17. one amendment.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Hynes.

20. SENATOR HYNES:

21. ... This amendment increases the grants for private higher
22. education from 7.2 million to 13.3 million, a 6.1 million increase.
23. I move the adoption of the amendment.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Shapiro.

26. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

27. Mr. President ... Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I
28. think everyone should be aware that this amendment increases the
29. line item concerning the Financial Assistance Act by ... I think
30. approximately six or seven million dollars. Now you should also
31. know that the Board of Higher Education has recommended a 20%
32. increase in this line item for this next fiscal year. With this
33. amendment that will increase, be an increase of 32.3%. It is

1. in far in excess of what our public institutions are receiving.
2. Most of them are getting approximately a 10% increase and I think
3. that this amendment should be rejected.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Hickey.

6. SENATOR HICKEY:

7. ... Mr. President. I would like to echo Senator Shapiro's
8. sentiments on this. I think we should realize that at this
9. point, without this extra seven million dollars that right now
10. the community college students in this State get ... eight
11. hundred seventeen dollars support from the State for F.T.E. and
12. the private college students now for F.T.E. get eight hundred
13. and eighty-two and this would add a great deal more to that. I
14. can see no reason for this addition. We ... we've put the private
15. colleges into work study plan at a lot of extra money and ...
16. probably we're going to increase the ... the average award to the
17. students from thirteen fifty to fifteen hundred and it seems to
18. me that this is going way, way beyond what we should be doing
19. in consideration of what we're doing for public higher education
20. students in this State, and I urge a no vote.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Egan.

23. SENATOR EGAN:

24. Yes, Mr. Speaker and members of the Senate. There are
25. infrequent occasions upon which I can rise in support of the
26. Chicago Tribune Editorial Staff but on March the 16th, nineteen
27. hundred and seventy-five a half page editorial was written in
28. favor of this type of legislation that specifically this ...
29. amendment, however, the ... the concept is supported in the
30. editorial. One of the things, among others which they say is
31. that private schools are needed to keep up higher education ...
32. to keep all higher education up to the standard and quality and
33. independence, among other things and ... private higher education

1 may be virtually destroyed in the United States by ... nineteen
2 hundred and ninety, which is only fifteen years away. This is
3 a very, very modest amount of money in comparison in what we
4 spent on higher education in Illinois ... and I would urge the
5 support of the amendment.

6 PRESIDENT:

7 Senator Buzbee.

8 SENATOR BUZBEE:

9 Well, Mr. President, ... the ... the implication was just
10 made, if we don't vote this additional six million dollars to
11 public ... to rather to private higher education, that it's going
12 to fold up in the State of Illinois. Well, I submit that is not
13 true, in the first place as Senator Shapiro said, the seven
14 million dollars that's already in the budgetary request included
15 a 20% increase for them ... and now we're almost doubling that
16 seven million dollars and jumping it to thirteen million. Now,
17 this isn't the end however, let's don't be fooled into thinking
18 that poor private education is just getting thirteen million
19 dollars from the State of Illinois, because Ladies and Gentlemen
20 we're giving every private college in this State thirteen hundred
21 and fifty dollars per student .. to those ... for those students
22 who have an Illinois State Scholarship scholarship. That amount
23 is going to be raised to fifteen hundred dollars per year and
24 you can bet that that private college if their tuition isn't already
25 at fifteen hundred, it's soon going to be there. Now, we've
26 got to stop somewhere in just continually spending the State's
27 money, whether it be on private education or public education or
28 wherever. Now, the private colleges have never come, to my
29 knowledge ... to the Higher Board of Education or to this Legis-
30 lature, and said, here is our legislative program, here is what
31 we need to survive, we need this kind of support from the State
32 of Illinois. They haven't done that. They have never done
33 that, instead they send letters of ... incredulous letters to ...

1. to me saying, I just can't believe, that you would be opposed
2. to this, it's impossible that anybody who has a head on his
3. shoulders and can think would be opposed to this. They go at
4. it piecemeal. And for whoever comes in and says we need another
5. six million here, another eight million there, another five
6. million here, they don't come in and say here's our program,
7. here's what we need; they go at it piecemeal because they know
8. ~~CRUISEMAN~~ they can tear us up that way, they can get at us one at a time
9. and they keep on getting everything they want ... and this State's
10. going to go broke if we keep on funding what everybody wants
11. that comes in every little package they want. I think this is
12. a terrible amendment and has to be defeated.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Morris.

15. SENATOR MORRIS:

16. My problem with this amendment is somewhat of ... a novice
17. understanding of our entire appropriation system. I understand
18. we have a formula for funding of public education and we also
19. have a formula for funding of community college education. If
20. I understand right we are not even full funding the community
21. college education appropriation this year, yet we're now talking
22. about raising the private college donation from the State. Now,
23. as I understand it ... the State of Illinois created the community
24. college system, the State of Illinois has made several efforts
25. to force communities into junior colleges and community colleges
26. and now we're going to turn our backs on those agencies which
27. we created for higher education, yet we're going to open our
28. arms and our pocketbooks to the private schools. I have several
29. private colleges in my district and I would very much like to
30. get them more money because they're excellent institutions of
31. education. But I think first, we ought to take care of our own
32. children and those of the public community colleges we've
33. created and full fund that formula. The private schools do not

1. want State regulation and control, they only want State money.
2. And I think it's rather silly that we're talking about putting
3. that kind of money into the private colleges without any real
4. justification other than apparently Chicago Tribune Editorial ...
5. and I think it's time that we defeat this big spending attitude
6. we have because some special interest group wants a few dollars.
7. You know, we're going to have to go home after this Session
8. and explain to a lot of voters about all of the money that we
9. gave away. We've given several, I believe thirty million in
10. Senior Citizen tax relief this Session. We're giving five
11. million here and five million there like it's just something
12. that we can just throw around. Now, I am one of the fortunate
13. members of this Senate who don't have to run for re-election
14. in 1976, I believe there are only twenty of us. I have grown
15. fond of some of the people who are members of this Senate in my
16. short term here and I would hate to see some of you not come
17. back because you decided to open the purse strings and give
18. away the money. I think you ought to really think about this
19. vote and vote no on this amendment and let's become responsible
20. about the State funds, you know it is not free money and I for
21. one don't want to vote for a tax increase next year, anyway.
22. And I think we're going to do it because this is not free money
23. and don't forget the community colleges, the institutions that
24. you created.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Dougherty.

27. SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

28. Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, members of the Senate,
29. I rise in support of this amendment. I feel and I have felt for
30. many years, that the backbone of the educational process of this
31. country for many years was the private colleges, the private
32. universities and they have done a tremendous job. Now, we have
33. gone to the process of ... providing education by public means

1. and I do not quarrel with it. However, I do ... I do feel that
2. they've gone far beyond ... what is needed to provide necessary
3. element in education. This is ... a really a definition of
4. freedom of choice. And we exercise freedom of choice you have
5. to pay a little bit for it because that's part of our American
6. system. I think this is a very good amendment and I'm going
7. to support and urge my colleagues to do so.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Knuppel.

10. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

11. I'm not going to take very much time to say this, but I
12. don't have any public universities in my district.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Hynes.

15. SENATOR HYNES:

16. One other point that ought to be mentioned

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Just a minute Senator just a minute Senator. Senator
19. Kosinski ... Senator Chew ... Senator Daley ... let's have ...
20. let's have some order now. Senator Hynes.

21. SENATOR HYNES:

22. One final point that I would mention is that, as part of the
23. Governor's accelerated building program, there was a twelve
24. million dollar one year grant program for remodeling, rehabilitation
25. and capital improvements to private higher education. That
26. program ... in the view of the administration was within the
27. capability of the ... State to afford. That was defeated along
28. with the other portions of the bond program. This is five million
29. dollars, six million dollars less than that appropriation would
30. have been.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Netsch.

33. SENATOR NETSCH:

1. Mr. President, I ... think in good conscience I should state
2. first of all that I have a literal conflict of interest in voting
3. on this amendment, I am employed in PERT by a private university.
4. ... My own resolution of that conflict however, is to vote no
5. on the amendment. It is not because I think that aid and consid-
6. erable aid to private universities is not justified, I think
7. that it is. They are a critical part of the entire program and
8. they should be kept alive and healthy, both to supplement and
9. to compete with the public universities. ... My own conclusion
10. though, is that this particular amount is not justified at this
11. form, in this form and at this time.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Any further discussion? Senator Rock.

14. SENATOR ROCK:

15. Well, as long as we are bearing our souls here this morning,
16. I think I should also point out that I rise in support of this.
17. I attended a private university and I think for the welfare of
18. our State we should fund them to the full extent available.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Any further discussion? The question is shall Amendment
21. No. 1 to Senate Bill 633 be adopted? Those in favor will vote
22. Aye, opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
23. Take the record. On this question the Ayes are 33, the Nays are
24. 20. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments? 3rd
25. reading. Senate Bill 634, Senator Hynes.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Bill 634.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One Floor
30. amendment offered by Senator Weaver.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Weaver.

33. SENATOR WEAVER:

1. Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment would put this
2. money in ... from the General Revenue Fund and I would move
3. its adoption.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Any further discussion? Senator Hynes.

6. SENATOR HYNES:

7. Well, Mr. President, with great reluctance I am going to
8. support Senator Weaver's amendment. ... It may be necessary at
9. ... at a later point in the Session to reconsider this, perhaps
10. in the House. But, at this moment, we must move the bill and
11. without this amendment the bill at the present time is meaning-
12. less. This is a critical area of State support ... for health
13. education and I think that ... we have to get the bill on the
14. road, therefore I will support the amendment ... for the moment.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Any further discussion? Those in favor say Aye, opposed
17. Nay. Ayes have it, the amendment is adopted. Any further amend-
18. ments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1496, Senator Kosinski. Senator
19. Kosinski on the Floor? Are there any amendments? Read the bill.
20. He's on the phone, he'll be right back. Senate Bill 1496,
21. Senator Kosinski.

22. SECRETARY:

23. Senate Bill 1496.

24. (Secretary reads title of bill)

25. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
26. one amendment.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Kosinski.

29. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

30. Mr. President, members of the Senate ... Senator Lemke has
31. an amendment which I agree to. The Senator wants to

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Wait just a minute. Wait a minute. Is this the amendment

1. that you're referring to ... Is this Senator Lemke's amendment
2. that we're addressing at this moment? Let's adopt the Committee
3. Amendment first and then we'll get to his. Is there any discussion
4. on the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1? Those in favor
5. will say Aye, opposed Nay. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted.
6. Any further amendments?

7. SECRETARY:

8. Two Floor amendment, one offered by Senator Lemke and one
9. by Senator Weaver.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Amendment No. 2, Senator Lemke is recognized.

12. SENATOR LEMKE:

13. Amendment No. 2 ... allows ... the money for the purpose of
14. reimbursing Cook County for services of interpreters in a lang-
15. uage other than English. This is to ... provide for the ... court
16. interpreters ... because of the large influx of the ... Spanish
17. and ... people into Chicago we need interpreters and this is to
18. ... allow that sum of money to ... for us to ... give them a
19. trial which ... I think a few Sessions ago we passed a bill that
20. ... to allow for this

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Weaver.

23. SENATOR WEAVER:

24. Thank you, Mr. President. Well this ... Senator Lemke is
25. an increase of three hundred and ten thousand dollars. Right
26. now we've got about, last year we had about forty thousand dollars
27. in for this purpose. Now, you really feel we're going to need
28. another three hundred and ten thousand dollars for this?

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Senator Lemke.

31. SENATOR LEMKE:

32. Well, with the influx of ... of the ... immigrants into the
33. City of Chicago which is I think is the number 1 ... area, we do

1. need the money for interpreters, and ... we have problems with
2. immigration but ... they're here and we have to give them fair
3. trials ... in conformity with our Constitution. We need these
4. interpreters.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Weaver.

7. SENATOR WEAVER:

8. Well, I can see maybe doubling the appropriation to ...
9. maybe eighty or a hundred thousand, but to bring it up to three
10. hundred and fifty thousand, I think it's ridiculous and I'm ...
11. stand in opposition to this amendment.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Any further discussion? Senator Kosinski. Any further
14. discussion? The question is shall Amendment No. 2 be adopted?
15. Those in favor will say Aye, opposed? Ayes have it. Amendment
16. No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments? Amendment No. 3,
17. Senator Weaver.

18. SENATOR WEAVER:

19. Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment would reduce
20. personal services by thirty-one thousand six hundred and sixty-
21. four dollars. Actually, this money is for an assistant director
22. ... in the position of the administrative office of the court.
23. This position has not been filled. It's for a P.R. man and
24. based on the courts ability to get funds out of this General
25. Assembly, I don't think they need a legislative ... liaison man
26. in ... in this ... in the court system. So I would move adoption
27. of this amendment.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Senator Kosinski.

30. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

31. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I opposed this
32. amendment and very strongly so. I have talked to ... the
33. Administrator of the Supreme Court ... and ... he tells me that

1. he is very badly in need ... of a deputy director. The additional
2. assistant director is badly needed, to be located in Springfield
3. ... to assist the director in his duties with the Legislature.
4. It is contemplated that this assistant director be a lawyer who
5. could assist in drafting needed legislation, attended committee
6. hearings, work with the members of the Legislature, who sponsor
7. legislations recommended to the Supreme Court, and perform other
8. duties recommended by the Director. Mr. President, I again
9. urge the defeat of this amendment.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Any further discussion? Any further discussion? The
12. question is shall Amendment No. 3 be adopted? Those in favor
13. will say Aye, opposed Nay. The Nays have it. A roll call has
14. been requested. The question is shall Amendment No. 3 be adopted?
15. Those in favor will vote Aye, those opposed Nay. The voting is
16. open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
17. the Ayes are 28, the Nays are 29. Amendment No. 3 is lost. Any
18. further amendments? 3rd reading. Would Senator Daley come to
19. the podium, please? Any announcements? Senator Egan, for what
20. purpose do you rise?

21. SENATOR EGAN:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. If I'm not out of order, I have
23. filed a motion in writing with the Clerk and I would ask that
24. it be read and ... put into the record.

25. SECRETARY:

26. Pursuant to temporary Rule No. 11, I move to take House
27. Bill 1124 from the Table. Place it on the order of 2nd reading.
28. Signed Senator Robert Egan.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Put it on the Calendar for tomorrow. Senator Egan, they're
31. putting it on for hearing tomorrow. Any ... any further announce-
32. ments? Senator Course.

33. SENATOR COURSE:

1. Yes, Mr. President. The six day rule being in effect, I
2. would like to have unanimous consent to have House Bill 1265

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Course, that rule has been waived for this period,
5. from now until the twelfth of June. (Machine cut off) of June.
6. Senator Daley.

7. SENATOR DALEY:

8. The Senate Judiciary Committee meeting will be held immed-
9. iately after the Republican caucus. 11:00 o'clock.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Now may I have the attention from the membership? The
12. Calendar, I want Senator Graham's attention. Senator Graham,
13. I'm trying to get them quiet. The Calendar calls for committee
14. hearings commencing at 10:30. The Republicans have requested
15. a caucus, which will begin immediately after we adjourn, which
16. will be momentarily ... and Senator Daley has requested that the
17. Committee on Judiciary be rescheduled for 11:00 a.m. And that
18. is the program. Are there any other announcements? Senator
19. Demuzio.

20. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

21. ... I like leave of the body to move House Bill 2998,
22. which is currently on 2nd reading to 3rd reading and I'll bring
23. it back tomorrow for amendments. It's a deficiency appropriation
24. for Education and Registration.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Latherow. ...
27. We've got to read the bill, I'm sorry. 2988. 2998.

28. SECRETARY:

29. House Bill 2998..

30. (Secretary reads title of bill)

31. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations offers
32. one amendment.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Demuzio.

2. SENATOR DEMUZIÒ:

3. I'll move for the adoption of the committee amendment.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. All in favor say Aye, opposed Nay. Amendment is adopted.

6. 3rd reading, with the understanding it can be brought back tomorrow.

7. Senator Course, any further amendments? 3rd reading

8. SENATOR COURSE:

9. Yes, Mr. President, the six day rule having been waived

10. then, Mr. President, I'd like unanimous consent to have House

11. Bill 1265 heard in Revenue Committee tomorrow at 2:30. It's

12. Senator Berning's bill.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Johns.

15. SENATOR JOHNS:

16. Mr. President, Senator Mike Brady has asked permission of
17. the Body to have House Bill 1961 heard today in Executive along
18. with another bill of the same caliber and content.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Kenneth Hall.

21. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

22. ... Mr. President, I'd like to know if I'd be in order to
23. Table a bill?

24. PRESIDENT:

25. State the number.

26. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

27. ... I would like leave of this Senate to have ... House Bill
28. 349 which has been re-referred to the Appropriation Committee,
29. Tabled as it's incorporated in House Bill 1587.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Hall moves to ... discharge the Committee on ...

32. Appropriations from further consideration of House Bill 349 for
33. the purpose of Tabling it. Is there leave? Leave is granted.

1. Now Senator Hall moves to Table House Bill 349. All in favor say
2. Aye, opposed Nay. House Bill 349 is Tabled. Senator Wooten.

3. SENATOR WOOTEN:

4. Mr. President, I heard something go by here about Judiciary
5. being delayed to accomodate a Republican caucus. Is that a
6. caucus of the entire Republican side which will delay all committee
7. meetings? Agriculture is scheduled to meet at 10:30.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Knuppel was ready to be recognized for that point,
10. also. I don't see him at the moment.

11. SENATOR WOOTEN:

12. So Agriculture will meet at 11:00 instead

13. PRESIDENT:

14. At 11:00 also, that's correct. Any committee that's scheduled
15. for 10:30 will meet at 11:00. If we get out of here before 11:00.
16. Any further announcements? The Senate will stand adjourned until
17. 9:00 a.m. tomorrow morning.

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
