14. simply requires all children 12 and under to wear a coast guard
15. approved, float...personal floatation device. The provisions
16. of 13 are identical to those contained in Senate Bill 692 of
17. Senator Demuzio; passed the Senate on May 21st, the implied
18. consent Sections, of which were amended out. There was no
19. opposition to this in the Agricultural Committee. It came
20. out with an 8 Aye, 0 Nay. I know of no dispute with the
21. bill, I would appreciate a favorable roll call.
22. PRESIDENT:
23. Any further discussion? The question is shall House
24. Bill 13 pass? Senator Mitchler.
25. SENATOR MITCHLER:
26. I'm wondering, Mr. President, and members of the Senate,
27. if we're not going a little bit too far here in requiring
28. the actual wearing of a coast guard approved life jacket by
29. all children twelve years of age and under when you're
30. under weigh. It's now a requirement that in any...in any
31. boat, canoe or what you have, whatever you've got out
32. in the water, that you have life jackets, but to require the
33. actual wearing of this, in any type of a vessel. Now, what

1. if you're down, if you're on a pretty good size cruiser and
2. you're down having lunch and you're under weigh. Does that
3. child have to wear that life jacket all during the lunch
4. period? Now, you're getting into something here where you're
5. ...it sounds good that you're protecting the lives of these...
6. these children out there, but I don't know of how many drown-
7. ings we've had of...of twelve year old and under. But it's
8. just like we're having to wear a motorcycle safety helmet
9. when you're down at the beach, and you're going to run a block
10. on the bike to get a pack of cigarettes and you're in nothing
11. but a swimsuit and you'd have to put on a helmet. It just
12. doesn't make sense. Now, I wonder if we're going too far.
13. Take a good look at this before you vote on it. I'm going
14. to vote no.

16. Senator Berning.

17. SENATOR BERNING:

18. Thank you, Mr. President, on page four, starting with
19. line twelve and thirteen and fourteen, the end of line
20. thirteen, is the significant part, it says, "while on deck",
21. this has nothing to do with the below deck occupation.

23. Any further discussion? Question is shall House Bill
24. 13 pass? Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The
25. voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record.
26. Postponed Consideration has been requested. House Bill
27. 15, Senator Berning. House Bill 44, Senator Hall. House
28. Bill 65, Senator Knuppel. Read the bill.

29. SECRETARY:

30. House Bill 65.

31. (Secretary reads title of bill)

32. 3rd reading of the bill.

33.

1. PRESIDENT;

2. Senator Knuppel.

3. SENATOR KNUPPEL;

4. Mr. President, and members of the Body, this bill amends
5. the Code of Criminal Procedure to provide that any person charged
6. with an offense is entitled, when appearing before a Grand Jury,
7. to have...to be represented by counsel. And it provides a state's
8. attorney to inform the Grand Jury of its rights to subpoena
9. and question anyone against whom he is seeking a bill of in-
10. dictment. It's a very simple bill and it provides that anyone
11. who is charged and you have to appear before the Grand Jury is
12. entitled to counsel and I think it's a good legislation and
13. I'll ask for a favorable roll call.

15. Any further discussion? The question is shall House

25. McCarthy. House Bill 164, Senator Harris.

26. SECRETARY:

27. House Bill 164.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 3rd reading of the bill.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Harris.

32. SENATOR HARRIS:

33. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, Senate Bill...I'm

1. sorry, House Bill 164 does essentially just what the
2. Calendar demonstrates. It's the enactment in public policy,
3. and assessment provisions of advantage to encourage the people
4. of Illinois to use this somewhat expensive source of energy
5. for heating and cooling but which expensive, non...this...this
6. kind of energy production, while expensive, we, of course,
7. should encourage its use. This bill would provide for
8. treatment within the assessment procedures to accomplish
9. just that. I would be happy to respond to any questions. I
10. know of no opposition to the bill in its general philosophy
11. and approach, and would encourage and request a favorable
12. roll call.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Any discussion? The question is shall House Bill 164
15. pass? Senator Hickey.

16. SENATOR HICKEY:

17. I wonder if the sponsor would yield for a question?

18. PRESIDENT:

19. He indicates he will.

20. SENATOR HICKEY:

21. Can you refresh us, Senator Harris, on how this was
22. amended?

23. SENATOR HARRIS:

24. Yes. The committee indicated to me that they wanted
25. to make certain that if such solar heating or cooling
26. equipment were no longer used for such purpose, that the
27. owner of the property would have to send notice to the
28. assessor that the use had been discontinued.

29. SENATOR HICKEY:

30. And...and was there a penalty?

31. SENATOR HARRIS:

32. Yes. The same penalty is imposed as we've just lifted
33. the language out of the mobile home privilege tax Section in

1. Revenue. That in those cases where a mobile home, which
2. is used as a permanent abode, is...is changed from a permanent
3. abode to transitory utility. The same language was pulled
4. out of that Act and applied to this.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Any further discussion? Question is shall House
7. Bill 164 pass? Senator Hynes.

8. SENATOR HYNES:

9. I did have a question of the sponsor. It requires notice
10. to the assessor if there is any change in the use of the
11. system. What is the penalty for failing to so notify the
12. assessor?

13. SENATOR HARRIS:

14. A class...

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Harris.

17. SENATOR HARRIS:

18. ...it...as is the case in the law now, it would be for
19. the change in use of a mobile home, used for permanent
20. domicile. This language was just lifted out of that Statute
21. and the...the penalty would be a Class B misdemeanor, for
22. failure to give notice, if the solar heating or cooling unit
23. is no longer used for such purpose. This amendment was
24. requested by Senator Carroll.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Any further discussion? The question is shall House
27. Bill 164 pass? Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed
28. Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take
29. the record. On this question the Ayes are 40, the Nays are
30. none, with 6 Voting Present. House Bill 164, having received
31. the constitutional majority is declared passed. House Bill
32. 165, Senator Donnewald.

33. SECRETARY:

1. House Bill 165.

2. (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. 3rd reading of the bill.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Donnewald.

6. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

7. Yes, Mr. President, it does exactly what the Calendar says.

8. This is exactly the same bill that Senator Latherow had, and
9. passed out several weeks ago. And I would...reduces the number
10. needed to organize as a municipality to two-hundred people.
11. I would urge a favorable roll call.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Question is shall House Bill 165 pass? Those in favor
14. will vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all
15. voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the Ayes
16. are 46, the Nays are none, with none Voting Present. House
17. Bill 165 having received the constitutional majority is de-
18. clared passed.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. House Bill 168, Senator Johns. Read the bill.

21. SECRETARY:

22. House Bill 168.

23. (Secretary reads title of bill)

24. 3rd reading of the bill.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Senator Johns.

27. SENATOR JOHNS:

28. M.. President, and members of the Senate, this amends the
29. River Conservancy District Act. Evidently they feel like that...
30. they want to have the right to appoint an Executive Vice
31. President and add a title to such a district. They already ap-
32. pointed an engineer, an attorney, a manager, treasurer and
33. other engineers and attorneys, and the board determines

1. the salaries. So, I would appreciate a favorable roll call.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. Is there...Senator Bell.

4. SENATOR BELL:

5. Mr. President, members of the Senate, we heard this

6. in committee. It came out of committee ten to nothing,

7. there was no problems with the bill. It seems to be

8. merely one of Senator Johns outlines, of codifying and maybe

9. making more clear, the organizational structure and certainly

10. support him in the passage of the bill.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12. Is there further discussion? Question...the question

13. is shall House Bill 168 pass? Those in favor vote Aye.

14. Those opposed No. The voting is open. Have all voted who

15. wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 38,

16. the Nays are none. House Bill 168, having received a

17. constitutional majority is declared passed. House Bill

18. 169, Senator Brady. House Bill 172, Senator Hall, Kenneth

19. Hall. Read the bill.

20. SECRETARY:

21. House Bill 172.

22. (Secretary reads title of bill)

23. 3rd reading of the bill.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. Senator Kenneth Hall.

26. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

27. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, this bill as

28. amended will add language to Section 9-4. Designate to

29. reduce any potential for any quality in payment for daycare

30. service, made to the Department of Public Aid and the Department

31. of Children and Family Services. Now, Senator Moore put

32. an amendment on this bill and I'll defer to him at this

33. time. Senator Moore.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Senator Don Moore.

3. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

4. Don Moore.

5. SENATOR DON MOORE.

6. Yes, Mr. President, the bill was amended and
7. reversed the procedure whereby family services shall
8. follow the rates set by public aid, rather than public
9. aid following the rates set by family services. On this
10. basis the department has no objection to the bill, nor do
11. I.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Is there further discussion? Question is shall House
14. Bill 172 pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed No.
15. The Voting is open. Have all those voted who wish?
16. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record. On that
17. question the Ayes are 36, the Nays are none, 4 Voting Present.
18. House Bill 172, having received the constitutional majority
19. is declared passed. House Bill 174, Senator Lane. House
20. Bill 178, Senator Egan. House Bill 187, Senator Bell.
21. Read the bill.

22. SECRETARY:

23. House Bill 187.

24. (Secretary reads title of bill)

25. 3rd reading of the bill.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. Senator Bell.

28. SENATOR BELL:

29. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, this bill would
30. eliminate the requirement that the municipalities notifier,
31. notify fire protection or library districts of proposed
32. annexation, when that municipality does not already provide
33. fire protection or library services. Seems to me that the bill

1. eliminates a needless notification procedure and that
2. was the intent of Representative Leinenweber. It came
3. out of committee with no problems. I know of no problems.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Is there further discussion? Senator Glass.

6. SENATOR GLASS:

7. Well, thank you, Mr. President, I'd like to ask a question
8. on this bill.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. He indicates...Senator Bell indicates he will yield.

11. SENATOR GLASS:

12. Senator Bell, now this indicates the synopsis that
13. the provision for notifying a fire protection district
14. or library district of a proposed annexation is no longer
15. necessary. I found that to be a helpful procedure, where
16. the library district, or the fire protection district, is
17. providing services to the territory that's about to be
18. annexed to the municipality. And I'm just a little confused
19. by the synopsis, as to what...in what cases there, there
20. doesn't have to be notification anymore. And it says, when
21. the municipality does not provide fire protection service.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Senator Bell.

24. SENATOR BELL:

25. Well, Senator Glass, is...is there, let me ask you this,
26. first, is there a particular line or series of lines in the
27. bill that bother you? And secondly, to answer your first
28. question as best I can, this bill addresses itself only to
29. fire protection and library districts that are not, as I
30. understand it, not preceding services from other fire pro-
31. tection...

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. Just...just a moment, I think the Senator Bell has clarified

1. it in his own mind. Senator...I mean Senator Glass.

2. SENATOR GLASS:

3. I...I...I think I do understand it, in other words, if you
4. have a municipality that isn't providing any fire protection
5. services and so that the district will continue to provide
6. them, then there's no need for this. Yeah, I understand it
7. and I support the bill.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Is there further discussion? The question is shall House
10. Bill 187 pass? All those in favor say Aye, or indicate by
11. voting Aye. All those opposed vote No. The voting is open.
12. Have those voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
13. the Ayes are 42, the Nays are none, 1 Voting Present. House
14. Bill 187, having received the constitutional majority is de-
15. clared passed. House Bill 190, Senator Bell. Read the bill.

16. SECRETARY:

17. House Bill 190.

18. (Secretary reads title of bill)

19. 3rd reading of the bill.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. Senator Bell.

22. SENATOR BELL:

23. Again, Mr. President, and members of the Senate, this is
24. a relatively simple bill, in that...it's supported by the
25. recorders and all they're asking is being able to raise the
26. amount of their recording fee and these type of transactions
27. from the present three dollars to five dollars and in lieu of
28. the times we're in and the necessity of increasing fees in the
29. recorders' offices. I would ask for support of the Senate,
30. I know of no problems.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Is there further discussion? Question is shall House
33. Bill 190, pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed No.

1. The voting is open. Have all those voted who wish? Take
2. the record. On that question the Ayes are 35, the Nays are
3. 3. House Bill 190, having received the constitutional majority
4. is declared passed. House Bill 191, Senator Bell. Read
5. the bill.

6. SECRETARY:

7. House Bill 191.

8. (Secretary reads title of bill)

9. 3rd reading of the bill.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11. Senator Bell.

12. SENATOR BELL:

13. Yes, thank you, Mr. President, and members of the
14. Senate. Again this is another bill which the recorders
15. are asking to raise the fee, the present fee structure
16. from three to five dollars for the recording of liens and...
17. against the Internal Revenue Service. At present it's three
18. dollars and the fee is paid by the Internal Revenue Service,
19. at present, that three dollar fee is, and if this passes
20. it would be raised to five dollars. There's no problems
21. in committee on it, and I don't know of any problems at this

30. Senator Bloom. House Bill 202, Senator Wooten. House Bill
31. 223, Senator Lemke. You wish to call the bill? Read the bill.

32. SECRETARY:

33. House Bill 22...

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Just a moment, just a moment, take it out of the record.

3. 257, Senator Knuppel. Read the bill.

4. SECRETARY:

5. House Bill 257.

6. (Secretary reads title of bill)

7. 3rd reading of the bill.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Senator Knuppel.

10. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

11. Mr. President, and members of the Body, all this bill does
12. is reduce the age when a parent employing a child has to start
13. paying unemployment compensation in for that child. It lowered
14. it from twenty-one to eighteen, so that it corresponds with most
15. of the other laws, where we've lowered the voting age, et cetera.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall House
18. Bill 257, pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed No.
19. The voting is open. Have all those voted who wish? Take the
20. record. On that question the Ayes are 44, the Nays are none.
21. House Bill 257, having received the constitutional majority is
22. declared passed. House Bill 278, Senator Carroll. House Bill
23. 300, Senator Lemke. House Bill 323, Senator Lemke. Read
24. the bill.

25. SECRETARY:

26. House Bill 323.

27. (Secretary reads title of bill)

28. 3rd reading of the bill.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30. Senator Lemke.

31. SENATOR LEMKE:

32. This is a bill setting up, that's been amended to set up
33. for the third Sunday in August, which is better than the

1. original bill in October, since we'd have a conflict with
2. Senator Citizens' Day and Columbus' Day, and...and there's
3. no holidays in the month of August, and I think the weather's
4. better, and the Senior Citizens will enjoy themselves better.
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
6. Is there further discussion? Senator Mitchler.
7. SENATOR MITCHLER:
8. This is not a Monday holiday is it, it's Sunday?
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
10. Senator Lemke.
11. SENATOR MITCHLER:
12. Can it fluctuate?
13. SENATOR LEMKE:
14. This is Sunday, holiday.
15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
16. Is there further discussion? Senator Kosinski.
17. SENATOR KOSINSKI:
18. Are you going to call this, the Senior Day Picnic Day?
19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
20. Senator Lemke.
21. SENATOR LEMKE:
22. It's going to be called, Senior Citizens' Day. They
23. can do what they want to do on Senior Citizens' Day.
24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
25. Is there further discussion? Senator Schaffer.
26. SENATOR SCHAFFER:
27. Is this the traditional day, or is this just a convenient
28. day for people to go out and have a good time, and not
29. remember the important things?
30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
31. Convenient. Senator Lemke.
32. SENATOR LEMKE:
33. This is not a traditional day, this is a requested day

1. by most Senior Citizens' Groups in the State of Illinois.
2. And they feel...feel that the third Sunday in August is a
3. good day to recognize them for being...for contributing to
4. the State and being...being our Senior Citizens.
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
6. Senator Schaffer.
7. SENATOR SCHAFFER:
8. You mean to tell me this bill was...this State was picked by
9. the vested interest and has no tradition nor historic importance?
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
11. Senator Lemke.
12. SENATOR LEMKE:
13. This...this is just an original day. The history will start
14. when we have the first holiday in August.
15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
16. Senator Schaffer.
17. SENATOR SCHAFFER:
18. But we're only going to have one day for it. We're all
19. going to agree on one day?
20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
21. Senator Lemke.
22. SENATOR LEMKE:
23. That's right. We'll all agree on one day until Congress
24. screws everything up.
25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
26. Senator Berning, did you wish recognition?
27. SENATOR BERNING:
28. Thank you, Mr. President. My question has to do whether
29. or not this would preempt a local day? My Lake County has
30. historically had a day in August. And this is in conformance
31. with the wishes of the Senior Citizen Groups in Lake
32. County. Now, will this mean that we will be celebrating
33. two Senior Citizen Days in Lake County the way we do two

1. Memorial Days in Illinois? Or is this strictly an optional
2. sort of thing? I'm sorry I have not had a chance to read
3. the bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Lemke.

6. SENATOR LEMKE:

7. This is a State commemorative holiday. It's not a
8. mandatory thing. Seniors...that you can...local Governments
9. can set up their own Senior Citizens' Weeks as we do in
10. the City of Chicago and...and give out awards. But this
11. is a day, in fact, that your people in Lake County wanted it
12. amended to. It's at the request of the representatives
13. from your county. In fact, the sponsor of the bill also
14. requested that...this is the day that the Senior Citizens of
15. Lake County have agreed on. So, I mean it's...it's not
16. a mandatory thing but it's in agreement with most Senior
17. Citizen Groups in the State of Illinois.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

19. Further debate? Question is shall House Bill 323 pass?
20. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed No. The voting
21. is open. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record.
22. On that question the Ayes are 42, the Nays are 4. House Bill
23. 323 having received the constitutional majority is declared
24. passed. House Bill 328, Senator Fawell. House Bill 333,
25. Senator Bell. Read the bill.

26. SECRETARY:

27. House Bill 333.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 1st, or 3rd reading of the bill.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Senator Bell.

32. SENATOR BELL:

33. Thank you, Mr. President. Now, we're...got two bills 333 and

1. 340, both are addressing themselves to Public Library
2. District Act, or Representative Sangmeister's bill from
3. my district. Now, specifically in reference to 333, this
4. bill amends the Public Library Act and it deletes the
5. requirement that the election clerk appoint persons who
6. are not election judges to render assistance to voters
7. during election under this Act. Allows the judges at pol-
8. ling place to appoint election judges in case of vacancy. Now, the
9. present language requires that the library district's election
10. clerk to appoint one or more persons in addition to three
11. election judges to provide voter assistance. This partic-
12. ular bill seeks to delete that requirement as unnecessary.
13. The three election judges should be able to assist voters
14. satisfactorily. I think that's about it. No particular
15. problems in the bill.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Is there further discussion? Question is, shall House
18. Bill 333 pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Senator Mitchler
19. for what purpose do you rise?

20. SENATOR MITCHLER:

21. I'd like to ask the sponsor a question. Who appoints
22. the election judges in the first place?

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Senator Bell.

25. SENATOR BELL:

26. Well, the election clerk shall appoint three election
27. judges for each polling place. In the event an election
28. judge declines to serve, or is incapable of serving, the
29. judge present may appoint some other qualified legal voter
30. as election judge. That's the...that's the new language
31. of this bill, it's the election clerk, Senator Mitchler.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. Senator Mitchler.

1. SENATOR MITCHLER:

2. Why cannot the election clerk appoint somebody? Why
3. do we leave that up to the judges if the election clerk is
4. the original appointing authority?

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Senator Mitchler, Senator Bell.

7. SENATOR BELL:

8. I'm sorry, Senator Mitchler, I don't understand the
9. question or the thrust of it.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11. Would you repeat it? Senator Mitchler.

12. SENATOR MITCHLER:

13. Well, the election clerk makes the original appointment
14. of three election judges for each polling place. Now, if
15. one of the election judges declines to serve, or is incapable
16. of serving, it would appear that the election clerk should
17. be the one to appoint someone else. They could be nominated
18. to the election clerk by the election judges. But I...I sort
19. of question and wonder why the election judges should appoint.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. Senator Bell.

22. SENATOR BELL:

23. Well, I don't know that I have any immediate answer for
24. you on that, Senator Mitchler.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Senator Latherow, do you wish to respond? Is there further
27. discussion? The question is shall House Bill 333 pass? Those
28. in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed No. The voting is open.
29. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
30. the Ayes are 41, the Nays are none. House Bill 333 having re-
31. ceived the constitutional majority is declared passed. May I
32. have leave to revert to the order of the Secretary's Desk?

33:

1. We have an emergency situation concerning Senate Bill 1489.
2. Is there leave granted? Senator Hynes. Senate Bill 1489
3. on the Secretary's Desk.

4. SENATOR HYNES:

5. Mr. President, there are two House Amendments to this
6. bill. It is a supplemental appropriation to the Office of
7. Education to pay the claims of school districts under the
8. school aid formula and to pay certain other claims in con-
9. nection with special education. There are also, there's
10. also a limited appropriation for personal services that
11. was necessary because of a mandated increase by the legis-
12. lature last year. There are two amendments, the first is
13. technical. It corrects a two hundred dollar error...math-
14. ematical error in the totals. The second amendment re-
15. distributes the amounts requested for personal services
16. by division. There is no increase in the amount of money
17. appropriated and I would move that the Senate concur in
18. Amendments one and two to Senate Bill 1489.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. The Chair notes that on the Calendar the...I think it
21. is an error, it says, "State Board of Elections", and I
22. think it should be, "State Board of Education". Is that
23. correct, Senator Hynes?

24. SENATOR HYNES:

25. That is correct.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. The Calendar is in error. The question is before the
28. Body, shall amendment...House...the question is shall the
29. Senate concur in Amendment No. 1 and 2 in Senate Bill 1489?
30. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is
31. open. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record.
32. On that question the Ayes are 44, the Nays are none, those
33. Voting Present are none. And...and the Senate concurs in

1. Amendment No...numbers 1 and 2 to Senate Bill 1489, these
2. are House Amendments and the bill having received the required
3. constitutional majority is declared passed. Is there further
4. business to come before the Senate? Senator Rock.

5. SENATOR ROCK:

6. Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 3014 was assigned
7. this morning to the Committee on Appropriations. I'm asking
8. leave to waive the posting notice, if any, and ask that
9. that bill heard on Wednesday of this week in the regular
10. Appropriations meeting. House Bill 3014.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Is there further
13. business or announcements to come before the Senate?
14. Senate stands...Senator Lane.

15. SENATOR LANE:

16. Mr. President, on House Joint Resolution 45, I'd like
17. to be shown as a co-sponsor. It's now on Executive.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

19. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Course.

20. SENATOR COURSE:

21. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to ask the
22. members of the Revenue Committee, to be prompt. Usually
23. we're about a half hour late in starting and it...it ties
24. things up for us. Members that...bills to be heard, are
25. attending other meetings and it's an inconvenience to
26. them so I wish you would be prompt.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Senator Brady.

29. SENATOR BRADY:

30. I would like leave to be named as additional sponsor
31. on House Bill 534 and 964.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. Is there leave? Leave is granted. The Chair wishes to

1. announce that House Bill 3028 will be heard at 10:30 A.M.
2. Tuesday, in the Agricultural Committee. The Senate stands
3. adjourned until nine o'clock, Tuesday, June 10th.
