- 31. Senator Bell.
- 32. SENATOR BELL:
- 33: Thank you, Mr. President. Now, we're...got two bills 333 and

- 1. 340, both are addressing themselves to Public Library
- 2. District Act, or Representative Sangmeister's bill from
- 3. my district. Now, specifically in reference to 333, this
- 4. bill amends the Public Library Act and it deletes the
- 5. requirement that the election clerk appoint persons who
