This is the Omnibus Commission Bill, ... First Conference Committee Report on it and I believe that it is here to resolve the differences between the House and Senate. It provides that the House will concur in all of the Senate amendments to the bill with the following exceptions. The three hundred fifteen thousand dollar appropriation for the Inter-Governmental Information Services... Service is deleted. The Space Needs Commission Appropriation is reduced to seven point five million dollars with the area of concern delineated in the bill. The following items are added to the bill.
