8. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I'd like the...

9. PRESIDENT:

10. One moment, one minute, Senator. I know everybody is glad to see
11. everybody, and you like to visit a little, but we can't hear the gentle-
12. man. Senator Course.

14. I'd like the Journal to show that Senator Kosinski is absent be-
15. cause of illness of himself and his wife is in the hospital with a
16. blood clot.

18. The record will so show. Also, let the record show that Senator
19. Harris is not here today, because of a death in his wife's family.

11. Senator Shapiro has moved for the suspension of the rules for the

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

32. If we can have the attention of the membership, please.

33. SECRETARY:

1. Senate Joint Resolution No. 51 introduced by Senators Partee,
2. Rock and Donnewald.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

4. If we can have the attention of the membership. Senator Partee.
5. SENATOR PARTEE:

6. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is a resolution, a
7. Joint Resolution, which, I understand, may well come over as a House
8. Joint Resolution, also. But, it was a resolution I had planned to
9. go on today, because I would like to get it back to the House for
10. tomorrow, but because Senator Harris is not here, and I've spoken
11. with Senator Graham, I'm simply going to introduce it today, and call
12. it for a motion vote tomorrow, but I wanted to apprise you of what
13. it's about, and I'm going to ask the Pages to pass out copies of it
14. so that you will know tomorrow what we are about when we consider it.
15. The resolution is one which came to my attention in terms of our being
16. in sort of a quandary as to the actual status of the fund balances
17. in the State of Illinois. There's been a great deal of conflicting
18. and, actually, diametrically opposed statements as to how much money
19. is available in our State coffers and what will be available, and I
20. think it's essential to the proper operation of government, that the
21. Legislature be advised and be kept advised of the true financial
22. condition of the State, and on that basis this resolution would address
23. itself to the appointment of a special committee of the Legislature
24. composed of members both of the Appropriation Committees in the House,
25. the Appropriation Committee in the Senate, the Revenue Committee in
26. the House and the Revenue Committee in the Senate as well as another
27. committee in both Houses, a Judiciary Committee, because I think that
28. in the hearings there will be some legal questions raised, and I
29. think we should have some of them present for that purpose. Now, I'm
30. going to ask them to be passed out. I'm only introducing it at this
31. moment, and I want it journalized, but I'm not asking for the immedi-
32. ate suspension of the rules for its adoption today, for the reasons
33. I've already stated.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

2 Senator Partee has moved that Senate Joint Resolution 51 be placed
3 on the Secretary's Desk, and will be handled tomorrow. Senator Graham.

4 SENATOR GRAHAM:

5 Mr. President and members of the Senate. I want to, in behalf of
6 Senator Harris and some of us who prevailed upon Senator Partee to
7 take the action that he has just taken, knowing him as we do in his
8 usual compassionate attitude with regard to these problems, I want
9 to speak in behalf of our leadership and thank you, Senator, and I
10 know that Senator Harris will appreciate it, and we certainly do, too.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

12 All those in favor of the motion to place this Senate Joint Reso-
13 lution on the order of the Secretary's Desk and have it heard tomorrow,
14 signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. So
15 ordered. Introduction of...introduction of bills. Senator...Senator
16 Graham, for what purpose do you arise?

17 SENATOR GRAHAM:

18 A question on procedure, Mr. President, with regard to what we
19 plan on doing with the Introduction of Bills. My schedule says the
20 Assignment of Bills. Are we going to use that procedure, or are we
21 going to send them into Rules Committee? I'd like an answer on that,
22 Senator.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

24 My...my understanding, Senator, is that, under the rules, as adopted
25 by the Senate and the joint rules adopted by the Senate and the House,
26 that appropriation bills will be sent to the Appropriations Committee,
27 or routed through the Assignment of Bills Committee. All other bills
28 will be, upon proper motion, sent to the Rules Committee.

29 SENATOR GRAHAM:

30 Thank you very much.

31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

32 Introduction of bills.

33 SECRETARY:

1. Senate Bill 1508 introduced by Senators Bruce, Partee and Donnewald.
2. (Secretary reads title of bill)
3. 1st reading of the bill.
4. Senate Bill 1509 introduced by Senators Netsch and Wooten.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
8. I wonder if...Senator Partee, do you want them for the purpose of

11. SENATOR PARTEE:
12. I so move, Mr. President.
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
14. Senator Partee has moved that the bills that are of nonappropriation
15. matters will be given a number and assigned to the Committee on Rules.
16. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The
17. Ayes have it. So ordered.
18. SECRETARY:
19. In like manner then, 1509 would go to Rules Committee?
20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
21. Rules Committee.
22. SECRETARY:
23. Senate Bill 1510 introduced by Senators Fawell, Berning, Glass,
24. Shapiro and Clarke.
25. (Secretary reads title of bill)
26. Rules Committee.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

9 Senator Partee.

10 SENATOR PARTEE:

11 For the purpose, Mr. President, of an announcement. I would like
12 to have the members' attention. Several of the members have asked
13 me as to what the balance of the day's schedule is, and I'd like to
14 say it now, so that you can make plans to do other things. When we shall
15 have finished here today, we will, at 2 o'clock, before we finish, we
16 will go into a Special Session for the purpose, as I understand it, of
17 receiving a bill relating to the whole harmless situation, and there-
18 after that Special Session we will finish whatever business there
19 is here today, and at 2:45 we will go to the Floor of the House for a
20 Joint Session. At that Joint Session, at 3:00 o'clock the Governor
21 will speak with reference to the school situation, generally, and
22 as soon as that meeting is concluded we'll return to this Body. If
23 there is work then to be done, we will complete it. If not, there-
24 after we will have, in Room 465 in this building, a Democratic Caucus
25 following the 3:00 o'clock meeting in the House of Representatives.
26 Are there any questions? The Caucus, I said, 465 in this building.

27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

28 Senator Weaver.

29 SENATOR WEAVER:

30 Thank you, Mr. President. In the morning at 9:00 o'clock there
31 will be a Republican caucus in 471. 9:00 o'clock in the morning.
32 In this building, yes.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

1. Senator Graham.

2. SENATOR GRAHAM:

3. Mr. President, I'm sure all of you, and especially lawyers of this
4. Body, will join with our colleague today, Senator Weaver, because
5. as soon after noon, his son, Blake, will be sworn in as a lawyer in
6. the State of Illinois, and I think all of us share the pride that
7. Senator Weaver and his son, Blake, with this accomplishment, and I'm
8. sure we all wish him good luck.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

10. The Chair will remark that I hope he follows advice. Always follow
11. the advice of a lawyer. All right. The Secretary...the Secretary ad-
12. vises me that there will be now passed out telephone numbers where
13. for the balance of this Fall Session, at least, we can be reached by
14. phone, if you care to be reached.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. For what purpose does Senator Graham arise?

17. SENATOR GRAHAM:

18. I presume that I...I would like the attention of the Senate, please.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Graham has the Floor. May he have your attention? Senator
21. Graham.

22. SENATOR GRAHAM:

23. I presume that I bring you good news and sometimes bad news. I
24. think that every member of this Senate needs to know that our former
25. colleague and wonderful gentleman from Peoria, Senator Hudson Sours,
26. went to his Yale class reunion last week and suffered a heart attack
27. on the streets of New Haven, Connecticut. A doctor was following
28. immediately behind Hudson, administered mouth to mouth resuscitation
29. and those things that doctors can do for a patient in that predicament.
30. He was taken to a hospital out there, I do not have the name of it.
31. But we will find it, and my information indicates that a temporary
32. pacemaker was installed at that time. He is in intensive care, and if
33. this is successful to the extent that he gains sufficient strength, then
34. he will be transported back to Illinois for a permanent pacemaker

1 to be installed at that time. I'm sure that all of us can send a
2 silent prayer up for the welfare and the well-being of our dear friend
3 Hudson Sours. Thank you, Mr. President.

4 PRESIDENT:

5 Thank you... For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

6 SENATOR ROCK:

7 I wonder, Mr. President, just for the purpose of clarification of
8 today's schedule. It appears that I have received a message, and I'm
9 sure everyone else has, from the Secretary of State for the Governor's
10 Proclamation, to call us into Special Session at 2:00 o'clock. I
11 have not seen any motions filed with respect to the hundred and forty
12 veto messages that were introduced. So it appears, that we are kind
13 of standing at ease until 2:00 o'clock. I...I wonder if you might
14 clarify what the schedule will be?

15 PRESIDENT:

16 Well, Senator Rock, we have just about, really, finished the morn-
17 ing's work with except for some death resolutions, with the sole ex-
18 ception of a message that we were awaiting from the House. I could
19 tell you what the message is about. The message relates to a
20 Committee of the Whole, a Joint Committee of the Whole, tomorrow at
21 noon on the Floor of the House with reference to the education picture
22 generally, and some specific bills for...which are under consideration
23 for veto overrides. We're waiting for that message, here, if it has...
24 it just has not arrived, and I certainly wanted to journalize it today,
25 but I can tell you what it is about so you can make plans accordingly.
26 At noon tomorrow, on the Floor of the House, for a Joint Committee of
27 the Whole. Now, it also occurs to us, that after the 3:00 o'clock
28 speech, today, by the Governor, there will not be a necessity to re-
29 turn to this Hall for any further business today. The business has,
30 in the main, been cared for, but the only thing that we're aware of
31 that will be taking place after the Governor's speech, is the Demo-
32 cratic caucus in Room 465 in this building. Senator Donnewald.

33 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

1 Well, Mr. President, due to the...relying on what you've just
2 stated about the lack of necessity of our being here after three,
3 as far as the Democratic caucus, the membership will be in the Capitol
4 Building, why...is it possible to have our caucus in Room 400, or in
5 your office?

6 PRESIDENT:

7 Yes, it is, of course, possible to have it there inasmuch as we
8 are in the Capitol Building we could have it in Room 400. That wouldn't
9 make any difference at all.

10 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

11 Well, Senator Bloom says that's their room, but I don't think they'r
12 going to have a caucus at that time, so...

13 PRESIDENT:

14 Their caucus is tomorrow morning, Senator Bloom. You're caucus
15 is tomorrow morning.

16 SENATOR BLOOM:

17 Well, we'll de-bug it.

18 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

19 Well, Mr. President, it's your...your desire then, is to have
20 the caucus at...after 3:00 o'clock in Room 400? Question. It is...
21 then, I understand it is your desire to have the caucus in Room 400 afte
22 the...after the Joint Session does arise. Mr. President...

23 PRESIDENT:

24 I'm sorry, Senator, well, the Parliamentarian was talking...

25 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

26 You're talking to that lawyer fellow up there, Mr. President.

27 PRESIDENT:

28 The Parliamentarian was asking me some questions, and I'm sorry
29 I did not hear...

30 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

31 So was I.

32 PRESIDENT:

33 ...what you said, Sir. You desire to repeat them? I'm sorry.

1. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

2. Well, no, I...it is your desire then, Mr. President, to have the
3. caucus meet after the Joint Session arises, in Room 400 in the Capitol
4. Building. Is that correct?

5. PRESIDENT:

6. That's correct. Room 400 in the Capitol Building. May the Chair
7. have your attention? We, hopefully, have altered the schedule which
8. would permit you, perhaps, to have lunch before we come back into
9. the Special Session. We're going to recess the Session in which we
10. are now engaged until 1:55. At 1:55 we will come back into Session,
11. and we will recess that Session at the hour of 2:00 o'clock for the
12. purpose of the Special Session. We will handle the business of the
13. Special Session at 2:00 o'clock, and thereafter we will go back into
14. this Regular Session. It is contemplated that the entire business for
15. today can be concluded before 2:45, which will then allow us to go
16. from here to the Capitol for the Joint Session at three. Now, are
17. there any questions? We will stand in recess until 1:55.

4 Senator Morris. Senator Morris moves the suspension of the rules
5 for the immediate consideration and adoption of this resolution. All
6 in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopted. Will the
7 members be in their seats. There are a series of death resolutions.

8 SECRETARY:

9 Senate Resolution 154 introduced by Senator Schaffer.

10 PRESIDENT:

11 Senator Schaffer. Senator Schaffer.

12 SENATOR SCHAFFER:

13 I make the appropriate motion to waive the rules for immediate
14 consideration of this resolution.

15 PRESIDENT:

16 Senator Schaffer has moved for the suspension of the rules for the
17 immediate consideration and adoption of this resolution. All in
18 favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopted.

19 SECRETARY:

20 Senate Resolution 155 introduced by Senators Lemke, Romano, Daley,
21 Savickas, Kosinski, and Hynes.

22 PRESIDENT:

23 Senator Lemke.

24 SENATOR LEMKE:

25 I make the motion to move the appropriate rules, have the resolu-
26 tion considered immediately.

27 PRESIDENT:

28 Senator Lemke...

29 SENATOR LEMKE:

30 This is for former Representative Frank Wolfe.

31 PRESIDENT:

32 Senator Lemke...Senator Howard Mohr.

33 SENATOR MOHR:

1. Mr. President, I would suggest that the names of these people
2. that are involved in the resolutions be mentioned, and then in some
3. cases, many of us would like to be on those resolutions.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Is there leave to show all members on this resolution? Leave is
6. granted. Senator Lemke moves for the immediate suspension of the
7. rules and for the immediate consideration and adoption of this reso-
8. lution. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is
9. adopted.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Resolution 156 introduced by Senators Mitchler, Harris and
12. all members. Mr. Glenn D. Palmer of Yorkville, Illinois.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Mitchler.

15. SENATOR MITCHLER:

16. Mr. President and members of the Senate. Glenn Palmer served in
17. State Government in various capacities. He probably is known for
18. his tenure of service as the Director of the Department of Conservation
19. during the terms of former Governor William G. Stratton. I believe,
20. without question, those of us who knew Glenn Palmer, knew him as a
21. man of deep political faith with his political party, but yet recog-
22. nized him to be a man of understanding and compassion for people. I
23. believe, those of you that served in the General Assembly when Glenn
24. Palmer was Director of Conservation, found that his door was always
25. open in that department, that he was willing to take responsibility
26. and assist you in matters relating to that department. He did this
27. in his community and throughout the State of Illinois in whatever
28. capacity he was called upon to serve. Glenn lived a good full life,
29. passing eighty years of age, and he received a proper memorial ser-
30. vice, and which was attended by many dignitaries from throughout the
31. State of Illinois and other parts of our great Nation. So, it is
32. only fitting, I believe, that we do suspend the rules and have immedi-
33. ate consideration and adoption of this resolution in memory of our

1 dear friend, Glenn D. Palmer.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

3 Senator Mitchler has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate
4 consideration of Senate Resolution 156. All those in favor signify
5 by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules
6 are suspended. Senator Mitchler now moves for the immediate adoption
7 of Senate Resolution 156. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.
8 All those opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.

9 SECRETARY:

10 Senate Resolution 157 introduced by Senators Soper, Mohr, Harris,
11 Partee and all members relative to Mr. Victor J. Witt.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

13 Senator Soper.

14 SENATOR SOPER:

15 Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I think you
16 all remember Vic Witt. He was a conscientious man, he followed a strict
17 line as far as morality was concerned, espoused the Policeman's Associa-
18 tion precepts...and he did everything he could for the...for the
19 police and the State of Illinois, and I know he's always been a friend
20 of all the Senators here, and I move for the suspension of the rules
21 for the immediate adoption of this resolution.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

23 Senator Soper has moved for the suspension of the rules for the
24 adoption...immediate adoption of Senate Resolution 157. All those
25 in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it.
26 The rules are suspended. Senator Soper now moves for the immediate
27 adoption of Senate Resolution 157. All those in favor signify by
28 saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution
29 is adopted.

30 SECRETARY:

31 Senate Resolution 158 introduced by Senators Mohr, Harris, Graham,
32 and all members. Relative to a Robert J. O'Rourke.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

1 Senator Howard Mohr.

2 SENATOR MOHR:

3 Yes, Mr. President, I'd like to make a motion to suspend the rules,
4 and then follow with appropriate motion to have the resolution adopted.
5 It is for Bob O'Rourke, who was a friend of many members of this Body,
6 served as the first assistant to William J. Scott, the Attorney
7 General, former Chicago alderman, and just one all around wonderful
8 person, and I'd like, Mr. President, that we, at this time, suspend
9 the rules and adopt this resolution.

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

11 Senator Mohr has moved for the suspension of the rules for the
12 immediate consideration and adoption of this resolution. All those
13 in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have
14 it. The rules are suspended. Senator Mohr now moves for the
15 immediate adoption of Senate Resolution 158. All those in favor
16 signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it.
17 The resolution is adopted.

18 SECRETARY:

19 Senate Resolution 159 introduced by Senator Partee and all members.

20 (Secretary reads Senate Resolution 159)

21 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

22 Senator Partee.

23 SENATOR PARTEE:

24 Thank you, Mr. President. As this resolution reflects, Senator
25 Kusibab served in this Body from 1959 through 1973, a total of four-
26 teen years in the Senate. I was pleased to know him and to respect
27 him. Many of the members here, serving now, perhaps did not know
28 him. I would only say to you, that he was a able representative of
29 his district, and he was a man with a word, he was a man with a very
30 genial personality and a man who gave of himself toward the betterment
31 of mankind. I would move for the suspension of the rules for the
32 immediate consideration of this resolution.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

1. Senator ParTEE has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate
2. consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 159. All those in
3. favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have it.
4. The rules are suspended. All those in favor of the adoption of Senate
5. Resolution 159 will signify by rising. The resolution is adopted.
