SENATOR BRUCE:

9 Well, at one time it was said by a wag that a committee is composed 10 of people who individually can decide nothing. The committee is then a group of those individuals who can jointly decide that nothing should 11 12 be done. I just... I will support this resolution, but I would call the 13 attention of the members a June 9th press release, which stated that the 14 alleged legitimate experts of this State had made their estimates and 15 those estimates were, in fact, correct. We now review again the revenue 16 estimates of the State. I've had a chance to talk to the Bureau of the Budget as late as this morning. I asked them what new data will be 17 18 available to any committee, commission, or member, that is not presently available to that committee, commission or member between now and 19 20 November 6th. The gross national product figures for this month have 21 been released on Thursday by the Federal Government. The quarterly 22 estimates by the Federal Government were released last week. On October the 16th, the Economic and Fiscal Commission issued their last report 23 24 before November the 6th, when this commission is to report back. Bureau of Budget's quarterly report was issued last week. I don't 25 26 know what other figures you're going to get. You're not going to get additional sales tax, inheritance tax, income tax, any of the 27

tax receipts have been received and duly noted in every report.Now I am, like any other member, I am thrilled to death to get

additional information. But if this is going to be a way of theLegislature telling the public one more time, that we want to create

32 another commission or committee to study a problem rather than doing some

thing about it, I would think that I would be opposed. I am confident 1 that the President would not put in that type of resolution, that 2 these eight members will, in fact, meet and have some sort of new approach either in a way of new taxes to be proposed or in a way 3 of new revenues that will be coming into the State. But I want to 4 5 point out to the members that I think that we should be very care-6 ful that the public sometime is going to get very disturbed with this 7 General Assembly, that when everytime we have a problem, we create yet another commission. It's time to solve the problem, not to 8 9 create more commissions. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD) 10 Is there further discussion? The question is... Senator Morris. 11 SENATOR MORRIS: 12 13 I have just one question. We have...I've got a letterhead 14

I have just one question. We have...I've got a letterhead here from the Illinois Economic and Fiscal Commission, and all of the names on that letterhead are Legislators and I just wonder why, you know, why don't they do this or I got a report from them yesterday, but what new is this committee of legislators going to do that that committee of legislators hasn't already done. I think that gives us our control that we're concerned about. If we don't want to believe the Comptroller and if we don't want to believe the Bureau of the Budget, we,in fact, have a Legislative Commission that is...come out with many statements on this economic situation. It seems like we're just being redundant. I...I'd like to know why, what the justification is, Senator Partee.

Is your first question, if I will yield to a question? SENATOR MORRIS:

30 Yes, my first question is would you yield to a question?
31 SENATOR PARTEE:

Yes, I will yield. Now, having heard your question, you don't have to repeat it. I would only suggest to you, and I don't want to

take a long time doing this, that I have become a little disenchanted with the Economic and Fiscal Commission. I almost consider myself one of its parents, because that idea of having an Economic and Fiscal Commission, I saw germination a few years ago and we worked hard to have it. We thought that they would be an independent arm of the Legislature. We find that that is no longer true. They are in concert on a daily basis with the Bureau of the Budget and their figures do not always reflect any independence at all. But rather it's like two men who are playing in a golf tournament and one says if I win first prize and you win second, we'll put the money together and we'll split it right down the middle. They're not an independent arm anymore and I just think it's time that the Legislature itself, eight members of this Legislature made some kind of in-depth study themselves so that we can know what the financial picture of this State is, and that's the only reason for the resolution.

Senator Regner. Oh, Senator Morris.

SENATOR MORRIS:

Just an observation. Some of the members of this...who are going to appoint the new members of this new committee are ... I see Senator Hynes is a member of this Economic and Fiscal Commission, so the people...some of the people who are going to appoint our new committee are, in fact, members of this non-independent agency. As a sidelight I'd just like to point out that maybe the solution is to solve problems in the State of Illinois and abolish the commissions, which seem to spend a lot of time putting out reports, printing a lot of paper and not doing the job. So I would hope that you would, Senator Partee, join me and Senator Daley, who's indicated his interest, and Senator Nudelman and next Spring I hope to introduce a bill to abolish the commissions in the State of Illinois and I hope I will get support from that.
