13. Springfield, Illinois. Proclamation: Pursuant to Article IV,
14. Section 5 (b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby call and
15. convene a Special Session of the 79th General Assembly to commence
16. on November the 18th, 1975, at 2:30 o'clock, P.M., Central Standard
17. Time, for the purpose of considering consideration of legislation
18. relating to (1) The selection of Delegates and Alternate Delegates to
19. the National Nominating Convention of Political Parties. (2) Changes
20. in the formula for distribution of aid to Elementary and Secondary
21. school districts pursuant to Section 18-8 of the School Code, and
22. appropriations, therefore. Signed, Daniel Walker, Governor. November
23. the 17th, 1975.

25. Senator Rock. Will the members be in their seats.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
28. I have placed on the Secretary's Desk, as with the other two Special
29. Sessions, five Senate Resolutions for the Third Special Session to -

5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6 Now, for the information of the Body, we are now going to have

19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20 It would...the Chair would...if necessary have to be read a first
21 time today.

22 SENATOR BUZBEE:

23 It...it will be if it falls within the call, then?

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25 Correct.

26 SENATOR BUZBEE:

27 Thank you.

28 SECRETARY:

29 Bill introduced by Senators Rock, Partee, and Donnewald.

30 (Secretary reads title of bill)

31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32 Rules.

33 SECRETARY:

34 A bill introduced by Senators Bruce, Morris, Joyce, Hickey,
35 Netsch, and Wooten.

3. Title of this offered bill.

34. The Third Special Session. Committee Report.

1. SECRETARY:
2. The Rules Committee of the Third Special Session met at 3:45 P.M.,
3. November the 18th, and authorized the introduction of the bills
4. with the following titles: Senate Bill number 1, introduced by
5. Senators Rock, Partee, and Donnewald.
6. (Secretary reads title of the bill)
7. 1st reading of the bill.
8. Senate Bill number 2, introduced by Senators Bruce, Morris, Joyce,
9. Hickey, Netsch, and Wooten.
10. (Secretary reads title of the bill)
11. 1st reading of the bill.
12. Senate Bill number 3, introduced by Senator Berning.
13. (Secretary reads title of the bill)
14. 1st reading of the bill.
15. Senate Bill number 4, introduced by Senator Berning.
16. (Secretary reads title of the bill)
17. 1st reading of the bill.
18. Senate Bill number 5, introduced by Senators Buzbee, Bruce, Morris, Wooten,

21. The vote of the foregoing bills was unanimous.
22. PRESIDENT:
23. Senator Rock.
24. SENATOR ROCK:
25. Thank you, Mr. President. I would move that the Third Special
26. Session now stand adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.
27. PRESIDENT:
28. All in favor? Third Special...there's a motion to adjourn,
29. which is not debatable. State your Parliamentary inquiry.
30. SENATOR BUZBEE:
31. Mr. President, I was just present at a meeting of the Rules
32. Committee, at which time a sixth bill was reported out favorably by the
33. Rules Committee and I did not hear the Secretary read that bill by title.

1. And I'm wondering if you're going to close this Special Session now,
2. without that bill being read a first time.
3. PRESIDENT:
4. I did hear the Committee Report. I'll ask the Secretary.
5. Did you read the six bills by title? Mr. Secretary.
6. SECRETARY:
7. I did read all the bills by title, however I only read...
8. PRESIDENT:
9. Did...did you read them by title? He said he did read them
10. by title. There were six of them. Did you read off six? Is there
11. another bill to be read. Please read the bill...
12. SECRETARY:
13. Senate Bill number 6, introduced by Senators Buzbee, Bruce, Morris,
14. Wooten, Netsch, Joyce, Hickey, Demuzio, and Bloom.
15. (Secretary reads title of the bill)
16. PRESIDENT:
17. State your...one minute. Senator Lemke.
18. SENATOR LEMKE:
19. Motion to adjourn. That takes precedent over everything else.
20. PRESIDENT:
21. Senator Rock...
22. SENATOR LEMKE:
23. You can't be calling...any other bills.
24. PRESIDENT:
25. Senator Rock made the motion. He seeks to be recognized. Senator
26. Rock.
27. SENATOR ROCK:
28. Yes, I...I will hold that motion til that bill is read.
29. There was no intent at all to shut off the report of the Committee
30. on Rules. It was agreed unanimously that all six bills would be ordered
31. out of the Rules Committee and ordered read a first time and that...that
32. was the point of my motion.
33. PRESIDENT:

1. Continue with the reading of the sixth bill.

7. SENATOR ROCK:
8. Now, if there's no further business, I would move that this
9. Special Session stand adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow
10. morning, or whatever hour the Chair desires, tomorrow morning.

12. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. Third Special Session is
13. adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning. Pardon me, this Third
14. Special is adjourned until 11 o'clock tomorrow morning. Is there any...
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
