32. Wednesday and Thursday there is an inaugural preparedness and
33. an actuality in the Capitol of our Nations, Washington, D.C..

1. Some of us had planned to attend these festivities and by the
2. same token, we firmly feel that there would not be a...legislature
3. in Session for at least those two days. I would ask my colleagues
4. to reconsider that factor and take some steps to amend their
5. ways. Some of us do plan to go and naturally we would not want
6. to be here...away if you were going to have continuation of
7. business, and yet we would not want to be disappointed or
8. ...disappoint some of our constituents in the proposals that
9. we have pertaining to the trip. I would just to remind that and
10. ask them to respond please.

11. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

12. For what purpose does Senator Knuppel arise?

13. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

14. On a point of personal privilege, too. I concur in what
15. Senator Chew has said. It's been a matter of common courtesy
16. here when something of this stature where people have people
17. made plans for it, have participated in National politics as
18. same as here that that courtesy has been extended. We want to
19. participate, we want to...we want to partake. We've been here,
20. we've...we've waited, we've attempted to work this thing out.
21. We at three o'clock today more than a week after the start of
22. this Session first received what some of the people here thought
23. they wanted as a part of this group, and I...I don't think that
24. the Hall will fall apart for the two days that some of us who would
25. like to partake in one inauguration in our lifetime in which we
26. have planned with our families. If you could, change the date,
27. reconsider and vote no and change the date to Saturday morning
28. or Friday morning at ten o'clock. I'm willing to stay here tonight
29. and work.

30. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

31. For what purpose does Senator Soper arise?

32. SENATOR SOPER:

33. Well, thank you, Mr. ...Mr. Governor, but I think that...I

1. think it would be more feasible if we adjourn this till the...some-
2. time in February. We're not going to do anything here tomorrow,
3. and we're not going to do anything next week till, and if we're
4. going to have these...these votes, we're not going to get any
5. place with this thing. If...people have to think it over, and
6. I think that we ought to come back, say about the...
7. about the 2nd or...2nd or 3rd of February, and we give every-
8. body a chance to think it over. Let them go to see Carter.
9. I'm all for it.
