5. seem to be speechless outside of this Chamber, some of them,
6. but here they can...here they can negotiate in great detail,
7. so I'm going to move for a recess till five o'clock.

9. Now...now, Senator, first of all let me announce the

23. matters and we had to come back for a roll call and I think
24. the point ought to be made that we really can't negotiate
25. during a roll call, so I think we ought do one or the other,
26. but the two are mutually exclusive at this point.

28. Senator Morris,

29. SENATOR MORRIS:

30. Thank you, Governor. It's very seldom that I agree
31. with John Knuppel on the Floor or off the Floor, in caucus,
32. or anywhere else in Illinois, but I think that was a tremendous
33. suggestion on Senator Knuppel's part and whatever I can do

1. to proceed along this matter, \. Senator Knuppel, it was
2. terrific. Lets, \. can we have a vote on the recess?

3. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

4. There's a motion to recess until five o'clock,
5. Senator Shapiro,

6. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

7. Well, Governor, we have had so many recesses and, \. and
8. delays and the roll calls over the past three weeks that
9. this side of the aisle is getting just a little impatient.
10. Now, it just seems to me that progress could have been made
11. in the past, it could have been made over the four day recess
12. that we took from last Thursday, \. It could have been made
13. during a three hour recess that we took just a short time
14. ago. This side of the aisle feels that we ought to continue
15. with our business of electing, \. There are thirty-four votes
16. on that side of the aisle and if we, \. to, \. to us we just
17. think this is just delaying tactics, that nothing will be
18. resolved and if several of them want to go off the Floor
19. to hold a private caucus amongst themselves to try to get
20. the thing resolved, well and good, but let's continue the
21. roll calls or another suggestion, if that side of the aisle
22. wants to call a caucus and all of them sit down and iron out
23. their differences maybe that's the way it should be done.

24. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

25. I \. I appreciate your suggestions, Senator Shapiro,
26. but there's a pending motion on the Floor that I'm going
27. to have to put to a vote. Senator Knuppel, \.

28. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

29. Let me say this. I've been an advocate since the start
30. of this thing that we all get in one room, \. In fact, I'd
31. love to go in a room with the other thirteen and just stay
32. there until we got the thing settled, and I'm not afraid of
33. a caucus, I'd like to have them come in there, but they don't

1. get in there for some reason. I think that's the way to
2. settle it too, Senator Shapiro.

17. SENATOR BERNING:

18. Governor, I have a point of inquiry. Do I understand
19. you have ruled that a constitutional majority of the members
20. elected to this Body is the necessary vote by which a President
21. shall be designated?

22. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

23. Senator, I have not explicitly so ruled. That has been
24. the implicit rule of all of my roll call announcements.

25. SENATOR BERNING:

26. Well, Mr. Governor, calling your attention to the new
27. Illinois State Constitution, Article 4, Section 6...

28. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

29. Well, Senator, If I may...if I may...

30. SENATOR BERNING:

31. ...paragraph B...

32. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

33. ...interrupt you for just a moment. My parliamentarian

1. reminds me that at the beginning of this Session I did ex-
2. plicitly state that thirty votes would be required, yes.
3. Now, go ahead.

4. SENATOR BERNING:

5. Then, your Excellency, I'd like to appeal the ruling
6. of the Chair. No where, Mr. Governor, does it say that it
7. takes a constitutional majority. Let me read you paragraph
8. B. "On the first day of the January Session of the General
9. Assembly in odd numbered years, the Secretary of State
10. shall convene the House of Representatives to elect from its
11. membership a Speaker of the House of Representatives as pre-
12. siding officer and the Governor shall convene the Senate to
13. elect from its membership a President of the Senate as pre-
14. siding officer." No where there or anywhere else does it re-
15. quire a constitutional majority. We are not operating under
16. Senate rules, we are not, really, operating under Roberts
17. Rules of Order and, Mr. Governor, I submit that the candidate
18. with the highest vote total legally, legitimately, rationally
19. must be declared the President of the Senate, and consequently
20. we...we are at a stalemate under the present proceedings. This
21. Senate is doing itself publically or individually no good.
22. The members of our community are distressed with our lack of
23. ability to address ourselves to the the business of the State
24. solely because there is no ability on the part of the membership
25. to agree on who is the President. So, Mr. Governor, I submit
26. the ruling of the Chair must be that that individual with the
27. most votes is declared...is to be declared President and con-
28. sequently I appeal the ruling of the Chair and would ask for a
29. roll call.

30. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

31. Senator, I...I respect that and I'll hold it in abeyance
32. for just a moment to allow me to explain the rationale for my
33. requirement of thirty votes. This was a matter that was given

1. a great deal of consideration by me, by my counsel and by
2. my parliamentarian before the opening of the Senate Session
3. and it was our unanimous conclusion that Senate history,
4. Senate tradition and a respect for the spirit of the con-
5. stitution required the imposition of a constitutional ma-
6. jority and that was my reason for so ruling. Senator Carroll.

7. SENATOR CARROLL:

8. In commenting, also, I see Senator Shapiro has arisen
9. and he may be a less than reluctant bride in this matter.
10. I would suggest to his Excellency that were an appeal to be
11. a proper procedure under the rules under which we are operating,
12. he is a hundred and forty-five roll calls late in appealing
13. the ruling of the Chair.

14. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

15. He also may be a few votes short, Senator Carroll,
16. Senator Maragos.

17. SENATOR MARAGOS:

18. My inquiry was the same and my point of order was going
19. to be the same as Senator Carroll just expressed. Thank you.

20. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

21. Senator Glass.

22. SENATOR GLASS:

23. Thank you, Governor, I just wonder if, if what those
24. two attorneys are saying is that Senator Berning is guilty
25. of latches.

26. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

27. What...what team does he play on, Senator? Senator
28. Shapiro.

29. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

30. Governor and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, not-
31. withstanding the good intentions of my colleague, Senator
32. Berning, I would also like to remind the Chair and the members
33. of the Senate that there was a consensus amongst the nominated

1. candidates that thirty votes were necessary to elect a
2. President and...and to do otherwise, I think, would demean
3. the process and the election to a person to that office. I
4. would like to point out that thirty votes are not unattainable.
5. The other side of the aisle has thirty-four votes. Almost
6. two...three-fifths of this Body and they ought to be able to
7. come up with a consensus candidate.

8. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

9. Senator Berning, do you still press your appeal from the
10. Chair's ruling?

11. SENATOR BERNING:

12. On the good intentioned advice of my counsel over here, yes,
13. I will withdraw the motion taking the liberty to reiterate that
14. what we are doing is a disservice to this Body, to each of
15. its members and to the general public and I would admonish
16. the members on the other side to get with it and let's elect
17. a President.

18. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

19. Senator Wooten.

20. SENATOR WOOTEN:

21. Your Excellency, I...I would simply like to console Senator
22. Berning to the greatest extent possible to remind him that not
23. all events are wholly bleak. There is some good in every event.
24. I would remind you that really the time a decision takes is not
25. nearly so important as the quality of the decision itself and
26. we need only...we need only look back to our problems with
27. executive overtime and a few other considerations. I think if
28. we could all turn the clock back we would wish we had spent a
29. good deal more time on those things. So, the amount of time
30. isn't all...all that important. We're all missing a little
31. vacation, but I think it's time well spent.

32. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

33. The Governor is missing a little more than that, Senator

1. Wooten, but with that...that postscript, Senator Soper.

2. SENATOR SOPER:

3. Thank you, Governor. To Senator Wooten I would say, in
4. the old Chautauqua they used to say "next week we play East
5. Lynn."

6. GOVERNOR THOMPSON:

7. No other Senator desiring recognition we'll proceed with
8. the call of the roll for the election of a permanent President.
9. I'm sorry...Senator Ozinga, I'm sorry.

10. SENATOR OZINGA:

11. Well, I was just listening to Senator Wooten talk about
12. quality of a decision. Maybe it would be wise for the Democrats
13. to invite the Republicans into their caucus.
