23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOYCE)

24. Senator Hickey.

25. SENATOR HICKEY:

26. Thank you, Mr. President. I resist this amendment  
27. inasmuch as it really negates the purpose of this bill,  
28. which is to do away with bounties which are not a scientific  
29. way of controlling population even of predators. Bounties  
30. encourage the taking of animals on a random basis and have  
31. nothing to do with approaching the problem of too many  
32. groundhogs or woodchucks, I just found that out that that's  
33. all the same thing, where they do need to be destroyed.

1. The Department of Conservation is willing to help anyone who  
2. has a woodchuck or groundhog problem in controlling it, in  
3. getting rid of them, in a scientific and effective  
4. way. Two or three years ago, we took the bounties off  
5. of foxes and crows because it is a...because simply  
6. bounties are in an anachronistic way of trying to control  
7. a population. Now, we're asking that it be taken off of  
8. groundhogs and we want it the same all over the state. This  
9. is not to preserve groundhogs, if they're a nuisance, we  
10. encourage getting rid of them. But, this is not an effective  
11. way to get rid of them and so I would ask that you resist  
12. this amendment.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

14. Any further discussion of the amendment? Senator  
15. John Davidson. Senator Rock, you're next. Senator John Davidson.

16. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

17. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I'd like to  
18. rise in support of this amendment. I have been a past County  
19. Board Chairman who went through this situation of bounty and  
20. no bounty in relation to foxes which was mentioned. This  
21. bill takes away the option of what the county board can do  
22. under the old situation, the county board had that option.  
23. They know that their local problem is and if any of you have  
24. been out across a field and had to go out and shoot a  
25. horse or a steer that broke a leg from sticking it in a  
26. groundhog hole, then you would appreciate the genius of this  
27. amendment. And I urge all of you to vote in support of this  
28. amendment. It leaves it to the option of the county board.

17. in lieu of thereof, the following, is amended to read as  
18. follows and then that's where it goes to giving the county  
19. board of any county in this state the authority to allow  
20. bounties on groundhogs as they deem reasonable. Provides  
21. such board shall enter into an order setting forth the amount  
22. of such allowance for any one year which the bounty  
23. shall be paid thereof. So, it allows each county to have  
24. the authority which they do in Coles County to...they have  
25. the authority now and we want to continue to have the  
26. authority to be able to allow bounties to be paid in our  
27. area. We have an agriculture area, we have many of our  
28. buildings that are destroyed, foundations destroyed by...by  
29. groundhogs. This is our concern and we just want  
30. the authority in the county to be able to do this.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

32. Senator Rock.

33. SENATOR ROCK:



1. Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the sponsor

20. That concludes Senator Rock's questioning. Any further  
21. discussion? Senator Rock, you still have some more?  
22. Okay.

24. Yeah, what about Section 2? Is that a new section or is  
25. that just repeating what's already there?

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

29. Her bill eliminated one, two,...Sections 1, 2, and 3.  
30. This bill just puts back Sections 2 and 3.

31. SENATOR ROCK:

32. I see. Thank you, very much.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

1. Any further discussion of the amendment? Senator  
2. Mitchler.  
3. SENATOR MITCHLER:  
4. Mr. President, I have a question of the sponsor of the  
5. amendment.

9. Senator Coffey, the one question. Who now pays the

21. SENATOR MITCHLER:  
22. Well, then you've got a good amendment.  
23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

27. I'd like to say that the same result would be achieved  
28. that the amendment provides for if the bill in itself is

32. exactly what we're trying to take out which is the bad law on  
33. the Statute books that is anachronistic, that is antiquated

1. and is ineffective and that has nothing to do with getting
2. rid of groundhogs. I'm all for getting rid of them where
3. you want to get rid of them, but do it by scientific methods,
4. do it so that you aim in at the groundhog that's doing the...
5. doing the damage, not just encouraging people to go out
6. and shoot groundhogs where they aren't doing any damage.
7. It's...it's because it's anachronistic and we shouldn't have
8. laws on our books that are antiquated and purposeless and
9. so therefore, I ask that the amendment be defeated.

26. section that is wrong can be republished within thirty

27. days and they can right the wrong. As introduced, the bill

28. was aimed at smaller communities but in the course of the

29. hearing in the committee, the committee members indicated

30. that they felt it would be better to keep the bill uniform

31. throughout the state and that the problem probably existed

32. in large towns as well as small. Simply put, the problem

33. is that many of the municipal ordinances are quite involved

1. and that the municipal attorneys and the attorneys  
2. representing developers and citizens groups are having  
3. a difficult time responding and getting it published within  
4. ten days. There was a section in there which involved  
5. the publication of pamphlets in lieu of advertising.  
6. The Press Association reacted negatively to that and that  
7. has been deleted and I know of no objections.

22. Senator Schaffer.

23. SENATOR SCHAFFER:  
24. No, no. The ordinances involved don't become  
25. effective, it's my understanding until after publication.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
27. Senator Carroll.

28. SENATOR CARROLL:  
29. So that our record is clear, you are sure then,  
30. that no ordinance will become effective until after  
31. publication?

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
33. Senator Schaffer.

1. SENATOR SCHAFFER:
2. It's my understanding, Senator Carroll, that these...  
representing developers and citizens people are have
3. these type of ordinances cannot become effective  
representing and citizens and people of citizens
4. until publication.
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

1. between ten and ten thousand and over. We delete that and  
2. it just...all municipalities have the thirty day time  
3. period and they also have the possibility that if an  
4. error is made in publication that they can, within  
5. another thirty days, react and correct the publication  
6. by publishing that portion of the ordinance that was in  
7. error.

8. SENATOR BOWERS:

9. Then, up to the adoption of this type of bill,  
10. municipalities can publish in pamphlet form. If this  
11. bill is adopted, they will not be able to publish in  
12. pamphlet form. I'm not sure I understand the...

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

14. Senator Schaffer.

15. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

16. No, no. This does not affect that. As a matter-of-  
17. fact, as it turned out, they only reason the publication  
18. pamphlet language was there was to reprint it if we  
19. created a second type of city of ten thousand or under  
20. and since we aren't doing that, that language became  
21. superfluous.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

23. Senator Bowers, you have any further questions?

24. Senator Rock. The Chair recognizes Senator Rock for  
25. questioning.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Yeah, frankly, Senator, I am a little confused.  
28. I...I don't...the purpose of the bill seems to be defeated  
29. by virtue of Amendment No. 2 and I...you know, the  
30. substance of the bill as introduced was contained in lines  
31. sixteen to twenty-eight. Amendment 1 was added in  
32. committee and then Tabled and now Amendment No. 2 totally  
33. rewrites the bill. And I frankly, have lost track and I  
34. am not prepared to vote in favor of Senate Bill 66 at this

1. point.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

3. Senator Schaffer.

4. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

5. I think I'd like to take it from the record and  
6. talk to Senator Rock because I think the situation is not  
7. as complicated as he might think.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

9. The bill will be held on 3rd reading. The Chair  
10. wishes to recognize the President, Senator Hynes.

11. SENATOR HYNES:

12. Members of the Senate, if I may have your attention  
13. please. We have a special guest with us today, from  
14. Great Britain, the British Deputy Council General,  
15. Mr. Henry Sturdy. I would ask that he say a few words  
16. to the members of the Senate.

17. MR. STURDY:

18. Thank you, Senator Hynes. It's a great privilege  
19. indeed to be accorded the opportunity of standing here  
20. before the Illinois Senate and I bring to you with a  
21. great deal of sincerity the good wishes of Her Majesty's  
22. government in London. This is my first visit to Springfield  
23. of Mr. Lincoln and my first visit to this very beautiful  
24. building. We don't enjoy such oppulent surroundings  
25. in the Consulate General in Chicago, although we've been there

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
4. Senate Bill 99, Senator Knuppel. Read the bill,
5. Mr. Secretary.
6. SECRETARY:
7. Senate Bill 99.
8. (Secretary reads title of bill)
9. 3rd reading of the bill.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
11. Senator Knuppel.
12. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
13. This is one of the bills that's designed to correct
14. language with respect to making parents equal. It changes
15. the term mother to parent so that a husband will be
16. treated...or father be treated in the same manner
17. as a mother and it's been checked out with the Public
18. Aid people and they have no objection to it. This bill
19. was introduced and passed the House last year.
20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
21. Any discussion from the Floor? The question is shall
22. Senate Bill 99 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those
23. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted
24. who wish? We will. We'll hold it. Let's get in order.
25. Get in your chairs. And there won't be such a scramble.
26. Is that right, Senator Kosinski? Good...good pupil.
27. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
28. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 51,
29. the Nays 0. Senate Bill 99 having received a constitutional
30. majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 101. Senator
31. Knuppel. Yes.
32. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
33. I'd like to return Senate Bill 1...101 to 2nd reading

1. for an amendment,...

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

3. All right.

4. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

5. ...a technical amendment.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

7. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senate Bill

8. 101 is now on 2nd reading.

9. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

10. Mr. President...

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

12. Pardon me, Senator Knuppel. The Secretary asks

13. a little time right here. He'll be right with you.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Knuppel.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

17. Senator, will you explain the amendment, please?

18. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

19. Yes, these bills as I've said before, passed the

20. House in the last Session and what apparently happened

21. was the old seventy-three code was used and the date of

22. April 29th, 1975 was not in the bill which is the

23. correct date for the end of the Viet Nam struggle

24. and I therefore, have a technical amendment which has

25. been distributed which corrects it by deleting the date

26. of March 28th and inserting the date of April 29th, 1975.

27. I move the adoption of the amendment.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

29. Senator Knuppel moves the adoption of Amendment No.

30. 1 to Senate Bill 101. All those in...wait a minute. Any

31. further discussion from the Floor? All those in favor

32. say Aye. All those opposed say Nay. The motion is adopted.

33. Any further amendments from the Floor?

1. SECRETARY:  
2. No further amendments.  
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
4. 3rd reading. Senator Knuppel. You want to call the  
5. next...  
6. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
7. No further...I want it on 3rd reading. But, I think  
8. we have to have intervening business.  
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
10. Yes, we do Sir.  
11. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
12. So...  
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
14. You have another bill there. You want to call  
15. another bill?  
16. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
17. 108.  
18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
19. 108. Mr. Secretary, read the bill. Do you want to recall  
20. that one also?  
21. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
22. Just 2nd reading for a technical amendment.  
23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
24. Is leave granted? Leave is granted, Senator Knuppel.  
25. The bill is now on 2nd reading.  
26. SECRETARY:  
27. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Knuppel.  
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
29. Senator Knuppel.  
30. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
31. There's...there's a need to insert the words, and  
32. developmental disabilities between the words...word health  
33. and which in line twenty-eight. I move the adoption of the

1. amendment.
2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
3. ~~PRES~~ Any further discussion of the amendment? Senator
4. Knuppel moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate
5. Bill 108. All those in favor say Aye. All those
6. opposed say Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any further
7. amendments from the Floor?
8. SECRETARY:
9. ~~THE~~ No further amendments.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
11. ~~THE~~ No further amendments, Senator Knuppel? 3rd reading. Now, you
12. want to go back to...wait a minute. He's got 120.
13. Let's get that one too, Senator Knuppel. He...he asked
14. leave to move the bill back to 2nd reading?
15. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
16. Yes.
17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
18. For the purpose of amendment. Leave granted?
19. Leave is granted. 2nd reading.
20. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
21. Now, when this bill came up, there had been some
22. changes in here...in the language other than the sex
23. changes and there should not have been and what this
24. amendment does, someone...someone of the Senators objected
25. to the word heirs being changed to lineal decedents
26. which it should not have been. This amendment will put
27. back the original phrase of heirs being...rather than
28. lineal decedents. I don't know why the change in the
29. first place. There...that was not the purpose of the bill.
30. I therefore, move the adoption of the amendment.
31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
32. Any further discussion of the amendment? Senator
33. Knuppel moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate

1. Bill 120. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed  
2. say Nay. -The amendment is adopted. 3rd reading. Any  
3. further amendments...wait a minute. Any further amendments  
4. from the Floor?
5. SECRETARY:
6. No further amendments.
7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
8. No further amendments. Sorry, Mr. Secretary.  
9. 3rd reading. Now, do we have all those corrected,  
10. Senator Knuppel, that you wish to correct? And can we  
11. go back now to Senate Bill 101, which is now on 3rd  
12. reading. Senator Knuppel. Let's see. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
13. SECRETARY:
14. Senate Bill 101.  
15. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
16. 3rd reading of the bill.
17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
18. Senator Knuppel.
19. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
20. Well, what this bill does is...is it gives  
21. equal status to a surviving spouse rather than just  
22. a widow and includes the Viet Nam as a qualifying  
23. for services, superintendent of veterans assistance is the  
24. basis for it. And I think this is a good bill. It brings  
25. the legislation up to date and I would appreciate a favorable  
26. roll call.
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
28. Any further discussion? Senator Knuppel moves  
29. the adoption of...Senate...I mean he moves...let's just  
30. vote on it, Mr. Secretary. The question is shall Senate  
31. Bill 101 pass. All those in favor vote Aye. All those  
32. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open, Mr. Secretary.  
33. Have all those voted who wish? I will. I will wait.

1. One more time. Have all voted who wish? All right.
2. Mr. Secretary, take the record. On that vote...on that
3. question the Ayes are 50, the Nays are 0. Having received
4. the constitutional majority, Senate Bill 101 is declared
5. passed. Mr. Secretary, Senate Bill 108. Read the bill.
6. SECRETARY:
7. Senate Bill 108.
8. (Secretary reads title of bill)
9. 3rd reading of the bill.
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
11. Senator Knuppel.
12. SENATOR KNUPPLE:
13. This bill deals with correcting the situation
14. where a person who is committed is the custodian over
15. a child. It used to read any woman. Now reads any
16. person having custody of a child at the time of commitment
17. and goes ahead and then says any woman giving birth
18. to a child after commitment may arrange through the
19. department, and so forth. So, what it does is correct
20. the language so that a person having custody of a child is
21. treated the same as a woman having custody of a child.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
23. Any further questions from the Floor? All right. Now,
24. the question is shall Senate Bill 108 pass. Those in favor
25. vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.
26. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
27. Mr. Secretary, take the record, please. On that question
28. the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none. The bill having
29. received the constitutional majority is declared passed.
30. Senate Bill 120, Mr. Secretary.
31. SECRETARY:
32. Senate Bill 120.
33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 3rd reading of the bill.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

3. Senator Knuppel.

4. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

5. This bill again, is designed to treat men and women

6. in the same category and this is the one where

7. there's benefits under the bridge contracting act.

8. But, it changes the language from widow to a surviving

9. spouse.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

11. A question from the Floor from Senator Harber

12. Hall.

13. SENATOR HALL:

14. Would the sponsor yield for a question?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

16. Senator Knuppel. He will.

17. SENATOR HALL:

18. Senator Knuppel, I note today again, this concludes

19. another series of bills intended to eliminate sex

20. reference in our Statutes and therefore, try and eliminate

21. discrimination against women wherever we find it.

22. I wonder if you would be good enough, Senator, to furnish

23. at least me and perhaps other members of the Senate with

24. a summary of the bills that you successfully passed this

25. year that do in general what you do here with this bill.

26. I only use this as I see it's the last of the series.

27. You probably have others coming. It would be very helpful

28. for me to explain to my constituency that this Body

29. does what so many people think we can do and should do

30. and that is legislate and eliminate discrimination

31. legislatively rather than trying to pass a simple phrased

32. amendment to the Federal Constitution which wipes out

33. some good that we have, some protections for women at the

1. same time that it is intended to eliminate some  
2. discriminatory provisions of law throughout the country.  
3. I think we're doing it the right way and I think many  
4. people do and if you could summarize what you are doing  
5. here today, it would be helpful for me.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

7. Senator Knuppel.

8. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

9. I will be happy to have a summary prepared. We have  
10. a lot of bills that just went to 3rd today. After all these  
11. bills have been disposed of one way or another, I'll be  
12. happy to furnish a summary so that you have it, each  
13. Senator has it of what these bills contained and what  
14. they did.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

16. Any further discussion from the Floor? The  
17. question is shall Senate Bill 120 pass. All those  
18. in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote No. The voting is  
19. open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?  
20. Take the record, Mr. Secretary. On that question, the Ayes  
21. are 57, the Nays are none, the bill having received  
22. the constitutional majority is declared passed. Senator  
23. Hickey, do you wish to call Senate Bill 164? No.  
24. Hold the bill, Mr. Secretary. Senator Vadalabene.  
25. Senator Vadalabene, 179. All right. Then we'll have  
26. to pass that one over. Senator Bowers, Senate  
27. Bill 216. Pass over. Okay. Senator Netsch, Senate Bill  
28. 219. Senator Netsch. You guess not. Okay. Senate Bill  
29. 229, the honorable Senator Rock. No. Senator Grotberg,  
30. 300. You wish to call the bill. He does. Mr. Secretary,  
31. read the bill.

32. SECRETARY:

33. Senate Bill 300.



1. (Secretary reads title of bill)  
2. 3rd reading of the bill.  
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
4. Senator Grotberg.  
5. SENATOR GROTEBERG:  
6. Yes, Mr. President; Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
7. Senate. Senate Bill 300 is the bill that adds to the  
8. language of the Illinois Welfare and Rehabilitations  
9. Services Planning Act. The substantive issue that they  
10. should also when they report their plan, report on  
11. recent court decisions that will have been of a  
12. fact on their particular department. We are now  
13. addressing the Department of Children and Family Services  
14. and several of the other social service departments.  
15. In...they have a three year planning process in which  
16. they're supposed to tell us what they're doing and what  
17. relevant issues may...should come before the Legislature.  
18. This merely asks that they bring to us in that plan  
19. recent court decisions that are...that are bugging  
20. the administration. And I...it's a good bill and I move  
21. for its adoption, and a unanimous vote. That's the best kind.  
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
23. The Chair wishes to recognize Senator Rock.  
24. SENATOR ROCK:  
25. Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the sponsor  
26. if he will yield.  
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)  
28. Will the sponsor yield? He indicates he will.  
29. SENATOR ROCK:  
30. Senator, the purpose...or is the purpose, I don't  
31. disagree with the stated intent of the bill. My question  
32. is have you spoken with the administration and if so,  
33. I understand that there was a recent court case not...not

1. too recent with respect to the Department of Children  
2. and Family Services which will, in fact, entail  
3. about a six hundred thousand dollar deficiency  
4. appropriation to that department. The decision was  
5. rendered last year and the administration failed to mention  
6. that item in its annual budget message. Is this  
7. the purpose of the bill?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

9. Senator Grotberg.

10. SENATOR GROTEBERG:

11. I would submit, Senator, that it has...it is not part...in  
12. of the annual budget of any administration but  
13. rather, in the three year plan within the department,  
14. as they put forth such issues that would be administrative  
15. in nature, not necessarily a part of the fiscal message.  
16. Although, I agree with you, there is probably no reason  
17. ...there's nothing in this bill that said that that  
18. should not be mentioned.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

20. Senator Rock.

21. SENATOR ROCK:

22. Well, I...I frankly, feel unresponded to but I feel  
23. that way most of the time around here. But, I would  
24. suggest to you that in August of last year there was in  
25. fact, a court decision which required the department to  
26. pay to foster parents who were relatives of foster  
27. children an amount equal to that paid by the department  
28. to foster parents who were not relatives of foster children  
29. and that decision resulted in about a six hundred thousand  
30. dollar liability to the Department of Children and Family  
31. Services and when the Governor submitted his budget  
32. message in March of this year, he not only failed to  
33. mention that but in fact, the line item for payment  
34. to foster parents was lower than last fiscal year.

1. And now we are going to be asked shortly to appropriate  
2. some six hundred thousand dollars for a deficiency  
3. appropriation. I think the idea of the bill is a good  
4. one and I would point out that in my judgment, although  
5. the plaudits have been paid to Director Mandeville  
6. and the Bureau of the Budget, that the budget message  
7. in fact, overlooked some of these items and now the  
8. General Assembly is again expected to pick up the  
9. pieces. This legislation, I hope, will put this  
10. administration and every other administration on notice  
11. that at least in the annual budget message, the administration  
12. ought to tell us the truth.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

14. Senator Grotberg.

15. SENATOR GROTBURG:

16. It just happens that I concur with Senator Rock  
17. a hundred percent on that whole proposition. I'm  
18. very familiar with that case and I'll be working with  
19. him to try to hustle that six hundred grand because  
20. that's where it's at and if this mandates them to put it  
21. out in front it goes along with a lot of other things  
22. that we've been working at on these departments and trying  
23. to once and for all, if the courts are going to run the  
24. State of Illinois, the least we should do is know who...  
25. where their actions lie as they do each and every one of  
26. us in and that's what all this asks for in a three year plan  
27. and I would love to have your Aye vote on this bill.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

29. Any further discussion to the sponsor? The question  
30. is shall Senate Bill 300 pass. All those in favor vote  
31. Aye. All those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.  
32. Have all voted who wish? No. Hold it Mr. Secretary.  
33. Have all voted who wish? Take the record, Mr. Secretary.

1. On that question the Ayes are 51, the Nays are 4.  
2. The bill having received the constitutional majority  
3. is declared passed. Senator Grotberg, you want to go with  
4. Senate Bill 301?

5. SENATOR GROTBERG:

6. Mr. President, with leave of the Body, I would like  
7. to return 301 as I promised when we moved it to 3rd  
8. back to the Order of 2nd reading for an amendment and  
9. to announce that I have posted a fiscal note.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

11. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. The bill is now  
12. on 2nd reading.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Amendment No. 1 along with the fiscal note offered  
15. by Senator Grotberg.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

17. Any questions of the sponsor? The...

18. SENATOR GROTBERG:

19. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, in this bill  
20. there was some discussion in committee that we probably  
21. preempted the Department of Children and Family Services  
22. from utilizing as many options as they can by the language  
23. of this bill as they create an individual plan for unserved  
24. children. In doing so, we would like then to add where it  
25. states that the department...it states that if the  
26. department finds there are no appropriate programs or  
27. facilities within the department, no licensed private  
28. facility has the adequate or appropriate program, then  
29. they're supposed to build an individual program. We would  
30. like to include the language on line nineteen, page four  
31. that if there are no licensed private facilities or  
32. available programs or programs available and also  
33. on line twenty-two the words, program oriented individualized

1. plans and it's...the...it's a committee suggestion and  
2. the Commission on Children came forth with this and I  
3. agreed to put it on in committee.
4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
5. Any questions of the sponsor of the amendment?
6. Senator Rhoads.
7. SENATOR RHOADS:
8. Will the sponsor yield?
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
10. The sponsor indicates he will yield.
11. SENATOR RHOADS:
12. Senator Grotberg, who prepared the fiscal note?
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
14. Senator Grotberg.
15. SENATOR GROTBERG:
16. We now have one from the department and that's the  
17. one that's filed and it also dovetails essentially what  
18. the bottom line around sixty-one thousand dollars with the  
19. one that was created by the other option.
20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
21. Senator Rhoads.
22. SENATOR RHOADS:
23. What your're saying then is that it is essentially  
24. the same as the fiscal note that was prepared by the  
25. commission because we passed it out with the understanding  
26. that the department had to come back with this  
27. fiscal note.
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)
29. Senator Grotberg.
30. SENATOR GROTBERG:
31. The department came back on their own letterhead signed  
32. by the director, a fiscal note which coincidentally  
33. dovetails with the easy one that we had the other day.

1. I'm telling you more than you want to know, Mark.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

3. ~~Senator Mark Rhoads. No further questions?~~

4. Any further... Senator Rock.

5. SENATOR ROCK: ~~...~~

6. The purpose... if the sponsor will yield, Mr.

7. President.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

9. Will the sponsor yield? He indicates he will.

10. SENATOR ROCK: ~~...~~

11. The purpose of the amendment as I read it now,

12. is to obviate the necessity for building a facility

13. if...if...if, in fact, no program is available to a

14. particular individual?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

16. Senator Grotberg: ~~...~~

17. SENATOR GROTBURG: ~~...~~

18. Yes, it would go beyond obviating the necessity

19. of a building. It would also go to standing programs

20. non-building oriented, programs period, Senator.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

22. Senator Rock, do you have further questions? He says

23. none. Any further questions from the Floor concerning

24. Amendment No. 1? The question is Senator Grotberg moves

25. for the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 301.

26. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed say Nay.

27. The amendment is adopted. 3rd reading, Mr. Secretary.

28. Now, we have to have intervening business. Introduction

29. of bills, Mr. Secretary.

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Bill No. 597, introduced by Senators Weaver,

32. Shapiro, and others.

33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. Senate Bill No. 598, introduced by the same sponsors.

2. (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. Senate Bill No. 599, introduced by Senators Harber

4. Hall, Vadalabene, Joyce and others.

5. (Secretary reads title of bill)

6. Senate Bill No. 600, introduced by Senators
