21 ...and...and clear the board and go on forward from here
22 with him on it.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

24 That's correct. That's exactly what I'm about. All
25 right, on the Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading is Senate
26 Bill 129. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary. All right, the bill
27 has been read. I would suggest to all the members who are
28 present in the Chamber that they again have to vote on this
29 one. The question is, shall Senate Bill 129 pass. Those in
30 favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting
31 is open. Senator Hall, for what purpose do you arise?

32 SENATOR HARBER HALL:

33 Well, I want to thank you for doing that procedure, but

1 I also would like the record to show that I was here for all
2 ...all those bills and would have voted for all of them
3 previously except the first one.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

5 The record will so indicate. Have all voted who wish?
6 Have all voted who wish? Take the record. All right, with...
7 with leave of the Body, with...we will again proceed with our
8 extraordinary procedure and run these same roll calls. On
9 that question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none, none Voting
10 Present. Senate Bill 129 having received the constitutional
11 majority is declared passed. On the Order of Senate Bills 3rd
12 reading is Senate Bill 130. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
13 Senator Berning, for what purpose do you arise?

14 SENATOR BERNING:

15 After you read the bill, I'd like to be recognized.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

17 All right. Senator...

18 SECRETARY:

19 Senate...

20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

21 ...read the bill, Mr....

22 SECRETARY:

23 ...Senate Bill 130

24 (Secretary reads title of bill)

25 3rd reading of the bill.

26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

27 Any discussion? Senator Berning.

28 SENATOR BERNING:

29 Question of the sponsor, please.

30 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

31 Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Berning.

32 SENATOR BERNING:

33 This adds creed as well as sex and national origin. My

1 question is, can the document of the Communist Party be
2 considered creed? Would we be mandating the hiring of
3 Communists into a defense industry?

4 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

5 Senator Knuppel.

6 SENATOR KNUPPEL:

7 What this is...what we have done here and I'm not going
8 to this specific bill right at the moment...what we've done
9 is tried to make the language uniform as to all fifty-two
10 of these different instances where there's recitations of
11 sex, religion, and with respect to handicap when it deals
12 with housing or employment. Sir, I could not tell you whether
13 creed includes...in a judicial opinion whether creed would
14 include someone who has a Communist belief. I...I don't
15 believe that creed would include someone who did not believe
16 in and was not willing to uphold the Constitution of the
17 United States, but I would think creed would have reference
18 to something other than political persuasion. That's just
19 my opinion, not...you can get a different decision anytime
20 just as it's been pointed out with the Workmen's Compensation
21 Law. Anytime you get arbitrator, one can give you twenty-five
22 percent of a leg and another one can give you ten. I can't tell
23 you what a judge will do. You've got a dispute in Illinois
24 today as to whether cocaine is a...is a dangerous drug. I
25 can't tell you what a judge would hold, whether creed would
26 encompass political persuasion or not.

27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

28 Senator Berning.

29 SENATOR BERNING:

30 Well, then, Mr. President, with all due respect, I, for
31 one, would not like to be recorded favorably on this particular
32 bill if there is by any stretch of the imagination inclusion
33 of an endorsement of Communism as a...as a creed, thereby

1 entitling a person to participate in any of our defense
2 industries and...and...and failure of a positive position on
3 that, I would respectfully request that I be recorded, or
4 be allowed to vote No on this one unless the word "creed"
5 could be excluded here.

6 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

7 Senator Knuppel.

8 SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

9 Well, the word "creed" has a...has a definite...has
10 a dictionary definition, it probably has a judicial definition.
11 I'm not in a position to tell you how broad it is, and I
12 don't think anyone else is. As the Legislature...as a legislator
13 what I'm trying to do is make uniform the language with
14 respect to discrimination, only as to discrimination, and I
15 can't tell you and nobody else can tell you, and I'm not so
16 sure but of what if a judge wanted to say that it was discrimina-
17 tion, he couldn't say it anyway, whether the word "creed"
18 was in there or wasn't.

19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20 Senator Maragos.

21 SENATOR MARAGOS:

22 I think that the discussion itself would state the
23 legislative that we...we're not talking about political
24 philosophy and maybe the record will show that so that if any
25 ...this matter becomes a judicial consideration, they'll
26 have a legislative intent. I think the sponsor of the bill does
27 not...would not...so included, so I think your fears are...
28 should be allayed to a certain degree Mr...Senator Berning.

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30 Take the record. Just a moment, Senator Knuppel.

31 SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

32 I...when I look at this, I think the caption is a...
33 probably it's...it's...the word "creed" is already in there

1 anyway, because it says because of his race or color, creed,
2 sex...no, it isn't, it's being added...but I...it's in a lot
3 of others. Well, up above there...it isn't being added above.
4 In one paragraph, it's being added, if...and line 23, the
5 word "creed" is in there and in line 27, it wasn't in there, so
6 this is what the purpose of the bill is to correct language.
7 It was...the word "creed" was in there apparently on line 23,
8 but wasn't in on line 27.

9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10 Just...just a...Senator Berning, what's...what's your
11 desire?

12 SENATOR BERNING:

13 Okay...okay...okay.

14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15 Roll them. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes
16 are 51, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 130 having received
17 the constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill
18 131. Read the bill.

19 SECRETARY:

20 Senate Bill 131.

21 (Secretary reads title of bill)

22 3rd reading of the bill.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24 Take the record. Any discussion? Question is, shall
25 Senate Bill 131 pass. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye.
26 Those opposed Nay. The Ayes...just a moment. Take the
27 record. Trying to do three things at one time. Voting is open.
28 Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays
29 are none, none Voting Present. Senate Bill 131 having received
30 a constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 132.
31 Read the bill.

32 SECRETARY:

33 Senate Bill 132.

1 (Secretary reads title of bill)

2 3rd reading of the bill.

3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4 Is there discussion? Take the record. The question is,
5 shall Senate Bill 132 pass. Those in favor indicate...those
6 in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open.

7 Have all those voted who wish? Take the record. On that
8 question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none. Senate Bill
9 132 having received a constitutional majority is declared
10 passed. Senate Bill 133. Read the bill.

11 SECRETARY:

12 Senate Bill 133.

13 (Secretary reads title of bill)

14 3rd reading of the bill.

15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16 Question is, shall Senate Bill 133 pass. Those in favor
17 vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all
18 those voted who wish? Take the record. On that question,
19 the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none, none Voting Present.

20 Senate Bill 133 having received a constitutional majority is
21 declared passed. Senate Bill 134. Read the bill.

22 SECRETARY:

23 Senate Bill 134.

24 (Secretary reads title of bill)

25 3rd reading of the bill.

26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27 Is there discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill
28 134 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The
29 voting is open. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes
30 are 51, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 134 having received a
31 constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 135.
32 Read the bill.

33 SECRETARY:

1 Senate Bill 135.
2 (Secretary reads title of bill)

3 3rd reading of the bill.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5 Is there discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill
6 135 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The
7 voting is open. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes
8 are 51, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 135 having received a
9 constitutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 136.
10 Read the bill.

11 SECRETARY:

12 Senate Bill 136.

13 (Secretary reads title of bill)

14 3rd reading of the bill.

15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16 Question is...the question is, shall Senate Bill 136
17 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting
18 is open. On that question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none.
19 Senate Bill 136 having received a constitutional majority is
20 declared passed. Senate Bill 137. Read the bill.

21 SECRETARY:

23 (Secretary reads title of bill)

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6 Senate Bill 138 having received a constitutional majority is
7 declared passed. Senate Bill 139. Read the bill.

8 SECRETARY: Senate Bill 139.

9 Senate Bill 139.

10 (Secretary reads title of bill)

11 3rd reading of the bill.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13 Question is, shall Senate Bill 139 pass. Those in favor
14 vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open. On that
15 question, the Ayes are...take the record. On that question,
16 the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none. Senate Bill 139 having
17 received the constitutional majority is declared passed.
18 Senate Bill 141.

19 SECRETARY: Senate Bill 141.

20 Senate Bill 141.

21 (Secretary reads title of bill)

22 3rd reading of the bill.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

24 The question is, shall Senate Bill 141 pass. All those voting
25 on that question...those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed
26 vote Nay. The voting is open. Take the record. On that
27 question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none. The bill having
28 received the constitutional majority is declared passed.

29 Senate Bill 15...142. I'll get with it here, Mr. Secretary.

30 SECRETARY:

31 Senate Bill 142.

32 (Secretary reads title of bill)

33 3rd reading of the bill.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

2 The question is, shall Senate Bill 142 pass. Those in
3 favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open,
4 Mr. Secretary. Have all voted who wish? Take the record,
5 Mr. Secretary. On that question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays
6 are none. The bill having received the constitutional
7 majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 143.

8 SECRETARY:

9 Senate Bill 143.

10 (Secretary reads title of bill)

11 3rd reading of the bill.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

13 The question is, shall Senate Bill 143. Those in favor
14 vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Take
15 the record, Mr. Secretary. On that question, the Ayes are
16 51, the Nays are none. The bill having received the consti-
17 tutional majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 145, Mr.
18 Secretary.

19 SECRETARY:

20 Senate Bill 145.

21 (Secretary reads title of bill)

22 3rd reading of the bill.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

24 The question is, shall Senate Bill 145 pass. Those in
25 favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.
26 Take the record, Mr. Secretary. On that question, the Ayes are
27 51, the Nays are none. The bill having received the constitu-
28 tional majority is declared passed. I'll hold, Mr. Secretary.
29 Senate Bill 146, Mr. Secretary.

30 SECRETARY:

31 Senate Bill 146.

32 (Secretary reads title of bill)

33 3rd reading of the bill.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

2 The question is, shall Senate Bill 146 pass. All those
3 in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is
4 open. Take the record, Mr. Secretary. The Ayes are...the
5 question...on that question, the Ayes are 51, the Nays are
6 none. The bill having received the constitutional majority
7 is declared passed. Senate Bill...that was it, Mr. Secretary.
8 Now, we go to...Senator Hickey, do you...she in her chair, on
9 Senate Bill 164. Senator Vadalabene, 179. These are bills
10 on 3rd reading. Senator Bowers, 216. Pass. Okay. Senator
11 Dawn Clark Netsch, Senate Bill 219. No, I'll pass. 229,
12 Senator Rock. No, hold. Okay. Senator Grotberg on 301.
13 Go. All right, Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

14 SECRETARY:

15 Senate Bill 301.

16 (Secretary reads title of bill)

17 3rd reading of the bill.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

19 Senator Grotberg.

20 SENATOR GROTBORG:

21 Thank you...thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and
22 Gentlemen of the Senate. I think this to be a good time to
23 move this bill out. We fixed it up yesterday a little with
24 two amendments. The bill reads as follows: Regarding the
25 Department of Children and Family Services as amended - If
26 the Department finds that there is no appropriate program or
27 facility within or available to the Department for a ward and
28 that no licensed private facility has an adequate or appropriate
29 program or none agrees to accept the ward, the Department shall
30 create an appropriate individualized program oriented plan
31 for each kid. Now, this goes back to our out-of-state kids of
32 two years ago where we used to pack them up, buy a bus ticket,
33 and send them down sometimes under armed guards, sometimes

1 under escorted with a Social Service Worker and take them to
2 Texas, Canada, or wherever they could take them. This is the
3 solution, or a partial solution, to that old problem. We are now
4 trying to take care of the most difficult kids within the
5 State of Illinois. The Department needs such an authorization
6 to proceed on it, and I would ask a favorable roll call in
7 this bill.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

9 All right, any discussion? Question is, shall Senate
10 Bill 301 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed
11 will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
12 Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question,
13 the Ayes are 49, the Nays are none, none Voting Present.
14 Senate Bill 301 having received the constitutional majority
15 is declared passed. We skipped over earlier Senate Bill 66.
16 On the Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading, Senate Bill 66.
17 Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

18 SECRETARY:

19 Senate Bill 66.

20 (Secretary reads title of bill)

21 3rd reading of the bill.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

23 Senator Schaffer.

24 SENATOR SCHAFFER:

25 I think, Mr. President, the members of the Senate will
26 recall we discussed this bill briefly yesterday. As amended,
27 it accomplishes two things. It extends the publication time
28 for municipalities from ten days to thirty and it also provides
29 for a...a publication of the section that was in error in
30 case there is an error or something is omitted. Senator
31 Rock had a couple of questions. I believe he's been able to
32 discuss it with his staff and is now in support and Senator
33 Bowers had a couple of questions, and I believe those have

1 been resolved. If there aren't any other questions, I'd
2 appreciate a favorable roll call.

3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

4 Any discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill 66
5 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote
6 Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take
7 the record. On that question, the Ayes are 47, the Nays are
8 none, none Voting Present. Senate Bill 66 having received
9 the constitutional majority is declared passed. On the Order
10 of Senate Bills 3rd reading is Senate Bill 179. Read the
11 bill, Mr. Secretary.

12 SECRETARY: Take the record.

13 Senate Bill 179.

14 (Secretary reads title of bill)

15 3rd reading of the bill.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

17 Senator Vadalabene.

18 SENATOR VADALABENE:

19 Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate,
20 Senate Bill 179 will give the Bi-State Development Agency the
21 permission of the right to raise their interest rate bonds
22 from six percent...revenue bonds from six percent to eight
23 percent. This is identical legislation in the compact with
24 the State of Missouri who are doing the identical...who are
25 having identical legislation in Missouri. Both bills have to
26 pass both the State of Illinois and the State of Missouri for
27 this to become effective, and I would appreciate a favorable vote.

28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

29 Any discussion? Question is, shall Senate Bill 179 pass.

30 Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.

31 The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record.

32 On that question, the Ayes are 45, the Nays are none, none

33 Voting Present. Senate Bill 179 having received the constitutional

1 majority is declared passed. All right, if I can have the
2 attention of the membership, we are, in fact, scheduled for
3 the Executive Committee at 1:30 in Room 212. I have spoken
4 with Senator Shapiro. It is the intent of the Chair that
5 given the large number of bills to be introduced, that we
6 would very shortly recess and allow the Secretary and the
7 Assistant Secretary to read in the introductions and hold the
8 Session open until five o'clock this afternoon at which time
9 we will come in and introduce whatever bills have to be
10 introduced and then, of course, we will adjourn until the
11 ...till tomorrow for introduction and then subsequently till
12 the 20th of this month. We have a couple of things we should
13 do now and with that understanding we can proceed on the
14 Senate Resolution Consent Calendar. Read the...Senator
15 Berman, for what purpose do you arise? Senator Berman.
16 Senator Berman, our million dollar system isn't working
17 again. Can you move over.

18 SENATOR BERMAN:

19 Mr. President, what time will we be convening on the 20th?

20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

21 The adjournment resolution, I think, will call for the
22 hour of one o'clock...

23 SENATOR BERMAN:

24 Thank you.

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

26 ...on the 20th. Yes, Sir. All right, why don't you...
27 all right, everyone has received I'm told a copy of the
28 Resolutions Consent Calendar. Given no additions or deletions
29 and no objections in writing, Senator Donnewald moves that
30 the Senate Resolutions listed thereon, in fact, be adopted.
31 All those in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed.
32 The Ayes have it. The Resolutions 72 through 80 are adopted.
33 The Chair has been informed, if the I can have the attention of

1 the membership. The Chair has been informed that today
2 unfortunately for us is the last legislative day for Barry
3 Hanson, the Associated Press Senate Reporter. He's going to
4 work in the Colorado Legislature, so I think the Senate
5 should recognize that fact and wish him Godspeed. Motions
6 in Writing. Read the motion, Mr. Secretary.

7 SECRETARY:

8 Pursuant to Senate Temporary Rule No. 8, I move to
9 discharge the Committee on Labor and Commerce from further
10 consideration of Senate Bill 17, have the bill placed on the
11 Calendar on the Order of 2nd reading. Signed, Senator
12 Dawn Clark Netsch. Dated, April 7th, 1977.

13 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

14 All right, Senator Netsch, did you wish to proceed on that
15 Motion in Writing? Is there a note there to wish...

16 SECRETARY:

17 There is an attached note that she would like it heard
18 on April the 21st.

19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

20 All right, is there leave? So ordered. Motions in
21 Writing.

22 SECRETARY:

23 I move to take Senate Bill 363 from the Table and that
24 the bill be advanced to the Order of 2nd reading without further
25 reference to committee Dated, April the 7th, 1977. Signed,
26 Bradley M. Glass.

27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

28 Senator Glass, do you wish this motion placed for the 20th
29 or continued? 20th or the...21st? All right, is there leave?
30 So ordered. Senator Harber Hall, for what purpose do you
31 arise?

32 SENATOR HARBER HALL:

33 I'd like leave of the Body, Mr. President, to be shown as

1 cosponsor of Senate Bill 306. The sponsor said he'd be
2 absolutely tickled to death if I were shown on there.

3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

4 You've heard Senator Hall's request. Is leave granted?
5 Leave is granted. So ordered. Harber Hall, right. Senator
6 Nimrod, for what purpose do you arise?

7 SENATOR NIMROD:

8 Yes, Mr. President, I'd like to seek leave to be shown
9 as a cosponsor on Senate Bill 417.

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

11 You've heard the request. Is leave granted? So ordered.

12 All right, any further business to come before the Senate

13 before we recess for the purpose of committees? We do, in

14 fact, have a death resolution, which I would like Senator

15 Donnewald to adopt at this point. All right, if we can have the

16 attention of the Body. Again, Senator Shapiro, if this is

17 all right, we will at this point...for all practical purposes,

18 we are...have concluded the day's business, and we will ask

19 that the Secretary read in the...the new introductions after

20 which we will recess until the hour of four-thirty for again

21 the purpose of introduction. All right, there is a death

22 resolution sponsored by Senators Hynes, Donnewald and all

30 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

31 Senator Donnewald.

32 SENATOR DONNEWALD:

33 Yes, Mr. President, I was formerly employed by that same

1 Eddie Barrett back in the middle '40's. Eddie Barrett was
2 primarily responsible for my being able to go law school, and
3 Mr. President, I would ask now that the rules be suspended for the
4 immediate consideration of that resolution.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

6 Senator Donnewald has moved to suspend the rules for the
7 immediate consideration of Senate Resolution 82. All those in
8 favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes
9 have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Donnewald now
10 moves the adoption of Senate Resolution 82. All those in
11 favor please signify by rising. Resolution is adopted.
12 We will now revert to the Order of Introduction so that the
13 Secretary can clear these bills. I am informed by the committee
14 chairman of the Committee on Executive that it will meet
15 immediately in Room 212. Introduction of Bills.

16 SECRETARY:

26 (Secretary reads title of bill)

29 (Secretary reads title of bill)

30 Senate Bill 820 introduced by Senators Berman, Rock,
31 Maragos and others.

32 (Secretary reads title of bill)
