15 SENATOR KOSINSKI:

16 Mr. President and members of the Senate, I move that

18 some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

19 PRESIDENT:

20 You've heard the motion by Senator Kosinski. Is there
21 any discussion? If not, all those in favor signify by saying
22 Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion is adopted.
23 Senator Kosinski.

24 SENATOR KOSINSKI:

25 Mr. President, I move that the reading and the approval
26 of the Journal of Tuesday, April 26th, 1977, be postponed
27 pending arrival of the printed Journal.

22 SENATOR HICKEY:

23 This amendment simply cleans up the way the bill was originally
24 written which was patterned after the Statute now existing
25 pertaining to conservators for the mentally retarded which is
26 being altered in Senate Bill 252 and we...since our pattern
27 was changed, we changed ours after the other pattern. At the
28 same time, we provide...we add a sentence which not allow a
29 nursing homes to be conservators of aged individuals.

30 PRESIDENT:

31 Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Hickey moves
32 the adoption of Amendment No. 1. All those in favor signify
33 by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1

1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

15 Well, Mr. President, I had my hand up and I was going
16 to ask the Senator...Senator Lemke, sponsor of Senate Bill
17 234 if he would be willing to pull that back for purposes of
18 a...an amendment. I would like to offer one. I don't have
19 it ready today.

2 Senator Clewis.

3 SENATOR CLEWIS:

4 Mr. President, my amendment would make Senate Bill 347
5 apply only to counties with a population of over three
6 million. It would delete the unnecessary section dealing
7 with municipalities over five hundred thousand. It complies
8 with an agreement that I had with the committee, and I move
9 for a favorable roll call at this time, or a favorable...

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6 Mr. President, I would move to Table that amendment and
7 substitute then the amendment that I have on the desk up there.

10 All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amend-

14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15 Senator Sommer, to explain the amendment.

16 SENATOR SOMMER:

17 This amendment does what the committee suggested we do.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19 Further discussion? Senator Sommer moves the adoption of
20 Amendment No. 2. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The
21 Ayes have. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?

22 SECRETARY:

23 No further amendments.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 3rd reading. Senate Bill 835, Senator Buzbee. For what
26 purpose...Senator Philip.

27 SENATOR PHILIP:

28 Point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

30 State your point.

32 Yeah, we have on the floor a ex-Senator from the city of
33 milk and honey, Elmhurst, who used to represent the 40th district
34 extremely well and I would like to make note of that that Senator
35 Jack Knuepfer is here among us today. We're very happy to see

1 him back.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3 Senator Mitchler, can you take your...the conference there
4 off the floor now, if we can. Senator Regner was off the Floor

17 Yes Mr. President and members of the Senate, this is a
18 committee amendment which clarified the language in the bill
19 as originally presented. There was an error made in the
20 Reference Bureau in drafting. And it puts the bill in the
21 shape that it should have been in regarding voting on creation
22 of a solid waste disposal district. I move its adoption.

17 Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.

18 The amendment was offered in committee by myself and I would
19 like to move its adoption. It cuts...it is a total deletion
20 of twenty-eight thousand dollars. It cuts the travel and con-
21 tractual services line items in half in accord with what, in fact,
22 the commission has spent this Fiscal Year. I would move its
23 adoption.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 Is there discussion? Senator Buzbee.

26 SENATOR BUZBEE:

27 Yes, this is the expenses for the Energy Resources Commission
28 and I would point out that I am opposed to it. I opposed it
29 in committee and was unsuccessful then.
