8. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. Senate
9. Bill 955 was read into the record and it listed Senator
10. Guidice as the Senate sponsor, inadvertently, and I'd
11. like to correct this error that I am the sponsor of
12. House Bill 955.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Merlo has asked leave to be shown as
15. the principal Senate sponsor of House Bill 995. Is
16. leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. Message
17. from the House.

18. SECRETARY:

19. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

20. Mr. President - I am directed to inform the
21. Senate that the House of Representatives has adopted the
22. following Joint Resolution, in the adoption of which I
23. am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate, to-wit:

24. House Joint Resolution 34.

25. (Secretary reads HJR 34)

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Donnewald moves for the adoption of the
28. Resolution. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.
29. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.
30. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. Yes, while we had a lull, Mr. President, I would
33. ask that the record show that Senator Rock and Senator

1. Sangmeister are absent due to illness.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. The record will so show. A request for leave for television
4. filming. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. (Machine cut-off)
5. Senator Guidice arise?

6. SENATOR GUIDICE:

7. To discharge a committee, Mr. President. A motion to discharge
8. the Insurance Committee from further consideration of Senate
9. Bill 1030 and to Table it.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. All right. Senate...Do we have leave to go to the Order of
12. Motions? Senator Guidice moves to discharge the Senate Committee
13. on Insurance and Licensed Activities from further consideration of
14. Senate Bill 1030.

15. SENATOR GUIDICE:

16. That's correct.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
19. have it. The committee is discharged. Senator Guidice now moves
20. to Table Senate Bill 1030. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.
21. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is Tabled.

22. SENATOR GUIDICE:

23. Thank you, Mr. President.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. On the Order of Motions, Senator Mitchler has filed a Motion in
26. Writing. Senator, do you wish to withdraw that motion, because as...

27. SENATOR MITCHLER:

28. Well, Mr. President...Mr. President, Senate Bill 1320 was heard
29. in the Senate Agriculture, Conservation, Energy Committee on the 2nd,
30. May 2, and was...received a Do Not Pass vote of 6-5-0. In discussing
31. the bill last night in the committee, it was determined that the bill
32. was not in the committee, having been reported out Do Not Pass. So, it
33. was decided that a motion would be made on the Floor today to take the
34. bill from the Table and advance it to the Order of 2nd reading. If
35. that motion is in order, I would make the motion.

PRESIDENT:

1. Well, Mr...Senator Mitchler, the motion is not in order.
2. Rule 11 specifically provides that it must be made on the
3. next legislative day and that was not done. And the Chair
4. will rule that it is not in order.

5. SENATOR MITCHLER:

6. The only alternative that I would have would be to
7. ask for suspension of the rules so that the motion that
8. I make could be considered. And I will leave that to
9. the discretion of the Chair. Whether you want to get
10. into that type of a procedure.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Well, I would leave it to the discretion of Senator...
13. of the Senator making the motion, whether he wishes to
14. proceed with the motion.

15. SENATOR MITCHLER:

16. Well, then, Mr. President, I would make a motion
17. to suspend the rules...

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Well, that...motion is out of order. You have a
20. motion on file, Senator, that Senate Bill 1320 be taken
21. from the Table and advance to the Order of 2nd reading
22. and the Chair rules that that motion is out of order
23. under Rule 11. And your remedy is to appeal the ruling
24. of the Chair, if you wish to do so.

25. SENATOR MITCHLER:

26. Well, I don't prefer to file a motion to overrule
27. the...well, I'll...make a motion to overrule the ruling
28. of the Chair as a technical means of achieving what we
29. want to do. Or would it be better, Mr. President, to
30. suspend the rules.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. The question is shall the ruling of the Chair be
33. sustained. And...I will...the Chair has ruled that

1. this motion is out of order under Rule 11 and Senator
2. Mitchler is appealing the ruling of the Chair. All
3. those in favor of sustaining the ruling of the Chair
4. will vote Aye. Those opposed? For what purpose does
5. Senator Joyce arise?

6. SENATOR JOYCE:

7. Thank you, Mr. President. Before we get into this,
8. I think...this is a dead bill. Now, there was an amend-
9. ment on it and, in fact, we're not really aware what this
10. amendment does because the motion was not filed yesterday
11. and our staff has not had a chance to really find out
12. just what...what this does. You know, what we're
13. dealing with gentlemen is hauling sludge down and
14. spreading it on farm land. Now, I think that we had
15. better be very careful about this and we better be sure
16. what we're doing before we start overruling the Chair
17. on this matter.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator, I think in addition to that, we run the
20. risk that with respect to every bill reported out of
21. committee that we're going to need a motion like this.
22. We have a provision in the rules for taking the bill
23. from the Table after unfavorable action by the com-
24. mittee and if that procedure is followed there is an
25. opportunity to have a vote. The procedure was not
26. followed in this case and therefore the Chair has
27. ruled that the motion is out of order. Senator Mitchler
28. is appealing the ruling of the Chair and it requires
29. 36 votes. For what purpose does Senator Glass arise?

30. SENATOR GLASS:

31. For a parliamentary inquiry, Mr. President. Would
32. it not be in order for the Senator to move to suspend?
33. Rule 11, so that his motion might be voted on.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. It would not, because he has made a motion to
3. take the bill from the Table and has not...and I have
4. ruled on that motion and he...is now appealing the
5. ruling of the Chair and that is what is before us.
6. The question is shall the ruling of the Chair be
7. sustained. All those in favor of sustaining the
8. ruling say...will vote in the affirmative, those
9. opposed to sustaining the ruling will vote in the
10. negative. The voting is open. (Machine cut-off)
11. Mitchler, if you wish to overturn the ruling of
12. the Chair, you'll have to vote No. The question
13. is presented in the affirmative form. Shall
14. the ruling of the Chair be sustained. If you wish
15. to sustain the ruling of the Chair, vote Aye. If
16. you do not wish to sustain the ruling of the Chair,
17. vote No. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
18. who wish? Take the record. On that question the
19. Ayes are 30, the Nocs are 12, and 2 Voting Present.
20. The ruling of the Chair is sustained. For what
21. purpose does Senator Knuppel arise?

22. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

23. On this order of business, I just talked to
24. the Chairman of Labor and Commerce with respect
25. to bills that were considered in subcommittee and
26. then they made a final determination last night
27. and this...involved two bills that were introduced
28. in an attempt to increase the salaries of the court
29. reporters for the Industrial Commission. I was
30. told by the chairman of the committee that they
31. inadvertently overlooked these two bills, that they
32. had intended to vote them out. Now, is that correct,
33. Senator Savickas? And I'd like to move that they...

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator, there appears to be some controversy
7. over this motion. Could you withdraw it for the
8. moment and...check with the chairman and then we can
9. go back to it. Senator Knuppel, would you withdraw
10. the motion? Senator Knuppel indicates by his action,
11. withdraw the motion. On the Calendar in Motions and
12. Writing, there is a motion by Senator Netsch and she
13. ...Senator Netsch moves to postpone that motion until
14. Thursday, May 12th. All those in favor signify by
15. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion
16. is postponed until May 12th. What purpose does
17. Senator Bloom arise?

18. SENATOR BLOOM:

19. Thank you, Mr. President. I...I too have a
20. motion and I wonder if I could have that postponed
21. until the same day.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Bloom moves to postpone the Motion in
24. Writing with respect to Senate Bills 8, 6, 4, 5 and
25. 6 until Thursday, May 12th.

26. SENATOR BLOOM:

27. And...yes, and I also...

28. PRESIDENT:

29. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
30. The Ayes have it. All right.

31. SENATOR BLOOM:

32. I also have filed a motion on Senate Bill 605
33. within the Legislative day and if I could have that

1. up then too. It's not on the Calendar. Maybe we ought
2. to get it on the Calendar and then do it. Okay. Thank
3. you.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. The Secretary will read the motions that have
6. been filed.

7. SECRETARY:

8. I move that the Senate Finance and Credit Regulations
9. Committee be discharged from further consideration of
10. Senate Bill 605 and that the bill be placed on the
11. Order of 2nd reading. Filed with me on the 4th of May,
12. 1977, signed, Senator Bloom.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. There are four motions to take bills from the
15. Table as a result of committee action and with leave
16. of the Senate, those motions will be read and all of
17. them will be set for Thursday, May 12, with the two
18. motions we have just considered. Leave is granted.
19. Read the motions.

20. SECRETARY:

21. I move that Senate...that the Senate Committee
22. on Labor and Commerce be discharged from further
23. consideration of Senate Bill 600 and that the bill
24. be advanced to the Order of 2nd reading without reference
25. to committee. Signed, Senator Nimrod.

26. I move that the Senate Committee on Labor and
27. Commerce be discharged from further consideration of
28. Senate Bill 601 and that that bill be advanced to the
29. Order of 2nd reading without reference to committee.
30. Signed, Senator Nimrod.

31. I move that the Senate Committee on Labor and
32. Commerce be discharged from further consideration of
33. Senate Bill 1155 and that that bill be advanced to the
34. Order of 2nd reading without reference to committee.
35. Signed, Senator Harber Hall.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. For what purpose does Senator Graham arise?

3. SENATOR GRAHAM:

4. I'd like...to make a noncontroversial motion, Mr.
5. President. Thank you. Yesterday, in the Committee on
6. Transportation...Committee on...I'm afraid you can't
7. hear me, but, yesterday on the Committee on Transportation,
8. I agreed to Table a bill. I'd like to do it at this
9. time. I'd like to move discharge. Move to discharge
10. the Committee on Transportation from further consider-
11. ation of Senate Bill 619 for the purpose of Tabling.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Graham moves to discharge the Senate
14. Committee on Transportation from further consideration
15. of Senate Bill 619. All those in favor signify by
16. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The Committee
17. is discharged. Senator Graham moves to Table Senate
18. Bill 619. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.
19. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is Tabled. Senator
20. Merlo.

21. SENATOR MERLO:

22. Senator Merlo...Mr. President, I would like to
23. have leave of the Senate to Table Senate Bill 977. I
24. am the principal sponsor of that bill.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Where is the bill presently, Senator?

27. SENATOR MERLO:

28. It moved out of the Pensions Committee yesterday.
29. I don't think it's been posted on the Calendar.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. It was read into the record this morning. All
32. right. Senator Merlo moves to Table Senate Bill 977.
33. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
34. The Ayes have it. Senate Bill 977 is Tabled. Senator

1. Kosinski.

2. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

3. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. I'd
4. like to correct the Calendar. Senate Bills on 2nd
5. reading, Bill 668, we have Senator Hynes as chief
6. sponsor and that has been changed to Kosinski as chief
7. sponsor, Senator Hynes and Senator Rock, cosponsors.
8. I'd like to correct the Calendar.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. You...you're correct, Senator. That...leave was
11. granted last week and the Calendar will be corrected.

12. For what purpose does Senator Joyce arise?

13. SENATOR JOYCE:

14. Thank you, Mr. President. For the purpose of
15. Tabling Senate Bill 1048. Which is in Revenue Com-
16. mittee now.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Joyce moves to discharge the Senate
19. Committee on Revenue from further consideration of
20. Senate Bill 1048. All those in favor signify by saying
21. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee is
22. discharged. Senator Joyce moves to Table Senate Bill
23. 1048. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
24. The Ayes have it. The bill is Tabled. For what purpose
25. does Senator Nimrod arise?

26. SENATOR NIMROD:

27. Mr. President, I would like to...I checked with Senator
28. Netsch and I would like to discharge Judiciary II of
29. further consideration of Senate Bill 249 so that it

31. with both Senator Daley and Senator Netsch and have
32. their approval.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Have you checked with the Chairman of the Committee
2. on Assignment of Bills?

3. SENATOR NIMROD:

4. No, I did not.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. If you would.

7. SENATOR NIMROD:

8. Well, I will do that, however, and then get back
9. to you and in the meantime I would like to then seek
10. leave to discharge the Committee on Agriculture and
11. Energy of Senate Bill 943 for the purpose of Tabling.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Nimrod moves to discharge the Senate
14. Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy
15. from further consideration of Senate Bill 943. All
16. those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The
17. Ayes have it. Senator Nimrod now moves to Table
18. Senate Bill 943. All those in favor signify by saying
19. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. For what purpose does
20. Senator Collins arise?

21. SENATOR COLLINS:

22. Mr. President, I would like leave of the Body to
23. be shown as Senate Sponsor of House Bill 1022.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Leave has been requested to have Senator Collins
26. shown as a cosponsor of House Bill...

27. SENATOR COLLINS:

28. 1022.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Senator, who's the principal sponsor?

31. SENATOR COLLINS:

32. No, just to be shown as sponsor, Senate sponsor. I
33. don't know who the principal sponsor is.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Well, the procedure is with House Bills that there
3. is only a principal sponsor or joint principal sponsors,
4. and if that is your intention.

5. SENATOR COLLINS:

6. Yeah, I said sponsor, I didn't say cosponsor, could
7. ...Senate sponsor. There's no sponsor of that bill of
8. the Senate to my knowledge.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Okay. Fine. All right. Fine. You will be so
11. shown. For what purpose does Senator Weaver arise?

12. SENATOR WEAVER:

13. Thank you, Mr. President. I've checked with Senator
14. Chew and Senator Carroll on the... on Senate Bill 598. I
15. was to provide them with some additional information
16. that was...the bill was held in committee. So at this
17. time I would move to discharge Transportation from
18. further consideration of Senate Bill 598 and ask that
19. it be placed on the Calendar on the Order of 2nd reading.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Weaver has moved to discharge the Senate
22. Committee on Transportation from further consideration
23. of Senate Bill 598. All those in favor signify by
24. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee
25. is discharged. The bill is on the Order of 2nd reading.
26. For what purpose does Senator Berman arise?

27. SENATOR BERMAN:

28. Thank you, Mr. President. I'd ask for leave to
29. be shown as a cosponsor on Senate Bill 952. I have the
30. consent of the principal sponsor, Senator Bloom.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Berman has asked leave to be shown as a
33. cosponsor of Senate Bill 952. Is leave granted? Leave

1. is granted. So ordered. I have a request to go to the
2. Order of House Bills 2nd reading for the purpose of
3. reading a bill a second time and moving it to 3rd reading
4. for passage next week. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
5. House Bills, 2nd reading, House Bill 717. Read the bill,
6. Mr. Secretary.
7. SECRETARY:
8. House Bill 717.
9. (Secretary reads title of bill)
10. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One
11. Floor amendment offered by Senator Sommer.
12. PRESIDENT:
13. Senator Sommer.
14. SENATOR SOMMER:
15. Mr. President, this amendment simply takes out
16. the opportunity to spend this money for more than one
17. fiscal year.
18. PRESIDENT:
19. Senator Sommer moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1.
20. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The
21. Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any further
22. amendments?
23. SECRETARY:
24. No further amendments.
25. PRESIDENT:
26. 3rd reading. What purpose does Senator Vadalabene
27. arise?
28. SENATOR VADALABENE:
29. Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to ask leave
30. to remove myself as cosponsor of Senate Bill 616.
31. PRESIDENT:
32. Senator Vadalabene has asked leave to be removed as
33. a cosponsor of Senate Bill 616. Is leave granted? Leave

1. is granted. Message from the House.

2. SECRETARY:

3. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

4. Mr. President - I am directed to inform the
5. Senate that the House of Representatives has concurred
6. with the Senate, in the passage of a bill with the
7. following title, to-wit: Senate Bill 485, together
8. with the following amendment in the adoption of which
9. I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate,
10. to-wit: House Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 485.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Carroll.

13. SENATOR CARROLL:

14. Thank you, Mr. President. This is Senator Rupp's
15. bill. He and I have discussed this. We would move
16. that the Senate concur with House Amendment No. 2 to
17. Senate Bill 485. This would be final passage of the
18. bill. This is the supplemental appropriation to the
19. Department of Labor and to its Bureau of Unemployment
20. Securities. The amendment just makes sure that
21. nothing that we do by this supplemental bill in any
22. way affects a pending case in the Illinois State
23. Supreme Court. I would, therefore, move you, Mr. President,
24. that the Senate concur with House Amendment No. 2 to
25. Senate Bill 485.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Carroll has moved to suspend the rules
28. for the purpose of the immediate consideration and
29. concurrence in House Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill
30. 485. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
31. The Ayes have it. The question is shall the Senate
32. concur in Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 485. Those
33. in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting
34. is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who

1. wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are
2. 48, the Nays are none, none Voting Present. The Senate
3. does concur in Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 485 and the
4. bill having received the required constitutional majority
5. is declared passed. The Consent Calendar has been
6. distributed. Mr. Secretary, are there any objections
7. filed?

8. SECRETARY:

9. No objections filed.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. No objections have been filed. If not, all those
12. in favor of the adoption of the motion...of the resolu-
13. tions on the Consent Calendar, signify by saying Aye.
14. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are
15. adopted. For what purpose does Senator Nimrod arise?

16. SENATOR NIMROD:

17. Yes, Mr. President, this is inreference to Senate
18. Bill 249. I did check with the Chairman of Assignment
19. of Bills and they received concurrence to have the
20. Senate Bill 249 discharged from Judiciary II and
21. assigned to Judiciary I for the purpose of a hearing,
22. today.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Nimrod moves to discharge the Senate
25. Committee on Judiciary II from further consideration
26. of Senate Bill 249 and that the bill be re-referred
27. to Judiciary I. All those in favor signify by saying
28. Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee is
29. discharged. The bill is re-referred to Judiciary I.
30. Senator Nimrod moves to suspend the rules for purpose
31. of waiving the Six Day Notice requirement so that the
32. bill may be heard today in Judiciary I. All those
33. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes

1. have it. Senator Nimrod.

2. SENATOR NIMROD:

3. Yes, I also ask, Mr. President, that we discharge
4. Senate Bill 1141 from Agriculture and Energy for further
5. consideration for the purpose of Tabling. This bill is
6. a duplicated bill.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Nimrod moves to discharge the Senate Com-
9. mittee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy from
10. further consideration of Senate Bill 1141. All those
11. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
12. have it. The committee is discharged. Senator Nimrod
13. moves to Table Senate Bill 1141. All those in favor
14. signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it,
15. the Bill is Tabled. Senator Nimrod.

16. SENATOR NIMROD:

17. Yes, Mr. President, I would seek leave to be
18. shown as the chief sponsor of House Bill 1108. I
19. have discussed this with Senator Knuppel.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. You wish leave to be shown as...

22. SENATOR NIMROD:

23. As the sponsor of that...

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Principal sponsor?

26. SENATOR NIMROD:

27. Principal sponsor of 1108.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Senator Nimrod has asked leave to be shown as principal
30. sponsor of Senate Bill 1108 and Senator Knuppel to be
31. removed as sponsor. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
32. (Machine cut-off) motions. Senator Knuppel has filed a
33. motion to discharge Senate Bill 1012 from Labor and Commerce

1. and another motion to discharge Senate Bill 984 from
2. Labor and Commerce and request leave that the hearing
3. on these motions be postponed and set for consideration
4. on Thursday, May 12. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
5. Is there any further business to come before the Senate?
6. Senator Daley.
7. SENATOR DALEY:
8. Mr. President, and fellow Senators. Judiciary I
9. will meet immediately after the Session in Room 212.
10. PRESIDENT:
