33. and fees and for State and Federal Aid and funds received

1. through contract. Specifically, Amendment 1 requires that  
2. all items of student income, including tuition, laboratory  
3. and library fees, excess income from auxiliary enterprises  
4. and activities to be deposited in the State Community  
5. College of East St. Louis Income Fund. Federal and State  
6. aid funds received through contracts with governmental and  
7. private agencies or persons for instructional service.  
8. ...Research public service for student services and all such  
9. funds are subject to appropriation by the General Assembly.

14. I have a question of the sponsor, Mr. President.

23. Yes, Senator, this was put on because Senator Grotberg  
24. and the others and...and...and Senator Hickey so that they  
25. would be...they wouldn't be all compiled together, they would  
26. be lined out separately and therefore it would make it easy  
27. to be audited. Now I don't know if the other community colleges  
28. have it, but we did that at the request of the committee.

10. to establish this fund, so...and we did this as the bill  
11. provided and also outlined every item separate so there would  
12. be no doubt. Also we have a letter from the Auditor General  
13. recommending that we follow this procedure.

15. I'll tell you, Senator Rock, that the independent private  
16. universities and colleges concur with the solution as it's

27. PRESIDENT:

28. For what purpose does Senator Lemke arise?

29. SENATOR LEMKE:

30. Does this...I thought that when we had this in committee we  
31. were talking about putting an amendment on it that indemnifies  
32. local governments that allow these demonstrations or later come  
33. back and haunted by the Federal Government under their civil...

3. Senator Nimrod.
4. SENATOR NIMROD:
5. Yes, Mr. President and fellow members. This is the bill
6. which transfers the...the Division of Energy in accordance with
7. the Governor's provision so...or Executive Order and what I
8. wanted to do here with the amendment that was technical in
9. nature and observed in the committee and leaves out a name change
10. that was forgotten in one of the paragraphs and then in one of

22. Senator Nimrod.

24. Yes, Senator Buzbee, it is and it's accordance with the wishes

26. it leaves one point which allows the...the Division of Energy to
27. receive grants...Federal grants for supervision.

29. Is there any further discussion? If not, Senator Nimrod

1. No further committee amendments.
2. PRESIDENT:
3. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Is there any
4. further business to come before the Senate? Senator Carroll.
5. SENATOR CARROLL:
6. A few announcements, Mr. President. First of all, Appropriations
7. I will attempt to meet immediately after adjournment. We would
8. like leave of the Body to move the meeting up from 3:00 o'clock

14. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
15. Yes.  
16. PRESIDENT:  
17. Would you like...  
18. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
19. Yes...  
20. PRESIDENT:  
21. ...a vote on your motion.  
22. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
23. ...I certainly would, Mr. President...  
24. PRESIDENT:  
25. Senator Buzbee has moved to waive the Six Day Notice Requirement  
26. with respect to the bills read. All those in favor signify by  
27. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. The  
28. notice requirement has been waived.  
29. SENATOR BUZBEE:  
30. Then the other point...  
31. PRESIDENT:  
32. Senator Buzbee.  
33. SENATOR BUZBEE:



1. ...Thank you, Mr. President. The other point is the  
2. Appropriations II Subcommittee dealing with the Department of  
3. Public Aid appropriation will have another meeting, Senator Rhoads,  
4. on Thursday at 3:00 p.m. in Room 400. We anticipate that that

27. SENATOR ROCK:

28. To afford the speaker a little order. Can we get the Committee

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Will the...will the Committee on Illinois Government please...

32. SENATOR ROCK:

33. That's...tautology. Illinois is good government. Thank you.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Senator Vadalabene.
3. SENATOR VADALABENE:
4. Yes, thank you for the introduction, whatever tautology is.
5. Mr. President, with respect to the Governor's Message of April 20th,
6. 1978, I will read the names of the salaried appointments that the Committee
7. on Executive Appointments and Administration recommends that the
8. Senate advise and consent to. After reading the names I intend to
9. ask leave to consider all of the salaried appointments on one roll
10. call unless any Senator has objection to any particular name.
11. To be Chairman and member of the Illinois Industrial Commission
12. for a term expiring January 19th, 1981...
13. PRESIDENT:
14. ...Excuse me, Senator Vadalabene. You've asked leave to have
15. all of them read on...and taken on one roll call.
16. SENATOR VADALABENE:
17. Yes, Mr. President.
18. PRESIDENT:
19. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
20. SENATOR VADALABENE:
21. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
22. To be Chairman and member of the Illinois Industrial Commission
23. for a term expiring January 19, 1981, Rebecca Schneiderman of Chicago
24. and to be a member of Illinois Industrial Commission for a term
25. expiring January 19th, 1981, Ted Black, Jr. of Chicago. To be
26. a member of the Illinois Industrial Commission for a term expiring
27. January 19th, 1981, Leroy E. Duncan of Williamsville and for a
28. term expiring January 15th, 1979, James A. Thomas of Chicago. To
29. be a member of the Board of Review to the Department of Labor for
30. a term expiring January 15th, 1979, Charles J. Fiden of Wheaton and
31. Eugene E. Christy of Milan. Mr. President and members of the Senate,
32. I think I would like to have leave to scratch all these appointments

3. Senator Vadalabene asked leave to take the names read from the

5. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying Aye. Opposed.

7. (Machine cutoff) Secretary's Desk. If any Senator wished to call

28. but both of them are redundant if we pass HJR 84. That ought to be

29. sufficient.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. For what purpose does Senator Lemke arise?

32. SENATOR LEMKE:

33. Senate Joint Resolution 78...

1. PRESIDENT:  
2. Well, Senator, we are on Senate Joint Resolution...House  
3. Joint Resolution 84. If it doesn't relate to that, if you could  
4. just hold it.  
5. SENATOR LEMKE:  
6. Okay.  
7. PRESIDENT:  
8. Senator Weaver.  
9. SENATOR WEAVER:  
10. Well, Mr. President, I think that the sponsorship on both of  
11. these or all three of these resolutions is...almost identical so  
12. I see that it makes no difference which resolution is adopted.  
13. This is a House joint resolution and I hope we can act on it.  
14. PRESIDENT:  
15. Well, I think the suggestion was that...that all of the  
16. resolutions be acted on. Is that agreeable, Senator Berning?  
17. What...what is the number of the other...Senator Rock, do you  
18. have the number of the other resolution or resolutions?  
19. SENATOR ROCK:  
20. SJR 80, I believe.  
21. PRESIDENT:  
22. Senator Berning.  
23. SENATOR BERNING:  
24. And SJR 79.  
25. PRESIDENT:  
26. All right. For the sake of procedure we will take Senate...  
27. House Joint Resolution 84 out of the record momentarily and  
28. Senator Rock moves to discharge the Committee on Executive from  
29. further consideration of Senate Joint Resolution 79 and Senate  
30. Joint Resolution 80. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
31. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The committee is discharged. The  
32. resolution is on the Order of the Secretary's Desk. Senator  
33. Berning now moves that the Senate adopt Senate Joint Resolution 79,

1. Senate Joint...Resolution 80 and House Joint Resolution 84. All  
2. those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.  
3. The resolutions are adopted. Senator Lemke.  
4. SENATOR LEMKE:  
5. Just an inquiry. Senate Joint Resolution 17, how many times  
6. has that been read? It's on the Secretary's Desk. Has that been  
7. ever read and...  
8. PRESIDENT:  
9. That need not be read, Senator. That can be called for a

14. (Machine cutoff)does Senator Regner arise?  
15. SENATOR REGNER:

17. minded row here, I was just wondering if we do pass all three of  
18. these, will they all be put in the same envelope to save the  
19. postage?  
20. PRESIDENT:  
21. I'm unable to answer that, Senator Regner, we'll have to check  
22. with the Senate Operations Committee on that. Resolutions.  
23. SECRETARY:  
24. Senate Resolution 366 offered by Senator Sangmeister and Senate  
25. Joint Resolution 84 offered by Senators Ozinga and Hynes and all  
26. members.  
27. PRESIDENT:  
28. Resolutions Consent Calendar. Is there any further business  
29. to come before the Senate? Senator Egan.  
30. SENATOR EGAN:  
31. Yes, just to announce Mr. President and members that the sub-  
32. committee on the commissions is going to meet in Room 122A at 9:00  
33. a.m.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Mitchler.

3. SENATOR MITCHLER:

4. (Machine cutoff) Mr. President and members of the Senate an  
5. announcement that the annual German dinner will be held May 11th,  
6. that's Thursday evening at the Forum XXX. All the Deutsch boys  
7. can get tickets to you. Thank you.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Is there any further business to come before the Senate? If
