3. Mr. President, I'd like to enter into the record
4. the fact that Senator Bloom will not be here today.
5. His father passed away over the weekend and the
6. funeral is today.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Glass.

9. SENATOR GLASS:

10. Mr. President, if this is appropriate, I would
11. like leave to be shown as the chief sponsor of House
12. Bill 1197 in place of Senator Netsch. I've spoken
13. with her about it and she's indicated that's agreeable.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Is Senator Netsch going to be taken off as a
16. sponsor? You will be a sole...

17. SENATOR GLASS:

18. A sponsor, but I will be the chief sponsor.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. All right, will it show Glass-Netsch. Is that
21. correct?

22. SENATOR GLASS:

23. That's the child custody, Uniform Child Custody Act.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. It will show Glass-Netsch. All right. You have
26. heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
27. Senator Smith.

28. SENATOR SMITH:

29. Mr. President, I should like to be shown as a
30. cosponsor of House Bill 1472 and 1474 with Senator Guidice.
31. You just called it on 1st reading.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. The request is to have Senator Smith shown as a

1. principal cosponsor of Senate...House Bills 1472 and 1474,
2. which were read into today. Is leave granted? Leave is
3. granted.

4. SENATOR SMITH:

5. Now, Mr. President, I should like to make a motion
6. in connection with each of those two bills. As a matter
7. of fact, there are three. But I should like to make a
8. motion with regards to two of those bills. They are
9. sponsored by Senator...by Representative McLendon of
10. my district over in the House and he had asked as of
11. Friday that I pick these three bills up, but I had
12. already noticed on the Calendar that one of the
13. Senators had picked up one and the two that were called
14. today are the other two in that series of bills. Now,
15. 1472 provides that a policy holder shall receive notice
16. of the existence of the Public Service Division of the
17. Department of Insurance and the address of the complaint
18. department of the Insurance Department. And House
19. Bill 1774 provides that any person entering into a
20. contract for the adjustment of a fire loss must be
21. provided with a copy of the law which permits such
22. contracts to be rescinded within ten days. Now, the
23. first of the two bills came out of committee, out of
24. the...

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Well, Senator, Senator...may we have some order.
27. Will the members please be in their seats. Senator,
28. are you going to make a motion with respect to these
29. bills?

30. SENATOR SMITH:

31. Yes, I want to move that they be taken to 2nd
32. reading without reference to committee.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator, that...that may well be an acceptable motion,
2. but I...I would ask that you first talk to the Chairman
3. of the Committee on Assignment of Bills and they appear
4. to be bills that would go to the Committee on Insurance
5. and I think we ought to at least give the chairman of
6. that committee the courtesy of...of notifying him, and
7. then I think we...

8. SENATOR SMITH:

9. I...I see so many do that daily here and that's
10. why...

11. PRESIDENT:

12. No, I...

13. SENATOR SMITH:

14. ...knowing that there's no opposition to it...

15. PRESIDENT:

16. That...that may well be acceptable, but...

17. SENATOR SMITH:

18. I'll go back and see...assignment.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. ...and...and Senator Lane and Senator Donnewald,
21. if you could discuss it with them. Senator...on the
22. Order of Motions, there is a Motion in Writing on
23. the Secretary's Desk. Senator Rock.

24. SENATOR ROCK:

25. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of
26. the Senate. I have filed a Motion in Writing with the
27. Secretary, which reads as follows: I move to recommit
28. the following Senate Bills to the following committees.
29. And what I have done, just in the sake of brevity, is
30. list those Senate Bills on 2nd reading and those Senate
31. Bills on 3rd reading. There are eleven total bills, and
32. move to be...that they be recommitted to the committees
33. from which they came. And I would so move.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. You've heard the motion. Is there any discussion?
3. If not, all those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
4. The Ayes have it. So ordered. If I may have the attention
5. of the membership, we will very shortly go to the Order
6. of House Bills 2nd reading. Any member having a House
7. Bill on 2nd reading and wishing to advance it, if you
8. would please be prepared to act on it when the...the bill
9. is called. (Machine cut-off) Senator Carroll arise?
10. SENATOR CARROLL:
11. Thank you, Mr. President. For the purpose of taking
12. four House Bills that were read for the first time today,
13. bypassing the Assignment of Bills Committee, having them
14. assigned to Appropriations I, where they are on the Calendar
15. for hearing tomorrow, waiving the Six Day Notice.
16. PRESIDENT:
17. Tomorrow afternoon?
18. SENATOR CARROLL:
19. Yes, so...
20. PRESIDENT:
21. Well, why not let them go through Assignment of
22. Bills, the...the report will be ready tomorrow and we
23. can do that at the Session tomorrow.
24. SENATOR CARROLL:
25. Fine, they are scheduled already on the notice
26. they are hearing tomorrow. So that...you want to waive
27. the Six Day Rule now, or...
28. PRESIDENT:
29. No, why don't we wait until tomorrow, I think...
30. SENATOR CARROLL:
31. We can waive tomorrow.
32. PRESIDENT:
33. Right. Senator Egan, for what purpose do you arise?

1. SENATOR EGAN:

2. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. If...if
3. I could have Senator Walsh's attention, it has just come to
4. my attention that the Calendar is mistaken. The Revenue
5. Committee meets on Thursday morning, so that should alleviate
6. all of your anxieties, but that's...that's to announce that
7. there is a mistake on the Calendar, which I know never
8. happens.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. (Machine cut-off) does Senator Donnewald arise?

11. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

12. Yes, Mr. President, it's been called to my attention
13. that Local Government also is listed on Friday at 3:00 p.m.
14. and Finance and Credit Regulations at 7:30 p.m. Friday. Those
15. particular meetings are to be...are actually set for Thursday,
16. Local Government at 3:00 p.m. and Finance and Credit Regulations,
17. 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, instead of Friday as the Calendar shows,
18. the Calendar is in error.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. (Machine cut-off) Senator Joyce arise?

21. SENATOR JOYCE:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to refer
23. House Bill 404 from Executive to Pensions. It is a
24. Pensions bill, I've talked to Senator Donnewald about it.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Is there any discussion? Senator Joyce moves to
27. discharge Senate Committee on...on Executive from further
28. consideration of House Bill 404 and to re-refer the bill
29. to the Senate Committee on Pensions and Personnel. All
30. those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes
31. have it. So ordered. (Machine cut-off) purpose does
32. Senator Egan arise?

33. SENATOR EGAN:

34. Mr. President and members of the Senate. As long

1. as there is a lull, I've been requested many, many, times
2. by the members of the press and radio and TV, to let them
3. know, if I could, when the death penalty bill will be
4. called. I am the sponsor in the House, it's House Bill 10,
5. it is on 3rd reading. And I would with...would like very
6. much with leave of the Senate on tomorrow to ask that it
7. be returned to 2nd reading so that we could satisfy anyone
8. who has a desire to amend it, and then if we can advance
9. it to 3rd on tomorrow, call it with leave of the Body
10. as a matter of special importance on Thursday at about
11. one o'clock. That would satisfy, I think, the schedule.
12. I've checked with the President and the press would
13. have sufficient forewarning when it will be called.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. All right. Senator...Senator Egan has just requested
16. leave of the Body to...for the following procedure to
17. be adopted with respect to House Bill 10, which is
18. the Death Penalty Bill. First, the bill will be brought
19. back on the Order of 3rd reading to 2nd reading tomorrow,
20. Wednesday, for purpose of any amendment that any member
21. may wish to offer and that the bill be set as a Special
22. Order of Business on Thursday at 1:00 p.m. for final
23. hearing and vote on final passage. Is leave granted
24. for that procedure to be followed? Leave is granted.
25. Resolutions.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Resolution 152 offered by Senator Mitchler
28. and it's congratulatory. Senate Resolution 153 offered
29. by Senator Nimrod and it's congratulatory. Senate
30. Resolution 154 ordered...offered by Senators Lemke,
31. Daley, Kosinski, Hynes and others and it's congratulatory,
32. and Senate Resolution 155 offered by Senator Carroll and
33. it's congratulatory.

34. PRESIDENT:

1. Do we have leave to place the Resolutions just read
2. on the Resolutions Consent Calendar? Leave is granted.
3. Resolutions.

4. SECRETARY:

5. Senate Resolution 156 offered by Senator Berning.
6. Oh, wait a minute, it's Senate Resolution 156 offered
7. by Senators Weaver, Graham and Carroll.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Executive.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Joint Resolution No. 44 offered by Senator
12. Berning.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Executive. (Machine cut-off) Bills, 2nd reading.
15. House Bill 13, Senator Egan. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

16. SECRETARY:

17. House...House Bill 13.

18. (Secretary reads title of bill)

19. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health,
20. Welfare and Corrections offers one amendment.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

22. May we have attention please. Senator Egan is
23. going to discuss the Heimlich Manuever. Senator Egan.

24. SENATOR EGAN:

25. Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment that was
26. adopted in the committee is for the restaurant owners
27. who desire to clarify the location where the...the
28. description and the direction of the whichever maneuver,
29. Mr. President, is used and...it requires that it not
30. be in the actual dining area, so as to preserve any
31. particular decor that a restaurant might have, but it...
32. it does have to be prominently displayed, that's all it
33. does.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Is there further discussion? Senator Glass.

3. SENATOR GLASS:

4. A question of the sponsor if he will yield.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Just a moment, over to my right there's an awful

7. lot of chatter. May we have order. It's all over.

8. I'm...I'm informed, it all over in the left and in

9. the right and to the rear. Proceed.

10. SENATOR GLASS:

11. Senator Egan, does George Lindberg approve this

12. amendment?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Senator Egan.

15. SENATOR EGAN:

16. Yes, I understand that...that he has been in

17. total sympathy with the bill and the amendment and

18. that he, along with others, are ready, willing and able

19. to instruct on the maneuver.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. Is there further discussion? The question is shall

22. Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 13 be adopted. Those

23. in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay.

6. So the rationale for the change and the means of
7. notification is that not all dispatchers are equipped
8. with radios and consequently, would be required to use
9. some other form of communication and the number of
10. places where they are handling this..they...what they
11. call forgign crews, that they come over other lines,
12. that their radios are not in communication with
13. each other. So this was the first...the...the
14. reasoning surrounding this amendment. I move for
15. the adoption of the amendment.

16. will do House Bills 1st and 2nd reading and a Special
17. Order of Business with House Bill 10, the Death Penalty,
18. which we previously announced. On Friday, no Session.
19. The committee schedule has been slightly rearranged to
20. accommodate this change. There will be no committee
21. meetings on Friday. The Thursday evening committees
22. are being rescheduled to Wednesday evening at the
23. same time and place and the Thursday afternoon committees
24. will meet at 2:00 p.m. rather than 3:00 p.m.. I think
25. we can have a productive week and still be able to...to
26. leave here Thursday afternoon and I would ask for
27. leave of the Body to follow this schedule.
