11. SENATOR JOHNS:

12. Mr. President, I move that reading and approval

18. You've heard the motion. Is there any discussion?
19. If not all those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.
20. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Messages from the House.

2. Mr. President - I am directed to inform the
3. Senate that the House of Representatives has adopted the
4. following Joint Resolution in the adoption of which I am
5. instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate to-wit:

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Ziomek.

10. SENATOR ZIOMEK:

11. Yes, I'd like to move that we suspend the rules and ask
12. for the immediate adoption.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Ziomek has moved to suspend the rules for
15. the purpose of the immediate consideration and adoption
16. of House Joint Resolution 92. All those in favor signify
17. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it, the rules
18. are suspended. Senator Ziomek now moves for the adoption
19. of House Joint Resolution 92. All those in favor signify
20. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it, the resolution
21. is adopted. Resolutions.

23. Resolution 401 offered by Senator Mitchler.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Executive. What purpose does Senator Mitchler arise?

26. SENATOR MITCHLER:

27. Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate Resolu-
28. tion 401, I believe the name...the number that the Secretary
29. gave is identical with Senate Joint Resolution 83 and they
30. advised that that should be a Senate Resolution rather than
31. a Joint Resolution and the way to overcome this would be
32. to introduce this resolution at this time, ask leave of
33. the Senate to have the Six Day Rule waived and have it
34. heard in Executive tomorrow when Senate Joint Resolution 83

1. is normally set. And then we'll Table that Senate Joint
2. Resolution 83. I've talked to both sides of the aisle
3. on it.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. All right. Senate Resolution 401 will be assigned
6. to the Committee on Executive. Senator Mitchler, you
7. said it is identical to the Senate Joint Resolution 83
8. that is being considered by the committee tomorrow.
9. Senator Mitchler asks leave to have Senate Resolution
10. 401 heard jointly with Senate Joint Resolution 83 at
11. tomorrow's Executive Committee meeting. Is...is leave
12. granted? Leave is granted.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Resolution 402 offered by Senator Berman, it's
15. congratulatory.

16. Resolution 403 offered by Senator Mitchler, it's
17. congratulatory.

18. Resolution 404 offered by Senator Berning, it's
19. congratulatory.

20. And Resolution, or Senate Joint Resolution 92, it's
21. congratulatory.

5. Rules Committee. For what purpose does Senator
6. Vadalabene arise?

7. SENATOR VADALABENE:

8. I suppose one of the greatest announcements that
9. I've made on the Floor of the Senate since I've been
10. in the Senate...

11. PRESIDENT:

12. All right. May...may we have some attention,
13. please. Senator Vadalabene has an important announce-
14. ment.

15. SENATOR VADALABENE:

16. Yes, I think I really should have attention on
17. this because as you recall Senator Sam had lost eighteen
18. straight races and was in the money the last, since
19. the thirteenth race up to the eighteenth race. On Memorial Day on
20. Memorial Day and I happened to watch it on television.
21. It was televised on Channel 4, CBS, Senator Sam came
22. in first and won his first race. I went to several
23. Memorial Day exercises, I saluted about forty times,
24. but I'll say one thing, I saluted Senator Sam on
25. this event.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. For what purpose does Senator Knuppel arise?

28. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

29. Well I just noticed on the House Bills, 1st reading,
30. House Bill 3010, enacts Registered Container Trademark
31. Act, I thought surely Senator Shapiro and Senator Hickey
32. would want that bill as cosponsors.

1. For what purpose does Senator Glass arise?

2. SENATOR GLASS:

3. Mr. President, with respect to House Bill 841, I

4. would like to move that the Senate refuse to recede

5. and accept the recommendation of the House for a Second

6. Conference Committee.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. All right. Senator Glass has asked leave to go

9. to the Order of the Secretary's Desk and to consider House

10. Bill 841. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator

11. Glass moves that the Senate accede to the request of

12. the House that a Second Conference Committee be appointed.

13. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying Aye.

14. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries and the

15. Senate accedes to the request of the House to...for

16. the appointment of a Second Conference Committee.

17. For what purpose does Senator Rupp arise?

18. SENATOR RUPP:

19. Mr. President, I would like the leave of the Body

20. as far as House Bill 1468, which is on the Secretary's

21. Desk under nonconcurrency. This was House Bill as

22. amended and it seeks to amend the Local Governmental

23. and Government Employees Tort Immunity Act. I would

24. like to move that the Senate refuse to recede from

25. Senate Amendment No. 1 and that a Conference Committee

26. be appointed.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. All right. On the Order of the Secretary's Desk,

29. House Bill 1468, Senator Rupp has asked leave of the

30. Body to consider that bill. Is leave granted? Leave

31. is granted. Senator Rupp moves that the Senate refuse

32. to recede from the adoption of Senate Amendment No. 1

33. to House Bill 1468 and that a Conference Committee

1. be appointed. All those in favor of the motion signify
2. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it, the motion
3. carries.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. For what purpose does Senator Harber Hall arise?

6. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

7. Well, Mr. President, my cousin, Kenneth Hall brought
8. to my attention an error that he and apparently...many of
9. the members here have come in contact with wherein one
10. of our distinguished downstate newspapers had on their
11. front page a picture of our President. And it called him
12. a Presidential Secret Service Agent. Now, the full-time
13. Pantagraph reporter is sitting here with us and I thought
14. it would be an opportune time for him to meet the President
15. of the Illinois Senate, Thomas Hynes, if he could get
16. together with him, he's sitting right over here.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Senator Hynes.

19. SENATOR HYNES:

20. Thank you, Senator Hall. In many ways, at least in...in
21. terms of the comments that I've heard this morning from
22. some of my colleagues it might be a promotion. But I...I appreciate...I
23. appreciate very much your comment, Senator, and I...I'm
24. very happy to...to meet the reporter.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Senator Knuppel.

27. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

28. On a point of personal privilege, I've taken the
29. liberty of passing out that picture so that most of
30. the people would have a copy where it says that...that
31. our President...Secret Service Agent, but I think there's
32. something far more interesting in that picture. If
33. you'll look at the size of the three heads, you can

1. understand what the problem is in Washington. I've never
2. been able to get four quarts in a two quart container.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Hynes.

5. SENATOR HYNES:

6. Mr. President and members of the Senate. For...I
7. rise for purposes of an announcement. First of all there
8. will be a meeting of the Rules Committee this afternoon
9. at 4:00 p. m. in the President's Office. As you know,
10. the Committee on Executive Appointments will meet at
11. 2:30 in Room 212. We've also distributed the schedule
12. for the next two weeks and it is on your desk and I
13. would ask that the members take that copy and...and
14. study it carefully because those will be two very
15. important weeks if we are to meet our deadline of
16. adjourning prior to July 1. There will also be a
17. meeting of the Rules Committee as you can see on the
18. schedule next Tuesday at 11:00 a. m. And the Session
19. will begin next week at 1:00 p. m. So this is...on
20. Tuesday...and this is the schedule that we are going
21. to stick to. You'll notice that on Friday, June 9th,
22. no specific committees are scheduled and we are holding
23. that day open for any overflow of business because
24. the schedule on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of
25. next week is very tight. So Rules Committee today
26. at 4:00 o'clock. The next Rules Committee will be
27. next Tuesday at 11:00.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Further announcements? Senator Hall, Kenneth Hall.

30. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

31. Point of personal privilege, Mr...

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. State your point, Senator Hall.

1. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:

2. Mr. President and fellow members of the Senate.

3. We are honored today to have in the Gallery, in the back

4. of me here, three honor students from Lovejoy Senior

5. High School which is located in my district. They are

6. here with their principal, Mr. Leo Triplet. They are

7. Coriana Warren...Miss Coriana Warren, Mr. William Adams and

8. Mrs. Corneatha Becket. I would ask they would stand

9. and be recognized by the Senate.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. Would our guests please stand and be recognized.

12. Senator Vadalabene.

13. SENATOR VADALABENE:

14. Yes, in form of an announcement, Mr. President.

15. At 2:30, today, the Executive Appointments and Administra-

16. tion will meet in Room 212 for the confirmation of the

17. ...Governor's appointments. Room 212, at 2:30 today.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Senator Philip. Did you wish recognition?

20. SENATOR PHILIP:

21. Thank you, Mr. President, a purpose of an announce-

22. ment. We once again have softball practice tonight

23. at 6:00 o'clock at Lincoln Park, Diamond 4. And as you're

24. probably aware, we have the main event coming up June 8th.

25. So this is the last practice, we hope that everybody would

26. get out there tonight and let's have a good workout.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. The a...the electrician has an announcement for

29. the members of the Senate. In the remaining month here,

30. he requests that if you would raise your microphones

31. by the black hand-held provided they will last through

32. this month and you will not be denied the right of

33. expression in this Chamber. So, I would warn you one

1. more time to use the black hand-hold as opposed to the
