11.           From the Committee...Executive Committee...

12. PRESIDENT:

13.           ...from the Committee on Executive and...

14. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

15.           to...to the committee...

16. PRESIDENT:

17.           ...re-refer the...

18. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

19.           ...Appropriations.

20. PRESIDENT:

21.           ...bill to Committee on Appropriations I.

22. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

23.           Appropriations No. I.

24. PRESIDENT:

25.           All those in favor of the motion signify by saying Aye.  
26. Opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.

27. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

28.           Yes, now, Mr. President, I...I now move to recommit  
29. from Education...Committee on Education House Bill 2205  
30. to the Committee on Labor and Commerce. Now, Mr. President,  
31. this bill would...would have been heard this afternoon.  
32. I would ask that the Six Day Rule be waived and that the  
33. bill be heard in Labor and Commerce tomorrow.

27. PRESIDENT:  
28. Senator Nimrod moves to discharge the Committee  
29. on Judiciary II from further consideration of House Bill  
30. 782 and to re-refer the bill to the Committee on Judiciary  
31. I. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed.  
32. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Senator Carroll, after his conference.

30. with the other principal sponsor, Senator Netsch.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. You've heard the request...

33. SENATOR HALL:

34. The lead...the lead principal sponsor.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. You have heard the request. You will be the lead  
3. principal sponsor, Senator Hall? You have heard the request.  
4. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. Could I  
5. have the attention of the membership? There are a number  
6. of easement bills on the Calendar on the Order of  
7. House Bills, 3rd reading which have been checked by the staffs  
8. on both sides of the aisle and are apparently without  
9. any controversy. And it is our intention to put all of these  
10. bills on the Calendar as Agreed Bill List No. 3 to be called  
11. for passage on Friday. The procedure to be followed will be

25. Leave is granted. Resolutions.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Resolution 167 offered by Senators Harber Hall  
28. and Mitchler, it's congratulatory.

29. Senate Resolution 168 offered by Senator Mitchler,  
30. it's congratulatory.

31. Senate Resolution 169 offered by Senator Mitchler,  
32. it's congratulatory.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Is leave granted to place the...these resolutions  
2. on the Consent Calendar? They are congratulatory. Leave  
3. is granted. ...purpose does Senator Netsch arise?

4. SENATOR NETSCH:

5. Thank you, Mr. President. For an announcement  
6. that relates to Judiciary II. The Committee was originally  
7. scheduled to meet tomorrow night and there are several  
8. conflicts which I think are unacceptable to the members of the  
9. Committee and so we have been able to resolve it, not
