8. located in Coles County. Restores access rights and it...describes  
9. adjacent property owner on the payment of five thousand dollars and  
10. I'd ask for a favorable roll call.

26. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

27. Mr. President and members of the Senate. That's just  
28. exactly what it says. This was land bought from originally and  
29. now that highway has been changed and this is reverting back.  
30. Appreciate a favorable vote.

28. 3rd reading of the bill.  
29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
30. Senator Coffey.  
31. SENATOR COFFEY:  
32. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This bill is  
33. somewhat differed in that it is a trade of lands between the

1. Department of Conservation of...Vermilion County Conservation  
2. Department and...Illinois DOT. The land exchange is negotiated  
3. between these three based upon the purchase price trading  
4. dollar for dollar on land values so that the Vermilion County  
5. Conservation District will be able to control the land on the  
6. East side of the what is called the Middle Fork Reservoir and  
7. the lands that they owned on the West side will go back to the  
8. conservation district and DOT so they can manage those lands  
9. more feasibly and I would ask for a favorable roll call.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

11. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is, shall  
12. House Bill 3257 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those  
13. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted

16. House Bill 3257 having received the constitutional majority  
17. is declared passed. All right. With leave of the Body we  
18. will turn to page 9. There's been a request from certain  
19. members to call their resolutions that are...have been placed  
20. on the Secretary's Desk. 211, Senator Berning. 340, Senator  
21. Lemke. Senate Resolution 340. Hold it. 370, Senator Bloom.  
22. On the Order of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions; Senate

24. SENATOR BLOOM:

25. Thank you very much, Mr. President. This resolution calls  
26. upon the Auditor General to conduct a management audit of two  
27. programs in the Department of Public Health, Emergency Medical  
28. Services and the Maternal and Child Care. Basically, it's  
29. because Appropriations staff in the House and then our  
30. Appropriations staff in the Senate was unable to establish a  
31. good audit trail of Federal funds. It came out of Executive  
32. with no dissenting votes. I'll answer any questions and  
33. appreciate a favorable roll call.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)  
2. Is there any discussion? Senator Hynes.  
3. SENATOR HYNES:  
4. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I...I wonder...  
5. without trying to be dilatory if the sponsor would be willing  
6. to hold this for the simple reason that it appears we are  
7. getting more and more of these resolutions asking the Auditor  
8. General to do certain things and I...I think we ought to try  
9. to establish some policy on it and if we could just have a  
10. couple of days to discuss that I think it would be helpful.  
11. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)  
12. Senator Bloom.  
13. SENATOR BLOOM:  
14. Well, I wish you'd spoken earlier about that. I wouldn't  
15. have pushed that. I thought there was no problem.  
16. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)  
17. Senator Hynes.  
18. SENATOR HYNES:  
19. Well, I...I don't think there is a problem, Senator, but  
20. I was just asking. I'm sorry that I didn't have a chance to  
21. talk to you before it was called. If...If you'd be willing to  
22. do that it would be appreciated.  
23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
24. Senator Bloom.  
25. SENATOR BLOOM:  
26. Fine.  
27. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)  
28. Okay. Take it out of the record. 391, Senator Graham.  
29. I think there's a Committee Amendment on this one, Mr.  
30. Secretary. 391. On the Order of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions,  
31. Senate Resolution 391.  
32. SECRETARY:  
33. Senate Resolution 391 with Amendment No. 1 offered by

1. Executive Committee.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

3. Senator Graham.

4. SENATOR GRAHAM:

5. Move the adoption.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

7. Senator Graham has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1

8. to Senate...Resolution 391. All in favor signify by saying Aye.

9. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. On

10. the Order of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, Senate Resolution

11. 391. Senator Graham.

12. SENATOR GRAHAM:

13. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This resolution

14. proposes to do what I had thought we might do with the bill

15. earlier in the Session. After consulting with the leadership

16. on both sides of the aisle as we start dealing into the...dealing

17. with this very important subject matter of chymopapain that has

18. something to do with the lower back pain that many individuals

19. suffer...Thought...It was thought the best we create a committee

20. and have two or three hearings, invite in some people that were

21. experts in this field and be prepared to report back for a bill

22. in the next Session of the General Assembly and I move the

23. adoption of the amendments.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

25. Senator Graham has moved the adoption of Senate Resolution

26. 391. Is there any discussion? All right. Those in favor will

27. vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.

28. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the

29. record. On that question, the Ayes are 45, the Nays are None,

30. 1 Voting Present. Senate...Resolution 391 is adopted. 396,

31. Senator Lane. HJR 49, Senator Berman. HJR 72, Senator Netsch.

32. Okay. SJR 17, Senator Lemke. SJR 74, Senator Egan. On the

33. Order of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, Senate Joint Resolution

1. 74, Senator Egan. Oh, I'm...I'm informed by the Secretary there  
2. is an amendment. Is...

3. SECRETARY:

4. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Regner.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)

6. Senator Regner.

7. SENATOR REGNER:

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate. It's a very simple  
9. amendment. All it says is that the cost of the typing, printing  
10. and postage to mail this resolution wherever it's supposed to be  
11. mailed shall be borne by the sponsor and I'd move its adoption.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)

13. Senator Regner has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1  
14. to Senate Joint Resolution 74. Is there any discussion? Senator  
15. Egan.

16. SENATOR EGAN:

17. Yes, if I can pass the hat I'd be in favor of it. Do we  
18. have time to pass the hat, Senator? Otherwise I've got to be  
19. opposed.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)

21. Further discussion? Senator Knuppel.

22. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

23. To...this is an outstanding piece of legislation and I  
24. support it wholeheartedly.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)

26. Any further discussion? If not, Senator Regner has moved  
27. the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Joint Resolution 74.  
28. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. In  
29. the opinion of the Chair the Noes have it. The amendment fails.  
30. On the Order of Senate Joint Resolution 74, Senator Egan.

31. SENATOR EGAN:

32. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This  
33. has come to the attention of the Illinois General Assembly in the

1. past I'm informed in the history of our deliberations that from  
2. time to time we do reach out to help our sister states and in  
3. this particular instance I think it noteworthy that the Illinois  
4. Legislature or the Alaska Legislature has...is seeking our help  
5. in support in a resolution that they passed urging Congress to  
6. reconsider its position on parts of the native land settlement  
7. claim to help those pioneers in Alaska that want to develop their  
8. own land. As you know the territory...the State of Alaska is  
9. comprised of...upwards of three hundred and fifty million acres,  
10. all of which Congressmen from out of the state wish to freeze to  
11. Federalize their Fish and Game Laws and literally lock up the  
12. development of the state people who have pioneered its existence.  
13. The...Alaska delegation asks that we support them in seeking help  
14. from the other members of the Senate and Congress who are in favor  
15. of the legislation and I think it noteworthy to add that both of  
16. the U.S. Senators from Alaska and its Congressmen...it's single  
17. Congressman are all opposed and in favor of the resolution that  
18. we're supporting and I ask for your favorable consideration.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

20. Senator Egan has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution  
21. 74. Is there any discussion? Senator Berning.

22. SENATOR BERNING:

23. Well, just one question. I have to assume that the sponsor  
24. is knowledgeable in this area and in the matter in which he speaks,  
25. however, my question has to do with why no Alaskan Senator or  
26. Representative has communicated with this Body or with any of us  
27. individually. At least I haven't heard from anybody. I would  
28. hesitate to be taking action which might be contrary to the  
29. avowed position of the people of Alaska and I have no way of know-  
30. ing.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

32. Senator Egan.

33. SENATOR EGAN:

1. Yes, Senator Berning, Senator or Representative Smith  
2. was down at a meeting with the Speaker of the House and the  
3. President of the Senate and a few others that were present that  
4. had some knowledge of the situation in Alaska. As a matter of  
5. fact, Representative Smith represents the Fairbanks area and  
6. came down and gave a presentation, a film and a...a map display  
7. on all of the details.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

9. Further...further discussion? All right. If not, the  
10. question is, shall...shall the Senate adopt Senate Resolution  
11. 74. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote  
12. Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all  
13. voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes  
14. are 40, the Nays are 2. None Voting Present. Senate Joint  
15. Resolution 74 is adopted. Yes, Senator Grotberg, for what  
16. purpose do you arise?

17. SENATOR GROTBORG:

18. On a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

20. State your point.

21. SENATOR GROTBORG:

22. I thought the Body would be interested to know that during  
23. the March of Dimes Program a few weeks back radio station WBOK  
24. in Pontiac had a radio auction and I know you've all been  
25. solicited for items for radio auctions the only thing that I  
26. can come up with was a day as a Senate page attached particularly  
27. to Senator Grotberg and I want you all to meet Jeff Jones, whose  
28. uncle, Bob Jones, the Deputy Sheriff of Livingston County paid  
29. twenty-five dollars for the privilege to the March of Dimes of  
30. having Jeff here today to help me and ~~anyone~~ of you who needs help  
31. today. Jeff Jones.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

33. On the...top of page 10.Senator Johns, SJR 75. On the Order

1. of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, Senate Joint Resolution  
2. 75. The Secretary informs me there is an amendment.  
3. SECRETARY:  
4. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Regner.  
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
6. Senator Regner.  
7. SENATOR REGNER:  
8. May I ask the sponsor, Senator Johns, a question before I  
9. offer the amendment?  
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
11. Indicates he...  
12. SENATOR REGNER:  
13. Senator Johns...  
14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
15. ...will...  
16. SENATOR REGNER:  
17. ...in this resolution how many copies and where are you all  
18. planning on mailing them?  
19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
20. Senator Johns.  
21. SENATOR JOHNS:  
22. To my old and formidable opponents and one that I recognize  
23. as...would have risen on such an occasion. I do not intend to  
24. distribute any of these except to the Governor and President  
25. Carter as so directed in this resolution.  
26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
27. Senator Regner.  
28. SENATOR REGNER:  
29. In other words you'll hand deliver them and you won't have  
30. to pay any postage.  
31. PRESIDING OFFICER : (SENATOR ROCK)  
32. Senator Johns.  
33. SENATOR JOHNS:

1. If Senator Regner will pay my expenses. Yes.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

3. Senator Regner.

4. SENATOR REGNER:

5. I'll withdraw the amendment then.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

7. All right. The amendment has been withdrawn. On the Order

8. of the Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, Senate Joint Resolution 75.

9. Senator Johns.

10. SENATOR JOHNS:

11. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Illinois

12. has a seventy million dollar Coal and Energy Development Bonding

13. Authority. As a member of the Energy Resource Commission I'm

14. proud to present this resolution which emphasizes the utilization

15. of coal of Illinois and its reserves while protecting the environ-

16. ment and it would encourage various industries and public

17. institutions to convert to coal and encourage the use of coal

18. in conjunction with conservation of energy and alternative fuel

19. resources. It's a very simple statement by this commission and

20. a few Senators urging Illinois to make full utilization of its

21. major resource while we have coal under eighty percent of the land

22. of Illinois we must use it to the fullest. I would answer any

23. questions in this regard.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

25. Any discussion? Senator Schaffer.

26. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

27. Well, Senator Johns, the only thing that's always kind of

28. mystified me, most of this coal is in the Southern part of the

29. State but most of my colleagues from the Southern part of the State

30. are always trying to cover the ground down there with concrete.

31. Don't we have a little bit of a conflict there?

32. SENATOR JOHNS:

33. Well, if he means by the covering of soil with concrete in

1. the making of good highways, yes, I agree but we must have that  
2. highway to bring coal out of Little Egypt to Chicago.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

4. Any further discussion? If not, the question is, shall  
5. the Senate adopt Senate Joint Resolution 75. Those in favor  
6. vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have  
7. all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.  
8. On that question, the Ayes are 43, the Nays are 1, None Voting

5. SENATOR NETSCH:

6. Thank you, Mr. President. I think that the language that  
7. Mr. Wright was reading was in part the committee amendment. The  
8. Committee Amendment No. 1 makes the membership of this Special  
9. Joint Committee to pursue the long-term debt management problem  
10. an evenly divided one between the majority and minority parties

25. Senator Netsch.

26. SENATOR NETSCH:

27. ...thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 was suggested  
28. to us by the Republican staff members to make it clear that the  
29. committee could ...this Special Joint Committee could make  
30. use of the appropriation that is normally made for the incidental  
31. expenses of joint committees. We have added a provision that  
32. does make that clear and in addition have changed the title of  
33. the committee from a commission to a committee. It really is...

1. is to serve a function of a Special Joint Committee rather  
2. than a commission and I think it is a more appropriate nomenclature.  
3. I agree with both of these proposals. Offer the amendment and  
4. would move its adoption.

19. on long-term State debt with an evenly divided membership

21. Joint Committee is to pursue the report of the Auditor General  
22. on the management of long-term State debt. There were some  
23. very important recommendations and a great deal of very  
24. important information in that report that all members of a  
25. General Assembly ultimately and certainly a...a particular group  
26. in the interim should be conscious of because it presents a  
27. very important challenge for us in terms of the future of long-  
28. term State debt. We feel that...this resolution, incidently,  
29. was strongly supported by the...by the Comptroller and also by  
30. the Auditor General so that and I think it was agreed to generally  
31. on both sides by this time. I think it gives us an opportunity

8. Indicates she will yield. Senator Rhoads.

9. SENATOR RHOADS:

10. Senator Netsch, does the definition of long-term debt...is  
11. that limited to just the subject matter of the Auditor General's  
12. report which, I believe, was bonded indebtedness or does it  
13. also get into the question of unfunded liability of pension  
14. systems?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER:(SENATOR ROCK)

16. Senator Netsch.

17. SENATOR NETSCH:

18. Well, the resolution does not define it other than by  
19. reference to the report of the Auditor General. I don't  
20. suppose that there...it was, you're right, it dealt mostly  
21. with bonded debt although I'm not sure that because of the  
22. relationship of that issue to...to the debt status of the State  
23. that that would be completely outside the pail but primarily  
24. it was intended to deal with that which is in the Auditor General's  
25. report.

27. Senator Rhoads.

28. SENATOR RHOADS:

29. Thank you, Mr. President. Well then, I do support the
