30. He indicates...he indicates now that the bill itself

31. does have Senator Knuppel as the Senate sponsor. Senator

32. Knuppel, do you wish to move House Bill 507? You are hand-

33. ling the bill, Senator. One of the fifteen that you have.

1. House Bill 508, Senator Rupp. Senator Rupp. You wish
2. to move 508? Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

26. Well, then that synopsis on the Calendar is just totally
27. wrong.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

29. Senator...Senator Knuppel, would you give an explanation
30. for that.

31. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

32. Yes. What this bill does is increases the rate of interest
33. on non-municipal judgments. Judgments against other municipalities

1. from six to eight percent after they're secured. That's
2. all it does. Read the bill.
3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
4. Senator Rock.
5. SENATOR ROCK:
6. I...I'm not quarreling with that, John. I have a bill
7. that does exactly the same thing that we sent out of here
8. over to the House. My question is, that when something is
9. so radically wrong on the Calendar, would it not be better
10. just to hold on to it?
11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
12. Just...just a moment. Senator Graham, cannot hear.
13. There's noise behind him. There's noise on the right.
14. There's noise on the left and noise in the front. Would
15. the members please be in their seats. Would all unauthor-

19. Thank you. Mr. President, Committee Amendment No. 1

21. Committee Amendment...it is Committee Amendment No.
22. 1, Senator. Shall we take it from the record?

23. SENATOR COLLINS:

24. Yah, would you take that from the record?

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Take it from the record. House Bill 931, Senator
27. Regner. House Bill 936, Senator Bruce. Senator Bruce.

28. SECRETARY:

29. House Bill...

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Read the bill.

32. SECRETARY:

33. House Bill 936.

1. (Secretary reads title of bill)

2. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. Are there amendments from the Floor?

5. SECRETARY:

6. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Lemke.

2. Senator Regner.

3. SENATOR REGNER:

4. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amend-
5. ment further defines the words and description of diagnostic
6. evaluation. I move its adoption.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. Is there further discussion? Question is, shall Amend-
9. ment No. 1 to House Bill 931 be adopted. Those in favor
10. indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it.
11. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Are there further amendments?

12. SECRETARY:

13. No further committee amendments.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Are there amendments from the Floor? Just a moment,
16. Senator, we're trying to find the amendment. I...I'm

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
29. House Bill 957, Senator Bruce. Read the bill.

30. SECRETARY:

31. House Bill 957.

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.

3. House Bill 968, Senator Hynes. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

4. SECRETARY:

5. House Bill 968.

6. (Secretary reads title of bill)

7. 2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Executive offers
8. one amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Senator Hynes.

11. SENATOR HYNES:

12. Mr. President. This simply changes the appointment
13. method that the minority members would be appointed by
14. the minority leader in each House and I would move the
15. adoption of the amendment.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Is there further discussion? Question is, shall Amend-

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.

25. House Bill 972, Senator Kosinski. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

26. SECRETARY:

27. House Bill 972.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.

32. House Bill 975, Senator Chew. There is a request, Senator,
33. for a fiscal note on this bill. Do you wish to take it from

1. the record? Take it from the record. House Bill 978,
2. Senator Grotberg. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
3. SECRETARY:
4. House Bill 7...978.
5. (Secretary reads title of bill)
6. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Govern-
7. ment offers one amendment.
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
9. Senator Grotberg.
10. SENATOR GROTBORG:
11. Thank you, Mr. President. I would ask the Secretary
12. which amendment...what's the LRB number on the amendment
13. that he has?
14. SECRETARY:
15. Well, Senator Grotberg, I only have one...
16. SENATOR GROTBORG:
17. I have two.
18. SECRETARY:
19. One amendment attached to the bill...
20. SENATOR GROTBORG:
21. I have two...
22. SECRETARY:
23. ...and the LRB number on it is LRB 804058.
24. SENATOR GROTBORG:
25. All right. That's a...three page amendment, Mr.
26. Secretary?
27. SECRETARY:
28. Right. Right.
29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
30. Senator Grotberg.
31. SENATOR GROTBORG:
32. That's a three page amendment?
33. SECRETARY:
34. Yes. Yes, Sir.

1. SENATOR GROTEBERG:

2. Yes. This amendment then is the redrafted version
3. of this bill, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen
4. of the Senate providing for an orderly manner in which
5. the State may lease...State owned property and within
6. the rental process provide for local taxes and I move
7. the adoption of Amendment No. 1.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Just a moment. Senator Graham, for what purpose do
10. you arise?

11. SENATOR GRAHAM:

12. Mr. President. I am going to get up every three
13. minutes, if necessary, and ask to have some peace and
14. quiet in this place so we can understand what the speakers
15. are talking about. It's absolutely crazy.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. I'm with you a hundred percent. The noise level
18. is from both sides of the aisle, by the way. Will the
19. members please be in their seats? We will not proceed
20. until we have order. If we have order. Senator Rock.

21. SENATOR ROCK:

22. Our file, too, indicates that there are two committee
23. amendments which were, in fact, adopted.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. Senator Grotberg.

26. SENATOR GROTEBERG:

27. The staff is on its way down with the other amendment.
28. We'll...file it right now and clean the bill up...with your
29. permission, Mr. President.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. Well, we...we're moving along very well. Senator,
32. we'll...we'll...we'll take...Just a moment. Senator Rock.

33. SENATOR ROCK:

1. Well, that's committee action. My suggestion, is we
2. take this from the record and check it out.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. I think that's an excellent suggestion. Take it from
5. the record. Yah, for right. House Bill 1003, Senator
6. Berman. House Bill...Senator Berman. You wish to call the
7. bill, Senator? Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

8. SECRETARY:

9. House Bill 1003.

10. (Secretary reads title of bill)

11. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
14. House Bill 1010, Senator Netsch.. I think the members
15. should be in their seats at this...stage of the ball
16. game. Members of the Senate, so we can move them.

17. SECRETARY:

18. House...

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Read the bill.

21. SECRETARY:

22. House Bill 1010.

23. (Secretary reads title of bill)

24. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Are there amendments from the Floor?

27. SECRETARY:

28. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Netsch.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30. Senator Netsch.

31. SENATOR NETSCH:

32. Thank you, Mr. President. This is the amendment that
33. responds to questions that were raised in committee by
34. various members of the committee. The bill is one that

1. changes the definition of indecent liberties and...to
2. attempt to get at the...taking of photographs and getting
3. children to participate in activities which are the current
4. subject of what is broadly defined as child pornography.
5. The...the feeling was that they, there were still some
6. problems in the language and scope of the Act and the
7. amendment which has been prepared responded to those
8. questions that were raised in committee. I would move
9. the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1010.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11. Is there first...Senator Egan.

12. SENATOR EGAN:

13. Yes, would the sponsor please yield to a question?

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. She indicates she will.

16. SENATOR EGAN:

17. As I remember that meeting, Senator Netsch, there were
18. two Chicago police officers present to testify, that it
19. made it very difficult for the enforcement of this Act if
20. the...the...exemption of child prostitutes be not taken out.
21. Has this amendment taken that out?

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Senator Netsch.

24. SENATOR NETSCH:

25. I think you're referring to the affirmative defense.
26. Senator Knuppel is going to offer that amendment or at least
27. has it in his possession and is considering it. That is
28. different from the points that are covered in this amend-
29. ment. This amendment goes to the matters that were covered
30. in the subject matter of this bill. The affirmative defense
31. goes to the basic existing provision of law and that's why
32. we have separated the two things out. Senator Knuppel
33. had asked me whether I would either hold the bill and I...

1. which I have for a while. I just want to get it moved now
2. or bring it back and I've already given him my word that
3. I would do that.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Egan.

6. SENATOR EGAN:

7. It was my understanding that there was a general agree-
8. ment in the committee that to remove that exemption would
9. aid the police enforcement of this new bill...of this new
10. provision and I would like to make sure that it's offered.
11. I do not have a prepared amendment. I assume that it was
12. going to be done by the committee. Is that correct or...

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Senator Netsch.

15. SENATOR NETSCH:

16. No, that isn't quite correct. The...the point was
17. brought up by Senator Knuppel and I think one or two of
18. the members discussed it briefly, but there was no final
19. concensus. It was discussed further with the sponsor...
20. the House sponsor of the bill who initiated the bill and
21. he agreed that it ought to be...that the entire Senate
22. ought to have an opportunity to discuss it. But it was
23. not a...it was not a specific committee suggestion. In any
24. event...

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Just...just a moment, Senator. This is about the
27. fifteenth time I've asked for order and we haven't got it
28. yet. Would the members please be in their seats? Would
29. all unauthorized personnel remove themselves? The Sergeant-
30. at-Arms clear the aisles. Proceed.

31. SENATOR NETSCH:

32. In any event, Senator Knuppel does, in fact, have that
33. amendment.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Senator Egan.

3. SENATOR EGAN:

4. Well, if he's going to offer it, then the...the alterna-
5. tive to that would be that I would request that you hold it
6. so that I can get...an opportunity to offer it myself. I just
7. want to make sure it's offered.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Well, shall we hold the bill, Senator? Senator Netsch.

10. SENATOR NETSCH:

11. Let's get this amendment on and I had already said when
12. I started out that I would be happy to bring the bill back.
13. I thought Senator Knuppel was ready to go with the amendment,
14. but apparently he is not quite ready. I will be happy to
15. bring the bill back and I give my word that I will.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. All right. All right. Senator Egan.

18. SENATOR EGAN:

19. Yes, the amendment is available if...if we can proceed
20. with...either I or Senator Knuppel will offer the amendment.
21. But we're still acting on Amendment No. 1 to the bill...the
22. Secretary has no copy of the Amendment No. 2 as yet.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. All right. We'll proceed. Is there further discussion
25. as to Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1010. All right. The
26. question is, shall that be adopted. Those in favor indicate
27. by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amend-
28. ment No. 1 is adopted. Senator Egan, as to Amendment No. 2
29. to House Bill 1010.

30. SENATOR EGAN:

31. Yes, Senate Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1010 deletes
32. the exemption where the child is a prostitute, which means
33. that if someone pays a child to engage in a...an obscene or

1. pornographic film, that child is considered a prostitute.
2. That child cannot be punished relative to the involvement
3. in the film and it makes it very difficult for the police
4. to enforce the law if the participants cannot be punished.
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Is there further discussion? Senator Ozinga.

7. SENATOR OZINGA:

8. I...I thought I just heard Senator Netsch say that she
9. offered Amendment No. 1 that practically rewrote this bill
10. to put the concept of the committee in the bill. Now we
11. come right along with Senate Bill or Senate Amendment No.
12. 2 to the same bill and within seconds I'm just wondering
13. whether we're in line here or whether things are getting
14. all fouled up.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Senator Knuppel.

17. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

18. Well, the...the concept of the purpose of this bill
19. is not involved in the second one. It's always been, it's
20. always been a defense to someone who...who is involved with
21. a...an under eighteen year old girl. If she was a prostitute
22. that was a defense. Now here we're trying to do away with
23. this using underage children in pornography and so-forth and
24. you say you...if you leave that old defense in there and you
25. use someone that's under eighteen and you pay them, particularly
26. female, and I'm not so sure it isn't true of a male, too, that
27. maybe...they...they fall within the definition of what a
28. prostitute is. So they got a perfect defense. So, the old
29. defense is there, you just...you put this all in and you
30. just break your sword on the old defense. So we want to get
31. rid of that defense. If the person is under eighteen and
32. they're paid money, it's no longer a defense, whether it's
33. a...boy or a girl or whatever it is. It...it gets rid...rid

1. of that old defense that's been in the law all this time.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. Senator Ozinga.

4. SENATOR OZINGA:

5. Senator, I'm with you all the way. The only thing
6. that I'm saying is that she said just a minute ago that
7. it was a rewrite of the whole bill. Now I don't know if
8. she's got that in there or whether she doesn't.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

10. Senator Netsch.

11. SENATOR NETSCH:

12. No. I didn't say that the entire bill was rewritten,
13. Senator Ozinga. The amendment that has already been adopt-
14. ed simply changed a couple sections to clarify some language
15. and to...and to respond to some questions that were raised
16. by members of the committee at the time the bill was heard.
17. This question about the affirmative defense was raised but
18. was never really resolved by the committee and that is why
19. it is being offered in a separate amendment. I just...if
20. I could just make one comment on the amendment itself while
21. I'm on. I discussed this after the committee meeting at some
22. length with Representative Getty, who is the House sponsor
23. and initiator of the bill and his feeling was, and it's
24. mine also, that it's perhaps a close question with perhaps
25. a little bit of the...the advantage on the side of adopting
26. the amendment that is now being offered. The ...the problem
27. is that the basic bill was designed not with...in mind
28. what has been happening lately, or at least what has been
29. brought into the public lately with the use of children
30. and the abuse of children through this technique. Its...
31. it really tracks the basic rape Statu~~e~~ and in rape it has
32. always been a defense that the ...the person was a
33. prostitute. Now I don't happen to think that is necessarily

1. a very good idea. But there certainly are opportunities
2. for...for setting someone up where it is not, in fact, an
3. affirmative defense. But I think right now what we're
4. faced with is both in terms of...heterosexual attacks
5. and...and homosexual attacks. The fact that a lot of
6. young kids are apparently being lured into engaging
7. in the acts, which are then photographed, which are
8. basically the subject matter of this bill. And, perhaps,
9. when you're talking about that kind of abusive behavior
10. it really should not be a defense that the child was
11. already a prostitute. Particularly when you consider
12. the fact that that also, can be twisted. That is, as
13. the, one of the policemen suggested. You can pay the child,
14. the minor something to agree to participate in the act and
15. the picture beforehand and then claim that, well, the
16. child was already a prostitute and it is, therefore,
17. an affirmative defense. So I, again, it's a...it's a
18. close question but the sponsor certainly has no objection
19. violently to the adoption of this amendment. We felt, though,
20. since there were arguments on both sides that it should be
21. brought out and discussed by the Senate as a whole.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Is there further discussion? Question is, shall
24. Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1010 be adopted. Those in
25. favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes
26. have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Are there further
27. amendments?

28. SECRETARY:

29. No further amendments.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. 3rd reading. House Bill 1018, Senator Knuppel.
32. Read the bill.

33. SECRETARY:

1. House Bill 1018.
2. (Secretary reads title of bill)
3. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
5. Are there amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
6. House Bill 1046, Senator Hynes. 1046. House Bill 1051,
7. Senator Guidice. There is a fiscal note request. Senator
8. ...Senator Guidice.
9. SENATOR GUIDICE:
10. Thank you, Mr. President. There's a...a pending bill
11. that does take care of this. There's an appropriation bill.
12. 237...
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
14. The...the rules are that it must be filed with the
15. bill, Senator, on the Order of 2nd reading.
16. SENATOR GUIDICE:
17. There's no necessity for it. That because there's
18. a...the...appropriation bill that's pending.

24. Glass, you're recognized. Senator Guidice, are you through?
25. Well, now wait a minute. I recognized you, then Senator
26. Glass, then who's next? Maragos. Anybody else? All right.
27. That's how the order is going to be. Senator Glass.

28. SENATOR GLASS:

29. Well, thank you, Mr. President. I'm going to ask the
30. sponsor who...who had requested the amendment. I...certainly
31. favor the amendment and feel that as an opponent to the bill,
32. generally, the bill wouldn't have gotten out of committee
33. and it got out on a six to four vote. It apparently wouldn't

1. have gotten out without this amendment. And it is...if it
2. is not amended it would not allow an eighteen year old to
3. have an abortion without the consent of her parents. There
4. are constitutional arguments against that that I think should
5. be raised on 3rd reading. But I, at least, would like to
6. hear from Senator Knuppel...who it was that asked for this
7. amendment? Do you recall?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

9. Senator Knuppel.

10. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

11. ...Senator Maragos. It could have been Senator
12. Guidice. Senator Guidice questioned with regard to it,
13. but I believe the amendment is offered at the request of
14. Senator Maragos. He said he would support the bill out
15. of committee if this was offered on the Floor, so that
16. the Body as a whole, could have the right to vote on
17. whether they wanted an age eighteen or age sixteen. He'll
18. recall that I told him I made no promises. I would prepare
19. the amendment, however, and offer it here on the Floor
20. for a vote. Is that not true, Senator Maragos?

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

22. Are you...through, Senator Glass? No. Go ahead.

23. SENATOR GLASS:

24. Yield to Senator Maragos.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

26. Senator Maragos.

27. SENATOR MARAGOS:

28. Mr. President and members of the Senate. It is true
29. as Senator Knuppel...just stated that we had asked about
30. this because there was some questions among some of the
31. members of the committee whether we should let 480 out
32. because it's a constitutional question. But, more importantly
33. we felt that under sixteen I had questions whether this

1. parental consent, but under sixteen there's no doubt that
2. the parents should know because there's a question of
3. judgment on the part of the minor who's involved whether
4. she should go through the process of having an abortion.
5. However, I felt that girls seventeen and eighteen years
6. old was old enough to make those judgments on her own
7. because many times we even do in the law allow fourteen
8. year olds to pick who they want to live with and which
9. parent they want to live with when there's a custody
10. question. We also pick...give them right or choice of
11. many other areas and I thought even if the sixteen we
12. give them an additional two years but...between seventeen
13. and eighteen I think it should be a judgmental part on the
14. child...on the girl herself without having to go through
15. the heartaches of going to the parents if she has those...
16. these problems. And that's why we...we voted this thing
17. out at that time and that's why I'm in favor of this
18. amendment.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

20. The Chair recognizes Senator Lemke. He's got his
21. light on to speak. Here he comes. Then, Senator Shapiro,
22. you'll be recognized, Sir.

23. SENATOR LEMKE:

24. If I recall that committee thing, I think Senator
25. Knuppel said that he would offer the amendment, but that
26. he would vote against it because he was not for it. So
27. he is being fair to the committee in offering the amend-
28. ment and letting the full Body decide as to what it is.
29. I cannot see the amendment on there, because I think the
30. bill is in the correct form and I'd like to send it on out
31. of here to the...to the Executive branch so they can act on
32. it. I...I must resist the amendment in all means and urge
33. my colleagues in the Senate to also amean it because this

1. is a good bill and I think it calls for parental consent
2. which is necessary in our daily life to preserve our family.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

4. Senator Shapiro. Then, Senator Guidice, if there's
5. no one else wishes to speak again, you can speak your
6. second time.

7. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

8. Well, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
9. Senate. This amendment should be rejected and defeated.
10. We're talking about a surgical intervention here and as
11. far as I'm concerned other than the social issues involved
12. it's no different than an appendectomy, a tonsillectomy,
13. or a simple tooth extraction, for which a minor needs
14. parental consent. To me, it should be that that parental
15. consent should be required for anyone under eighteen and
16. under and to establish a sixteen and under, to me, just
17. complicates the entire picture. Nothing more than surgical
18. intervention. I see no good reason not to pass this bill
19. in its original form and I urge defeat of the amendment.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

21. Senator Guidice, you wish to be recognized again.

22. SENATOR GUIDICE:

23. Yes, please.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

25. All right.

26. SENATOR GUIDICE:

27. Thank you, Mr. President. This in clarification...

28. PRESIDING OFFICE: (SENATOR JOHNS)

29. Wait a minute...

30. SENATOR GUIDICE:

31. I did not support this amendment. I want to make that
32. clear. I supported the...bill in it's...in it's original
33. form.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

2. There's been a request for a roll call. Any further
3. discussion? Mr. Secretary. Wait a minute. Senator Rock.
4. And then Senator Demuzio.

5. SENATOR ROCK:

6. Well, everybody that's gotten up, Mr. President and
7. Ladies and Gentlemen has eschewed the request for this
8. amendment. We're talking about unemancipated minor having
9. a very, very deadly surgical procedure, apparently without
10. the consent of the parent. This ought to be rejected out
11. of hand. It should, in fact, be withdrawn or else let the
12. person who wants to offer it put their name on it.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

14. Senator Knuppel, do you wish to explain that once
15. more?

16. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

17. I explained it in quite...quite a bit of detail. I
18. ...I...I had a four to four vote and to get it out of
19. committee Senator Maragos said that he thought the Body
20. should have the opportunity to vote on this. I said all
21. right I'd prepare the amendment on it. I wouldn't support
22. it, I wouldn't guarantee its adoption. But I would ...
23. prepare it and submit it and that's the way it happened.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

25. Well, Senator Demuzio...Maragos is recognized because
26. his name was brought into the conversation again. Do you
27. want to explain that, again.

28. SENATOR MARAGOS:

29. Mr. President. All I want to say is this. I brought
30. this up because there's a lot of discussion in committee.
31. So...if the Body with not withdraw the amendment of Senator
32. Rock, let the Body decide. If they don't want it fine,
33. we'll go back to eighteen or...whatever the bill...

1. but I...we, but...speaking of the committee and that's
2. why I ask that it be put on at that time. ...that's all...

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

4. Now, the Chair recognizes Senator Ozinga. You wish
5. to speak. No. ...

6. SENATOR OZINGA:

7. All that I was going to say is that I'm in thorough
8. opposition to this amendment and in favor of the bill and
9. that's good enough for me and let's have a roll call.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

11. Senator Lemke.

12. SENATOR LEMKE:

13. I move to Table the amendment.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

15. He withdraws that motion. Now we'll have a roll call
16. on the...adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 480. All
17. those in favor vote Aye. All those opposed vote Nay. The
18. voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
19. who wish? Now give it one more brief moment. Have all
20. voted who wish? Mr. Secretary, take the record. On that
21. motion, ...motion to adopt received 7 Ayes, 47 Nays and
22. will be so recorded. Mr. Secretary, the motion fails.
23. Any further amendments from the Floor?

24. SECRETARY:

25. No further amendments.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR JOHNS)

27. 3rd reading.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?

30. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

31. Well, Mr. President, if we've concluded 2nd reading
32. I have, I would move that...

33. PRESIDENT:

1. We are...we are just concluding 2nd reading.

2. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

3. I have an announcement...a motion to rerefer House
4. Bill 2374 from Appropriations I to Appropriations II. Do
5. I have leave?

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Donnewald moves to discharge Appropriations I
8. from further consideration of House Bill 2374 and to rerefer
9. the bill to Appropriations II. All those in favor signify
10. by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.
11. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

12. SENATOR ROCK:

13. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of
14. the Senate. I rise to move to suspend the rules and waive
15. the six day posting requirement so that these twenty-one
16. named bills may be heard in Appropriations I commencing
17. at four thirty this afternoon. House Bills 715, 1023,
18. 1594, 1637, 1834, 2001, 2296, 2355, 2359, 2369, 2379,
19. 2381, 2385, 87, 88, 89, 92, 93, 94, 99 and 2408.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. You've heard the motion for suspension of the rules
22. for purpose of waiving the six day notice requirement with
23. respect to the bills read. All those in favor signify by
24. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. On
25. the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading is House Bill 2386,
26. which is an emergency appropriation. Do we have leave to
27. go to that Order and to call House Bill 2386? Leave is
28. granted. On the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading, House
29. Bill 2386, Senator Regner. Read the bill.

30. SECRETARY:

31. House Bill 2386.

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 3rd reading of the bill.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Regner.

3. SENATOR REGNER:

4. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is a
5. supplemental appropriation for one million dollars to the
6. Department of Finance for payment of Workmen's Compensation
7. claims. Presently, there's about a hundred thousand dollars,
8. a little less than a hundred thousand dollars left in the
9. fund, and there are five hundred cases pending, so it is of
10. an emergency...measure and ask for a favorable roll call.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is, shall
13. House Bill 2386 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those
14. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted
15. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that
16. question, the Ayes are 55, the Nays are none, none Voting
17. Present. House Bill 2386 having recieved a constitutional
18. majority is declared passed. For what purpose does Senator
19. Savickas arise?

20. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

21. Are lobbyists permitted in the hallways? If they aren't
22. I'd like...

23. PRESIDENT:

24. They are not permitted under the rules of the Senate
25. and the Sergeant-at-Arms will please enforce the Senate
26. Rules. For what purpose does Senator Maragos arise?

27. SENATOR MARAGOS:

28. Mr. President. I happened to be called to the phone
29. when 2386 was called for voting and I was not voted. I'd
30. like...to let the records show that if I were voting I would
31. vote...in favor.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. The record will so show. The Chair would like to remind

1. all of the members that with respect to Agreed Bill list
2. No. 4 that any objections to any bill being included on
3. that list must be filed with the Secretary no later than
4. four thirty by three members in the form of a written
5. motion and further, any member wishing to vote either
6. Present or No on any of the bills on that list, must file
7. that request with the Secretary no later than four thirty
8. today. Motions in Writing.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Motion in Writing. I move to take House Bill 1547
11. from the Table and place it on the Order for 2nd reading.
12. Signed Senator Netsch.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Netsch. Senator Netsch, with respect to your
15. motion on House Bill 1547, do you wish to have that set
16. on Thursday with all of the other motions? Senator
17. Netsch moves to have that motion set over for a hearing
18. on Thursday, June 23rd. All those in favor signify by
19. saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.
20. For what purpose does Senator Vadalabene arise?

21. SENATOR VADALABENE:

22. Yes, for the purpose of an announcement, Mr. President.
23. Tomorrow at twelve the Executive on Appointments and Administ-
24. ration will meet in Room 212 tomorrow at twelve noon. I
25. thought...we have moved it up from one o'clock to twelve
26. o'clock. So all of the members on...Appointments and
27. Administration, Room 212 tomorrow and Mr. President and
28. members of the Senate, while I'm on my feet could I give
29. this announcement, please.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Make the announcement please, Senator, if you would.
32. We're all waiting. Patiently. Impatiently.

33. SENATOR VADALABENE:

1. Yes. This is another announcement. I've made the other
2. one. Senator Sam M. V., that's the race horse down at
3. Cahokia, as I haven't given you a bulletin on it for the
4. last two weeks. As you remember on May 5th it ran tenth,
5. on May 20th it ran seventh, on June 2nd it ran sixth, and
6. on June 6th it ran fifth and it's running tonight and I'll
7. give you a report on it. It seems like it's coming down
8. the line. Thank you.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Thank you, Senator. For what purpose does Senator
11. Soper arise?

12. SENATOR SOPER:

13. Well, thank you, Mr. President. It looks like
14. Senator Sam's horse there, he's been called many times
15. and he looks...looks like he's going to come forth this
16. time.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. ...further business to come before the Senate. If
19. not Senator D'Arco moves that the Senate stand adjourned
20. until Tuesday, June 21st at nine a.m. All those in favor
21. signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The
22. Senate stands adjourned.

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
