33. Thank you, Mr. President. All this does

1. there are two changes and what it does is add after  
2. the word "commission", "or the American Horse Show  
3. Association" and also adds the words, "track and or  
4. showgrounds." And it's just an effort to make sure  
5. that this is an optional situation for these folks  
6. and they would also like to have permission to have  
7. these examinations and tests made.

9. Senator Hickey.

10. SENATOR HICKEY:

11. Mr. President, I...I am going to oppose this  
12. amendment for this reason, this is asking the State of  
13. Illinois to put regulations for a private organization  
14. into our statutes. Any private organization can do anything  
15. it wants to. People now require Coggins tests  
16. whenever they want them. They get them from the vets.  
17. If they want as a private group to have it, they  
18. simply go ahead with it.. This is simply, to me it's  
19. an extraneous thing and it's cluttering up our  
20. books about rules and regulations for private organizations,  
21. simply doesn't belong there and I would urge this  
22. Assembly to vote against this amendment.

32. SENATOR McMILLAN:

33. I rise in...in support of this amendment. After we've

1. acted on this one, I do have another amendment that  
2. I'd like to offer, but at this point, this is  
3. an amendment which I feel should be added in order to...  
4. to improve 1412 as amended.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Is there any further discussion? Senator Hickey.

7. SENATOR HICKEY:

8. I would like to have some comment from the...from  
9. the sponsor of the amendment as to my remarks about this  
10. being totally unnecessary.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Rupp.

13. SENATOR RUPP:

14. Sorry. No, actually the whole purpose I think in  
15. this...in this...the bill even, is to promote  
16. some testing of the horses and it's a little bit difficult  
17. for me and some of the others to understand why there is  
18. some resistance rather than encouragement to have these  
19. tests made. I...I just can't understand that, Senator.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Wooten.

22. SENATOR WOOTEN:

23. It seems to me we went over this in committee at  
24. some length. The problem is that the Coggins test  
25. was adopted when it was thought that it was an answer  
26. to the problem. There are now questions, valid questions  
27. which have been raised. The total eradication of the  
28. ...of the program is not the way to go at it. If...I think  
29. we're all looking for a replacement of the Coggins test.  
30. But just to throw it out is, I think, terribly shortsighted  
31. to throw out the whole program. That's not what the bill  
32. is intended to do. It seems to me it's a reasonable step  
33. by step approach and to...to do anything else is simply to

1. take perceptive action and I do not think is wise and  
2. that was the committee's judgment.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Hickey.

5. SENATOR HICKEY:

6. Mr. President, I agree with what Senator Wooten  
7. said, but I feel that neither that nor Senator Rupp's  
8. answer was really addressed to my question. The...the  
9. amendment says that a private organization can mandate  
10. the Coggins test. Now, I just...any private organization  
11. can do anything it wants to. I'm not saying that...that  
12. they shouldn't have the Coggins test. As a matter-of-  
13. fact, if I belonged to that organization, I would promote  
14. it because it is the only thing at this point that there  
15. is. But I just don't think that it belongs in the  
16. Statutes that we should say that a private organization  
17. may have some kind of a medical test if they want to.  
18. Of course, they can do it. But it doesn't belong in the  
19. Statutes. The...there is something in there about the  
20. Illinois Racing Board may require the Coggins test, but  
21. that is a government agency, the American Horse  
22. Association is not. And it is not a statutory matter.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Knuppel.

25. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

26. Well, I can appreciate the concern of the people  
27. who approached Senator Rupp. I think that what Senator  
28. Hickey says, however, is accurate. How you want to vote  
29. on this amendment, you'll have to decide yourself. But,  
30. I think these people can test for Coggins test. They  
31. want this...they want this in the Statutes I don't  
32. think that it's necessary. However, I can appreciate their  
33. concern.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. All right. Senator Rupp moves the adoption of  
3. Amendment No. 2. All those in favor signify by saying  
4. Aye. Opposed. The Nays have it. The amendment is  
5. defeated. Amendment No. 3.

6. SECRETARY:

7. Amendment No. 3, Senator McMillan.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator McMillan.

10. SENATOR McMILLAN:

11. The purpose of this amendment which is a very  
12. short one, is in fact, to repeal the equine infectious  
13. anemia law. Many of us throughout the Senate have  
14. received letters from horse owners objecting to the  
15. EIA statute as it not stands. We had a bill, the bill  
16. 1412 from the House and we went over it in committee  
17. after long hearings and the bill was voted out of committee.  
18. But in the discussion that I have had with all facets  
19. of the horse industry, many of them plus the College  
20. of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Illinois  
21. and the Department of Agriculture feel that...that House Bill 1412  
22. in the shape that it is, would give us an Act that is  
23. unworkable, an Act that would not provide the kind of  
24. protection and the kind of disease control that is desirable  
25. and since there is for this disease, no human health aspects  
26. to it, all of those groups, the Veterinary Medicine College,  
27. the Department of Agriculture and many of the horse groups  
28. feel that we would be better off repealing the law than  
29. having 1412 as it now stands. For that reason, I have offered  
30. this amendment in order to give those in the Senate who  
31. feel that the whole Act should be repealed, an opportunity  
32. to do so.

33. PRESIDENT:

34. Senator Hickey.

1. SENATOR HICKEY:

2. I rise in opposition to this amendment. This has  
3. gone through rather complicated procedures. In the  
4. first place, I did offer a bill which this amendment is.  
5. However, I was convinced as I studied this whole thing  
6. thoroughly and I have studied it very thoroughly,  
7. that it is better to have House Bill 1412 than to have  
8. no program at all in the State of Illinois. This...this is  
9. a very complicated thing the way that it has been run  
10. by the Department. The Department locally has not  
11. recognized the fact that there is a difference between  
12. impositive reactors, between symptomatic and asymptomatic.  
13. That is recognized in House Bill 14 with appropriate follow-up  
14. course of action. And I plead with you that the State of Illinois  
15. should give some attention to equine infectious anemia, not  
16. in the way it has in the past, and that to go all the way  
17. from what we have been doing to complete eradication is  
18. not wise at this time and I ask for a No vote on this amendment.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Knuppel.

21. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

22. Well, I'm not going to take a strong position  
23. one way or another on this amendment. However, there were  
24. no veterinary...veterinarians from the State of Illinois.  
25. appearing in favor of 1412. The veterinarians who testified  
26. came largely from other states. The one veterinarian  
27. from Illinois who testified would have testified in favor  
28. of the amendment which is being offered here by Senator  
29. McMillan. The Department of Agriculture also indicated that  
30. they would be in favor of complete abolition. This is not  
31. what the sponsors of the bill nor the pleasure horse  
32. people want. And the...the bill in its present condition  
33. passed out of the House 155, I think, to zip or something, or 1,

1. something like that. But the Department of Agriculture  
2. would just as soon this amendment was adopted, so would  
3. the Illinois Veterinary Medical Association. I personally  
4. will be voting for the amendment. I did in committee,  
5. but I was in the minority. I don't think that ...that it...that it  
6. will be the end of the earth one way or the other out  
7. that's what the situation is at the present time with  
8. respect to this amendment. The Department of Agriculture  
9. says they want the total program abolished and the only  
10. veterinarian from Illinois who testified, testified in  
11. favor of abolition of the program.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Joyce.

14. SENATOR JOYCE:

15. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I'm in complete  
16. agreement with the amendment. I think that our Department  
17. did not want this...the way it is now, our Department  
18. of Agriculture and I think that if we abolish our...  
19. the...the present law that we have will be in conformity  
20. with the ...with the Feds and I think that, you know, we had  
21. three veterinarians all from out of State, one from  
22. Florida, one from Canada and I believe the other one was  
23. from Maine. And it just seemed a little bit strange to me  
24. and I'm...I'm for this amendment.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Berning.

27. SENATOR BERNING:

28. Thank you, Mr. President. I, too, rise in support  
29. of Amendment No. 3. I have in my district, a great many  
30. people who are concerned about the Act as it now exists.  
31. The amendments to Senate Bill 1412 in the view of the  
32. Department of Agriculture, make it totally unworkable and the  
33. Department through its representative, Dr. Doby,

1. has indicated to me that they would much prefer that the  
2. Act be totally repealed. Therefore, I urge the members  
3. of this Body to adopt Amendment No. 3.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Mitchler.

6. SENATOR MITCHLER:

7. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I believe  
8. there's a...a little argument going on between  
9. the Department of Agriculture and the administration the  
10. way they administer this Coggins testing and the people  
11. that have horses that are tested. There is misunderstanding  
12. and there are problems. Now, to repeal the Act in its  
13. entirety, does not solve the problem. I think it's an  
14. administrative problem in the Department of Agriculture.  
15. I think that House Bill 1412, if passed without the repealer  
16. of the entire Act on, would give for a period of time, a  
17. chance for them to get together. They're at complete odds.  
18. Dr. Doby doesn't understand what the horse people are  
19. talking about. The horse people don't agree with what Dr.  
20. Doby is talking about. I have respect for both sides  
21. but I think House Bill 1412, if it be given a chance  
22. to be in operation in the restricted form that it is  
23. now in, would benefit all concerned. I think the Department  
24. of Agriculture could learn to live with that restricted...  
25. restrictions placed on the Act. But to repeal it and do away  
26. with Coggins testing, you may develop a very serious  
27. problem. And I think Senator Hickey was right in withdrawing  
28. her complete opposition to the...the testing program and having  
29. this compromise. And so I would ask for defeat of the  
30. Amendment No. 3 and keeping House Bill 1412 in the form  
31. in which it came out of the Senate Agriculture, Conservation  
32. and Energy Committee.

33. PRESIDENT:

Senator Harber Hall.

1. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

2.           Would the sponsor yield for a question?

3. PRESIDENT:

4.           Indicates he will yield.

5. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

6.           Senator Hickey, I wonder if the...

7. PRESIDENT:

8.           Sponsor of the amendment or sponsor of the bill?

9. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

10.          No, of the bill.

11. PRESIDENT:

12.          Well, the sponsor indicates that she will yield  
13. even though technically she should not be yielding.

14. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

15.          Well, in order to vote on this amendment, I have  
16. to ask her a question. Does the Illinois Racing Board  
17. favor this amendment or did they favor the...the first  
18. amendment offered by Senator Rupp?

19. PRESIDENT:

20.          Senator Hickey.

21. SENATOR HICKEY:

22.          I haven't been addressed by the Illinois Racing  
23. Board itself. They are in House Bill 1412 as...there it  
24. does say that they may require the Coggins test if they  
25. so decide and they're...I...which I am sure they  
26. are aware of and I haven't been directly addressed by them.

27. PRESIDENT:

28.          Senator Harber Hall.

29. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

30.          In that case, Mr. President, I would rise to support  
31. this amendment. The American Horse Show Association  
32. favors this amendment. Dr. Doby, a State veterinarian  
33. favors this amendment. The Department of Agriculture favors

1. this amendment and I believe it should be passed...adopted.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Wooten.

4. SENATOR WOOTEN:

5. Well, Mr. President and colleagues. I think there's  
6. some points that ought to be made in response to  
7. subjects raised in the debate on this amendment.  
8. It has been stated that the one Illinois veterinarian  
9. who was there testified in favor of abolition of the  
10. Coggins test. There are plenty of veterinarians  
11. in this State who support this bill unamended. The three  
12. witnesses who were brought in are the three leading  
13. experts on the disease and what they are trying...what they  
14. are trying to explain is what the Department prefers  
15. to ignore, that there are differences in reactions to  
16. the Coggins test. Now, what the bill proposes is that  
17. we not do away with the Coggins test, which can be a  
18. valuable tool but that the Department recognize the  
19. advances which have been made in the study of the disease.  
20. And that there are two different ways in which an animal  
21. will respond to it. To simply throw out the bill because  
22. you can no longer use a meat ax, you have to now use  
23. a scalpel, seems to me to be a silly reason to adopt this  
24. amendment. It's...it's...I think the Department is  
25. being a little irresponsible in its reaction to the  
26. reality of developing science on this question. We should  
27. keep the program, but we should take cognizance  
28. of the advances that have been made in studying this  
29. test and so I would rise in opposition to this amendment.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Grotberg.

32. SENATOR GROTBORG:

33. Yes, will the sponsor of the amendment yield?

1. PRESIDENT:

2. He indicates he will yield.

3. SENATOR GROTBORG:

4. Senator, I've been like so many people here,  
5. I've gotten tremendous mail and a lot of my pony  
6. owners, not thoroughbred owners, have been terribly  
7. excited about this bill. Now, if I vote for your  
8. amendment, are all of their troubles over? Is the whole  
9. thing moot?

10. SENATOR McMILLAN:

11. My response to that is Yes. The mail that I got  
12. which was much like the mail that you got did talk  
13. about bill 1412, but in my discussions with any of  
14. those owners, what they really wanted was repeal.  
15. They thought that was not possible and so they were  
16. supporting 1412 as any other alternative. But, as far  
17. as I'm concerned, this would solve their problems.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Grotborg.

20. SENATOR GROTBORG:

21. Then, Senator, what you're saying is Dr. Doby  
22. is throwing in the towel on this whole issue and says  
23. scrub it, forget it, there will be no Coggins and everybody  
24. can have their horses without fear of...

25. SENATOR McMILLAN:

26. What...

27. SENATOR GROTBORG:

28. ...being checked...destroying them.

29. SENATOR McMILLAN:

30. There will still be a Coggins test, which could be  
31. used by...and will be used by the racing industry, by  
32. horse breeders and so forth. But, there will no longer  
33. be a mandatory State-run Coggins testing program.

1. PRESIDENT:  
2. Senator Knuppel for the second time and then Senator  
3. Hickey...  
4. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
5. Well, if I can...  
6. PRESIDENT:  
7. ...for the second time and then Senator...  
8. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
9. ...if I can cast just a...  
10. PRESIDENT:  
11. ...McMillan will conclude...  
12. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
13. ...If I could cast just a little bit of light on  
14. what Senator Grotberg has asked, one of the things  
15. is, is there is a Federal law which will still be enforced  
16. with respect to interstate shipments and those people  
17. who want to have their horses tested for Coggins such  
18. as the American Racing...or the USTA or the Thoroughbred  
19. Racing Association or anything like that can. I...I don't  
20. think the problem will be completely dissolved because a  
21. complete...a...a complete repeal of the Act still leaves the  
22. problem of the disease, the equine infectious anemia.  
23. But, it will please...it will please most people better  
24. than to have nothing. Now, the...the pleasure horse  
25. people are in favor of 1412 the way it is. The Racing  
26. Industry and professional breeders, thoroughbreds, would  
27. be satisfied if the bill stayed the way it is, but they  
28. feel that...that in between they don't want. So, all I can tell  
29. you is there will be some Federal regulation yet even if this  
30. ...if this amendment is adopted.  
31. PRESIDENT:  
32. Senator Schaffer for the first time.  
33. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

1. I'd just like to point out this weekend, I had an opportunity  
2. to meet with my pleasure horse people and there are an  
3. awful lot of them in my district and they want this bill  
4. just like it is. If you put this amendment on, all  
5. those letters you've got, you're going to get a second  
6. letter. I think the fact that this bill as amended  
7. creates a little work for the Department of Agriculture  
8. and creates a few problems for a few of our bureaucrats.  
9. If you vote for the amendment, you're voting for the  
10. bureaucrats. If you vote against the amendment, you're  
11. voting for the people.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. With that summation, we ought to take the roll  
14. call, Senator Schaffer. Senator Hickey.

15. SENATOR HICKEY:

16. Senator Hynes...Mr. President and members of  
17. the Senate. There...I think if we're going to vote on  
18. this now, we need to know a few other things. Equine  
19. infectious anemia was discovered on this continent  
20. early in the last century. But, it didn't come to a head  
21. in Illinois until in the 60's when at Arlington Park  
22. there was an outbreak of equine infectious anemia.  
23. There were at that time, between eleven hundred and  
24. thirteen hundred horses stabled in Cook County. Fifty  
25. had positive Coggins tests reactions and were as they say in the  
26. horse...could I have some attention, please?

27. PRESIDENT:

28. You're entirely correct, Senator Hickey.  
29. Will the members please be in their seats. The noise level  
30. is getting to the point of being intolerable. Senator  
31. Hickey has the Floor. Senator Hickey.

32. SENATOR HICKEY:

33. Thank you. Fifty horses were, as the horse people say,

1. put down because they reacted positively to the Coggins' test.  
2. Since that time, it's been decided that that was...that  
3. the disease...that they reacted positively because of  
4. dirty needles. The...the anemia can now, people know,  
5. only be transmitted through fresh blood, either by  
6. needles or by flies which bite. And they also have  
7. more recently discovered which they did not know in  
8. the 60's when they killed those fifty horses, and  
9. which apparently the Department of Agriculture has  
10. not known or has chosen to ignore the fact that...  
11. I...I really do want to be heard, Mr. President.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. May we have some order. Will the members please  
14. their seats. Senator Hickey.

15. SENATOR HICKEY:

16. ...That many of the horses that react positively to  
17. the Coggins test cannot give the disease to another  
18. horse. But the Department has been going around making  
19. tests and then by their rules, horses have been killed  
20. all over this State by their owners because they  
21. believed as the Department has been perpetuating the  
22. idea, that other horses could get the disease from them.  
23. Now...now, there has been new information. They've discovered  
24. that a horse has to have the symptoms..it has to be a sick  
25. horse before it can give the disease and still only  
26. by two methods. Now, if we completely repeal this,  
27. one of the things that we will be...we will be...we could be  
28. going back to is dirty needles. One of the things that  
29. House Bill 1412 mandates is clean or new needles every time  
30. a test is given, so, that it...the disease...the...the  
31. Cogginitis, not the IEA, cannot be passed around because  
32. the Coggins test, I think Senator Wooten said this  
33. only does tests for antibodies, not for the virulent disease.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Hickey, your time has expired. Would  
3. you conclude your remarks?

4. SENATOR HICKEY:

5. I want to answer two other things that somebody  
6. said that we didn't...that the witnesses were all from  
7. out of State. They were the experts in the world on  
8. equine infectious anemia and we don't happen to have  
9. any in the State of Illinois. Also, the Act would  
10. provide that horses twenty-four months before sale  
11. in the State of Illinois would have to have a  
12. Coggins test as well as those being brought in from  
13. across the State. I do not understand the Department  
14. which has needlessly been having horses killed all over  
15. this State, now, all of a sudden says, let's don't  
16. do it at all. They protest us too much. I think their  
17. position is a completely suspect one and I urge you  
18. to vote against the amendment.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator McMillan may close the debate.

21. SENATOR McMILLAN:

22. Well, I'm...I'm not going to...to try to question  
23. anybody's motives whether it's the Department or  
24. anybody else's. My position in seeking the repeal  
25. is simply this, the State of Illinois passed the  
26. EIA law and required the Department of Agriculture  
27. to carry it out. And that meant that it was required  
28. that some horses be slaughtered. This, House Bill  
29. 1412, sets up a program that is slightly different and in  
30. the opinion of not just the Illinois Department of  
31. Agriculture, but also the University of Illinois College  
32. of Veterinary Medicine. They feel that it's unworkable  
33. and it is not wise from a...from...a...an animal health standpoint.

1. This is not a disease for which there are any human  
2. health dangers. Most of the horse people involved  
3. feel that they'd be much better off without the...the  
4. mandatory program and all of the racetracks, all of the  
5. people in the breeding business, people in the showing  
6. business and so forth, will still continue to require  
7. this test for...for their particular shows. From  
8. the discussions I've had, I feel we'd be better off  
9. repealing it, so does the Department, so does the  
10. College of Veterinary Medicine because they feel that  
11. having no mandatory program would be much better than  
12. having a program that is unworkable in their opinion,  
13. quite costly and perhaps would not do anything to control  
14. the disease.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. The question is shall Amendment No. 3  
17. be adopted. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed  
18. will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted  
19. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.  
20. On that question the Ayes are 26, the Nays are 25,  
21. none Voting Present. Amendment No. 3 having received  
22. a majority of the votes cast is adopted. Are there  
23. any further amendments?

24. SECRETARY:

25. No further amendments.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. 3rd reading. Senator Hickey, I regret to inform  
28. you that we've moved the bill to 3rd reading  
29. and the request is...is too late. House Bill 1423,  
30. Senator Carroll. Read the bill.

31. SECRETARY:

32. House Bill 1423.

33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Finance and Credit

2. Regulations offers one amendment.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Carroll.

5. SENATOR CARROLL:

6. Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 is

7. to allow the county treasurers to give a receipt upon request

8. over and above any check or any other form of payment that's

9. an automatic receipt. It will save them some money where

10. receipts are not, in fact, needed. I would move adoption of Committee

11. Amendment No. 1.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Is there any discussion? Senator Carroll moves the adoption

14. of Amendment No. 1. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.

15. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any

16. further amendments?

17. SECRETARY:

18. No further committee amendments.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Any amendments from the Floor?

21. SECRETARY:

22. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Bloom.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Bloom. Senator Bloom is not on the Floor.

25. Senator Bloom, you have Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1423?

26. SENATOR BLOOM:

27. Yeah...oh, I didn't realize my microphone was on. I'm

28. sorry, Mr. President. Thank you. Yes. Staff gave me this.

29. The thrust of this amendment would be to specify that the

30. taxpayer could use any other form of...of payment including

31. personal checks. That was just to spell out and clarify the

32. methods of paying taxes. I'd urge its adoption.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Is there any discussion? Senator Bloom moves the adoption
2. of Amendment No. 2. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.
3. Opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any
4. further amendments?
5. SECRETARY:
6. No further amendments.
7. PRESIDENT:
8. 3rd reading. House Bill 1424, Senator Lane. House Bill
9. 1450, Senator Carroll. Read the bill.
10. SECRETARY:
11. House Bill 1450
12. (Secretary reads title of bill)
13. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
14. PRESIDENT:
15. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. House Bill
16. 1485, Senator D'Arco. Read the bill.
17. SECRETARY:
18. House Bill 1485
19. (Secretary reads title of bill)
20. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
21. PRESIDENT:
22. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. House Bill
23. 1500, Senator Egan. House Bill 1502, Senator Lenke. House
24. Bill 1508, Senator Berman. House Bill 1585, Senator Knuppel.
25. Read the bill.
26. SECRETARY:
27. House Bill 1585
28. (Secretary reads title of bill)
29. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
30. PRESIDENT:
31. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senator
32. Vadalabene, on...on House Bill 1218, that...that you took from
33. the record, the amendment is on the Secretary's Desk. Are you

1. prepared to read that bill? House Bill 1218. Read the bill.
2. SECRETARY:
3. House Bill 1218
4. (Secretary reads title of bill)
5. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
6. PRESIDENT:
7. Any amendments from the Floor?
8. SECRETARY:
9. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Vadalabene.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Senator Vadalabene moves the adoption...it's a technical
12. amendment...moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1. All those
13. in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it.
14. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?
15. SECRETARY:
16. No further amendments.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. 3rd reading. Senator Kenneth Hall on...the Secretary's
19. office had a technical problem with House Bill 1025. We passed that bill.
20. It is...the Secretary informs me the problem has been corrected.
21. Do you wish the bill read? Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
22. SECRETARY:
23. House Bill 1025
24. (Secretary reads title of bill)
25. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
26. PRESIDENT:
27. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading.
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
29. 1596, Senator Vadalabene. On the Order of House Bills 2nd
30. reading, House Bill 1596. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

5. Senator Vadalabene. All right. Take it out of the record. Any  
6. other member have a bill he wishes recalled while we're on  
7. this order of business? All right, Mr. Sergeant-at-Arms, we

25. I want to put the amendment on and move it out, too, if  
26. possible. I'm sure it's...this is the one that calls for the

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

29. Well...I'm...I'm sure we will get to it. We are going to  
30. proceed on...we're scheduled to adjourn at noon and we wish

4. House Bill 36
5. (Secretary reads title of bill)
6. 3rd reading of the bill.
7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
8. All right, will the members please be in their seat and
9. those not entitled to the Floor, please vacate. We are on
10. passage stage. Senator Graham.
11. SENATOR GRAHAM:
12. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, thank you
13. very much. House Bill 36 and its accompanying bill probably
14. have generated as much interest by law enforcement groups
15. throughout the State as any other legislation pending before
16. this General Assembly this year. This creates inter-govern-
17. mental drug laws enforcement commission and establishes the
18. criteria by which local enforcement groups may gain grants and
19. enforce drug laws of the State of Illinois, commonly known as
20. the Municipal Enforcement Group serving seventy-two percent
21. of the State population contained in twenty-six counties, are
22. being served by this very effective group of law enforcement
23. people, and this bill if passed and signed will be a means to
24. an end of a very important means to an end whereby in the
25. enforcement and control of drugs in the State of Illinois, we
26. incorporate the facilities of the State and certainly the
27. facilities of the local enforcement groups, and I think it's
28. the most advisable thing that we've considered here in a long,
29. long time. The last...the track record of this...of these
30. Meg units in 1976 had thirty-two hundred and seventy arrests, seventeen
31. hundred and seventy-seven convictions. Included in that were
32. twenty-three ...in those arrests were twenty-three hundred and fifty
33. for controlled substances - hard drugs, nine hundred and

1. twenty-eight for Marijuana and Cannibas Controlled Act. Ladies  
2. and Gentlemen of this Senate, the only people that appeared in  
3. committee in opposition to this bill were the bill who had come  
4. in contact with the MEG units either directly or indirectly  
5. at some time throughout the State. I think in efforts to be  
6. of service to our community and to the morals of our State, and  
7. to our young people, I think this is a step in the right  
8. direction, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, and I urge your  
9. most sincere support of this very important bill.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

11. Is there any discussion? Senator Hynes.

12. SENATOR HYNES:

13. Mr. President, I rise in support of this legislation.  
14. As...Senator Graham has so ably pointed out, this will codify a  
15. situation that has existed in this State and will give additional  
16. strength to these groups which have done so much throughout  
17. the State of Illinois. I think this legislation is long over-  
18. due. I think it is highly desirable and ought to receive an  
19. overwhelming vote here in the Senate.

21. Further discussion? Senator Buzbee.

22. SENATOR BUZBEE:

23. Thank you, Mr. President. I just want to add my voice  
24. also to one of those that is support of this...such an operation  
25. of this is going on in my town and my district. They have been  
26. most successful in slowing the flow of drugs into my area. I  
27. think it's one in testimony we heard the other day in the  
28. Appropriations Committee. It's one of the few where we have  
29. unanimous support from all geographical areas of the State. We  
30. had the MEG units from Chicago and from the suburbs and from the  
31. central and the southern part of the State that all came in  
32. unanimously. I think it's a good program, and I think we ought  
33. to support it.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

2. Any further discussion? Senator Graham, you wish to close  
3. the debate? Oh, Senator Harber Hall.

4. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

5. Yeah, I just would like the Body to know that in my area  
6. where the MEG units have brought cases they have a very high  
7. degree of convictions. And I find the only people opposing  
8. them are those who are suspect of trafficking drugs, and...using drugs,  
9. a high number of those being young on the college campuses.  
10. I support this bill a hundred percent.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

22. Senator Knuppel.

23. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

24. House Bill 3 has been introduced as the result of the  
25. Illinois Legislative Investigating Commission report released  
26. which showed that heroin drug traffic in Illinois, that this is  
27. one of the major distribution points for it, and it reduces  
28. the...the amount that's required for a person to have in  
29. possession from thirty to fifteen grams, and it does the same  
30. thing with respect to morphine. I think this is good legislation,  
31. and it will help reduce drug traffic or should, and it's a  
32. step in...in the right direction to...to protect our people and  
33. our citizens, and I would urge a favorable roll call.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

2. Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

16. Senator Shapiro.

17. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

18. Well, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, House Bill  
19. 42 as amended, amends the Horse Racing Act of 1975 by providing  
20. for the use of Ag Premium Fund monies to pay for prize monies  
21. and premiums at Mid-Continent Livestock Exposition which is  
22. located approximately three miles north of Amboy, Illinois. The...  
23. there is a companion...you will soon find out the minute this

1. Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Hynes.
2. SENATOR HYNES:
3. Senator, where did you say that this Exposition was going
4. to be held?
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
6. Senator Shapiro.
7. SENATOR SHAPIRO:
8. Approximately three miles north of Amboy, Illinois.
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
10. Any further discussion? Question is, shall House Bill 42
11. pass. Senator Knuppel.
12. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
13. Where is Amboy?
14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
15. Senator Shapiro.
16. SENATOR SHAPIRO:
17. Approximately one hundred and fifty-five miles due north
18. of Springfield, Illinois.
19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
20. Question is, shall House Bill 42 pass. Those in favor
21. will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is
22. open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
23. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 57, the Nays
24. are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 42 having received
25. a constitutional majority is declared passed. On the Order of

29. House Bill 43
30. (Secretary reads title of bill)

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
33. Senator Shapiro.

1. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

2. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate,  
3. this is the accompanying appropriation bill which appropriates  
4. eight thousand dollars from the Ag Premium Fund to the Depart-  
5. ment of Agriculture for the administration of House Bill 42.  
6. I would appreciate a favorable roll call.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

8. The question is, shall House Bill 43 pass. Those in favor  
9. will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is  
10. open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take  
11. the record. On that question, the Ayes are 57, the Nays are none,  
12. none Voting Present. House Bill 43 having received a constitu-  
13. tional majority is declared passed. 52, Senator Glass. On the

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

21. Senator Glass.

22. SENATOR GLASS:

23. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen. This bill  
24. increases from five hundred to one thousand dollars the amount  
25. which may be recovered from the parent or guardian of an un-  
26. emancipated minor who has committed willful or malicious  
27. actions, vandalism and the like. A Senate amendment lowered the  
28. age of the minor from under eighteen to under the age of sixteen  
29. years of age. Appreciate a favorable roll call.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

31. Is there any discussion? Senator Knuppel.

32. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

33. Well, two questions. The first one is of the sponsor. The

1. first one is, has there been any studies undertaken or is there any  
2. evidence that making parents responsible for children's tort  
3. prevented in any way vandalism or other destruction or damages  
4. caused by minors?  
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
6. Senator Glass.  
7. SENATOR GLASS:  
8. No such evidence was presented at the committee that I  
9. recall, Senator Knuppel, but I am familiar with a number of  
10. municipalities that have adopted ordinances of this type and have re-  
11. ported reductions in vandalism as a result. Deerfield, I think  
12. was the first one.  
13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
14. Senator Knuppel.  
15. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
16. The second question I have is, for what reason was the  
17. age lowered from eighteen to sixteen? This sounds like a  
18. strange thing to do.  
19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
20. Senator Glass.  
21. SENATOR GLASS:  
22. That...that was done at the request of Senator Lemke in  
23. order to get the bill out on the Floor;  
24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)  
25. Senator Knuppel.  
26. SENATOR KNUPPEL:  
27. Well, did that mean that a parent...a parent has no  
28. responsibility for the damages caused in tort...malicious tort  
29. actions by seventeen...sixteen and seventeen year olds?  
30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)  
31. Senator Glass.  
32. SENATOR GLASS:  
33. If this bill is passed in the present form, the financial

1. responsibility law would apply only to minors...under sixteen  
2. ...in effect between the ages of eleven and sixteen, Senator  
3. Knuppel.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Knuppel.

6. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

7. Well, it seems to me that you're raising the limits and  
8. lowering the age and that what you're doing proves to be about a...  
9. a crossout that it's counterproductive, because I...I have the  
10. feeling, and I...I have no statistic, but it seems to me and  
11. I have raised some children that...that the age when they're  
12. most apt to be destructive is from...when they're sixteen and  
13. seventeen in...in this nature rather than those that are  
14. sixteen or closer...under closer supervision. So that what  
15. you're going to do is end up by collecting more from...from  
16. younger.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18. Senator Glass.

19. SENATOR GLASS:

20. Well, I would only respond this way. I've had the same  
21. experience as you in...in raising several through that age  
22. level, and Senator Lemke stated in committee...I don't want to  
23. misquote him, but in effect, after a child reaches the age of  
24. sixteen or seventeen, there is relatively little effective  
25. control that a parent has, and therefore, it's unfair to continue  
26. to saddle them with this responsibility.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Is there further debate? Question is, shall House Bill 52  
29. pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting  
30. is open. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record. On  
31. that question, the Ayes are 44, the Nays are 2, 3 Voting Present.  
32. House Bill 52 having received a constitutional majority is de-  
33. clared passed. House Bill 53, Senator Rhoads. Read the bill,

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. SENATOR RHOADS:

9. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Back  
10. in 1909 a law was passed in Illinois known as the Women's Eight  
11. Hour Day Law. It prohibited the employment of females in certain  
12. occupations to eight hours in a twenty-four hour period or to forty-  
13. eight hours in a regular work week. Because of the preemption  
14. of Federal laws in this regard for many years, specifically the Equal  
15. Opportunity Employer Act in interstate commerce and because of

26. wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 47, the  
27. Nays are none. House Bill 53 having received the constitu-  
28. tional majority is declared passed. House Bill 91. Read the  
29. bill, Mr. Secretary.

30. SECREATY:

31. House Bill 91

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 3rd reading of the bill.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Senator Schaffer.

3. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

4. House Bill 91 and 92 under joint sponsorship of myself  
5. and Senator Knuppel would authorize the county boards of the  
6. State and the counties to create an alternative form of  
7. sentencing that would allow them to create...this bill specifically  
8. create public service employment agencies in cooperation with  
9. the...judiciary so the several circuit courts, to provide  
10. alternative forms of punishment. Specifically what we had in  
11. mind and what the bill would allow to be possible would be  
12. for a court to reprimand a minor who had been convicted, say  
13. of, throwing beer cans out of a car to go out under the super-  
14. vision of the appropriate county agency to pick up the beer  
15. cans and clean up the mess. I think it's a good concept and  
16. merits our support.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18. Senator Hickey.

19. SENATOR HICKEY:

20. I'd like to ask the sponsor a question.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

22. Indicates he will yield.

23. SENATOR HICKEY:

24. Will they be paid for the work they do?

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

26. Senator Schaffer.

27. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

28. No.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30. Senator Demuzio.

31. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

32. Well, Senator Hickey asked one of the questions that I  
33. was going to ask. Senator Schaffer, in the setting up of these

1. boards, is it mandatory or is permissive, and if...if it's  
2. mandatory, how much is it going to cost? What's...what's  
3. the cost estimates?

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Senator Schaffer.

6. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

7. Well, I'm corrected on one thing. While they aren't  
8. ...being paid, it is in lieu of fine, and this bill is  
9. optional by the county and optional by the judiciary. There  
10. is nothing mandatory in the bill at all. The...the county  
11. could say we don't want to do it. The judiciary could say,  
12. fine, if you want to do it, we don't, and...and nothing would  
13. happen. It's a very optional bill.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Senator Demuzio.

16. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

17. What happens if the judiciary says to the county board  
18. that...that they, in fact, want to do it, and the county board  
19. doesn't want to do it?

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. Senator Schaffer.

22. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

23. The judiciary would have to convince the county board.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. Is there further debate? Senator Schaffer may close the  
26. debate or ask for a roll call. Senator Knuppel.

27. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

28. Mr. President, I have joined with Senator Schaffer in  
29. ...in the sponsorship of these bills. I think that these...  
30. these things will do a lot more good than saying that the parents  
31. have to pay for the damages that the youngster does, particularly  
32. in this age group of sixteen to seventeen. I've always had the  
33. feeling that if...if I had a son that stole some hubcaps, the

1. best way to punish him would make him to go around the square  
2. with a bucket each day...on Saturday afternoon when everybody  
3. was in town, and wash their wheels, that it would be both a  
4. little bit demeaning and he would find out what...what hubcaps  
5. were. I think this legislation is good legislation. It's in  
6. keeping with what...what types of punishment ought to be rather  
7. than saying somebody will draw six months or pay so many dollars  
8. which we have become, in my opinion, hardened to, in a kind of  
9. a rut. I think this is good legislation. It's permissive with  
10. the county boards. Hopefully, they will be able to work with  
11. the judges and that this will become more common place rather  
12. than just say, well, you're on probation or you got so many days  
13. to serve or so many dollars to pay. I think this is good  
14. legislation.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Is there further debate? Senator...Senator Demuzio, number  
17. two.

18. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

19. I just have another question. Senator Schaffer, what  
20. happens if one of these youngsters, for example, is cutting grass  
21. or...or something for the county and goes out and wrecks the...the  
22. highway truck, who's responsible and who's liable, and...and in...  
23. in fact, will the...will the counties be able to get any kind of  
24. liability insurance to cover any of these so-called employment  
25. activities?

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. Senator Schaffer.

28. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

29. Well, it's my understanding that when the county goes into  
30. the program, the county assumes certain forms of liability and  
31. I'm...and I think that type of situation is...is covered. We  
32. would not...wouldn't cover a person who say was sent out to pick  
33. up beer cans and in the process of the beer cans picked up a

1. brick and threw at the...through the window of a passing car,  
2. that person would still be held liable, but if he was say,  
3. operating a lawnmower and the lawnmover were defective and...  
4. and he hurt himself or did some damage, the county assumes  
5. responsibility. It's one of the reasons we wanted to make it  
6. optional, and...and I...I believe my analysis is correct, and  
7. if not, Senator Knuppel, I think we are covered on that.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Senator Demuzio.

10. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

11. Well, let me ask you another question. How would this  
12. bill or will this bill, in fact, have anything at all to do  
13. or jeopardize the counties involvement in Comprehensive  
14. Employment and Training Acts since these people are not being  
15. paid?

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Senator Schaffer.

18. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

19. I'm unaware of any conflicts. Certainly if a county  
20. thought there might be a problem, they could just opt not to  
21. be involved in this program. This is purely optional.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

23. Senator...Senator Ozinga.

24. SENATOR OZINGA:

25. I rise in support of this bill. This concept is not new.  
26. This has been used by various counties all over the State,  
27. especially up in suburbia. Years ago we used to have these  
28. kids that didn't have a buck and we didn't want to have...or we didn't  
29. have...we didn't think it right that their parents should be  
30. charged with some of the vandalism that went on, and all that we  
31. did was say okay, report back here to the court house on such  
32. and such a day and under supervision of some member of the  
33. municipality, they would go out and clean it up. It's a good

1. bill, and I would suggest support for it.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. Senator Hickey.

4. SENATOR HICKEY:

5. ...come back the second time, but I want to get this

6. in the record. Asked Senator Knuppel if it would be possible

7. for county boards to decide to pay them if they wanted to,

8. and he said yes, and I just would like to know if Senator

9. Schaffer concurs with that so that that's in the record. It

10. does not preclude any payment.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12. Senator Schaffer.

13. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

14. I'm...unaware of any aspect of the bill that would preclude

15. payment.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Senator Ozinga.

18. SENATOR OZINGA:

19. Just in answer to Senator Hickey. Sometimes these kids

20. would create maybe two, three, four hundred dollars worth of

21. damage...or just vandalism around the area. What we would do...

22. would say now, your fine amounts to maybe two hundred dollars,

23. but you'll work it off at the rate of fifty cents a day, and if

24. they didn't, why, the fine would still stand, so that they in

25. reality were paying off their fine as they went and this was

26. more meaningful than having to shell out the buck by the parents

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Senator Rock.

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. Thank you, Mr. President, ...Ladies and Gentlemen of the

31. Senate. I rise in opposition to House Bill 91. We have by

32. virtue of this House Bill are attempting at least to amend two

33. different Acts. One, the Counties Act which says that if, in

1. fact, a county embarks on this kind of program, that they are  
2. in no way liable for anything that these youngsters apparently  
3. do or anybody, it doesn't specify that's for youngsters.  
4. Secondly, this...this bill amends the Probation Officers Act,  
5. and it seems to me that the probation officers at least by  
6. virtue of the testimony I heard this Session have plenty  
7. enough to do without getting involved in...in promoting and  
8. encouraging these kinds of programs. I think if someone  
9. breaks the law, there are plenty of...of judicial sanctions  
10. that can and should be used, and to embark on a program like  
11. this, it seems to me is unwarranted and unworthy of our  
12. consideration, and I would...intend to vote No for House...  
13. on House Bill 91 and would urge everyone to do so.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Senator Berning.

16. SENATOR BERNING:

17. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.  
18. Somewhat in response to the last speaker, yes, there are many  
19. available judicial sanctions, but you and I know and so do our  
20. fellow citizens, those who are bearing the brunt of the  
21. vandalism that these judicial sanctions all too often  
22. are meaningless if they are even offered at all. The average  
23. American on our streets today is much concerned about vandalism  
24. and crime on the streets. Those young people who have assumed the  
25. attitude that there is complete immunity for them no matter  
26. what they do need to be taught a lesson. Sad as it may be,  
27. we have to accept the fact that there is a percentage of our  
28. young people who love to flaunt the law. This is good  
29. legislation. It is a step in the right direction. I don't  
30. think it will lead to the old stockade and the whipping post,  
31. which, incidentally, I happen to think might be a good idea, but  
32. in the alternative, this will act as a deterrent. It makes it  
33. meaningful to the young offender when he must get out and work

1. off his obligation. I think this deserves the vote of everyone  
2. of us.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. Is there further debate? Senator Knuppel...

5. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

6. Mr...

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. ...for the second time.

9. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

10. ...Despite what my leader says, the best evidence in  
11. favor of this legislation is, is that the existing methods of  
12. punishing juveniles and so forth just aren't working. That's  
13. what happening. Look at the rise in crime, the rise in  
14. juvenile delinquency. How many of you have ever gone out and  
15. taken somebody else's child under your wing as a big brother?  
16. What do you think is meaningful to these kids? Have any of  
17. you ever worked with as many as ten or twelve...children that  
18. belonged to somebody else? What do those children relate to?  
19. You can sit here in your ivory tower and say this is bad  
20. legislation. Fine them, or put in jail, send them to some  
21. youth camp where they learn all the damn mischief from the  
22. other kids that are in the same place, or are you going to do  
23. something about it? This is a bill that's headed in the right  
24. direction. Go ahead, stay in your rut, look straight ahead,  
25. close your eyes, put on your blinkers, and let the...the raid  
26. of juvenile delinquency and crime continue to rise. We got to  
27. change our outlook or we're sure as hell not going to solve  
28. our problem.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30. Is there further debate? Senator Schaffer may close.

31. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

32. I think it's an excellent concept. It's optional. My  
33. probation departments want it. I'd appreciate a favorable

1. roll call.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. The question is, shall House Bill 91 pass. Those in

4. favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open.

5. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record. On that

6. question, the Ayes are 41, the Nays are 8. House Bill 91

7. having received the constitutional majority is declared passed.

8. House Bill 92, Senator Schaffer. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

9. SECRETARY:

10. House Bill 92

11. (Secretary reads title of bill)

12. 3rd reading.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14. Senator Schaffer.

15. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

16. House Bill 92 which is the companion bill of 91 implements

17. the provisions of this...this concept with the circuit...courts.

18. The first bill was involved with the county boards.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. Is there further debate? The question is, shall House

21. Bill 92 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay.

22. The voting is open. Have all those voted who wish? Take the

23. record. On that question, the Ayes are 41, the...the...Nays

24. are 8. House Bill 92 having received the constitutional majority

25. is declared passed. House Bill 96, Senator Vadalabene. Read

26. the bill, Mr. Secretary.

27. SECRETARY:

28. House Bill 96

29. (Secretary reads title of bill)

30. 3rd reading of the bill.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Senator Vadalabene.

33. SENATOR VADALABENE:

1. Yes...yes, thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 96
2. amends the Election Code and fixes the compensation of
3. election judges at forty dollars per day. It's now thirty-five
4. dollars in counties over five hundred thousand, and I would
5. appreciate a favorable vote.
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
7. Is there further debate? Senator Walsh.
8. SENATOR WALSH:
9. Will the Gentlemen yield for a question?
10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
11. He indicates he will.
12. SENATOR WALSH:
13. See how I missed that five hundred thousand. Is this
14. just for downstate?
15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
16. Senator Vadalabene.
17. SENATOR VADALABENE:
18. Yes, I...I just now see it. It does not affect Cook
19. County and it's permissive legislation, and it permits up to
20. forty dollars per day, and presently its maximum level is thirty-
21. five, and it's for downstate.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
23. Senator Walsh.
24. SENATOR WALSH:
25. This would just apply to...to county and...and State-wide
26. elections. It wouldn't apply to local elections, would it?
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
28. Senator Vadalabene.
29. SENATOR VADALABENE:
30. I think that's correct, but I can't give you a direct
31. answer on that one.
32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
33. Senator Walsh.

1. SENATOR WALSH:

2.           Actually, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I...I  
3. have no objection to the forty dollar level. I think it should  
4. apply State-wide. I...I don't see why we should distinguish  
5. between downstate and Cook County on a bill such as this.  
6. There is legislation pending which would extend     the voting  
7. hours for another...for one more hour, from six to seven, which  
8. may or may not be a good idea, but the thirty-five dollar  
9. level is...is probably not adequate. Being from Cook County,  
10. it seems to me that if it's going to be forty downstate, it  
11. ought to be forty from Cook County, and I would...I would not  
12. support legislation in its present form.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

14.           Senator Rhoads.

15. SENATOR RHOADS:

16.           Question of the sponsor. Senator Vadalabene, is there  
17. a differential in downstate Illinois if a judge has attended  
18. a school or not? Is there a pay differential?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20.           Senator Vadalabene.

21. SENATOR VADALABENE:

22.           I don't know.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24.           Senator Rhoads.

25. SENATOR RHOADS:

26.           I am being whispered to that there is. I rise in support  
27. of this bill. I think it's a good bill, and the judges deserve  
28. more pay.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30.           Is there further discussion? Senator Philip.

31. SENATOR PHILIP:

32.           Thank you, Mr. President. Will the sponsor yield for a  
33. question?

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
2. Indicates he will.
3. SENATOR PHILIP:
4. Senator, this only applied to one county?
5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
6. Senator Vadalabene.
7. SENATOR VADALABENE:
8. No, this applies downstate.
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
10. Senator Philip.
11. SENATOR PHILIP:
12. We're increasing the judge of elections fees from thirty-
13. five dollars to forty dollars a day?
14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
15. Senator Vadalabene.
16. SENATOR VADALABENE:
17. Yes, an additional five dollars.
18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
19. Senator Philip.
20. SENATOR PHILIP:
21. That certainly would seem reasonable to me.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
23. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall
24. House Bill 96 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed
25. Nay. The voting is open. Have all those voted who wish?
26. Have all those voted who wish? Take the record. On that
27. question, the Ayes are 49, the Nays are 3, 2 Voting Present.
28. House Bill 96 having received a constitutional majority is
29. declared passed. Senator Hynes.
30. SENATOR HYNES:
31. Mr. President, the hour of twelve o'clock is approaching
32. and committees are set to begin at that point, so I would suggest
33. that we terminate the Order of 3rd reading at this juncture and

1. take care of announcements and motions, and I would begin that  
2. with a motion to defer 3rd reading and final passage of the  
3. bills on Agreed Bill List No. 4 until tomorrow. So, I...I...I  
4. would put that in the form of a motion that the vote on the  
5. bills on Agreed Bill List No. 4 be taken on Wednesday, June  
6. 22nd.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. You've heard the motion. All those in favor indicate by  
9. saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion  
10. carries. Senator Hynes.

11. SENATOR HYNES:

12. Secondly, I would move to...to suspend the rules for  
13. purpose of waiving the Six Day Notice Requirement with respect  
14. to House Bill 2374, so that that bill may be heard in the  
15. Committee on Appropriations II this week.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. You've heard the motion. Those in favor indicate by  
18. saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion  
19. carries. Senator Hynes.

20. SENATOR HYNES:

21. Also, I...I would like to announce that the...there will  
22. be a meeting of the Senate Operations Committee in...in the

24. Session will begin at 9:00 a.m. Now, I...I also think now,
