- Senator Wooten, Chairman of the Committee on Executive
- reports out House Joint Resolution No. 1 with the recommendation
- that the Senate Do Not adopt.
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- On the Order of House Bills, 2nd reading, is...House Bill
- 26 which is placed on the Calendar on the Order of 2nd reading
- should...should have been placed on the Order of 3rd reading
- and that is where the bill is properly placed. Senator
- Kosinski is recognized. May I have you...may we have some...
- may we have some attention, Gentlemen and Ladies.
- Senator Kosinski.
- SENATOR KOSINSKI:
- Mr. Chairman and members of the Senate, we have an amendment 26.
- to be brought back on this bill, 26. I now yield to Senator
- Graham for his move.
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- All right. Senator Kosinski has asked leave to return the 30.
- bill to the Order of 2nd reading for the purpose of amendment.
- Is there leave? Leave is granted. For what purpose does Senator 32.
- Graham arise?

- Didn't think you...I didn't think you were with me,
- but I see you are. I'm informed that we have another amendment

- SENATOR ROCK:
- Thank you, Mr....pardon me, thank you, Mr. President,
- 26. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Amendment No. 10
- 27.
  is an agreed amendment which incorporates the best features
- of Amendments 2, 6, and 9 which just have been reconsidered 29.
- and Tabled. That is to say that it is a...it incorporates the 30.
- technical changes which were contained in Amendment No. 6
- 31. which was yesterday adopted pursuant to Senator Kosinski's 32.
- motion. It spells out who are, in fact, the constitutional 33.

- Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
- I rise in support of Senator Rock's Amendment No. 10.
- Just to briefly recap, what we now have is a hybrid of
- many different bills as they've been working through the
- 14.

  General Assembly during the Session. An eight member board,
  15.
- four appointed from upstate, four from downstate, four from 16.
- each party, four appointed by the Governor and four appointed
- by the...another State-wide officer of the opposite political
- party. Three-fifths confirmation of the Senate, except when the 19.
- Governor appoints all eight and then two-thirds confirmation 20.
- by the Senate. The Governor's position has been consistent in that 21.
- he has felt that he should be appointing all eight members.
- That concept was embraced in my Amendment No. 4 which was
- defeated yesterday. The Governor is still of that opinion and 24.
- I think still the majority of the Republicans in both Houses
- 25. agreed to that, but we now feel that with a deadline facing us,
- 26. it is important to get some bill passed that in order to show
- 27. good faith to the Supreme Court. We talked with Representative
- 28. Ryan and Madigan in the House. It...they seem amenable to this.
- There is a...an April 15th effective date on it, so I...I
- urge adoption of Amendment No. 10.

  Mr. President and members of the Senate. Many hours
- $$\operatorname{\textsc{Were}}$$  spent trying to get a bill together. The Supreme Court
- 29. has ruled that November 30th was the deadline. And we have
- 30. now reached a deadline through fine cooperation of both parties.

  And I congratulate Senator Rhoads, Senator Graham, the committee
- and his staff. Congratulate Senator Rock, Senator Hynes, and the

- l. committee and the staff...one man staff of my...Tim Sullivan,
- for the fine work they've done. I think we have a good bill,
- a bill that we all can live with, maybe with some pains, but that
- 4. can be healed very quickly. I now, Mr. President, move
- 5. for full support and a very hearty vote count on this House
- Bill No. 26. Thank you, Mr. President.
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- Is there discussion? Senator Graham.
- SENATOR GRAHAM:
- 9. So we know where we are, now, the amendment that I 10.
- put on the bill yesterday to make the effective date

- The tape can't read your nod. Ladies and Gentlemen of the

  Senate. I think many things have to be said about the people
- 22. who have worked on this. I'd indicate to you that last January
- 23. the 19th, I summoned members of the Governor's staff to my
- 24. office together with some representatives from other party
- 25. in our attempt to come up with a bill dealing with the State
- 26. Board of Elections. Senator Rhoads, Tom Taylor, Senator Rock's
- 27. staff and Senator Kosinski and others have put in a considerable
- 28.  $\alpha$  amount of time. This is not the bill that any...either side of
- 29. the aisle really desires. I would rather have a different
- 30. bill. So would my Democrat colleagues on the other side, but this
- 31. represents perhaps one of the greatest endeavors in the spirit of
- 32. compromise that I have witnessed in my nineteen years in the Illinois
- 33.

- Senate dealing with a subject matter that is politically 1. volitile anytime you deal with it and we're down to the wire, 2. my friends, to the point that if we don't do something and the 3. House doesn't act favorably, we may be filing our petitions 4 in the middle of the square on the old courthouse on 5 December 12th or we might be back in Special Session to present... 6. prevent that possibility of occurring. The amendment 7. that I placed on will make the bill have to have thirty-8. six votes. I think it's important that we do it and I join 9. with all of those that support it and ask for a favorable roll 10.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Thank you, Mr. President. I know everybody has worked very hard on this bill and it really is a compromise bill and everybody deserves a lot of credit on it, but the problem I have with the bill is that the people who were working in the State Board under the merit system in the State Board took examinations to qualify for their jobs that they are presently employed in now and they passed those examinations and they qualified for those jobs and they're presently working in those jobs now. Well, under this bill, they're going to have to take new examinations and other people all over the State of Illinois can also take those new examinations and if the guy who has job now is not as qualified as someone else who happens to take the examination, then he's going to be out of a job even though he's worked for the State Board over the past three or four years of its existence. Who is going to be hurt by this bill, the little employee who works at the State Board. Everybody is happy, everybody is accomodated but those little guys that work at the State Board are going to be the recipients of unemployment welfare checks. Thank you.

- 3. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I rise in support
- 4. of House Bill 26 as amended. In briefly responding to
- 5. the comments of Senator D'Arco, there are about forty
- 6. employees of the State Board who might have to take an
- 7. examination but we're pretty sure they can pass that examination,
- 8. Senator D'Arco, and they do have a great deal of knowledge and
- 9. expertise. I know that the board probably wants to retain
- 10. those individuals that you mentioned. This is a good compromise
- 11. and I urge support.
- 12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- 13. Further discussion? Senator Rock.
- 14. SENATOR ROCK:
- 15. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
- 16. I, too, rise in support of House Bill 26 as amended and would
- 17. point out, I hope, for the purpose of the record and
- 18. within earshot of the Governor, that this is an agreement
- 19. reached by the members of the House and the members of the
- 20. Senate and we would hope that he would not tinker with or
- 21. attempt to use his Amendatory Veto on this legislation.
- 22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- 23. Further discussion? The question is shall House Bill
- 24. 26 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay.
- 25. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
- 26. who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are
- 55, the Nays are none, none Voting Present. Nays are 1,
- 28. none Voting Present. House Bill 26 having received a
- 29. constitutional majority is declared passed and the bill having
- 30. received the affirmative votes of three-fifths of the
- 31. members elected...and having received the affirmative vote of
- three-fifths of the members elected is effective as provided
- 33. within the law.
