12. Proclamation - For the reasons set forth below, I believe  
13. that need exists for a Special Session of the 81st General  
14. Assembly. On April 11th, 1979, Senate Bill 1292 was intro-  
15. duced. It was passed on May the 23rd, 1979, with the favorable  
16. vote of thirty-eight Senators. It was then transmitted to the  
17. House of Representatives for its consideration. On June the  
18. 13th, 1979, it was Tabled pursuant to House Rules where it  
19. has languished since that time. The failure of local government  
20. officials to consider the revenue production of the Corporate  
21. Property Tax Replacement Package would result in a substantial  
22. increase in Real Estate Taxes. This increase necessitates  
23. prompt action by the General Assembly on Senate Bill 1292,  
24. before the appropriate local officials prepare the 1980 Real  
25. Estate Tax bills. Any further delay in the consideration of  
26. Senate Bill 1292 will render ineffective its provisions in  
27. 1980 call. Therefore, pursuant to Article IV, Section 5B of  
28. the Constitution of 1970, I hereby call and convene the 81st  
29. General Assembly into a Special Session to convene on January  
30. the 12th, 1980, at...at ten o'clock a. m., in order to consider  
31. Senate Bill 1292, relating to the limitations of Real Estate  
32. extensions for units of local government and school districts.  
33. Signed, James R. Thompson, Governor.

4. a Proclamation for a Special which began this morning at 10:00  
5. o'clock. The bill that was named to be dealt with in that  
6. Special has yet to move in the House and it does not appear  
7. that any movement is likely, so I am proposing that the Senate  
8. in the 4th Special Session stand adjourned until January 22nd,  
9. at the hour of noon and I would so move.

12. Resolution No. 1 be adopted. Those in favor indicate by saying  
13. Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Senate Joint Resolution

16. Tuesday, January the 22nd, 1980, at 12:15 o'clock. Those in
