19. that the technicians are still ironing out the bugs, so to speak.  
20. The House has scheduled a Committee of the Whole hearing on the  
21. proposed amendments at 1:30 to which the Speaker has cordially  
22. invited all of us to attend. There are a number of witnesses from  
23. across the State who have seen fit to take advantage of this  
24. opportunity. I have suggested to the Speaker, and have conferred  
25. with Senator Shapiro, that given the fact that these witnesses have  
26. come from across the State to testify on this proposed legislation,  
27. that the Senate would be better advised not to take any pre-  
28. emptory action at this time. So, I would suggest that the Regular  
29. Session stand in recess until the hour of 4:30.
