25. Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 reduces the
26. amount of the appropriation because there's no possible way
27. that the agency that this...this board, rather, would be able
28. to spend this amount of money in the balance of the Fiscal Year.
29. Amendment...No. 1 reduces by fifty percent to reflect expenditures
30. for only one quarter and it also appropriates the fund for the
31. Purchase Care Review Board from Federal Funds rather than from
32. General Revenue Funds and I would move the adoption of Amend-
33. ment No. 1.

3. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

4. As a matter of personal privilege. I'm the Gentleman
5. that passed out the amendment, but the only guy that asked
6. about it was the one person that can't read. I don't under-

9. Thank you, Mr. President. This is a bill that was designed
10. by the Motor Vehicle Laws Commission and the Department of
11. Transportation. What it does, it allows what we commonly call
12. the Minute Man. That's those emergency vehicles that go to
13. accidents and go to accidents on the...on the expressways and
14. I'd ask for a favorable vote.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall Senate
17. Bill 111 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay.

32. Mr. President, this amendment results from the fact that
33. Enrolling and Engrossing noticed a number of transcription errors

1. in this bill. It does nothing other than change the spelling
2. and add some words that were inadvertently left out and I
3. move its adoption.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

5. Is there further discussion? The question is, shall
6. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 303 be adopted. Those in
7. favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have

14. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
15. Senate. Senate Bill 303 having just been amended, obviously,
16. intervening business is required before Senator Sommer could
17. call it for passage. In that vein I would ask leave of this
18. Body to go to the Order of Consideration Postponed so that we
19. may again consider Senate Bill 160.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

21. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senate Bill 160.
22. (Machine cutoff) has been read a 3rd time. Senator Rock,
23. proceed.

24. SENATOR ROCK:

25. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
26. Senate. Senate Bill 160 is an FY '79 appropriation to the
27. Judicial system of our State. Also included therein is an
28. additional appropriation to the General Assembly and to the
29. Executive Branch. It is necessary to meet the increased costs
30. that were engendered pursuant to the pay increase last November.
31. The total amount of the bill is four and a half million dollars
32. and without this legislation the Judicial fund for salaries will
33. be depleted, as of May 15th. I would urge your favorable support.

1. Yesterday, I think some members were unaware of the importance
2. of this bill and, additionally, there were some members who
3. were busy in other committees, but I would urge your favorable
4. support of Senate Bill 160.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Is there discussion? Is there discussion? The question
7. is, shall Senate Bill 160 pass. Those in favor vote Aye.
8. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all those voted

23. membership by two members and also provided that they should
24. have...draw lots when those members get elected and stagger
25. the terms...Such, at least, two of them are up for election
26. every two years. Well, the way the law is written this won't
27. work out for, at least, one...local park district and they need
28. the option to draw a lot for a two year term as well as a four
29. year term and this simply allows the drawing of the lot for
30. the two year term in addition to the four year term.

13. my colleagues something about the nature of our meeting of

28. Shapiro; Senate Resolution 72, Senator Wooten. The reason
29. I'm giving you this is because I'm trying to schedule the
30. many bills...put them on the list so you'll be protected
31. under our Sixty-Day Rule, but those are the only ones we
32. will hear and I'll try to give you some kind of schedule in
33. writing in future weeks so you'll know what bills will actually

1. before the committee: So even though your bill is posted,
2. do not be mislead. These are the ones we'll be hearing.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

4. Are there further announcements? Further announcements?
5. Senator Rock. Senator Vadalabene.

6. SENATOR VADALABENE:

7. Yes, Mr. President, this is...I don't know whether it will
8. be an announcement or in a form of a complaint, however, I
9. think as Chairman of the Executive on Appointments and
10. Administration, the messages come up to the Secretary of the
11. Senate from the Governor's Office and it has caused my
12. secretary and members of the committee a lot of problems
13. that the Economic Statement or the resume has not been
14. submitted to the...to my secretary, so consequently, we
15. have to either pull them off or they hand them to us in
16. one big lump sum the day of the hearings. I would suggest,
17. Mr. President and members of the Senate, if the Governor's
18. Office or his people send up messages from the Governor, that
19. the Economic Statement and the resume should be in his office
20. before they send the message up to us and I'm wondering if
21. that could be handled in some way...so that the liaison
22. people could get the message.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. ...We'll certainly look into that. Senator Netsch.

25. SENATOR NETSCH:

26. Mr. President, this is a slightly unusual request, but
27. I...I would like to make it if it's agreeable. There are a series
28. of House Bills that are now in the Senate that were technical
29. revisions that came out of the Law Revision Commission. The...
30. Senator Lemke's name is shown as the sponsor of most of them
31. and in discussions with the House sponsor, Representative
32. Terzich, Senator Lemke and other members of the Law Revision
33. Commission, we agreed that they...most of them should be

1. reallocated to members of the Law Revision Commission. They're
2. the kinds of bills that ought to be acted on and set early.
3. I wonder if I might have permission to...to alert the Chair-
4. man of the Committee in which those bills reside that they
5. will be asked to set them for a hearing by me, even though
6. I am not shown as the sponsor and I will submit to you...
7. within the next hour a list of the reallocation of the
8. sponsorship. This did have the approval of Senator Lemke,
9. who is presently shown as the sponsor and...also of the
10. House sponsor. Is that agreeable?

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

12. I agree...

13. SENATOR NETSCH:

14. They are not substantive bills. They are revision
15. bills.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. I think that that should...is agreeable with the membership.

18. SENATOR NETSCH:

19. That...that would save some time. Thank you. I didn't
20. know we were going to adjourn so fast. Thank you very much.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

22. Senator Hall.

23. SENATOR HALL:

24. Thank you, Mr. President. In the absence of the Chairman
25. of the Revenue Committee or the Vice-Chairman, Senator Egan
26. or Senator Maragos a Vice-Chairman and I'd like to be sure
27. that Senator McMillan might be listening to this. It was
28. agreed, Senator, if you will chair this, that the committee
29. because of the interest that's going to be...now since the
30. Supreme Court decision that we have to find some replacement
31. for this money that has been taken away...that the Committee
32. of the Whole is going to have a meeting Wednesday, March the
33. 28th...Isn't that correct, Senator McMillan and I just have

1. a note here from Senator Egan that this is going to be held
2. on the Senate Floor. Now the idea of that is that every-
3. body has so much interest in this that there's going to be
4. a Committee of the Whole of the Revenue Committee, Wednesday,
5. March the 28th for all people who are interested and discussing
6. a replacement...There's a...I don't have a time. I imagine
7. that...What time, Senator McMillan? Get...get on the mike.
8. Senator McMillan's got the...
9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
10. He indicates nine-thirty. It would be a meeting of the
11. Revenue Committee and not a meeting of the Committee of the
12. Whole.
13. SENATOR HALL:
14. Well, I mean a Committee of the...Yeah, a meeting of the
15. Revenue Committee. That's correct.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
17. Are there further announcements? Senator Rock moves
18. that the Senate stand adjourned...pursuant to the resolution,
19. to noon, March the 27th. The Senate does stand adjourned.
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
