26. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment
27. conforms the penalty on food stamp fraud to that of what the
28. Federal penalties are right now and I move for its adoption.

21. SENATOR RHOADS:
22. Thank you, Mr. President. This is, in fact, the committee
23. amendment. The committee report was in error. It was reported
24. out as no committee amendments. This amendment was, in fact,
25. adopted in committee. I have discussed it with Senator Lemke.
26. The reason it wasn't included in the report is that the bill
27. was held over when we...the amendment does one thing. Where-
28. ever the word "Congressional" appears, it inserts instead the
29. word "legislative" so that instead of having twenty-four
30. rotations on the ballot we would in have...fact have fifty-nine
31. rotations for each legislative district in the State and that
32. is consistent with the other bills which are recommended by
33. the State Board of Elections.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. Is there further discussion? Senator Bruce.

3. SENATOR BRUCE:

4. Yes, I just wonder if the sponsor would yield for a
5. question.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

7. He indicates he will.

8. SENATOR BRUCE:

9. Has a provision been made for the counties that...that
10. lay in more than one legislative district? When you went
11. from Congressional legislative you picked up not only fifty-
12. nine as opposed to twenty-four districts but you also picked
13. up a great deal more split districts. In my thirteen counties
14. I've got five counties that have at least one other...at least
15. one other legislative district. That will mean that those
16. five county clerks will have to pay the expense of printing
17. two separate ballots. I wonder if we could include some
18. provision that say that the major portion of that county.
19. I know like when you get into DuPage and Cook you got some
20. other problems. Some of the downstate counties...like I
21. have three townships out of Jefferson. That will mean that
22. entire county will have two separate sets of ballots.

26. Let's take this out of the record.

30. Demuzio. Senate Bill 176, Senator Sangmeister. 176. Read
31. the bill, Mr. Secretary.

33. Senate Bill 176.

2. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health,
3. Welfare and Corrections offers one amendment.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

7. Yes. The...Mr. President and members of the Senate.
8. This amendment was...was worked out with the committee and
9. what it does is it allows Public Aid recipients to be paid
10. up to the amount of the Public Aid that they have received
11. and after that point the taxing body would have to pay them
12. wages if they kept them in their employ. That's what the
13. amendment is. So they use up their public benefits first.
14. That was the committee amendment. I ask its adoption.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Is there...Is there further discussion? The question is,
17. shall Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 176 be adopted. Those

3. I'm sorry. We do have a...an amendment that I...I guess

4. apparently never got...It's a technical one. It just changes

5. from...the year from 1977 to 1979 and it was inadvertently

6. put in in '77. Can we file that now and...and have that

7. amendment adopted?

8. SECRETARY:

9. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Sangmeister.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

11. Is there further discussion?

12. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

13. Again...

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Senator...Just a moment. Senator Hall.

16. SENATOR HALL:

17. I'll wait until he finishes.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

19. Senator Sangmeister.

20. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

21. ...This amendment...when the bill was drafted the Reference

22. Bureau had '79 in it...'77 instead of '79. Just the wrong year

23. for the date of the Act and that's all that this does.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

25. It is a technical amendment. Senator Hall, for what

26. purpose do you arise?

27. SENATOR HALL:

28. Yes, I just wanted to ask a question of the sponsor.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

30. He indicates he will respond.

31. SENATOR HALL:

32. Senator, the...the object of your bill is to have people

33. who are receiving aid to do some type of...perform some type

1. of work. Is there a provision in it...I'm sorry I haven't
2. read the bill, for illness or things of that type so...my
3. understanding is unless they work they shall be cut off
4. from this aid. Is that correct?

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Senator Sangmeister.

7. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

8. Well, Senator Hall, that's a simplification of the bill.
9. There's no one going to be used if they're ill or...it's
10. impossible for them to work and, you know, that's really
11. not the...the matter of discussion before us here...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. The Chair recognizes that fact. It...you're speaking
14. to the bill itself and not...

15. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

16. On 3rd reading we'll be happy...I'll be happy to discuss
17. it with you privately, Senator.

18. SENATOR HALL:

19. Okay.

20. SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

21. All right. Fine.

17. Thank you, Mr. President. I raised some opposition
18. to this particular amendment. I do think that there...there
19. isn't any question that there will be a definite raise as far
20. as the premiums and the rates, that will go right back to
21. the people who are in the...buying the policies. There isn't
22. any question that that will happen. This has been the pattern
23. in the past and to eliminate all deductibles certainly is
24. going to result in an increase in the premium.

32. don't think he's going to oppose the amendment as such and

12. amend the...change the amendment on its face. The word "wind-
13. shield" is misspelled and if can get leave to correct the word
14. "windshield" it will save us from having a second amendment.
15. Senator Rupp, the word windshield' is misspelled. Is there
16. leave to get that amended on its face so that windshield is
17. spelled correctly?

7. Amendment No. 1 Mr. President and members of the Senate

8. is clarification language and...and especially in page 5,

9. line 5, by correcting the reporting and putting...knocking

10. out the word "the reporting" and put just "reporting." I

11. move its adoption.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Maragos has moved the adoption of Amendment

14. No. 1 to Senate Bill 563. Is there any discussion? If not,

15. all those in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The

16. Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any further amend-

17. ments?

18. SECRETARY:

19. No further...no further amendments.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. 3rd reading. Senator Nash, for what purpose do you arise?

22. SENATOR NASH:

23. Mr. President, can we go back to Senate Bill 556 and move

24. it to 3rd reading?

25. PRESIDENT:

26. We will, in fact, this time go back. I suggest to the

27. membership that we are in the next couple of weeks going have...

28. going to have to move rather rapidly. I would suggest every-

29. body stay in their seats. On the Order of Senate Bills, 2nd

30. reading. Senate Bill 556. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

5. No Floor amendments.
6. PRESIDENT:
7. 3rd reading. On the Order of Senate Bills, 2nd reading.
8. Senate Bill 562. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
9. SECRETARY:
10. Senate Bill 562.
11. (Secretary reads title of bill)
12. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
13. PRESIDENT:
14. Any amendments from the Floor?
15. SECRETARY:
16. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Maragos.
17. PRESIDENT:
18. Senator Maragos.
19. SENATOR MARAGOS:
20. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is the
21. same amendment I discussed earlier which I would do pending
22. approval by Senator Rhoads on the Republican side of the
23. aisle. Now they have agreed to it and I move for its adoption.
24. PRESIDENT:
25. Senator Maragos has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1
26. to Senate Bill 562. Is there any discussion? If not, all
27. those in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes
28. have it. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?
29. SECRETARY:
30. No further amendments.
31. PRESIDENT:
32. 3rd reading. Gentlemen, the hour of one o'clock is upon
33. us. Committees are scheduled. We have, however, three bills

4. Yes, Mr. President, there's a motion to be made by
5. Senator Donnewald of transferring one bill from a committee

8. Senator Donnewald. Senator Donnewald moves to rerefer
9. Senate Bill 1357 from the Committee on Revenue to the Committee
10. on Elementary Education. All those in favor signify by saying
11. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Senator Egan.
12. Senator Egan, for what purpose do you arise?

13. SENATOR EGAN:

14. I would ask, Mr. President, for leave of the members of
15. the Senate to allow me to be the chief sponsor of Senate
16. Bill 1340 in place of Senator Rock, with his permission.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? So ordered.
19. Senator Egan to be the chief sponsor of Senate Bill 1340. All
20. right, with leave of the Body we will move then to the Order

24. We are still on 562. We haven't...

26. That has been moved...that has been moved to 3rd reading.

28. It has? Okay.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. It has, indeed. With leave of the Body we will move to
31. the Order of Senate Bills, 3rd reading. If you'll take a look
32. at your Calendar on page 19. The attention of the membership...
33. we are on page 19 of the Senate Calendar. Senate Bills, 3rd

1. reading. With leave of the Body we'll go to that Order of
2. business. Leave is granted. On the Order of Senate Bills,
3. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 357. On the Order of Senate Bills,
4. 3rd reading, page 19 of the Calendar. Senate Bill 357. Read
5. the bill, Mr. Secretary.

6. SECRETARY:

7. Senate Bill 357.

8. (Secretary reads title of bill)

9. 3rd reading of the bill.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator DeAngelis.

12. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

13. Mr. President and other persons of the Senate. Senate
14. Bill 357 transfers five hundred thousand dollars for the
15. use of part time personnel in the Department of Revenue to
16. expedite senior citizens tax relief claims. I move for its
17. passage.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Is there any discussion? Senator Carroll. Senator Carroll.

20. SENATOR CARROLL:

21. Well, I thank you, Mr. President. By way of rhetorical
22. question to the sponsor, we're just very concerned that the
23. department was not able to realize its needs when it came in
24. for its original budgetary amounts and really the supplementals
25. just prove once again that the Governor's figures have been
26. inaccurate when stated and appear to be inaccurate throughout
27. the year.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Further discussion? Senator Maragos.

30. SENATOR MARAGOS:

31. Well, I'd like to ask the sponsor, doesn't the department
32. collect enough taxes without any more increase in their
33. appropriations? Will you please explain why you need this

1. immediately?

2. PRESIDENT:

3. The sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator DeAngelis.

4. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

5. Senator Maragos, this is not an increase. It's a

6. transfer.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Maragos.

9. SENATOR MARAGOS:

10. From what to what?

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator DeAngelis.

13. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

14. From the Circuit Breaker to the part time help that's

15. going to process the senior citizens tax relief forms.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Maragos.

18. SENATOR MARAGOS:

19. In other words, Senator DeAngelis, you can take the

20. money away that the senior citizens are supposed to receive

21. so you can give it to somebody to help somebody else that

22. is not a senior citizen.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator DeAngelis.

25. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

26. No. I would...Senator Maragos, I would never do that

27. to my mother. If it's...the money is left over.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Senator Maragos.

30. SENATOR MARAGOS:

31. It's not your mother I'm worried about, it's your father.

32. But anyway, being the case I think it's a bad bill and it

33. deserves defeat, Mr. President.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Is there any further discussion? Senator Mitchler.
3. SENATOR MITCHLER:
4. I'm totally confused and the bill just as much as the
5. sponsor is. Taking...taking the money from the senior citizens
6. to give to who?
7. PRESIDENT:
8. Senator DeAngelis.
9. SENATOR DeANGELIS:
10. To Director Zagel.
11. PRESIDENT:
12. Senator Mitchler.
13. SENATOR MITCHLER:
14. Well, I guess Senator Maragos is right. Thank you.
15. PRESIDENT:
16. Any further discussion? Senator DeAngelis may close the
17. debate.
18. SENATOR DeANGELIS:
19. Mr. President, I think the reason that this bill is so
20. controversial is that Amendment No. 3 failed and...Amendment
21. No. 3, which was offered by Senator Carroll stated that the
22. money was to be used exclusively for the expediting of
23. claims from the Legislature and it was shot down. I think
24. that's why this is controversial but I do move for its passage.
25. PRESIDENT:
26. All right. The question is, shall Senate Bill 357 pass.
27. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.
28. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
29. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that
30. question, the Ayes are 41, the Nays are None. None Voting
31. Present. Senate Bill 357 having received the constitutional
32. majority is declared passed.

9. functioning and the record will so indicate that she wishes to be
10. recorded in the affirmative on Senate Bill 357. All right.
11. Gentlemen, with leave of the Body, we have two matters of some
12. urgency on the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading. If you will turn
13. to page twenty-six on your Calendar, the middle of page twenty-

22. Senator Shapiro.

23. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

24. Well, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
25. House Bill 942 increases the bond authorization for correctional
26. facilities by 4.68 million dollars within the immediate
27. effective date. This has been cut from the original thirty-
28. five million, approximately thirty-five million as it came over
29. from the House and it was the considered opinion of the Senate
30. Appropriations Committee that we should provide only for the
31. planning monies because the projects could not really begin to
32. become...to start construction until October of this year. So,
33. it is for planning for capital projects for FY'80 in the correctional

1. field and I would appreciate a favorable roll call.
2. PRESIDENT:
3. Senator Carroll.
4. SENATOR CARROLL:
5. Thank you, Mr. President. This is not Senator Shapiro's
6. first bill that I know of and having been amended down to the amount
7. they can actually spend at this time, I think we should support
8. this emergency legislation.
9. PRESIDENT:
10. Any further discussion? If not, the Chair would point out
11. that under Article IX Section 9, subsection B, this will require
12. an extraordinary majority vote. The question is shall Senate...
13. House Bill 942 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those
14. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
15. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the
16. Ayes are 42, the Nays are none, 1 Voting Present. House Bill
17. 942 having received the required constitutional majority is declared
18. passed. On the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading, House Bill
19. 943. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
20. SECRETARY:
21. House Bill 943.
22. (Secretary reads title of bill)
23. 2nd reading...3rd reading of the bill.
24. PRESIDENT:
25. Senator Shapiro.
26. SENATOR SHAPIRO:
27. Well, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate,
28. House Bill 943 makes the appropriations from the Capital Development
29. Bond Fund and the General Revenue Fund for the various correctional
30. facilities for the planning monies. The bill carries, for the
31. Capital Development Bond Fund, 4.68 million and from
32. General Revenue Funds, five hundred and thirty thousand dollars
33. and I would appreciate a favorable roll call.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Is there any discussion? Senator Carroll.
3. SENATOR CARROLL:
4. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
5. As Senator Shapiro indicated, this bill, as amended, is now
6. only the planning monies and some immediate ones that they could
7. have gone ahead with. The reason we had to reduce it is that the
8. Capital Development Board has not even brought in the FY '79
9. programs for corrections to bid stage yet, so we're silly to go
10. with additional monies for '79 as the original request had been.
11. It has now been brought down to a level where it will be the
12. planning monies and they can proceed with construction in the
13. FY '80 budget and I would urge a favorable roll call.
14. PRESIDENT:
15. Any further discussion? If not, the question is shall House
16. Bill 943 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed
17. will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
18. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the
19. Ayes are 45, the Nays are none, 1 Voting Present. House Bill
20. 943 having received a constitutional majority is declared passed.
