12. Thank you, Mr. President, and members. This is the
13. Commercial Revenue Bond Act, and it amends the interest level.
14. Most of those are tied in at nine percent. We have started a
15. series of the following caps on revenue bonds,...that are now
16. saying nine or ten percent or whatever they say, we're adding then
17. ...or seventy percent of the prime commercial rate, in effect
18. at the time the bonds are adopted and authorized, the greater
19. of nine percent or seventy percent of the prime. It allows
20. a float in these trying times, so we don't have to come down
21. here every month and amend the measure. I move the adoption.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
23. The motion is to adopt. Is there discussion? All in favor
24. say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted.
25. Are there further Floor amendments?
26. SECRETARY:
27. No further amendments.
28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
29. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 1713, Senator Bloom. Read the bill,
30. Mr. Secretary, please.
31. SECRETARY:
32. Senate Bill 1713.
33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Are there amendments from the Floor?

4. SECRETARY:

5. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Bloom.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7. Senator Bloom is recognized.

8. SENATOR BLOOM:

9. Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment makes several
10. technical changes which clarify the distinction between
11. resident wholesale and retail fish dealer. It also reduces the
12. fish dealers' license which was the source of the problem and the
13. legislation, from fifty dollars down to the ten dollars. I'd
14. answer any questions, otherwise urge its adoption.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion? All
17. in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No.
18. 1 is adopted. Further Floor amendments?

19. SECRETARY:

20. No further amendments.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. 3rd reading. Senate Bill...for what purpose does Senator
23. Buzbee arise?

24. SENATOR BUZBEE:

25. Thank you, Mr. President. I just wanted to say that I'd
26. indicated to Senator Bloom in committee that I was going to have
27. an amendment...well I have the amendment, but the Department of
28. Conservation has convinced me that I should not put it on. So,
29. I don't intend to...attempt to.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

31. Senate Bill 1726, Senator...let's see. Senate Bill 1729,
32. Senator Berman. Senate Bill 1747, Senator...all right, Senate
33. Bill 1747, Senator Newhouse. There's a fiscal note that's been
filed, and should be complied with. 1764, Senator Nedza. Senator

1. Nedza, there's a request that those series of bills relating
2. to similar topics be held. Senate Bill 1774, Senator Savickas.
3. Senate Bill...Senate Bill 1800, Senator Buzbee. There's a...
4. there's a request for a fiscal note filed, Senator Buzbee.
5. All right, Gentlemen if I might have your attention. Several
6. of these bills, a multitude of bills, have had fiscal notes filed,
7. and we run into this problem every year, it is...it is filed
8. with the Secretary, but it would probably be appropriate that
9. you notify the sponsor and...and so that they can, in fact,
10. comply with the fiscal note. Senate Bill...for what purpose
11. does Senator Buzbee arise?

12. SENATOR BUZBEE:

13. Well, you know I don't mind a comply with a request for a
14. fiscal note, but I consider this a dilatory tactic because the
15. impact is going to be exactly what...the same as what we have
16. in the law now. It's already currently there.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Senator...Senator Mitchler has requested that a fiscal note
19. be attached.

20. SENATOR BUZBEE:

21. Well, Mr. President, what would be the status if I required
22. ...if I filed a request for a fiscal note on every bill on this
23. Calendar? Because...because it takes the time of the people of
24. the State of Illinois, so shouldn't we just go ahead and file
25. fiscal notes and...and I'll file one for every bill on the Calendar.
26. How's that?

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. Well, Senator that's...that would be your prerogative, but
29. the only things is, when you file those, Gentlemen you are to
30. notify the sponsor of the bill, and not just file it with the
31. Secretary of the Senate.

32. SENATOR BUZBEE:

33. Well, Mr. President, just let me go on record publicly right
now as saying that I intend to file such a request on every bill

1. on the Calendar.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Well, Senator, if you'll look at your bill, the form is
4. already available, and all you have to do is fill in the blank.
5. For what purpose does Senator Wooten arise?

6. SENATOR WOOTEN:

7. A...a point of order, along...where's Senator Buzbee? Mr.
8. President, would it not be sufficient, then, if he just went down
9. and signed a note saying no fiscal impact, and that would...that
10. would be a fiscal note?

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Well...

13. SENATOR WOOTEN:

14. Would that not do it?

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. Gentlemen, we get into the rulings of the Chair each time
17. on the Fiscal Note Act, and if the request is made, then it must
18. be complied with, and compliance will be within the domain generally
19. of the Chair, and whether or not a blanket statement that there
20. is no fiscal impact will comply with the Act, is...will have
21. to be decided on a case by case basis. Senator Wooten.

22. SENATOR WOOTEN:

23. Is it not true that there is no specificity to that requirement
24. that they simply ask for a fiscal note? It doesn't have to
25. come from anyone in particular? It can...there's no requirement
26. as to form, origin, anything of that sort. Is that correct?

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. That is correct, Senator. It just says that it shall be complied
29. with, and...and compliance is a term of art that will have to be
30. decided on a case by case basis, by the Chair.

31. SENATOR WOOTEN:

32. Well, it would seem to me then that Senator Buzbee is certainly
33. within his rights filing a note saying that this would have no
fiscal impact at all, and that would...if that is his contention,

1. and apparently is a strong one. I don't see why that will
2. not satisfy the requirement.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. ...this may come up. I alert the...the assemblage to Chapter
5. 63, Section 42-.32, which says,"the sponsor of each bill referred
6. to in this Section shall present a copy of the bill with his
7. request for a fiscal note to the board, commission, department,
8. agency, or other entity of the State which is to receive or expend
9. the appropriation proposed, or which is responsible for collection
10. of the revenue proposed to be increased or decreased or to be
11. levied or provided and here is where the operative language."
12. "The fiscal note shall be prepared by such board, commission,
13. department, agency, or other entity, and furnished to the sponsor
14. of the bill within five Calendar days thereafter." And...and
15. for those of you who are still interested, it goes on for another
16. probably sixty words or so in typical legalese, and...and which
17. we are encumbered to follow. Senator Buzbee, the form is down
18. here, someone has prepared it for you, it's a fill in the blank
19. form. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?

20. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

21. Well, yes, Mr. President. While we have a lull in the proceedings
22. here, I've been advised that our President is observing his forty-
23. third anniversary of his birth on this coming Sunday, and the
24. girls in the back have stated that there's some Democratic chili
25. and cake for everybody, if they want to partake.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Senator Donnewald, there's been several that...several of the
28. members want to know whether you're going to lead us in Happy Birthday
29. or not.

30. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

31. All right, I'll do it. Everybody join.

32. (Senator Donnewald lead Senate in Happy Birthday)

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

1. SENATOR ROCK:

2. Thank you all very much, I am truly grateful and I'm also
3. happy to advise you that I...I still have the chance of becoming
4. a judge.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. For what purpose does Senator Philip arise?

7. SENATOR PHILIP:

8. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
9. Senate. We also have another birthday boy today, Senator Nimrod's...
10. I'm just trying to think of what his...what he's...let's see he's
11. fifty-eight today, if I remember correctly. So...am I close John?
12. Fifty-eight. So, we are also celebrating that, and we ought to
13. have a...lead by...by Senator Geo-Karis. Maybe we could sing
14. a round of Happy Birthday.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. Senator Geo-Karis.

17. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

18. (Senator Geo-Karis leads Senate in Happy Birthday)

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. And...and there is cake and chili in the President's Office
21. for everyone. Senator Regner.

22. SENATOR REGNER:

23. Yes, Mr. President, and members. I was just wondering if
24. I could ask Senator Rock a question. He said something about
25. being a judge, was that with or without retention.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Senator Johns.

28. SENATOR JOHNS:

29. Mr. President. Isn't May the 3rd, 4th, 5th, under the sign
30. of Taurus the Bull. It is indeed, Mr. President, 'cause my wife is
31. the 3rd and I know of what I speak.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. All right, Senate Bill 18...for what purpose does Senator
Mitchler arise?

1. SENATOR MITCHLER:

2. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. I rise on a
3. point of personal privilege. In the gallery immediately
4. behind me, a group of students from the Illinois School for
5. the Deaf, in Jacksonville, and two of the constituents from
6. my district, in Batavia, and Montgomery, are included among
7. that group of students. I wonder if that group of students
8. would please rise and be acknowledged by the Senate. Please
9. stand so that they can observe...

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. Would our guests in the gallery please rise and be recognized.
12. Senate Bill 1813, Senator Nimrod. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
13. There's one committee amendment.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Senate Bill 1813.

16. (Secretary reads title of bill)

17. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture, Conservation,
18. and Energy offers one amendment.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. Senator Nimrod.

21. SENATOR NIMROD:

22. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
23. Senate. The amendment is a clarifying amendment, so that it
24. will not be misinterpreted, and I would ask for the adoption
25. of the amendment.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion? All
28. in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee
29. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

30. SECRETARY:

31. No further committee amendments.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. Are there amendments from the Floor?

1. SECRETARY:

2. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Gitz.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Senator Gitz, on Amendment No. 2. Senator Gitz.

5. SENATOR GITZ:

6. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. Amendment No. 2
7. is added to this bill in the same Section of rate making to
8. clarify for the Commerce Commission a practice which basically
9. is taking place today. This amendment is on advertising, and it
10. has been distributed to the membership. I would urge you to
11. note that this amendment takes due note of the fact that there
12. are legitimate advertising purposes, it confers upon the Commerce
13. Commission statutory authority to verify, oftentimes what they
14. do today. It has one additional feature, which I think is
15. quite important. It would allow as part of the rate making
16. process, certain kinds of public interest advertising. Specifically,
17. in the area of energy conservation. I think that this is a
18. worthy amendment. I think that it is carefully drawn, and it
19. would resolve some of the problems and conflicts that the Commerce
20. Commission Chairman last year in the Agriculture, Energy, and
21. Conservation Committee indicated when they had their own bill
22. in, which in part dealt with this. I'm referring to a bill that
23. was originally offered by Senator Bloom.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Is there discussion? Senator Nimrod.

26. SENATOR NIMROD:

27. Mr. President, I have just had a chance now to look this
28. amendment. I had not seen it before and I don't take any issue
29. with what is attempting to be done. I think that, however, that
30. it ought to be done in a separate bill, because it certainly is
31. independent of what the intent of Senate Bill 1813 is. Senate Bill
32. 1813 is intended to promote the use of Illinois coal, and all it
33. does, is it urges the Commerce Commission itself to take into
consideration those considerations on emission control equipment

1. that they, in fact, are adding, they ought to include into the
2. cost. I think to add this particular amendment would introduce
3. a whole new factor and in effect the very cause of what we are trying
4. to do, and that is promote the use of Illinois coal. So, I would
5. certainly have to at this time, take opposition to this amendment
6. and say it ought to be done at a separate time, with a separate
7. bill. I'm sorry that the sponsor didn't discuss this with me
8. ahead of time, I would have conveyed that to him, but I just think
9. that it's...it does not help the bill in any way. It takes away from
10. what the intent and the purpose of the bill is.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Senator Buzbee.

13. SENATOR BUZBEE:

14. Thank you, Mr. President. I concur with Senator Nimrod. I
15. see nothing wrong with the concept of the amendment. I would
16. probably vote for such a piece of legislation if it were in a
17. separate bill, but it's two entirely different topics. This is
18. Senator Nimrod's bill, is a bill which is aimed at promoting the
19. use of Illinois coal by...by Illinois utilities, and to get that
20. all confused with a separate consumerism type issue of public
21. utilities ability to advertise or not advertise, would just simply
22. muddy up the issue, and we think we're going to have trouble
23. enough as it is, with promoting the legislation we need without
24. getting it all muddled like that and so I would...I would also
25. resist the amendment.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Senator Weaver. Senator McMillan.

28. SENATOR MCMILLAN:

29. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. I would concur
30. with Senator Nimrod and Senator Buzbee. This is an idea that the
31. Agriculture, Conservation, and Energy Committee has wrestled with
32. for quite some time, but, in fact, it was not even brought to the
33. Argiculture, Conservation, and Energy Committee this year. It's
something that we ought to have a chance to look at. It's certainly...

1. it does not fall into the category of emergency things which
2. we ought to consider this year. The bill that was drawn, and
3. introduced by Senator Nimrod has a specific purpose. We did
4. hear the arguments related to that, and they did come out of the
5. committee unanimously. I think it would be unwise to mar this
6. piece of legislation with what is really an additional issue,
7. and I would urge a negative vote on this amendment.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. Further discussion? Senator Gitz may close.

10. SENATOR GITZ:

11. Well, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. This issue
12. did come before the Agriculture, Energy, and Conservation Committee
13. and it was tied in committee, and it seems kind of peculiar
14. that every time there is any kind of legislation there, that
15. is trying to protect the consumers' interest a little bit, that
16. legislation meets with a rather painful death, immediately. Now,
17. there are a lot of issues to be discussed in construction rates
18. and progress in that allowance, but if we're going to do this
19. for pollution control equipment, and if we're going to allow
20. all these guidelines for pollution control equipment, and I think that
21. that's a legitimate cause, then we ought to be able to put
22. in the statutory authority which would also make some sense
23. in terms of advertising. I'm sure that there are very few
24. people in this Body who have not turned on the television set
25. and seen a nice television spot by Commonwealth Edison. Now,
26. I don't begrudge them that, but if they want to advertise on
27. that basis, not relating to energy conservation, then they
28. ought to do that at the shareholders' expense and not the rate
29. payer. Now, I find it kind of ironic that we are amending the
30. very section on the rate making procedures. This is not a different
31. section within the Commerce Commission Act, it's the very same
32. section, and you know, and I know what's going to happen if this
33. amendment is defeated, than you'll go back and pat yourselves on
the back, the bill will go through, we'll do something for coal

1. allegedly, for the pollution control devices, we still won't
2. have statutory authority there to deal with advertising when
3. it's challenged. It's the identical section, it's a smoke
4. screen. I think this amendment is a worthy amendment, it should
5. be added, because I think it's important we also do something
6. for the rate payer, the consumer. You know, Commonwealth Edison
7. got an eighteen percent rate hike in Northern Illinois to finance
8. nuclear facilities, which..are probably going to have when they're
9. finished, fifty percent excess capacity. They advertise at the
10. same time that they don't have enough money then, and they're
11. back in for another increase. Well, let's look at how some
12. of that money is spent, and let's make sure that we have some
13. reasonable guidelines. This is not barndoor legislation, that
14. opens the vat, it's very carefully drawn, they have the latitude
15. to set reasonable guidelines. I can't think of a more reasonable
16. way to approach this than the way this has been drawn. I urge
17. an Aye vote.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. The motion is to adopt. All in favor say Aye. Opposed...
20. there's been a request for a roll call. Those in favor will
21. vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.
22. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the
23. record. On that question, the Ayes are 18, the Nays are 30.
24. 1 Voting Present. The amendment is lost. Further Floor amend-
25. ments?

26. SECRETARY:
