30. to increase it? There seems to be more of a move to get rid of  
31. it and I think we're moving in the exact opposite direction.  
32. That's what I'm trying to say, where's the impetus to make  
33. this commission that's already a pain to make it even bigger

1. so it can be more of a pain?

5. I'm not familiar with the commission, Senator, I...am

6. not a member of it. I was asked to hold this bill on 2nd

7. reading. Perhaps Senator Shapiro could...could respond to

30. favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it,  
31. the amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

7. SENATOR MITCHLER:

8. Mr. President and members of the committee. Floor Amendment  
9. No. 2, that I'm offering, was discussed briefly in the Senate  
10. Agriculture Conservation and Energy Committee when the bill  
11. was heard and this would be a new training program that is  
12. currently receiving a large amount of Federal funding. And before  
13. the State would obligate itself to the continuation and the  
14. funding of this program, the Floor Amendment 2 that I offer  
15. would amend Senate Bill 1887 on page 2 by deleting line 6 and  
16. inserting in lieu thereof the following; Section 5, the obligation  
17. to provide funding under this Act shall continue only as long  
18. as and to the extent that Federal funds are available for such  
19. funding. Section 6 of the Act would take effect July 1, 1980.  
20. That's to protect that we don't get ourselves into a...an  
21. obligatory funding program for a program that is currently  
22. receiving Federal dollars. I move for adoption of Floor Amend-  
23. ment No. 2.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Mitchler has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2  
26. to Senate Bill 1887. Is there any discussion? Senator Bruce.

27. SENATOR BRUCE:

28. Well, it would have been handy if he would have spoken  
29. to me about this. We tried to clarify his problems of understanding  
30. on Federal funds on this in the committee and I guess we were not  
31. successful. This program is presently in effect in many other  
32. states. There's a possibility of getting funding from the Federal  
33. Government, but at the present time this program would be

1. nonfederally funded and I see no reason to restrict it. We have  
2. the approval of almost all the industry involved in the coal  
3. industry, the mining companies and with the coal miners. I  
4. see no reason that we should put a hamper on this. If there's  
5. a problem, I have no problem with saying that we're going to  
6. expend Federal money for the program, but to say that the only  
7. money we're going to spend is Federal, I think we'll never  
8. attract the Federal money necessary to start this program as  
9. they already have spent some forty million dollars throughout  
10. the United States...four million dollars throughout the United  
11. States, much of it in West Virginia and in Kentucky, competing  
12. states to Illinois coal.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. All right. Senator Mitchler...Senator McMillan.

15. SENATOR McMILLAN:

16. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment  
17. probably improves the bill, but it certainly does not get at what  
18. should be the major objection to this legislation on the part  
19. of a lot of the members of the...of the Senate. This sounds  
20. like a fairly innocuous bill, but...but there are several  
21. problems with it. Anytime we do something and say that it won't  
22. cost any money and the Federal Government is going to pay for  
23. it, we know damn good and well the Federal Government will pull  
24. out the funds, then we'll have every coal miner in the State  
25. here telling us that we've got to come up with State funds in  
26. order to get the program back into effect. The second objection  
27. is, this is a substantial, costly, significant new program in  
28. Higher Education in Illinois. The advocates of this program  
29. did not even take it to the Community College Board for approval,  
30. they've totally ignored the Board of Higher Education to which  
31. we usually go for any kind of a new program in Illinois. There  
32. are several other Community College Districts in the State that  
33. have coal mines in their area or coal mining interests in their

1. area that have objection to this program. It has not been given  
2. the kind of consideration that it should. It's trying to do an  
3. end run around the normal procedure for getting a program...like  
4. this given consideration. It's another one of those gimmicks  
5. that it's all Federal money and no problem, but, in fact, it'll  
6. come back to haunt us when we have to make up the money on the  
7. State level. I oppose this amendment, it makes a bad bill better  
8. but it's still bad and I believe now is the time to stop it  
9. in its tracks.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Any further dicussion? Senator Mitchler, you wish to close?

12. SENATOR MITCHLER:

13. Mr. President and members of the Senate, just briefly.  
14. The intent of this amendment was the last sentence that Senator  
15. McMillan spoke and that is that it does make a bad bill just  
16. a little bit better. Without this amendment, certainly if the  
17. bill would get to 3rd reading, I would hope that it'll have no  
18. possibility of even being considered favorably, but with this  
19. amendment it protects the State from obligating itself into a  
20. large funding program for a new program that has not been accepted  
21. by the administration, by the Junior College Board or just about  
22. anybody. So this amendment would be a protection and without  
23. this amendment the...the bill just absolutely would go down  
24. in defeat. So this is a protective amendment, I would ask for  
25. a favorable roll call on Floor Amendment No. 2.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. All right. Senator Mitchler has moved the adoption of  
28. Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1887. Those in favor signify  
29. by saying Aye. Those opposed. In the opinion of the Chair
