17. The Adjournment Resolution.

19. Senate...Senate Joint Resolution 100.
20. (Secretary reads resolution)
21. PRESIDENT:
22. Senator Bruce.
23. SENATOR BRUCE:
24. Yes, this is the Adjournment Resolution which will adjourn
25. us today to bring us back on Tuesday at noon. I would move for
26. the suspension of the rules and the immediate consideration and
27. adoption of...of Senate Joint Resolution 100.
28. PRESIDENT:
29. You've heard the motion, all in favor signify by saying Aye.
30. All opposed. The Ayes have it, the rules are suspended. Senator
31. Bruce now moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 100.
32. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have
33. it, the resolution is adopted.

2. Senate Joint Resolution 100 offered by Senators Regner...

3. PRESIDENT:
4. 101.

5. SECRETARY:
6. 101, I'm sorry, Regner, Carroll and Sommer.

7. PRESIDENT:
8. Executive. All right, while we're on the Order of Resolutions,
9. we will...the Resolutions Consent Calendar has been distributed.
10. Have any objections been filed, Mr. Secretary?

11. SECRETARY:
12. No objections have been filed, Mr. President.

13. PRESIDENT:
14. All right. If I can direct your attention to the Resolutions
15. Consent Calendar, there's Senate Resolution 476, 477, 478, 479,
16. 480, 481, 482, 483, 484, 485, 486, 487, 488. Senate Joint Resolution
17. 99 and House Joint Resolution 99. Is there any discussion? If
18. not, Senator Bruce moves that the rules be suspended for the
19. immediate consideration and adoption of these resolutions. All in
20. favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it, the
21. resolutions are...rules are suspended. Senator Bruce now moves
22. the adoption of the foregoing resolutions as read. Any discussion?
23. If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes
24. have it. Those resolutions are adopted. Further resolutions?

25. SECRETARY:
26. Senate Resolution 490 offered by Senators Grotberg, Rock and
27. Moore.

28. PRESIDENT:
29. Senator Grotberg.

30. SENATOR GROTBORG:
31. Yes, Mr. President, members. I would move the suspension of
32. the appropriate rules so that we also may entertain...this is an Agreed
33. Resolution. Because of the timeliness of it yesterday, the gentleman

1. from Taiwan was here. It simply urges Illinois to be delighted
2. to sell more merchandise to the Taiwanese as long as they are
3. trying to buy from us and also urges the...the President of the
4. United States to keep up our good relationship with Taiwan. I would
5. move then, Mr. President, that we do suspend the appropriate rule
6. and put this on the Agreed List.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Well, the Agreed List has just been adopted. Why don't we
9. just move to suspend and adopt it.

10. SENATOR GROTBORG:

11. ...And adopt it.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Yeah. All right. Senator Grothberg has moved to suspend
14. the appropriate rules for the immediate consideration of Senate
15. Joint...Senate Resolution 490. Is there any discussion? If not,
16. all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have
17. it. The rules are suspended. Senator Grothberg now moves the
18. adoption of Senate Resolution 490. Any discussion? If not, all
19. in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it,
20. the resolution is adopted. Senator Rhoads, for what purpose do
21. you arise?

22. SENATOR RHOADS:

23. Yes, I also have a resolution on the Secretary's Desk.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. All right. Senator Rhoads has asked leave to go to the
26. Order of Secretary's Desk, Resolutions. Is leave granted?
27. Leave is granted.

28. SENATOR RHOADS:

29. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Mr.
30. Secretary, do you have the number of the resolution?

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senate Resolution 489, is that the one?

33. SENATOR RHOADS:

1. 489, right. This is a resolution which Senator Berman and
2. I am cosponsoring. It arose out of discussions we had in the
3. Appropriations II Committee concerning the level of funding by
4. the Federal Government of Public Law 94-142. This simply resolves
5. that our State Senate requests that Congress fully fund to the
6. authorized levels of Public Law 94-142. This obviously has been
7. a problem for the last two years especially and has created
8. distortions in our State budgeting process and we're asking
9. that Congress fund up to the levels that were recommended in
10. their own authorizations.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. All right. Senator Rhoads has moved the adoption of Senate
13. Resolution 489. Is there any discussion? Senator Bruce.

14. SENATOR BRUCE:

15. Well, the only thing I would suggest is that it may need
16. an amendment, since it does not tell anyone what to do with
17. the resolution. Although it may just be as well we pass it
18. and not tell anybody what to do with it, but it is...right...
19. Senator Carroll suggests what we could do with it, but it
20. doesn't say we're supposed to send it to Congress or do anything
21. with it, so once we pass it, it just stays in this Body.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Rhoads.

24. SENATOR RHOADS:

25. Well, I understand the usual verbiage about sending a...a
26. copy to Congress, we intend to do that, Senator.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Rhoads indicates that he...he intends to send it
29. to his personal Congressman. Further discussion? All right.
30. Senator Rhoads has moved the adoption of Senate Resolution 489.
31. If there's no further discussion, all in favor signify by saying
32. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.
33. Senator Johns, for what purpose do you arise?

1. SENATOR JOHNS:

2. Just got back on the Floor, Mr. President. Would it
3. be all right for me to try Senate Joint Resolution 95? It's
4. not a...an expensive bill at all, it has no money involved
5. except to study.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. All right. On the same order of business, we have just
8. afforded leave of the Body to go to the Order of Secretary's
9. Desk, Resolutions. On that same order is Senate Joint Resolution
10. 95, Senator Johns.

11. SENATOR JOHNS:

12. Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate Joint
13. Resolution 95 simply requests the Capital Development Board
14. to conduct a feasibility study for the use of the Veteran's
15. Building, that's Building No. 33 at the Anna Mental Health
16. Center as a facility to be used by Veteran's Organization.
17. It's an empty building, it's in good shape, it was built many,
18. many years ago and it would be of tremendous value to the
19. veterans of four state area and especially of southern Illinois,
20. if we could just simply give them some place to call their own. And
21. I would appreciate a favorable vote on this request.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. All right. Senator Johns has moved the adoption of Senate
24. Joint Resolution 95. Is there any discussion? If not, all in
25. favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it.
26. Senate Joint Resolution 95 is adopted. Senator Moore, for what
27. purpose do you arise?

28. SENATOR MOORE:

29. Thank you, Mr. President. On House Bill 3057...

30. PRESIDENT:

31. ...well, I...I intend to recognize you. Any...any other
32. member have anything on the Secretary's Desk of great urgency?
33. Senator Mitchler.

1. SENATOR MITCHLER:

2. Mr. President, could we clear off Senate Resolution 398?

3. There's no...should be no objection to that. It's a...

4. PRESIDENT:

5. All right. On the Order of Secretary's Desk, Resolutions,
6. is Senate Resolution 398. Senator Mitchler.

7. SENATOR MITCHLER:

8. Senate Resolution 398 has been approved by the Executive
9. Committee. It expresses appreciation to the former Canadian
10. Prime Minister, Joe Clark and the Canadian people for assisting
11. in the six U. S. Embassy staff members in Tehran to escape
12. from Iran and their...hospitality. The resolution will be
13. forwarded to them. I would move for adoption of the resolution.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. All right. Senator Mitchler has moved the adoption of
16. Senate Resolution 398. Is there any discussion? If not, all
17. in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have
18. it. The resolution is adopted. Any other member have
19. any business on Secretary's Desk, Resolution? Yes, Senator
20. Nimrod.

21. SENATOR NIMROD:

22. Yes, Mr. President, on House...Joint Resolution...on
23. House Joint Resolution 81, I spoke with Senator Savickas and
24. I'd like to be a cosponsor of that resolution. Seek leave to...

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Oh, Senator Nimrod seeks leave of the Body to be a cosponsor
27. of House Joint Resolution 81. Is that correct? 81. Is leave
28. granted? Leave is granted. All right. Senator Moore.

29. SENATOR MOORE:

30. Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 3057 has been read
31. a first time, I am shown as the chief sponsor, I would like
32. leave of the Body to substitute Senator Schaffer as the
33. chief sponsor of House Bill 3057.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Oh, all right. Senator Moore has...or has asked leave of
3. the Body to have Senator Schaffer shown as the chief sponsor
4. of House Bill 3056...7, all right. Heard the request. Is leave
5. granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. Senator Moore, for
6. what purpose do you arise?

7. SENATOR MOORE:

8. Thank you, Mr. President. There is...an emergency exists
9. in House Bill 3056. It has been reported back by the Appropriations
10. Committee. I would like at this time to go to that order of
11. business and to have that bill read a 2nd time. I believe there
12. is a committee amendment that would...Senator Buzbee, is there
13. a committee amendment on that?

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Buzbee.

16. SENATOR BUZBEE:

17. Yes, Mr. President. Is this the proper time to explain
18. the amendment?

19. PRESIDENT:

20. There is no amendment attached, thereto. All right, let's
21. just hold this until you guys get together here, okay. Senator
22. Wooten, for what purpose do you arise?

23. SENATOR WOOTEN:

24. Mr. President, I'd like leave of the Body to go to the
25. Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading for the purpose of recalling
26. Senate Bill 1893. We placed an amendment on it yesterday in
27. which there was a line transposed. I'd like to amend that.
28. I've talked to Senator Shapiro and Senator Rhoads, the copies
29. have been circulated and I'd like to get that out of the way
30. so we don't delay the bill.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. All right. Senator Wooten has asked leave of the Body
33. to go to the Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading for the purpose

1. of calling it back to 2nd for the purpose of a technical amend-
2. ment change. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the
3. Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading. On the Order of Senate Bills
4. 3rd reading is Senate Bill 1893. Senator Wooten seeks leave
5. of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd reading
6. for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is
7. granted. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd reading, Senate
8. Bill 1893. Mr. Secretary.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Wooten.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Now...you have to Table the other one or is this going...

13. SENATOR WOOTEN:

14. No.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. All right. All right. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd
17. reading, Senate Bill 1893, Amendment No. 3. Senator Wooten.

18. SENATOR WOOTEN:

19. Thank you, Mr. President. A clause in Senator Rhoads'
20. amendment was placed on page 4, line 33, should have been
21. placed on page 5, line 5 and on page 8, line 7. And that's
22. what the amendment does, just puts the clause in the proper
23. place. I move the adoption of the amendment.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Wooten has moved the adoption of Amendment No.3.
26. All right. Senator Wooten has moved the adoption of Amendment
27. No. 3 to House Bill 1893. Is there any discussion? If not,
28. all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes
29. have it, the amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

30. SECRETARY:

31. No further amendments.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. 3rd reading. All right. Senator Moore has sought leave

1. of the Body to go to the Order of House Bills 2nd reading
2. for the purpose of reading House Bill 3056. Is leave granted?
3. Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills, 2nd reading,
4. House Bill 3056. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
5. SECRETARY:
6. House Bill 3056.
7. (Secretary reads title of bill)
8. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations II
9. offers one amendment.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Senator Carroll.
12. SENATOR CARROLL:
13. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
14. Senate. On behalf of Senator Buzbee, this one eliminates the
15. appropriation of Federal funds that had already been spent.
16. They had not asked us for it before they spent it, now they're
17. coming in the back door with the referendum. And I would move
18. adoption of Amendment No. 1.
19. PRESIDENT:
20. Senator Buzbee. Do you wish to amplify on that?
21. SENATOR BUZBEE:
22. I just...concur.
23. PRESIDENT:
24. All right. Senator Buzbee has moved the adoption of
25. Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 3056. Is there any
26. discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All
27. opposed. The Ayes have it, the amendment is adopted. Further
28. amendments?
29. SECRETARY:
30. No further committee amendments.
31. PRESIDENT:
32. 3rd reading. Amendments from the Floor? I'm sorry.
33. SECRETARY:

1. No Floor amendments.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. All right. 3rd reading. With leave of the Body, we'll
4. move to the Order of Senate Bills 2nd reading. Any members
5. have a bill of an emergency nature or have an amendment which
6. should be noncontested, we can probably get to that order.
7. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd reading, in the middle of
8. page 4, is Senate Bill 1647. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Senate Bill 1647.

11. (Secretary reads title of bill)

12. 2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Appropriations II
13. offers three amendments.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Buzbee.

16. SENATOR BUZBEE:

17. Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 adds three
18. hundred thousand dollars payable from the General Revenue
19. ...Fund for expenses resulting from the March 9th, 1980 fire
20. at 535 West Jefferson Street in Springfield. And I would
21. move its adoption.

22. PRESIDENT:
