7. or something. Nothing is really ever dead, am I right?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

9. Senator, 30 votes could do anything in this Chamber.
10. Except the appealed ruling of the Chair. Is there further
11. discussion? If not, Senator Rock moves that...Senator
12. Rock's motion is to recommit all bills on 2nd, 3rd and
13. Consideration Postponed. All Senate Bills back to the committees
14. to which they originated. On that question, those in favor vote
15. Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all
16. voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.
17. On that question the Ayes are 43, the Nays are none, 3 Voting
18. Present. The motion carries. For what purpose does Senator

10. Netsch. The committee report, the committee met this morning,
11. which was the first opportunity we really had had to meet
12. since the hearing on the Executive Order some time ago. And
13. several things have happened since then. The principle thing
14. is that House Bill 1400, which was intended to be the bill
15. implementing and also making some modifications in the Governor's
16. Executive Order No. 3 was not called for a vote on Friday night
17. in the House. And so is, I guess, in the same status as the
18. bills which we just recommitted to committee here in the Senate.
19. That came as something of a surprise to all of us because many
20. people thought that that had reflected a number of the agreements
21. and accommodations that had been made with respect to the
22. Executive Order. The committee meeting this morning was fairly
23. brief, but there...the motion that Executive Order No. 3 not
24. be approved or be disapproved, prevailed by a vote of 6 to 5.
25. I was not on the prevailing side of that vote and so someone
26. else should make the case for supporting the motion. At which
27. point I would be willing to make a very brief case against the
28. motion.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

30. Is there further discussion? Senator Buzbee.

31. SENATOR BUZBEE:

32. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Netsch indicated she
33. was the...in opposition to the final action of the committee.

1. It was my motion that put us in this posture of saying that
2. we do not approve of this Executive Order. The position
3. we're in today is, if we take no action by the end of today,
4. the Governor's Executive Order No. 3 of 1979 becomes effective
5. with the new...new department being...being promulgated and
6. started as of 1, October, I understand. So we are in a position...

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

8. Excuse me Senator. For what purpose does Senator Graham
9. arise?

10. SENATOR GRAHAM:

11. Would it be expecting too much for us to try to get a
12. little order.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

14. Senator Graham, your point is well taken. Could we
15. have a little order. This is a very important discussion.
16. Deals with the reorganization of State government and Senator
17. Buzbee deserves your attention. Senator Buzbee.

18. SENATOR BUZBEE:

19. Thank you, I don't know if I deserve your attention or
20. not, but Senator Graham I think if you'll look around, most
21. of the talkers are the Governor's people that are on the Floor
22. lobbying for the Executive Order. So that's...that's where
23. part of our problem is coming. It was the feeling of at least
24. six of us this morning in the committee that we ought to take
25. the position of saying No to the Governor's Executive Order.
26. At the moment there is no pending implementing legislation.
27. Discussions with Representative Kane in the House who heads
28. the Executive Committee, the Executive Reorganization Committee
29. there, indicated that he might make an...he would make an
30. effort, rather to try to get a committee bill out dealing
31. with this...this particular question of reorganization. But
32. our feeling was that until they get such a bill and we can,
33. as the Chair stated earlier today, with 30 votes you can do

1. just about anything you want in this Chamber. So we could put
2. a bill out of our own if we wanted. But there were six of us this...
3. this morning that felt that we ought to go ahead and kill the
4. Governor's Executive Order as of today and then start working
5. on a package of reorganization of this Department of Business
6. and Economic Development and take it from there. So we would ask that
7. you would support our position of...killing the Governor's
8. Executive Order as of today.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

10. Is there further discussion? Senator Graham.

11. SENATOR GRAHAM:

12. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I...will you guys
13. get with the program for...maybe I can have some effect. I have
14. my feelings about Executive Orders, contrary to the Chairman
15. of our Committee on Reorganization. The Governor's people
16. and we, those of us, who are interested in doing something to
17. preserve some of the monies, taxpayer's monies of the State
18. of Illinois, feel a good comprehensive reorganization that
19. is workable and livable, we could support. We have a feeling
20. also, that it wasn't the fault of this Body that we don't have
21. House Bill 1400. This is purely the responsibility of the
22. Speaker of the House who showed absolute intemperance with
23. regard to the feeling of the General Assembly when he kept
24. moving this bill down on the call the other day and didn't
25. call it. We have always, I have always felt that...that
26. an Executive Order without accompanying legislation was
27. undesirable. This order will become, in effect, really, October
28. the 1st and we have done this before, we've passed these Executive
29. Orders and have followed up with a comprehensive statutory
30. provision to...implement the bill. That's the posture we are
31. in now, should be in now. The Governor's Office has given
32. us a commitment with regard to the amendment that was placed
33. on 1400 over in the House last week, to the extent that if we

1. find implementing legislation, and the House could, if they
2. get on the ball over there, could pass that bill anyway because
3. it is exempt by their rules. We can provide the necessary
4. statutory provisions to implement the Governor's Executive
5. Order. I don't like Executive Orders, but I do like statutory
6. provisions and I think we ought to be given the opportunity
7. to do that. I think just arbitrarily kill the Governor's
8. Executive Order might be a step in the wrong direction and I
9. rise in opposition to the motion and the feelings explained
10. by Senator Buzbee.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

12. Senator Shapiro.

13. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

14. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
15. I just want to reiterate what Senator Graham has said. I think
16. that this recommendation of the committee should be rejected,
17. then the force of the Executive Order will go into effect
18. because of my understanding that this is the sixtieth day.
19. Now for those of you who are apprehensive about their not being
20. implementing legislation, let me say to you that every other
21. Executive Reorganization Order that has come before us was
22. implemented by this Body before the implementing legislation
23. in the form of a bill was passed. We have assurances from
24. the Governor's Office that they will support the implementing
25. legislation in another bill whatever that bill may be. So I
26. am wholeheartedly and agree with what Senator Graham has said,
27. that the recommendation of the committee to disapprove the
28. Executive Order be rejected, which will require a No vote.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

30. Senator Rock.

31. SENATOR ROCK:

32. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
33. Senate. As you know, under Article V, Section 11, if the

1. Chief Executive delivers to this Body prior to April 1, an
2. Executive Reorganization Message, 60 Calendar days later
3. it will become effective unless this Body, by a majority of
4. those elected, votes to disapprove. I understand that's the
5. way the motion will be placed pursuant to the committee recommen-
6. dation. And those of us who wish to disapprove, will in fact,
7. vote Aye. I would suggest to the membership that a commitment
8. from the second floor is nice, except we don't know what he's
9. committed to or what his staff is committed to. I understand
10. that House Bill 1400 which underwent some lengthy committee
11. hearings was twice amended, at least twice amended on the Floor
12. of the House and it never, in fact, was called for final passage. So,
13. there seems to be some disagreement as to what should be embodied
14. in this reorganization. And how we can stand here and say we
15. will allow, there is a commitment to do this or that, I'm just
16. not sure we're able to do that. We certainly can't commit
17. to what the House is about. It just seems to me that as a
18. matter of legislative prerogative, if we are going to keep a
19. handle on this Executive Reorganization, we could very well
20. disapprove this today and ask our committee of the Senate,
21. Senators Netsch and Graham, to work on and bring a bill out
22. of the Executive Reorganization Committee, which will adequately
23. reflect both what the Governor wants and what the Legislative
24. Branch wants. So I would urge a...an Aye vote on the Motion
25. to Disapprove.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

27. Senator Netsch.

28. SENATOR NETSCH:

29. Thank you, Mr. President. First of all, I think, so that
30. we are in good parliamentary form, I should make the motion that
31. reflects the will of the committee, even though I didn't vote
32. on the prevailing side. So I would at this time, move that
33. the Senate disapprove Executive Order No. 3 and then I would

1. like the opportunity to speak against the motion I just made.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

3. Is there further discussion? If not, Senator Netsch may
4. speak against her motion.

5. SENATOR NETSCH:

6. I...I don't think the...the world will rise or set or the
7. sun will rise and set on what we do here today with respect
8. to this, but I would like to just make a brief point about
9. why I decided the Executive Order should be approved and
10. not disapproved. First of all, basically it is a good idea.
11. That is I think the reorganization that it reflects is
12. structurally sound and makes a good deal of sense. Obviously
13. a number of people have objections to some part of it, and
14. indeed House Bill 1400 did reflect a compromise of those
15. differing points of view. The bill which has subsequently
16. failed to be called in the House. I think the real difficulty
17. is that if the Executive Order is not approved, in effect, there
18. will be no real incentive to go ahead with this particular
19. reorganization. I think we will just simply lose the momentum
20. and probably flounder around and maybe something will happen
21. and maybe it won't, but it's not too likely. On the other hand,
22. if the Executive Order becomes fact, because there are points
23. in it that need to be revised and reviewed, there will be a
24. very strong incentive for us to continue to work out the
25. implementing legislation. And for that reason and also because
26. I do think that it reflects basically a sound idea, I think
27. that we would be in a better posture if we were to allow the
28. Executive Order to become effective at the end of today and
29. then take the opportunity either through a House Bill, excuse
30. me, and the House Rules do permit an exception to their deadline
31. for a bill implementing an executive reorganization order, or
32. perhaps by way of amendment here in this Body to carry out
33. the implementation. That is the reason why I took a position

1. in opposition to disapproval of the Executive Order.
2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)
3. There's no further discussion...Senator Buzbee.
4. SENATOR BUZBEE:
5. Parliamentary inquiry, Mr. President.
6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)
7. State your inquiry.
8. SENATOR BUZBEE:
9. How many votes will...will it be...take to be on the prevailing
10. side of this motion?
11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)
12. Under Article V, Section 11 of the Constitution, 30 votes
13. are necessary.
14. SENATOR BUZBEE:
15. To...to disapprove.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)
17. Yes.
18. SENATOR BUZBEE:
19. Then...then...may, let me follow that up one step further.
20. Let's assume that it does not get 30 votes, what posture are we
21. in at that point?
22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)
23. Senator Rock.
24. SENATOR ROCK:
25. Well, as I understand it, we're reading the same section.
26. If, in fact, a majority of the members elected, as the Constitu-
27. tion reads, if 30...if 30 members do not vote to disapprove,
28. then the next sentence says, an Executive Order not so disapproved,
29. shall become effective by its terms, not less than 60 calendar
30. days after its delivery. So the motion will be to disapprove,
31. if it does not receive 30 affirmative votes; the motion fails
32. and we go on to the next order of business.
33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

1. Is there any further discussion? If not, all those in
2. favor of disapproving Executive Order No. 3 will vote Aye.
3. Those in favor of approving Executive Order No. 3 vote Nay.
4. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
5. who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 26,
6. the Nays are 28, none Voting Present. The motion fails.
7. Any further committee reports?

8. SECRETARY:

9. No further committee reports.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

11. Senator Rock.

12. SENATOR ROCK:

13. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
14. Senate. We have been through, I think, House Bills 1st, 2nd
15. and have effectively cleared the Calendar of Senate Bills
16. and have handled the Executive Order. If there's no further
17. business or no further announcements, I would afford everyone
18. an opportunity to have a bite of lunch before we go to committee
19. at 2:00 and move that we stand adjourned until Wednesday, at
20. the hour of noon.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

22. Senator Maragos.

23. SENATOR MARAGOS:

24. The Labor and Commerce Committee will meet at 2:15, if no one
25. is there, we'll adjourn and cancel the meeting, but I'd like
26. to have in case all the...members of the committee to come
27. up in the event there are witnesses and we'll be out by
28. 2:30, a quarter to 3:00 because I want to go out and play golf
29. too.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

31. Senator...Senator Merlo.

32. SENATOR MERLO:

33. The Pension Committee will meet...will meet tomorrow

1. morning at 9:00 o'clock, Room 400. It's on...it's listed on
2. the Calendar, unfortunately it isn't indented so you might have
3. missed it so we are meeting tomorrow morning at 9:00 o'clock.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

5. Senator Philip.

6. SENATOR PHILIP:

7. Thank...thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of
8. the Senate. Remind the softball playing members, we have
9. practice tomorrow night, 6:00 o'clock, Lincoln Park, diamond
10. no. 4.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

12. Senator Vadalabene.

13. SENATOR VADALABENE:

14. Yes, if the...if the members on a Committee of Executive
15. and Appointments would go down to 212 within the next five
16. or ten minutes, we'll try to expedite it and get it out of
17. there so then you can eat your lunch and enjoy it and you
18. don't have to worry about coming up to a meeting. So, 212,
19. in the next five or ten minutes.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

21. Senator Buzbee.

22. SENATOR BUZBEE:

23. Thank you, Mr. President. At this time I would move to
24. suspend the Six Day Posting Notice requirement to hear the
25. following four House appropriation bills in Appropriation II
26. Committee tomorrow at 9:00 a. m. House Bills 857, 1205,
27. 1595 and 2176, which are bills dealing with fairground
28. appropriations.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

30. Senators, there's been a motion to suspend the rules
31. for the purpose...to suspend the rules regarding the posting
32. of the Six Day Notice for the purpose of hearing bills in
33. Appropriation Committee. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.

1. Is there any further business to come before the Senate? If
2. not, the Senate will stand adjourned until Wednesday morning
3. ...until Wednesday, May 30th, 12:00 o'clock noon.
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
